ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The Kent County Council, acting as the Local Traffic Authority and in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 19, 32, 35, 36, 45, 46, 49, 51, 53, 124 and Part IV of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act') as amended and all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the RTRA 1984, hereby make the following Order:

PART A - GENERAL

Citation and commencement

 This Order shall come into operation on 19th day of May 2023 and may be cited as "The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Ashford) (Waiting Restrictions and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2023" ('this Order').

Definitions and interpretation

2. (1) In this Order except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them;

"the RTRA 1984"	means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended;
"the TMA 2004"	means the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended;
"the Regulations"	means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016, as amended;
"the Council"	means Kent County Council as Traffic Authority and where appropriate Ashford Borough Council acting on behalf of the Traffic Authority as an Agent;
"Appropriate Remittance"	in relation to Valid Permits or Valid Virtual Permits is the sum referred to in Column 4 of Schedule 4;
"Ambulance"	has the same meaning as in Schedule 2 of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act (VERA) 1994 - Ambulances and health service Vehicles;
"Authorised Taxi Rank" or "Taxi Stand"	means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a Road marking complying with the Regulations;
"Ashford"	means the administrative area of the Ashford Borough Council;
"Assistant Director Safety and Wellbeing"	means such a person as shall be approved by the Borough Council to manage the implementation and enforcement of parking controls;
"Borough Council"	means Ashford Borough Council;
"Blue Parking Clock"	means the Blue Parking Clock sent together with the Disabled Persons Badge by an authorised issuing authority in accordance with 'The Blue Badge scheme: rights and responsibilities in England';
"Bus"	has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Regulations and as being type approved by the 'Vehicle Certification Agency' as M2 or M3, and "Buses" shall be construed accordingly;

"Bus Stand"	means a length of highway prescribed by and installed in accordance with the Regulations to be used by Public Service Vehicles to wait to adhere to the published Bus timetable;
"Bus Stop Clearway"	means an area of carriageway intended for stopping by Buses which is comprised within and installed in accordance with the Regulations;
"Business"	means a commercial enterprise or establishment operating within a Parking Area or Zone as identified in this Order and included on the Council's non-domestic rates listing;
"Business Parking Permit"	means a Business Parking Permit issued by, or a virtual business parking permit recorded by, the Council under the provisions of this Order;
"Business Parking Permit Holder"	means a person to whom a Business Parking Permit has been issued or recorded;
"Car Club Vehicle"	means a vehicle of a type approved by the Council or its agent for the use of persons who have paid any relevant membership or other club fee;
"Cashless Parking"	means a method of Payment whereby the charge levied under the Borough Council's Tariff of Charges (and any appropriate administration charge) is collected by a Borough Council appointed third party, via an arranged account, with Payment being made over the telephone or by other electronic system (including via the internet) by credit or debit card or other means of secure authorised Payment;
"Chargeable Hours"	means the times of regulation relating to a Payment Parking Place as specified by the period between the hours and on the days specified in the Map Schedule Legend and/or the Map Tile Label related to that Parking Place;
"Chargepoint"	means an installation adjacent to or within a Parking Place for the purposes of recharging the battery of an Electric Vehicle;
"Civil Enforcement Area"	means an area where Civil Enforcement of highway regulations can be carried out, as defined in the TMA 2004;
"Civil Enforcement Officer" ("CEO")	has the same meaning as in section 76 of the TMA 2004;
"Commercial Vehicle" or "Goods Vehicle"	have the same meanings as "motor Vehicle" in section 136 of the RTRA 1984 and relating provisions which is constructed itself to carry a load and is type approved by the 'Vehicle Certification Agency' as N1, N2 or N3;
"Contravention"	means any breach of the provisions herein contained;
"Current"	in relation to a Vehicle licence, Blue Badge or Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit means valid on the relevant date;
"Delivering" and "Collecting"	in relation to the delivery of any Goods to, or collection of any Goods from any premises and includes checking the Goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;
"Designated Parking Place"	means a Parking Place designated by an Order made under section 32 of the RTRA 1984;

"Disabled Person" and "Disabled Person's Badge" have the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Person's Vehicle"

means a Vehicle lawfully displaying a Disabled Person's Badge and which is a Vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 to be included in an Order under the RTRA 1984, has been or is to be driven by a Disabled Person or, as the case may be, has been or is to be used for carrying Disabled Persons as passengers;

"Dispensation Certificate"

means a 'dispensation' issued by the Council under the provisions of Part H exempting a specified Vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of Road where waiting of that Vehicle would otherwise be prohibited or restricted;

"Doctors Parking Permit"

means a Doctors Parking Permit issued by, or a virtual doctors parking permit recorded by, the Council under the provisions of this Order;

"Doctors Parking Permit Holder" means a person to whom a Doctors Parking Permit has been issued or recorded;

"Driver" (in relation to a Vehicle waiting in a Parking Place) means the person driving the Vehicle at the time it was left in the Parking Place;

"Electric Vehicle"

means a motor Vehicle which is propelled by electric energy (battery-only powered Vehicle) from rechargeable batteries. The batteries provide the power to propel the Vehicle and to power the lights and all accessories within the Vehicle. Hybrid Vehicles, that combine an internal combustion engine with one or more electric motors powered by rechargeable batteries, which require charging, are included in this category;

"Electric Vehicle Charging Place" means a Parking Place designated for the sole use by an Electric Vehicle for continuous charging time, subject to any maximum period of stay;

"Electric Vehicle Charging Point" means a purpose-built unit adjacent to a Parking Place designed specifically for Electric Vehicle charging;

"Electric Vehicle Parking Permit" means a Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit issued under the provisions of Part J of this Order;

"Electric Vehicle Parking Permit Holder" means a person, Business or company owning an Electric Vehicle with a dedicated Electric Vehicle Charging Point on the public highway outside their property within the Ashford area to whom such a Permit has been issued;

"Eligible Address"

means any postal address within a street or part of a street listed in Schedule 5 in relation to a permit Parking Place or Parking Area listed in Schedule 3, which indicates that the Resident of that address may apply for a Resident's Parking Permit, Visitor Parking Permit, Electric Vehicle Parking Permit, and/or a Business Parking Permit for use within the Parking Place or Parking Area in relation to which that address is listed;

"Enactment"	means any Enactment, whether public, general or local, which includes any Order, bylaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an Enactment;
"Exemption"	means an Exemption of the types described within this Order;
"Fire Engine"	has the same meaning as in Schedule 2 of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 – Fire Engines;
"Goods"	means objects too heavy or bulky to be carried very far by hand and this includes postal packets of any description;
"Goods Vehicle"	means a motor Vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of Goods or burden of any description or a trailer so constructed or adapted;
"Handheld Device"	means a handheld computer (including mobile phone) used by a Civil Enforcement Officer whilst carrying out duties; including the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice, logging of parked cars and holding data from a Telephone or Electronic Payment System operator;
"Heavy Motor Car"	has the same meaning as in section 136 of the RTRA 1984 and relating provisions;
"Layby"	in relation to a Main Carriageway of a Road means any area intended for use for the waiting of Vehicles, lying to the side of the Road and not forming any part of the Main Carriageway;
"Licensed Taxi"	has the same meaning as in section 13 of the Transport Act 1985 and shall be: a) licensed by the Borough Council; and b) attended by the Driver and available for hire;
"Licenced Market Trader"	means a market trader licenced to trade by the Council;
"Light Goods Vehicle"	means a 4-wheel Vehicle constructed for the transportation of Goods, which has a gross weight of 3.5 tonnes or less;
"Loading" and "Unloading"	means commercial Loading/Unloading or the delivery or collection of objects too heavy or bulky (Goods) to be carried very far by hand and where no Payment or transaction takes place; and this includes postal packets of any description;
"Loading Bay"	means any length of highway prescribed by Order to be used for the Loading and Unloading of Goods, subject to the provisions of this Order; and is installed in accordance with the Regulations that is reserved for Loading/Unloading;
"Local Bus"	means a Public Service Vehicle used for the provision of a Local Service not being an excursion or tour;
"Local Service"	has the meaning given in section 2 of the Transport Act 1985;
"Main Carriageway"	in relation to a Road means any carriageway of that Road used primarily by through traffic and excludes any Laybys;
"Map Schedule"	means the Map Tiles attached to this Order and listed in Schedule 2, which depict the stopping, waiting and Loading prohibitions and restrictions and Parking Places, Loading Bays and Parking Areas designated by this Order, and in conjunction with the Map Schedule Legend and/or Map Tile Label, identifies the type of each particular

