THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (VARIOUS ROADS) (VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS) AND (REVOCATIONS) No. 4 ORDER 2013

THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (hereafter referred to as 'the Council') under Section 1, 2, 3, 4, 32, 45, 46, 46a, 47, 49, 53 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereafter referred to as the 'Act of 1984), the Traffic Management Act 2004 and The Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Borough of Blackpool) Order 2003 (Statutory Instrument No 2677) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police pursuant to Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and all other enabling powers hereby propose to make the above Order.

1. IN this Order except where the content otherwise expressly requires the following words or expressions shall have these meanings assigned to them;-

"a person authorised by the Council" means a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer in uniform.

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person in uniform authorised by the Council to supervise any parking place.

"disabled person's badge" shall have the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended by the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2000 that has not ceased to be in force.

"disabled persons parking disc" means a device which:-

- a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue;
- b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
- c) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period has begun as described in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

"disabled persons vehicle" means a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in accordance with the circumstances prescribed in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended.

"invalid carriage" means the same as in Section 136 (5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued or served by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 containing the provisions therein required.

"Relevant Position" shall have the following meanings:-

- (a) on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle so that the font of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- (c) on the windscreen so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; and
- (d) in each case for the avoidance of doubt so that no letter, numeral or symbol on the front of the badge is obscured.

"servicing" means the conveyance of equipment, goods or merchandise to or from a premise or for carrying out maintenance works to a premise.

"Universal Service Provider" shall have the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

"vehicle" shall not be taken to include non-motor vehicles.

"goods" includes postal packets of any description.

"goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer and has an unladen weight not exceeding 30 cwt.

"motor cycle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984.

"parking place" means an area on a highway designated as a parking place by Article 14 of this Order.

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and which is 5.5 metres in length and 2 metres in width.

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers or their effects and adapted to carry not more than 12 passengers exclusive of the driver and not drawing a trailer.

"Permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 16 of this Order.

"permit holder" means a person to whom a permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 21 of this Order.

"resident" means a person whose usual place of abode is at premises the postal address of which is described in Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 of this Order.

"visitor" means a person who calls at or visits the premises of a resident described above.

"dual purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as the Sixth Schedule of the Act of 1984.

- 2. SAVE as provided in Article 4 or Article 5 of this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. SAVE as provided in Article 4 or Article 5 of this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 2 to this Order on the days and during the times specified therein.
- 4. NOTHING in Article 2 and Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 to this Order for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;

- (c) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (e) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
- if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;
- (g) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.
- <u>5. NOTHING</u> in Article 2 and Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 of this Order on the days and during the times specified therein in relation to that length of road:-
 - (a) if the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a disabled persons badge and a disabled persons parking disc which said disc is (i) exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle or (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that in either case, when marked to show the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle, on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, for a period not exceeding three hours and not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day.
 - (b) If the vehicle is an invalid carriage.

- 6. SAVE as provided in Article 8 of this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 3 to this Order for the purpose of loading and/or unloading.
- 7. SAVE as provided in Article 8 of this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 4 to this Order on the days and during the times specified therein for the purpose of loading and/or unloading.
- 8. NOTHING in Article 6 and Article 7 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;
 - (c) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (e) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
 - (f) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;
 - (g) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.

- 9. NO person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to stop in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 5 of this Order on the days and during the times specified therein.
- 10. (a) SAVE as provided in Article 11 to this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 6 or Schedule 7 to this Order on the days and during the times specified therein.
- (b) NOTHING in Article 10(a) hereto shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in a length of road described in Schedule 6 to this Order if the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a disabled persons badge and a disabled persons parking disc on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began for a period not exceeding three hour and not being a period separated by an interval of less than six hours from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day.
- (c) NOTHING in Article 10(a) hereto shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in a length of road described in Schedule 7 to this Order if the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a disabled persons badge and a disabled persons parking disc on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began for a period not exceeding one hour and not being a period separated by an interval of less than two hours from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day.
- 11. NOTHING in Article 10 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;
 - (c) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of

the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984:

- (e) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
- (f) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;
- (g) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.
- 12. THE Borough of Blackpool (Town Centre) (On-Street Pay And Display Parking Places) Order 2006 shall have effect as though the provisions contained in Schedule 8 to this Order were contained in and formed part of the Fifth Schedule to the 2006 Order.
- 13. THE said Order of 2006 shall be in full force and effect as if the provision of Article 12 and Schedule 8 hereto had originally formed part of the said Order of 2006.
- 14. EACH area on a highway which is described as a designated parking place in Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 to this Order is designated as a parking place for use at all times for the use by residents of properties described therein, subject to the provisions of Articles 15 to 29 inclusive, Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 of this Order, by the classes of vehicle specified in Article 16 (1) of this Order.
- 15. EACH parking place may be used, subject to the provisions of this order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles specified in Article 16 (1) of this Order that display in the manner specified in Article 23 of this Order a valid Permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle.
- 16. (1) ANY resident who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle or a motor cycle, may apply to the Council for the issue of (a) a Permit for the leaving of that vehicle at any time in a parking space in any parking place designated by this Order (b) a Permit for the use of visitors vehicles subject to the vehicle being a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle or a motor cycle. Each household will be

limited to one resident's and one visitor's parking Permit. Any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for such charge specified in Article 20 of this Order as is appropriate in respect of the Permit for which application is being made.

- (2) THE Council may at any time require an applicant for a Permit to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a Permit made to it as it may reasonably require to verify any particulars of information given to it.
- (3) ON receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Articles, and of the fee specified in Article 20 of this Order, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant therefore:-

One resident's and one visitor's Permit for the leaving of the vehicle to which such Permit relates to any time a parking space within the Area specified in the Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 to this Order; Provided that, subject to the provisions of Article 18 of this Order, the Council shall not issue a Permit to any resident which would be valid for any period during which any other Permit issued to that resident is or would be valid.

