### ROAD TRAFFIC

#### THE A36 TRUNK ROAD (WARMINSTER ROAD, BATHAMPTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2008.

Made.....11 July 2008

Coming into force.....21 July 2008

The Secretary of State for Transport in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1(1), 2(1) and 4(1) and 4(2) of, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Warminster Road, Bathampton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2008 and shall come into force on 21 July 2008.
2. In this Order:
  - (a) 'the trunk road' means the A36 Trunk Road, Warminster Road, in Bath and North East Somerset from a point 30 metres south west of the centre point of the junction with Trossacks Drive to the centre point of the eastern junction with St Georges Hill;
  - (b) 'bus stop area' means any area of carriageway on a side of the trunk road intended for the waiting of buses, which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1025.1 – 4 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 (b);
  - (c) 'disabled person's badge' has the meaning given in regulation 2(1) of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (c);

- (d) 'parking disc' has the meaning given in regulation 8(5) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 (a);
  - (e) 'relevant position' has the meaning given in regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
3. Save as provided in article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction of, or with the permission of, a police or traffic officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the trunk road.
4. Nothing in article 3 shall apply:
- i) in relation to a public service vehicle waiting at any time in a bus stop area;
  - ii) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting on a side of the trunk road for so long as may be necessary for it to be used in conjunction with-
    - a) any building operation or demolition,
    - b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic,
    - c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the trunk road, or
    - d) the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal removal in or near the trunk road of any sewer, main, pipe conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984 (b);
  - iii) in relation to a vehicle being used –
    - a) for fire and rescue authority, ambulance, police or traffic officer purpose,
    - b) in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties,
    - c) in the service of a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Industry Act 1991 (c), or
    - d) by a universal service provider for the purpose of the provision of a universal postal service as defined by the Postal Services Act 2000 (d),

iv) in relation to a vehicle waiting on a side of the trunk road for so long as may be necessary to enable –

a) any person to enter or leave that vehicle, or

b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from that vehicle.

b) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle, which displays, in the relevant position, a disabled person's badge and a parking disc upon which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began, to wait on a side of the lengths of trunk road specified in article 3 for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by that vehicle on the same side of the road on the same day).