type of prohibition, restriction, Parking Place, Loading Bay or Parking Area and certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the Map Schedule and where a prohibition, restriction, Parking Place, Loading Bay or Parking Area is depicted on the Map Schedule, that provision continues to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data;

"Map Schedule Legend" means the Map Schedule Legend to this Order which, when used in conjunction with a Map Tile as listed in Schedule 2, identifies the specific types of prohibitions and restrictions of stopping, waiting and Loading and the Parking Places, Loading Bays or Parking Areas designated by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions;

"Map Tile"

means an individual map with a specific tile reference, being part of the Map Schedule as listed in Schedule 2 to this Order;

"Map Tile Label"

where shown on a Map Tile forming part of the Map Schedule in relation to a prohibition or restriction of stopping, waiting or Loading, or a Designated Parking Place, Loading Bay or Parking Area, means a label which indicates the type of provision and, if appropriate, certain of its governing conditions;

"Medical Practitioner" has the same meaning as "legally qualified Medical Practitioner" in Schedule 6, section 56, II (I) of the Medical Act 1983;

"Mobile Phone Payment" means a cashless Payment made by mobile phone to allow the Vehicle to be parked for the period of time for which Payment has been made and available for use as a Parking Charge Payment method where such facility is advertised and provided for in a Payment Parking Place and use of which is specified by notice in the Payment Parking Place;

"Minibus"

means a small passenger carrying motor Vehicle not exceeding 5.5m in length capable of carrying more than 8 but not more than 16 passengers whether or not the same is either a Motor Car or a Heavy Motor Car as the case may be;

"Motor Car"

has the same meaning as in section 136 of the RTRA 1984 and relating provisions;

"Motor Caravan"

means a motor Vehicle not exceeding 5.5m in length which provides fixed sleeping arrangements whether or not the same is either a Motor Car or a Heavy Motor Car as the case may be;

"Motorcycle"

has the same meaning as in section 136 of the RTRA 1984 and relating provisions;

"Motorcycle Bay"

means a Parking Bay installed in accordance with the Regulations that is reserved for the parking of solo Motorcycles only;

"Owner" and/or
"Registered Keeper"
(in relation to a
Vehicle)

means the person by whom such a Vehicle is kept and used;

"Parking Adjudicator" has the same meaning as in section 81 of the TMA 2004;

*Parking	Area"
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means any area on a highway designated as a Parking Area by this Order, which includes Restricted Parking Zones, Parking Areas and Permit Parking Areas, and which are identified as to the type of Parking Area on the Map Tile relating to that Parking Area, by reference to the Map Schedule Legend and/or the Map Tile Label in the Map Schedule;

"Parking Bay"

means any part of a Parking Place marked out, in accordance with the Regulations (and subsequent amendments), for the leaving of a Vehicle;

"Parking Charge"

for a Vehicle left in a Payment Parking Place shall be determined by reference to Column 2 and 3 of Schedule 7;

"Parking Period" (for a Vehicle left in a Payment Parking Place)

shall be determined by reference to Column 2 of Schedule 7;

"Parking Place"

means an area on a highway designated or authorised and identified as a Parking Place in the Map Schedule to this Order;

"Parking Service"

means the service established by the Borough Council to carry out parking activities under the Kent Highways partnership agreement between Kent County Council, as Traffic and Enforcement Authority, and Ashford Borough Council;

"Parking Services Manager"

means a person as shall be approved by the Ashford Borough Council to manage the Parking Service;

"Parking Space"

means a space within a Parking Place which is provide for the leaving of a Motor Car or Motorcycle;

"Parking Ticket"

means a ticket issued by a Parking Ticket Machine operated by the Borough Council and relating to the Payment Parking Place obtained for the purpose of showing proof of Payment in accordance with the tariff specified in Schedule 7 to this Order and which authorises the parking of a Vehicle in that Parking Place when displayed in the Relevant Position in accordance with the provisions of Article 15 of this Order;

"Parking Ticket Machine"

means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State in accordance with section 35 (3) of the RTRA 1984 for the purpose of this Order, being apparatus designed to indicate the time by a clock and to issue Parking Tickets indicating the Payment of charge and the date and time at which the Payment was made, and the time the Parking Period expires;

"Passenger Vehicle"

means a Motor Vehicle (other than a Motorcycle) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than eight passenger's, exclusive of the Driver, and not drawing a Trailer;

"Pay and Display" or "P&D"

means to purchase a Parking Ticket from a Parking Ticket Machine run by the Borough Council for Payment of Parking Charges and to display the ticket within the Vehicle, with time and date information clearly visible at all times whilst in a Parking Place;

"Payment"

means:

 a) in the case of a Payment of a Parking Charge in respect of a Payment Parking Place, a Payment by coins, Payment Card or by use of the Borough Council's Cashless Parking system; and in relation to a Valid Permit or dispensation the method used for the purchase shall be in the form of a cash, cheque, Payment Card, postal order or any other approved electronic means;

"Payment Card"

means a debit/credit card, or any other accepted form of electronic Payment system, that can be used by a person and accepted by a Parking Ticket Machine, or as a means of making a Payment for a Valid Permit, Valid Virtual Permit or Dispensation, for the purposes of paying a Parking Charge;

"Payment Parking Place"

means a Parking Place to which a Payment for parking applies on leaving a Vehicle in that Parking Place designated as such by this Order and where Payment of the Parking Charge is made by means of a Parking Ticket Machine or a Telephone or Electronic Payment System;

"Pedestrian Zone"

has the same meaning as in Part 2, Schedule 1 of the Regulations;

"Penalty Charge"

means a charge of the appropriate higher or lower rates, set in accordance with the provisions of the TMA 2004 payable to the Council in the event of any Contravention of this Order;

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice indicating a Penalty Charge has been incurred served by either attaching it to the Vehicle or by first class post to the DVLA Registered Keeper of the motor Vehicle observed in Contravention of the regulations made by this Order;

"Permit"

means a Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit of the type described within this Order and issued by the Council for which the Payment of the appropriate charge specified in Schedule 4 to this Order (or as amended by 'Public Notice') is made;

"Permit Identifier"

means any symbol, logo, letter, numeral or name (or any combination of such), specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3 applicable to the Permit Parking Places or Parking Areas specified in Column 2 and named in Column 3 of that Schedule and used on Valid Permits or Valid Virtual Permits to identify the Permit Parking Places-or Parking Areas for which they are valid and on signs at Relevant Parking Places or Parking Areas and as specified in the Map Schedule to indicate the Permits and Virtual Permits valid for those Relevant Parking Places or Parking Areas;

"Permit Parking Area" or "PPA" means a Parking Area designated as such by the provisions of this Order in which a Valid Permit is required to be displayed in a parked Vehicle during permitted hours, or a Valid Virtual Permit has been granted for such Vehicle, and shall include any Permit Parking Area identified as such in the Map Schedule;

"Permit Year"

means a period of 12 months commencing on the Permit start date in any year;

"Police Vehicle"

has the same meaning as in Schedule 2 of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 – Police Vehicles;

"Public Service Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981;

"Relevant Parking Place" means any Parking Place or Parking Area designated as such by the provisions of this Order in which a Valid Permit is required to be displayed in a parked Vehicle during permitted hours, or a Valid Virtual Permit has been granted for such Vehicle, and shall include

any permit Parking Place, shared use Parking Place or Permit Parking Area identified as such in the Map Schedule;

"Relevant Position" (in the case of a Disabled Person's Badge) a Vehicle displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the Relevant Position if:-

- (i) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that part 1 of the badge is legible from the outside of the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that part 1 of the badge is legible from the outside of the Vehicle.

