

COUNTY COUNCIL OF AVON

(THE BATCH, BATHEASTON, DISTRICT OF WANSDYKE)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1977

The County Council of Avon (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 84C(1) of the Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on 7th March 1977 and may be cited as the "County Council of Avon (The Batch, Batheaston, District of Wansdyke) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1977".

2. (1) In this Order

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(England and Wales)(Amendment) Regulations 1975;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631: 1970), coloured orange and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means

(i) In the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen;

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applied for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. Save as provided in Article 4 and Article 5 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day in the length of road or on either of the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road or on either of the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

(a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

(b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;



- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length or the said sides of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length or the said sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road or on either of the said sides of road.

5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the length of road or on either of the sides of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road).

6. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1967 or by or under any other enactment.

THE BATCH

Both sides

- the whole of the vehicular length, except that part on the south-east side which extends from the north-east building line of Laburnam Terrace south-westwards for 15 metres.
