THE A4 TRUNK ROAD (LAYBY AT BATH ROAD, SALTFORD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2008

28 March 2008

Coming into force

5 April 2008

The Secretary of State for Transport in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1(1), 2(1), (2) and 4(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), makes the following Order:-

- This Order may be cited as the A4 Trunk Road (Layby at Bath Road, Saltford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2008 and shall come into force on 1 April 2008.
- 2. In this Order:

"the trunk road"

means the A4 Trunk Road at Bath Road, Saltford in Bath and North East Somerset;

"the layby"

means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by road marking of the type shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b) and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which

"Operating weight"

shall be calculated as provided in section 138 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

- 3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, cause or permit any vehicle with an operating weight exceeding 5 tonnes to wait in the layby adjacent to the north-eastern side of the trunk road situated 314 metres east of Pixash Lane, Saltford, at any time.
- 4. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to:
 - (a) any vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority, ambulance or traffic officer purposes; or
 - (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform.

"Operating weight"

shall be calculated as provided in section 138 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

- 3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, cause or permit any vehicle with an operating weight exceeding 5 tonnes to wait in the layby adjacent to the north-eastern side of the trunk road situated 314 metres east of Pixash Lane, Saltford, at any time.
- 4. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to:
 - (a) any vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority, ambulance or traffic officer purposes; or
 - (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform.