"Relevant Position" (in the case of a Blue Parking Clock) A Vehicle displays a Blue Parking Clock in the Relevant Position if:-

- in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the Vehicle.

"Relevant Position" (in the case of any other badge or Permit) A Vehicle displays any other badge or Permit in the Relevant Position if:-

- in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the item is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen;
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the item is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the Vehicle with the obverse side legible.

"Relevant Position"
(in the case of a Parking Ticket)

A Vehicle displays a Parking Ticket in the Relevant Position if the item is exhibited in a conspicuous position viewable from the front or front side windows of the Vehicle with the obverse side legible;

"Resident"

means a person whose usual residence is at premises the postal address of which is in any street or part of a street described in Column 2 of Schedule 5 of this Order, and therefore is eligible as a Resident of the Zone or Permit Parking Place or Parking Area identified in Column 1 of Schedule 5 to which that street or part of street relates;

"Residents' Parking Permit" means a Residents' Parking Permit issued or a record of a Virtual Residents' Parking Permit created under the provisions of this Order;

"Residents' Parking Permit Holder"

means a person to whom a Residents' Parking Permit has been issued or to whom a record of a Virtual Residents' Parking Permit relates;

"Restricted Hours"

in relation to waiting restrictions in a Restricted Road, means the times when a prohibition or restriction on waiting applies as identified as such in the Map Tile relating to that prohibition or restriction by the Map Schedule Legend and/or Map Tile Label in the Map Schedule;

"Restricted Road"

means the Roads, lengths of Roads or sides of Road (including any footway or verge and the perimeter of any central reservation, roundabout or traffic island) identified as being subject to any

prohibition or restriction of waiting or waiting and Loading in the Map Schedule:

Provided that the expression "Restricted Road" shall not for the purposes of this Order include any Designated Parking Place, Loading Bay or Parking Area;

"Restricted Parking Zone" or "RPZ"

has the same meaning as in Part 2, Schedule 1 of the Regulations;

"Road"

means the full width - including any footway or verge - of any length of highway or of any other Road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which the Road passes;

"Scheduled Express Service"

- (i) used to carry passengers for hire or reward at separate fares otherwise than in the provision of a Local Service; and
- (ii) which is operated in accordance with a timetable;

"Service Provider" or "Agent" means the contractor authorised by the Council to accept Payment of the Parking Charge or Appropriate Remittance, either for a Parking Ticket, or a Permit or both, on its behalf and to keep a record of that Parking Charge or Appropriate Remittance and the Vehicle, Parking Place or area and the Parking Period in respect of which Payment has been made using the Telephone or Electronic Payment System;

"Special Parking Permit"

means a Special Parking Permit issued or a record of a Virtual Special Parking Permit created under the provisions of this Order;

"Special Parking Permit Holder" means a person to whom a Special Parking Permit has been issued or to whom a record of a Virtual Special Parking Permit relates;

"Taxi Rank" or "Taxi Stand" means any Road or length of Road or side of Road appointed as a rank or stand for Licensed Taxis by the Borough Council in local legislation made under section 63 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976;

Electronic Payment
System"

means an electronic system, using a telephone connection or electronic application set up and maintained by the Service Provider whereby:

- a) the Driver of a Vehicle, or some other person authorised by that Driver on their behalf, uses a telephone or electronic device to communicate with the Service Provider and make Payment of the Parking Charge or Appropriate Remittance in respect of a specified Vehicle and Parking Place in which the Vehicle is left and for a specified Parking Period by use of a credit/debit card or pre-arranged Payment account; and
- b) the Service Provider, on behalf of the Council, accepts Payment of the Parking Charge or Appropriate Remittance by the method referred to in paragraph (a) of this definition and records such Payment together with the Parking Period for which Payment has been made, the Parking Place in which the Vehicle is left and the registration mark of the Vehicle in respect of which Payment has been made.

"Traffic Sign"

means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the RTRA 1984;

"Trailer"

has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the RTRA 1984 and relating provisions;

"Valid Permit"

means any Permit issued under the provisions of this Order and identified as such under Column 2 of Schedule 6 that is required to be displayed in a Vehicle left in any Parking Place or Parking Area identified under Column 1 of that Schedule, where that Permit complies with the provisions of this Order and the conditions stated in Column 3 of that Schedule, unless the Valid Permit Holder has obtained a Valid Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit:

"Valid Permit Holder"

means a person or organisation to whom a Valid Permit has been issued or in regard of whom a Valid Virtual Permit has been recorded under the provisions of this Order;

"Valid Virtual Permit"

means an electronic record of a Permit confirmed by the Council or other authorising Agent to exempt a Vehicle from a restriction in the provisions of this Order;

"Vehicle"

means a motor Vehicle or a Trailer and "motor Vehicle" and "Trailer" have the same meaning as in Section 136 of the RTRA 1984;

"Vehicle of the Permitted Class"

means a Motor Car or a Motorcycle and "Motor Car" and "Motorcycle" have the same meaning as in section 136 of the RTRA 1984;

"Virtual Dispensation Certificate"

means an electronic record of a 'Dispensation' confirmed by the Council or other authorising Agent under the provisions of Part H of this Order exempting a specified Vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of Road where waiting of that Vehicle would otherwise be prohibited or restricted;

"Visitors' Parking Permit" means a Visitors' Parking Permit issued or a record of a Virtual Visitors' Parking Permit created under the provisions of Part K of this Order:

"Visitors' Parking Permit Holder"

means a person to or for whom a Visitors' Parking Permit has been issued or a record of a Virtual Visitors' Parking Permit has been created, but does not include a person whose usual place of employment is at any commercial enterprise or establishment within Zones D E, F and G as defined in Schedule 3 to this Order;

"Zone"

means the streets and parts of streets containing Permit Parking Places and Parking Areas as specified in the Map Schedule, where the Permit Identifier for such Parking Places or Parking Areas indicates the Zone to which those Parking Places or Parking Areas belong, and the relevant details and conditions, as set out in Schedule 3, and the eligibility of Residents to obtain Valid Permits or Valid Virtual Permits for use in that Zone and no other as set out in Schedule 5.

