THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (CENTRAL AREA, CANTERBURY) (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT No. 1) ORDER 2018

Kent County Council acting as the local traffic authority and in exercise of its powers under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 3(2), of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the Act), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:

This Order may be cited as "The Kent County Council (Central Area, Canterbury) (Traffic Regulation) (Consolidation) (Amendment No. 1) Order 2018", (this Order) and shall come into operation on 13 August 2018.

The Kent County Council (Central Area, Canterbury) (Traffic Regulation) (Consolidation) Order 2001, (the Order) shall have effect as though:

In the Articles to the Order:

Article 5

The existing entry for Article 5 to be replaced as follows:

PROHIBITION OF DRIVING OF VEHICLES

- 5. SAVE AS PROVIDED in Articles 6, 16 and 17 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction of, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause any vehicle to proceed in any of the roads or lengths of road set out in Schedule III to this Order.
- (1) Nothing in this Article shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to proceed in Burgate, Buttermarket and Sun Street if it is:
 - (a) conveying a registered guest either to or from the cathedral Gate Hotel or a resident to or from their place of residence, or
 - (b) being used for the purpose of collecting items of post as defined in the Postal Services Act 2011 from the post office letter box situated in Buttermarket:
- (2) Nothing in this Article shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to proceed in The Friars if it is:
 - (a) a vehicle being used by a registered disabled person, and the vehicle displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and if the vehicle is gaining access to the disabled person's parking bays within the Marlowe Theatre curtilage,
 - (b) A vehicle conveying goods or merchandise to or from the loading bays within the Marlowe Theatre curtilage.

In the Schedules to the Order:

THE FRIARS

The existing item in Schedule 3 referring to The Friars to be replaced as follows:

Schedule 3

Roads to be closed to all vehicles between 10.30am and 4.00pm daily (with exemptions) and roads to be closed to all motor vehicles between 4.00pm and 10.30am daily except for loading (with exemptions)

The Friars	From the junction with St Peter's Street for a distance of 116 metres in a north-easterly direction.
