

## Information - Residential Parking'E'Permits 2016-2017

## CLEETHORPES: YARRA ROAD/WARDALL STREET CAR PARKS

- 1. This parking scheme is in operation on Wardall Street and Yarra Road Car Parks in Cleethorpes. The scheme is in operation to assist residents in close proximity, with no on-street parking facilities.
- 2. Parking is allowed by any vehicle in possession of an Electronic Permit (E-Permit) in any marked bay within the car park subject to the car park regulations, \*except the short stay bays in Wardall Street car park. Parking within disabled bays is not permitted unless a valid disabled badge is displayed.
  - The regulations applying to the car park are enforceable by North East Lincolnshire Council Enforcement Authority.
- 3. E-Permits are valid for twelve months from the 1<sup>st</sup> April of the current year. (Subject to review, E Permits may be withdrawn at any time)
- 4. The purchase price of an E-Permit is charged to offset the administration costs of the scheme.
- 5. The number of full E-Permits issued to any single residential property at any time is limited to a maximum of **one**. The E-Permit will be for use in **one vehicle only**, being the vehicle with the registration number given on the application form.
  - Please note: The vehicle must belong to or be hired by the applicant.
- 6. Where a property is a house in multiple occupations, (bed-sits etc.) the maximum of one E-Permit refers to the whole of that property.
- 7. Where a property has been divided into self-contained units (flats etc.) the maximum of one E-Permit refers to each individual unit.
- 8. Only the occupier of the property may apply for the E-Permit. Landlords are not eligible to apply unless they are residing in the property. If the occupier is a tenant then a tenancy agreement must be submitted plus a utility bill (preferably the Council Tax bill). If the occupier of the property is the owner then a utility bill must be submitted (preferable the Council Tax bill).
- 9. The E-permit in only valid for use on the car park for which it is issued.

If you are found to be in contravention of a parking restriction then you may receive a Penalty Charge Notice. Please Note that it is an offence to falsify information in order to obtain a permit.