- (2) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires:
 - a) any reference to a numbered Article or a numbered Schedule is a reference to the Article of Schedule bearing that number in this Order;
 - b) any reference to a numbered or lettered paragraph or sub-paragraph is a reference to the paragraph or sub-paragraph bearing that number or letter in the Article or Schedule or (in the case of a sub-paragraph) paragraph in which the reference occurs; and
 - c) any reference to a Table, or to a numbered Table, is a reference to the Table, or to the Table bearing that number, in the Article or Schedule in which that reference occurs.
- (3) Any reference in this Order to any Enactment shall be construed as a reference to that Enactment as amended by any subsequent Enactment;

- (4) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made under or having effect as if made under the RTRA 1984 or by or under any other Enactment; and
- (5) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament

PART B – PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS ON THE WAITING OF VEHICLES OR THE LOADING OR UNLOADING OF VEHICLES

Prohibition or restriction on waiting

- 3. Except as provided in Part G, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait contrary to the restrictions identified in the Map Schedule to this order which indicate, with reference to the Map Schedule Legend and/or Map Tile Label, the Roads, or parts of Roads, and class of Vehicles, where, and the days and hours when:
 - (a) waiting is prohibited;
 - (b) waiting is restricted; or
 - (c) waiting with one or more wheels of the Vehicle on the footway or verge is prohibited.

The Assistant Director Safety and Wellbeing or any other persons authorised by them may modify or suspend the operation of any goods vehicle waiting restrictions or prohibitions identified in the Map Schedule to this order, or any provision of it if it appears to them essential:

- (a) in the interest of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic;
- (b) in the interest of providing suitable and adequate on-street parking facilities; or
- (c) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by a goods vehicle waiting restriction or prohibition runs.

Prohibition or restriction of Loading and Unloading

4. Nothing in Articles 27, (Exemption for Loading and Unloading of Goods) shall apply so as to render it lawful to cause or permit any Vehicle of the class specified on the Map Schedule to wait for any purpose including the Loading or Unloading of Goods contrary to the restrictions in any Road or part of Road identified in the Map Schedule to this Order which indicate, with reference to the Map Tile Label and/or Map Schedule Legend, where and when Loading and Unloading is prohibited.

PART C - PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS OF STOPPING

Prohibition or restriction of stopping

- 5. Except as provided in Article 7 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit a Vehicle to stop or remain at rest contrary to the restrictions identified in the Map Schedule to this order which indicate, with reference to the Map Schedule Legend and/or Map Tile Label, the Roads and parts of Roads where:
 - (1) stopping in the Main Carriageway is prohibited;
 - (2) stopping with one or more wheels of the Vehicle on the footway or verge is prohibited; or
 - (3) stopping on entrance markings is prohibited.
- 6. Except as otherwise provided in Article 7, if any provision of Article 5 of this Order conflicts with a provision of any other Article in this Order which grants an Exemption from the provision, the provision of Article 5 shall apply.
- 7. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a Vehicle to stop where stopping is prohibited:
 - (1) if the Vehicle is being used for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (2) to enable the Vehicle to be used for any of the following purposes and whilst being so used it is necessary for the Vehicle to stop where stopping is prohibited
 - (a) in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (b) for the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the Road, of any of the said lengths of Road; or
 - (c) for the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the said lengths or sides of Road of any sewer or any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications.
 - (3) in any case where the person in control of the Vehicle
 - (a) is required by law to stop;
 - (b) is obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident;
 - (c) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.
 - (d) causes the Vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by Traffic Signs placed pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the RTRA 1984.

PART D - PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON TAXI RANKS

Prohibition of stopping on Taxi Ranks

- 8. Save as provided in Article 10 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle, other than a Licensed Taxi plying for trade during the period indicated on the Traffic Sign, to stop or remain at rest contrary to the restrictions identified in the Map Schedule to this Order which indicate, with reference to the Map Tile Label and/or Map Schedule Legend, the Roads and parts of Roads where stopping in a Taxi Rank is prohibited.
- 9. Except as otherwise provided in Article 10 of this Order, if any provision of Article 8 of this Order conflicts with a provision of any other Article in this Order which grants an Exemption from the provision, the provision of Article 8 shall apply.
- 10. Nothing in Article 8 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait or stop on a Taxi Rank
 - (1) if the Vehicle is being used for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (2) to enable the Vehicle to be used for any of the following purposes and whilst being so used it is necessary for the Vehicle to stop where stopping is prohibited
 - (a) in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (b) for the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the Road, of any of the said lengths of Road; or
 - (c) for the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the said lengths or sides of Road of any sewer or any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications.
 - (3) in any case where the person in control of the Vehicle
 - (a) is required by law to stop;
 - (b) is obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident;
 - (c) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.
 - (d) causes the Vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by Traffic Signs placed pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Contravention of restrictions

11. Except as provided in Part G of this Order or any Article specifically referred to in Article 3, 4, 5 or 8, if a Vehicle waits or stops in a Road or part of a Road contrary to any prohibition or restriction stated in Article 3, 445 or 8 of this Order, then a Contravention shall have occurred and a Penalty-Charge is payable.

PART E - DESIGNATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES OR PARKING AREAS

Designation of Parking Places or Parking Areas

- 12. Each area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway identified in the Map Schedule to this Order which indicate, with reference to the Map Tile Label and/or Map Schedule Legend, the Roads and parts of Roads as a Parking Place or Parking Area shall be designated as such by this Order;
- 13. The limits of each Parking Place or Parking Area and the limits of any Parking Space shall be indicated by a Road marking appropriate to the position in which a Vehicle may park.
- 14. Nothing in Article 12 of this Order shall restrict the power of a police constable or of the Council to suspend any Parking Place, Parking Area or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 31.

Parking for Payment

15. (1) SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait during the Chargeable Hours in a Payment Parking Place unless it is a Vehicle of the Permitted Class and unless the Parking Charge has been paid.

PROVIDED ALWAYS the Payment of the Parking Charge shall be indicated by the Driver of the Vehicle either:

(a) by displaying in the Relevant Position a Parking Ticket issued by the Parking Ticket Machine relating to the Parking Place in which the Vehicle has been left; or

- (b) the registering of the parking event effecting the 'return' of the Motor Car's Vehicle registration number for that Parking Place from the Borough Council's Telephone or Electronic Payment System.
- (2) SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait during the Chargeable Hours in a Payment Parking Place for longer than the Parking Period paid for on Payment of the Parking Charge.
- (3) No Vehicle which has been taken away from a Parking Space in a Payment Parking Place during the Chargeable Hours after a Parking Charge has been incurred, shall until the expiration of one hour, or the designated 'no return time' specified on the Map Schedules, from the time it was taken away, again be left in that Parking Place during the Chargeable Hours.
- (4) Nothing in this Article shall apply in respect of:
 - (a) any Vehicle which is waiting in a Payment Parking Place or Parking Area in accordance with a provision of Part G of this Order; or
 - (b) any Vehicle which is waiting in a Payment Parking Place or Parking Area which is also a Permit Parking Place or Permit Parking Area and has recorded a Valid Virtual Permit or is displaying in the Relevant Position a Valid Permit issued, or a Valid Visitors' Parking Permit validated, in respect of that Vehicle for the Zone in which that Payment Parking Place or Parking Area is included.

Permit Parking Places or Permit Parking Areas

- 16. SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle, other than a Vehicle which has a Valid Virtual Permit or is displaying in the Relevant Position a Valid Permit for the Zone in which that Parking Place or Parking Area is situated of the types as follows:
 - (1) A valid Residents' Parking Permit; or

 - (2) A valid Visitors' Parking Permit; or(3) A valid Business Parking Permit; or
 - (4) A valid Electric Vehicle Parking Permit,
 - (5) A valid Doctors Parking Permit;
 - (6) A valid Special Parking Permit; or
 - (7) A valid Licenced Market Traders Permit.

to wait in any of the Parking Places or Parking Areas identified in the Map Schedule by way of a Map Tile Label and/or the Map Schedule Legend as a Parking Place or Parking Area as an area marked out and/or signed for the use therein of specified classes of Vehicles following the conditions specified in this Order in relation to that Parking Place or Parking Area, as designated by this Order.

