

COUNTY COUNCIL OF AVONROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967 - SECTION 21VARIATION OF SCHEME FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CROSSINGS FOR FOOT PASSENGERS

The County Council of Avon in exercise of their powers under Section 21 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 hereby vary the "Scheme for the Establishment of Crossings for Foot Passengers" in the City of Bath, approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment on the 13th May, 1977, by :-

- (a) the deletion therefrom of the following uncontrolled (zebra) crossings -

Across Dorchester Street at its junction with Southgate Street	2
Across Southgate Street at its junction with Dorchester Street from the west side of Southgate Street to the traffic island	1
Across St.James' Parade at its junction with Somerset Street from the north-east side of St.James' Parade to the traffic island	1

and

- (b) the addition thereto of the following light controlled (pelican) crossings -

Across Dorchester Street at its junction with Southgate Street	2 pelican
Across Southgate Street at its junction with Dorchester Street from the west side of Southgate Street to the traffic island	1 pelican
Across St.James' Parade at its junction with Somerset Street from the north-east side of St.James' Parade to the traffic island	1 pelican
