ROAD TRAFFIC

THE A4 TRUNK ROAD (SALTFORD, BATH) (WAITING RESTRICTION AND PROHIBITION) ORDER 2007

Made 6 June 2007

Coming into force ... 16 June 2007

The Secretary of State for Transport in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:

 This Order may be cited as the A4 Trunk Road (Saltford, Bath) (Waiting Restriction And Prohibition) Order 200 and shall come into force on 16 June 2007.

2. In this Order:

'the trunk road' means the A4 Trunk Road at Saltford, known as

Bath Road, in Bath and North East Somerset:

'the layby' means the part of the eastbound carriageway of

the A4 from a point 44 metres east of Beech Road to a point 106 metres east of the same point and adjacent to the north eastern side of the bus layby:

'disabled person's vehicle' has the meaning given in the Local Authorities'

Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)

(England) (Regulations) 2000 (b);

'disabled person's badge' has the meaning given in regulation 2(1) of the

Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)

(England) Regulations 2000 (c);

'parking disc' has the meaning given in regulation 8(5) of the

Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

'relevant position' has the meaning given in

has the meaning given in regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled

Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 (a)

'a disabled person's parking bay'

means a parking bay for a vehicle displaying a

disabled person's badge;

'a doctor's parking permit'

means a parking bay for a vehicle displaying a

doctor's parking permit.

3. Save as provided in article 4, no person shall, except upon the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle -

- (a) to wait at any time -
 - on the eastern side of the layby of the trunk road from a point 44 metres east of Beech Road to a point 106 metres east of the same point; and
 - ii) on the western side of the layby of the trunk road from a point 96 metres east of Beech Road to a point 100 metres east of the same point;
 - iii) in a disabled parking bay on the northern side of the layby;
 - iv) in the doctor's parking bay on the northern side of the layby; and
- (b) to wait for a period exceeding two hours from Monday to Saturday (not being separated by an interval of less than one hour from the previous period of waiting by that vehicle on the road on the same day) between 8.00 hours and 18.00 hours on the western side of the layby of the trunk road from a point 52 metres east of Beech Road to a point 96 metres east of the same point.
- 4. Nothing in article 3 shall apply:
 - (a) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting on a side of the trunk road specified for so long as may be necessary for it to be used in conjunction with --
 - (i) any building operation or demolition,
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the trunk road, or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal in or near the trunk road of any sewer, main, pipe conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas,





water, electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984 (a);

- (b) in relation to a vehicle being used -
 - (i) for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes,
 - in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties,
 - (iii) in the service of a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Industry Act 1991 (b), or
 - (iv) by a universal service provider for the purpose of the provision of a universal postal service as defined by the Postal Service Act 2000 (c);
- (c) in relation to a vehicle waiting on a side of the trunk road for so long as may be necessary to enable
 - (i) any person to enter of leave that vehicle, or
 - (ii) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from that vehicle.
- 5. Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle, which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (upon which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began), to wait in the layby as shown in article 3 (a) (i), (ii) and (iii)] for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by that vehicle on the same side of the road on the same day).
- 6. Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a doctor's vehicle, which displays a doctor's parking permit, to wait in the doctor's parking bay.