Permit shared Parking Places or Parking Areas

- 17. SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle, other than a Vehicle:
 - (1) Which is displaying in the Relevant Position a Valid Permit issued or, in respect of which there has been granted a Valid Virtual Permit'; or
 - (2) Which is displaying in the Relevant Position a valid Visitor Parking Permit, or in respect of which there has been granted a valid Virtual Visitor Parking Permit, validated in respect of that Vehicle for the Zone in which that Parking Place or Parking Area is situated; or
 - (3) of a permitted class as described in an item in Column 3 of Schedule 4; and/or
 - (4) waiting within specified times for a specified period and not returning to wait to that Parking Place or Parking Area within the specified 'no return time',

to wait in any of the Parking Places or Parking Areas identified in the Map Schedule by way of a Map Tile Label and/or the Map Schedule Legend as a Parking Place or Parking Area as an area marked out and/or signed for the use therein of specified classes of Vehicles following the conditions specified in this Order in relation to that Parking Place or Parking Area as designated by this Order.

Administration of Parking Places and Parking Areas

18. The administration of any Parking Permit scheme shall be in accordance with the provisions of Part J, Part K, Part L, Part M and Part N of this Order.

PART F - AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES, PARKING AREAS OR LOADING BAYS

Authorisation of Parking Places, Parking Areas or Loading Bays

- 19. (1) Each area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway identified in the Map Schedule to this Order which indicate, with reference to the Map Tile Label and/or Map Schedule Legend, the Roads and parts of Roads designated as a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay are designated as such by this Order.
 - (2) The limits of each Parking Place, Parking Area, Loading Bay and the limits of any Parking Space shall be indicated by a Road marking appropriate to the position in which a Vehicle may park.
- 20. Nothing in Article 19 of this Order shall restrict the power of a police constable or of the Council to suspend any Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 31 of this Order.

Use of authorised Parking Places and Parking Areas

- 21. Save as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit:
 - (1) any Vehicle to wait where waiting is limited in any Parking Place or Parking Area;
 - (2) a Vehicle, that is not of the specified class and not displaying in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and Blue Parking Clock, to wait in any Disabled badge holder Parking Place;
 - (3) a Vehicle, that is not a Motorcycle without a sidecar attached, to wait in any of the Motorcycle Parking Place:
 - (4) a Vehicle, that is not a Motor Car or Motorcycle without a sidecar attached, to wait in any of the Motor Car and Motorcycle Parking Places;
 - (5) a Vehicle, that is not an Electric Vehicle parked for the purpose of charging at an Electric Vehicle Charging Point in any of the Electric Vehicle Charging Places, subject to any Parking Charge payable for waiting at an Electric Vehicle Charging Place must be paid in addition to any charge applicable to the supply of electricity;
 - (6) a Vehicle, that is not a Police Vehicle, to stop or to wait in any Police Vehicle Only Parking Place;
 - (7) a Vehicle, that is not an Ambulance, to stop or to wait in any Ambulance Only Parking Place;
 - (8) a Vehicle, that is not a Car Club Vehicle, to wait in any Car Club Vehicle Parking Place;
 - (9) a Vehicle, that is not a hire cycle, to wait in any hire cycle Parking Place;
 - (10) a Vehicle, that is not a Licenced Market Traders Vehicle and is not displaying in the Relevant Position a Licenced Market Traders Permit, to wait in any Licenced Market Traders Parking Place; and
 - (11) a Vehicle, that is not a Doctors Vehicle and is not displaying in the Relevant Position a Doctors Parking Permit, to wait in a Doctors Parking Place;

during the specified period, identified in the Map Schedule by way of a Map Tile Label and/or the Map Schedule Legend as a Parking Place or Parking Area as identified in any of (1) to (11) above and that is marked out and/or signed for the use therein of such Vehicles as are specified in (1) to (11) above, following the conditions specified in this Order in relation to that Parking Place or Parking Area as designated by this Order:

- (i) for longer than the maximum period for waiting specified in the Map Schedule in relation to that Parking Place or Parking Area; and
- (ii) if a period of less than the period of time specified in the Map Schedule relating to that Parking Place or Parking Area has elapsed since the termination during the permitted hours of the last period of waiting by that Vehicle on the same Road.

Use of authorised Loading Bays

22. Save as provided in Article 27 and Paragraphs (g), (h) and (i) of Article 28 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit a Vehicle not of the specified class to wait, whilst Loading or Unloading is taking place, in any of the Loading Bays identified in the Map Schedule by way of a Map Tile Label and/or the Map Schedule Legend as a Loading Bay that is marked out and/or signed for the use therein of specified

classes of Vehicles and/or designated users following the conditions specified in this Order in relation to that Loading Bay as designated by this Order:

- (i) for longer than the maximum period for Loading/Unloading specified in the Map Schedule; and
- (ii) if a period of less than the period of time specified in the Map Schedule relating to that Loading Bay has elapsed since the termination during the permitted hours of the last period of Loading/Unloading by that Vehicle on the same Road.

Conduct of Parking Places, Parking Areas and Loading Bays

23. PROVIDED ALWAYS that the provisions of Part H of this Order shall apply to any Designated Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay and, in the event of any non-compliance with a provision of Part H of this Order, a Contravention shall have occurred, and a Penalty Charge is payable.

PART G - EXEMPTIONS FROM PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

Exemption for emergency services

24. Nothing in this Order shall apply to any Vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, Ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of that Vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.

Exemption for Public Service Vehicles

25. Nothing in Part B of this Order shall apply to a Public Service Vehicle being used in the provision of a Local Service whilst waiting wholly within the limits of a marking prescribed in diagram 1025.1 of the Regulations.

Exemption for Licensed Taxis

26. Nothing in Part B of this Order shall apply to a Licensed Taxi, whilst plying for hire upon a duly authorised cab rank appointed by the Borough Council in accordance with the provisions of section 63(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 or any modification or re-enactment of the same for the time being in force and standing wholly within the limits of the marking prescribed in diagram 1028.5 of Schedule 7, Part 4, Item 7 to the Regulations.

Exemption for the Loading and Unloading of Goods

- 27. (1) SAVE as provided in Article 4 nothing in Parts B or E, or in Article 21 in Part F, of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in any Restricted Road or in any Parking Place for so long as may be necessary to enable Goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the Vehicle.
 - (2) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (1), the Driver of a Vehicle waiting for the purposes of Delivering or Collecting Goods or merchandise or Loading or Unloading the Vehicle shall move the Vehicle on the instruction of a police constable in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer whenever such moving may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.

General Exemption from prohibitions and regulations

- 28. Nothing in Article 3 of Part B, or in Part E, or in Article 21 in Part F, of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in any Restricted Road, or in any part of a Parking Place if the use of that Parking Place has not been suspended, for so long as may be necessary -
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the Vehicle or to load thereon or to unload therefrom personal luggage;
 - (b) to enable the Vehicle to be used in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
 - (c) to enable the Vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other Road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - (i) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (ii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the Road, of any of the said lengths of Road; or
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the said lengths or sides of Road of any sewer or any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications.

