THE COUNTY OF BEDFORDSHIRE (HIGH STREET, CHURCH WALK AND DOVE LANE, HARROLD) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2009

The Council of the County of Bedfordshire ('the Council') in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("The Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order: -

- This Order shall come into operation on the 23rd day of February 2009 and may be cited as "The County of Bedfordshire (High Street, Church Walk and Dove Lane, Harrold) Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2009"
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5, and 6 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule 1 to this Order at any time.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5, and 6 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule 2 to this Order between the hours of 8.00am 9.30am and 3.00pm 4.30pm Monday to Friday inclusive.
- 4. Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or in the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said lengths of road of any sewer or main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as described in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - (c) the vehicle to be loaded or unloaded while it is in actual use in connection with removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it is in the service of or employed by a universal service provider (as defined in Section 4(3) and (4) of the Postal Services Act 2000), to be used for the purpose of delivering and/or collecting postal packets (as defined in Section 125(1) of the Post Services Act 2000);
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (f) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road to be used in the service of a Local Authority in pursuance of Statutory Powers or duties;
 - (g) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;

- (h) the vehicle to wait for so long as it may be necessary for enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (i) the vehicle to wait for so long as it may be necessary to enable a gate or barrier to be opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises.
- 5. Nothing in Articles 2 or 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which lawfully displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of road referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road specified in the Schedule).
- 6. (i) For the purposes of Article 5 "disabled persons badge" and "parking disc" have the same meanings as in "The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000"
 - (ii) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when:
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or
 - (ii) In the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle and
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forward or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
 - (iii) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a number or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order

SCHEDULE 1

(No Waiting At Any Time)

- 1. On both sides of High Street, Harrold which extends from the boundary of 50/52 High Street eastwards for a distance of 100 metres.
- 2. On western side of Church Walk, Harrold which extends from the boundary of 37 High Street southwards for a distance of 6 metres.
- 3. On eastern side of Church Walk, Harrold which extends from the boundary of 1 Church Walk southwards for a distance of 6 metres.
- On western side of Dove Lane, Harrold which extends from the boundary of 48 High Street northwards for a distance of 3 metres.

SCHEDULE 2

(No Waiting between the hours of 8.00am - 9.30am and 3.00pm - 4.30pm Monday to Friday inclusive)

On both sides of High Street, Harrold which extends from a point 5 metres west from the boundary of 36/38 High Street eastwards for a distance of 26 metres.