- (d) to enable the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other Road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties:
- (e) to enable the Vehicle to be used for the purpose of Delivering or Collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2011;
- (f) to enable the Vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of Road;
- (g) to enable a Vehicle to wait at or near a premises where a civil partnership, wedding or funeral is being conducted for so long as waiting by that Vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with that Civil partnership, wedding or funeral, unless a request is made by a police officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Office for the Vehicle to be moved;
- (h) if the Vehicle is waiting owing to the Driver being required by law to stop; or being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or in order to avoid an accident; or
- (i) to enable the vehicle to be used for a purpose authorised and described on a Dispensation Certificate or Virtual Dispensation Certificate issued by the Council provided such Dispensation is displayed on the vehicle in the appropriate position unless it is a Virtual Dispensation Certificate which exempts them from displaying the Dispensation Certificate (an appropriate remittance may be due as published by the Council's 'Fees and Charges Book').
- (j) to enable the Vehicle to be used for the purpose authorised and described in a Permit issued by the Assistant Director Safety and Wellbeing on behalf of the Borough Council provided such permit is displayed on the vehicle in the appropriate position unless it is a Virtual Permit which exempts them from displaying the Permit.
- (k) if a Goods Vehicle is waiting on a Goods Vehicle Restricted Road owing to the Driver being required by law to stop for a break as specified by regulation EC No 561/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council, also known as the 'EU Driver's hours regulations'.

Disabled Person's Vehicle

- 29. Nothing in Article 3 of Part B of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Persons Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Blue Parking Clock (on which the Driver, or other person in charge of the Vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the Roads, lengths of Road or sides of Road referred to in any of the said Articles for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle that length of Road).
- 30. Nothing in Part E of this Order, or in Article 21(1) of Part F of this Order, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Persons' Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons' badge to wait without limit of time in any of the Parking Places referred to in the said Part E, or Article 21(1) of Part F.

"PART H- CONDUCT OF PARKING PLACES, PARKING AREAS OR LOADING BAYS

Suspension of Parking Places, Parking Areas or Loading Bays

- **31.** (1) The Council may, by Notice or by Order, suspend the use of any Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay or any part thereof
 - (a) if it is satisfied that use of that Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay should be restricted or prohibited by reason that works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the Road, or by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the highway, or
 - (b) In order to prevent or mitigate congestion or obstruction of traffic, or danger to or from traffic, in consequence of extraordinary circumstances; or
 - (c) for preventing obstruction of the streets on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed.

subject to such conditions or exceptions as they consider necessary.

(2) A constable, or a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the chief officer of police, may suspend the use of a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay or any part thereof for not more than seven days in order to prevent or mitigate congestion or obstruction of traffic, or danger to or from traffic, in consequence of extraordinary circumstances.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that any person suspending the use of a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay in accordance with the provisions of this Article shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay or the part thereof the use of which is suspended such Traffic Signs as are necessary to indicate that waiting by Vehicles is prohibited.

Manner of Standing

- 32. Every Vehicle left in a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall stand;
 - (a) so that every part of the Vehicle is within the limits of that Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay.

Miscellaneous conditions

- 33. A Driver of a Vehicle shall not use a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay:
 - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining a Road or the use of a Road by other persons or so as to be a nuisance;
 - (b) when such Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay has been closed in accordance with the provisions of the preceding Article of this Order.
- 34. A Driver of a motor Vehicle using a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay shall stop the engine as soon as the Vehicle is in position in the Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the Vehicle in or to depart from the Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay.
- 35. No person shall:
 - (a) sell, offer or exhibit for sale or hire any Vehicle while it is in a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay, or
 - (b) use a Vehicle, while it is in a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skills in handicraft or services in any capacity.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that this Article shall not be deemed to prohibit persons employed in connection with a licensed Public Service Vehicle or a Licensed Taxi operation from plying for hire or accepting passengers for hire in accordance with any regulation or condition under which the service is required by law to operate.

36. While it is in a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay, no Vehicle shall receive any work of construction, cleaning, maintenance or repair except such as may be necessary to enable the Vehicle to be moved from the Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay.

Moving and removal of Vehicles

- 37. (1) When a Vehicle is left in a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay in Contravention of or noncompliance with any of the provisions of this Order a police constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the Vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay.
 - (2) In case of an emergency a police constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter the position of that Vehicle in the Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay; or remove the Vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay to any place he thinks fit.
- 38. Any person altering the position of a Vehicle in, or removing a Vehicle from, a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the Vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the Vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.

Safe custody of Vehicles removed from Parking Places, Parking Areas or Loading Bays

39. When a police constable or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a Vehicle from a Parking Place, Parking Area or Loading Bay by virtue of Article 37 of this Order he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the Vehicle.

PART I - PARKING CHARGES AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

Parking Charges

- 40. (1) The Parking Charge and the Parking Period for a Vehicle left in a Designated Parking Place referred to in the first Column of the table for Schedule 7 shall be determined by reference to the corresponding items in the second and third Columns of the Table.
 - (2) No Parking Period for a Designated Parking Place referred to in an item in the first Column of Schedule 7 shall exceed the maximum length of time mentioned in the corresponding item in the third Column.
 - (3) Parking Charges may change from time to time and the relevant information will be advertised accordingly by notice prior to a change taking effect (and published in the Council's 'Fees and Charges Book').

Parking Ticket Machines to be installed at Parking Places

- 41. (1) The Cashless Parking service shall be available or there shall be a Parking Ticket Machine on or in the vicinity of each Payment Parking Place, as identified in the Map Schedule to this Order which indicate, with reference to the Map Tile Label and/or Map Schedule Legend to be a Payment Parking Place.
 - (2) No Parking Charge shall be payable in respect of any Vehicle waiting in a designated Payment Parking Place during the Chargeable Hours if:
 - (a) at the time the Vehicle was left in that Parking Place there was on the Parking Ticket Machine relating to that Parking Place a notice placed by any person duly authorised by the Council indicating that the Parking Ticket Machine relating to that Parking Place is out of order; and
 - (b) there is no other Parking Ticket Machine available to be used for that Parking Place; and
 - (c) the Borough Council's Cashless Parking Service is 'offline'; and
 - (d) the Vehicle is removed within one hour of the Parking Ticket Machine defect being rectified and/or the Cashless Parking Service becomes available.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that if any such Vehicle is not removed within that period the Parking Charge shall be treated as having been incurred and paid at the time when the Vehicle was left in the Parking Place and all the provisions of this Order shall apply accordingly.

Payment of a Parking Charge

- 42. (1) The Parking Charge shall be payable on the leaving of the Vehicle in a Payment Parking Place referred to in the Map Schedule by the insertion in the Parking Ticket Machine relating to the Payment Parking Place in which the Vehicle is left of coins to the value of the Parking Charge; or the use of a Payment Card if the Parking Ticket Machine is able to take a Payment Card payment of the parking charge; or the registering of the parking event for that Payment Parking Place from the Borough Council's Cashless Parking Service and showing on the Handheld Device.
 - (2) Payment of the Parking Charge for any Vehicle left during the Chargeable Hours in a Payment Parking Place referred to in the Map Schedule shall be indicated by the issue by the Parking Ticket Machine relating to that Parking Place of a numbered Parking Ticket indicating the amount of Parking Charge which has been paid, and by the exhibition of that Parking Ticket on the Vehicle in the Relevant Position; or the registering of the Payment parking event effecting the 'return' of the Motor Car's Vehicle Registration Number for that Payment Parking Place from the Borough Council's Cashless Parking Service.
 - (3) No Parking Charge shall be payable in respect of any Vehicle waiting in a Designated Parking Place during the Chargeable Hours in accordance with the provisions of Part G of this Order.

Indication of expiry of a Parking Period

43. The expiry of the Parking Period for which the Parking Charge has been paid for a Vehicle left in a Payment Parking Place referred to in the Map Schedule shall be indicated when there is exhibited on the Vehicle a Parking Ticket issued by the Parking Ticket Machine relating to the Payment Parking Place in which the Vehicle is left showing the day and time of Payment of the charge, and the time shown on the clock on the said Parking Ticket Machine is more than the duration of the Payment Parking Period is later

than the time shown on that Parking Ticket, or by the expiry of the period for which a charge has been paid by the Council's Cashless Parking Service and electronic notification of such to the Council or Agent.

Indications by Parking Ticket Machines and Parking Tickets as evidence

44. If at any time when a Vehicle is left in a Payment Parking Place during the permitted hours the clock on the Parking Ticket Machine relating to the Parking Place in which the Vehicle is left and on the Parking Ticket exhibited on the Vehicle or Handheld Device give the indication given in the preceding Article, it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the Parking Charge has been duly paid, and the Parking Period for which Payment was made by the Parking Charge has already expired.

Insertion of additional coins

- 45. (1) No person shall insert in the Parking Ticket Machine relating to the Payment Parking Place in which the Vehicle is left any coins additional to those inserted by way of Payment of the Parking Charge in respect of that Vehicle. Making a Payment of the Parking Charge by use of a Payment Card if the Parking Ticket Machine is able to take a Payment Card payment; or registering a parking event on the Council's Cashless Parking Service preceding and/or following the purchase of a Parking Period via a Parking Ticket Machine shall be construed as the 'insertion of additional coins'.
 - (2) No person shall display on any Vehicle left in a Payment Parking Place referred to in the Map Schedule during the Chargeable Hours any Parking Ticket subsequent to the Parking Ticket that was displayed at the time the Vehicle was first left in the Payment Parking Place unless the provisions of Article 15(3) have first been complied with.

PART J - PROVISIONS RELATING TO PARKING PERMITS

Parking Zones

- **46.** (1) For the purposes of administering parking schemes the Council shall define by name and unique Permit Identifier such parking Zones as are necessary.
 - (2) The names and Permit Identifiers shall be detailed in Schedule 3 to this Order and the addresses of premises which comprise each parking Zone shall be as detailed in Schedule 5 to this Order.

Types of Permit and Eligibility

- 47. The Council may issue Valid Parking Permits or Valid Virtual Parking Permits of the types described in an item in Column 1 of Schedule 4.
- 48. (1) Any person, Business, partnership, company, Licenced Market Trader or Medical Practitioner owning a class of Vehicle located within Ashford as described in an item in Column 3 of Schedule 4 and meeting the qualification requirement described in Column 2 of the corresponding item may make application to the Council for the issue of a Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit of a type described in Column 1 of that Schedule.
 - (2) Any such application for a Permit shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the Appropriate Remittance. In respect of a Valid Virtual Permit all Permit applications shall be submitted in electronic form using the Telephone or Electronic Payment System and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the Appropriate Remittance.

Applications for Permits

49. On receipt of any application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this part of the Order and of the Appropriate Remittance the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is the Owner of a permitted class of Vehicle as described in Column 3 of Schedule 4 and meets the qualification requirement described in Column 2 may issue to the applicant one Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit for the leaving in a Parking Place or Parking Area in the Zone indicated on the Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit of the Vehicle to which such Permit relates by the Owner of such Vehicle or by any person using such Vehicle with the consent of the Owner other than a person to whom such Vehicle has been let for hire or reward.

Charges for Permits

50. "Appropriate Remittance" means a remittance of the sum indicated in an item in Column 4 of Schedule 4 appropriate to the type of Permit or Virtual Permit for which application is being made and shall be for the twelve month period commencing on the first day of the Permit Year for a Permit or Virtual Permit and valid in respect of Designated Parking Places referred to in the Map Schedule to this Order; and

Permit charges may change from time to time and the relevant information will be advertised accordingly prior to a change taking effect.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that for any Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit issued after the first day of the Permit Year a sum equal to one twelfth of the annual remittance will be excused for each complete period of one calendar month of that Permit Year which has elapsed.

PROVIDED ALSO that for any Valid Permit or Valid Virtual Permit surrendered a sum equal to the fraction of the annual remittance shall be refunded for each period of one calendar month of that Permit Year which is remaining.

Verification of particulars

51. The Council may at any time require an applicant for a Valid Permit, Valid Virtual Permit or a Valid Permit Holder to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of that application or any Permit issued by them as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or that the Permit is valid. In respect of a Valid Virtual Permit the Council can access the record of the Valid Virtual Permit by a Handheld Device, on the electronic database approved by the Council.

Numbers of Permits to be issued

52. The Council shall not be required to issue for any Zone a greater number of Permits than the number of designated Parking Spaces available in that Zone, or for any other specified designated Permit Parking Places a great number of Permits than the number of Parking Places so specified.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, however, that it shall be entirely within the Council's discretion in such circumstances whether or not additional Permits beyond the number of designated Parking Spaces available may be issued;

PROVIDED ALSO that it shall be entirely within the Council's discretion to restrict such additional Permits to be issued on a non-renewable basis.

Transfer of a Permit for a change of Vehicle

- 53. A Resident's Parking Permit, a Business Parking Permit, a Doctors Parking Place Permit, a Licenced Market Trader Permit and an Electric Vehicle Permit shall be available for use only on the Vehicle in respect of which it is issued but in the event of the Valid Permit Holder disposing of such Vehicle he shall be entitled to have the Permit issued for the remainder of the Permit period in respect of any substitute Vehicle and the Council, upon being satisfied as to the change of Vehicles shall, upon Payment of a fee specified in Note 3 of Schedule 4:
 - (a) in the case of an issued Permit, on the surrender of the Current Permit, issue a replacement Valid Permit and upon such issue the Current Permit shall become invalid; or
 - (b) in the case of a virtual Permit, update the record of the Valid Virtual Permit for the new Vehicle details.

Restriction on the number of Permits to be held

54. The maximum number of Permits or Virtual Permits is stated in Column 5 of Schedule 4 in relation to each type of Permit specified in Column 1 of that Schedule.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that it shall be entirely within the Council's discretion to issue on an annual and non-renewable basis additional Parking Permits beyond the number referred to in this Article if it appears to the Council that all persons likely to require a Parking Permits have had sufficient opportunity of making application under the terms of Article 49, and that the total number of Permits which may be issued for any parking Zone, Area or Place in question has not been exceeded.

Termination of rights

55. The Council shall be entitled to terminate all rights granted by the Permit if at any time there is any Contravention of any of the provisions concerning Permits contained in this Order and in such circumstances the Valid Permit Holder shall not be entitled to any refund whatsoever of any amount paid in respect of such Permit WITHOUT PREJUDICE to any other rights of the Council against the Valid Permit Holder in respect of the breach of condition giving rise to the termination of the rights granted by that Parking Permit.

Surrender, withdrawal and validity of Permits

- 56. (1) A Permit shall not be assigned or transferred to any other person except as hereinafter provided but a Valid Permit Holder may surrender a Permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a Permit on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
 - (2) The Council may, by notice in writing served on the Valid Permit Holder by sending the same by first class post to the Valid Permit Holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the Permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, withdraw a Permit if it appears to the Council that any one of the events set out in paragraphs (3) (a), (b) or (c) of this Article has occurred and the Valid Permit Holder shall surrender the Permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt to the aforementioned notice.
 - (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-
 - (a) the Valid Permit Holder:
 - being a Residents' Parking Permit holder ceasing to be a Resident in the Parking Zone as described in Article 46 of this Order for which the Residents' Parking Permit in question was issued;
 - (ii) being a Business Parking Permit holder, Doctors Parking Place Permit holder, Licenced Market Trader Permit holder or Special Permit Holder, ceasing to meet the qualification requirement appropriate to that type of Permit as described in the Schedule 4 for which the Permit in question was issued;
 - (b) the Valid Permit Holder ceasing to be the Owner of the Vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued;
 - (c) the Vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a Vehicle of the class specified in Column 3 of Schedule 4 appropriate to the type of Permit held;
 - (d) the issue of a revised Permit or a duplicate Permit by the council under the provisions of the Article 57 of this Order;
 - (e) the Permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article.
 - (f) the withdrawal of such Permit by the Council under paragraph (2) of this Article.
 - (4) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Article, a Permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article, whichever is earlier.
 - (5) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall affect the validity of or require the surrender of or enable the Council to withdraw the Permit or not renew it on the grounds that the event set out in paragraph (3) (b) of this Article has occurred if the Valid Permit Holder has duly applied to the Council for the Permit to be amended pursuant to Article 53 of this Order.

Issue of duplicate Permits

- 57. (1) If a Permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate permit and the Council, upon the receipt of the Permit in issue and upon receipt the fee for the issue of a duplicate permit as specified in Note 4 to Schedule 4, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the Permit shall become invalid.
 - (2) If a Permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate permit and the Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the permit shall become invalid.

(3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a revised permit or a duplicate permit and an application therefore as if it were a permit or as the case may be an application therefore.

PART K - PROVISIONS RELATING TO VISITOR PARKING PERMITS

Visitor Parking Permits

- **58.** In addition to the generality of the provisions related to Parking Permits set out in Part J the operation of the Visitor Parking Permits scheme is set out in this Part as follows.
- 59. Any Resident may apply to the Council for the issue of one or more books or wallets of Visitor Parking Permits or Virtual Visitor Parking Permits for a Vehicle or Vehicles of the classes described in Column 3 of Schedule 4 of this Order and belonging to a person or persons visiting that Resident and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the Appropriate Remittance. In respect of a Valid Virtual Permit all Permit applications shall be submitted in electronic form using the Telephone or Electronic Payment System and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the Appropriate Remittance.
- 60. "Appropriate Remittance" means the charge listed in Column 4 of Schedule 4 for Visitor Parking Permits.
- 61. On receipt of any application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this part of the Order and of the remittance specified in the previous Article, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a Resident shall issue to the applicant one or more Visitors' Parking Permits or Virtual Visitors' Parking Permits for the leaving of a Vehicle belonging to or being used by a person visiting that Resident in a Parking Space in any Parking Place or Parking Area in the Parking Zone to which such Visitors' Parking Permit or Virtual Visitors' Parking Permit relates.
 - PROVIDED ALWAYS that the Council may, at its absolute discretion limit the number of Visitors' Parking Permits that are issued at any one time in respect of a particular household and may require the production and surrender of used Visitors' Parking Permits before issuing a further Permit or Permits.
- 62. A Valid Visitors' Parking Permit shall be valid on a particular day as if it were a Residents' Parking Permit issued by the Council pursuant to Part J of this Order if and only if on the face of the Valid Permit there is indicated as required the date of the occasion upon which the Valid Permit is being used and no other writing or remark, or the Valid Permit Holder has obtained a Valid Virtual Visitors' Permit which exempts them from displaying a Permit.

PART L - PROVISIONS RELATING TO DOCTOR PARKING PERMITS

Doctor Permit Parking Places

- 63. In addition to the generality of the provisions related to Parking Permits set out in Part J, the operation of the Doctors Parking Permit scheme is set out in this Part as follows.
- **64.** For the purposes of administering a Doctor Permit Parking Place scheme the Council shall designate such Doctor Permit Parking Places as are necessary.

Eligibility for Doctor Parking Permits

65. Any Medical Practitioner may apply to the Council for the issue of a Doctor Permit, or create a record of a Virtual Doctor Permit, in respect of each Vehicle which shall be specified on the application and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or shall be submitted in electronic form using the Telephone or Electronic Payment System and shall include the particular information and authentication required by such form to be supplied.

Restriction on Numbers of Doctor Parking Permits to be Issued

- 66. The Council shall not be required to issue or create records for a greater number of Doctor Permits than the number of designated Doctor Permit Parking Spaces available;
 - (1) PROVIDED ALWAYS, however, that it shall be entirely within the Council's discretion in such circumstances whether or not additional Doctor Permits, beyond the number of designated Doctor Permit parking spaces available, may be issued;
 - (2) PROVIDED ALSO that it shall be entirely within the Council's discretion to restrict such additional Doctor Permits to be issued or created on an annual and non-renewable basis.

Termination of Rights

- 67. The Council shall be entitled to terminate all rights granted by the doctor parking place permit if at any time there is any contravention of any of the provisions contained within this Order.
- **68.** WITHOUT PREJUDICE to any other rights of the Council against the Parking Permit Holder in respect of the breach of condition giving rise to the termination of the rights granted by that Doctor Parking Place Permit.

PART M - PROVISIONS RELATING TO SPECIAL PARKING PERMITS

Special Parking Permits

69. In addition to the generality of the provisions related to Parking Permits set out in Part J the operation of the Special Permit scheme is set out in this Part as follows.

Vehicle Specific Special Parking Permits

70. Any Medical Practitioner or person that is a Resident located within the Ashford area, and receives regular visits from care or other support service organisations using a specific Vehicle, may make an application to the Council for the issue of a Special Permit or Virtual Special Permit for a specific Vehicle Registration and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or shall be submitted in electronic form using the Telephone or Electronic Payment System and shall include the registration number of the Vehicle, medical evidence, information, and authentication as required by such form to be supplied.

Non-Vehicle Specific Special Parking Permits

71. Any Medical Practitioner or person that is a Resident located within the Ashford area, and receives regular visits from care or other support service organisations, where different Vehicles may be used, may make an application to the Council for the issue of a Special Permit or Virtual Special Permit to be used by a Health or Care Worker or a Medical Practitioner visiting said Resident and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or shall be submitted in electronic form using the Telephone or Electronic Payment System and shall include the medical evidence, information and authentication as required by such form to be supplied.

PART N - PROVISIONS RELATING TO LICENCED MARKET TRADER PERMITS

Licenced Market Trader Permits

- 72. In addition to the generality of the provisions related to Parking Permits set out in Part J the operation of the Licenced Market Trader Permit scheme is set out in this Part as follows.
- 73. Subject to availability, any Licenced Market Trader may apply to the Council for a Licenced Market Trader Permit or Virtual Valid Permit. Any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or shall be submitted in electronic form using the Telephone or Electronic Payment System. Such application for any Licenced Market Trader Permit shall include all information, and authentication required by the form and shall be accompanied by the Appropriate Remittance specified in Column 3 of Schedule 4 to this Order.
- 74. No person or market trader person shall be entitled to more than the number of Licenced Market Trader Permits or Virtual Valid Permits as specified in Column 5 of Schedule 4 to this Order.

PART P - VALIDITY

Validity

75. If a Court, or the Department for Transport, the Traffic Penalty Tribunal, or the Traffic Enforcement Centre declares any part of this Order to be invalid or unenforceable, such declaration shall not invalidate the remainder of the Order.

Revocations

76. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Orders specified in Schedule 1 and any amendments to the Orders in so far as they are consolidated by this Order are hereby revoked.