- 17. (1) A permit holder may surrender a Permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a Permit to the Council on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
- (2) THE Council may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder by delivery by hand or by the sending of the same by the recorded delivery service to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the Permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, withdraw a Permit if it appears to the Council that any one of the events set out in paragraphs (3)(a), (3)(b) or (3)(d) of this Article has occurred and the permit holder shall surrender the Permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice, such receipt, if the notice is sent by the recorded delivery service, to be deemed to have occurred in the normal course of post.
- (3) THE events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-
 - (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
 - (b) the permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued;
 - (c) the withdrawal of such Permit by the Council under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article;

- (d) the vehicle in respect of which such Permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of class specified in Article 16 (1) of this Order;
- (e) the issue of a duplicate Permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 18 of this Order;
- (f) the Permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions or paragraph (4) of this Article.
- (4) ALL Permits shall be issued for a maximum period of one year and shall, whenever issued, be valid only until and including the next 1st day of May or until the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraphs (3)(a), (3)(b), (3)(c), (3)(d) or (3)(e) of this Article, whichever is the earlier.
- (5) WHERE a Permit is issued to any person upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured, the Permit shall cease to be of any effect and the Council shall by notice in writing served on the person to whom such Permit was issued by delivery by hand or by the sending of the same by the recorded delivery service to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the Permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, require that person to surrender the Permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice, such receipt, if the notice is sent by the recorded delivery service, to be deemed to have occurred in the normal course of post.
- (6) THE visitor's Permit shall be surrendered in the event of the holder ceasing to be a resident.
- (7) THE Council may at any time require a permit holder to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of any Permit issued by it as it may reasonably require.
 - (8) A Permit will cease to be valid upon assignment.
- 18 (1) IF a Permit is accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the Permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate Permit and the Council, upon the receipt of the Permit, if such receipt is accompanied by an application for a duplicate Permit, shall issue a duplicate Permit so marked and upon such issue the Permit shall become invalid.
- (2) IF a Permit is lost, accidentally destroyed or mutilated, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate Permit, and the Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, and upon receipt of an application for a duplicate together with a payment of £12.50 (Twelve pounds and Fifty pence) or such other sum as may from time to time be determined by the Council, shall issue a duplicate Permit so marked and upon such issue the Permit shall become invalid.

(3) THE provisions of Articles 15 to 29 inclusive, Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 of this Order shall apply to a duplicate Permit and an application therefore as if it were a Permit. (1) A resident's parking Permit shall include the following particulars:-19 a. the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit has been issued; b. the date after which, subject to the provisions of Article 17 (4) of this Order, the Permit shall no longer be valid; c. an authentication that the Permit has been issued by the Council; and d. the abbreviation 'HAIG' in the case of Schedule 9 the abbreviation 'WTPK' in the case of Schedule 10 (2) A visitor's parking Permit shall include the following particulars:a. the date after which, subject to the provisions of Article 17 (4) of this Order, the Permit shall no longer be valid; b. an authentication that the Permit has been issued by the Council; c. the abbreviation 'HAIG' in the case of Schedule 9 the abbreviation 'WTPK' in the case of Schedule 10 d. the address of the resident's household. THE charge in connection with the issue of a resident's visitor's Permit for the leaving of a vehicle in the parking place designated by this Order shall be the sum of £12.50 (Twelve pounds and Fifty pence) or such other sum as may from time to time be determined by the Council. (1) THE charge in respect of the issue of a Permit for the leaving of a vehicle in a parking place shall be payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 20 of this Order. (2) NO person shall be entitled to a refund of the charge paid in respect of the issue of a Permit in any circumstances whatsoever. WHEN a resident surrenders his/her Permit because he/she has ceased to be the 22. owner of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued he/she may obtain, free of charge, a replacement Permit in respect of the vehicle with which he/she has replaced the vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued so long as the replacement vehicle is within the classes of vehicle specified in Article 16(1) of this Order. AT all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place there shall be displayed

behind the windscreen on the left or near side of the vehicle, a valid Permit issued in respect

of that vehicle so that all the particulars referred to in Article 19 of this Order are readily visible from the front or near side of the vehicle.

<u>24.</u> <u>WHERE</u> a Permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 23 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the Permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.

25. THE Council shall:-

- a. cause the limits of each parking place and of each parking space to be indicated on the carriageway by placing and maintaining thereon the appropriate traffic signs;
- b. place and maintain on or in the vicinity of each parking place appropriate traffic signs for indicating that such parking place may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving of the vehicles specified in Articles 15 to 29 inclusive, Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 of this Order; and
- c. carry out such other work as is reasonably required for (i) the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place and (ii) the purposes of the satisfactory operation of Articles 15 to 29 inclusive, Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 of this Order.
- 26. (1) A Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place he/she thinks fit, any vehicle left in a parking place.
- (2) NO person shall use any vehicle, while it is in parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill or his services in any other capacity, provided that nothing in this paragraph (Article 26 (2)) shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle if the vehicle is a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle or a motor cycle and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.
- (3) THE driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine of the vehicle as soon as the vehicle is in the proper position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicles in or to depart from the parking place.
- 27. (1) NOTWITHSTANDING the provisions of Articles 14 to 28 inclusive, Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 of this Order, any vehicle may wait anywhere on the carriageway in a parking place (other than a parking place or part of a parking place the use of which has been suspended, under Article 29 of this Order) for so long as may be necessary if:-

- a. the vehicle is waiting to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid accident;
- c. the vehicle is a vehicle used for Fire and Rescue Service purposes or an Ambulance, or a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of a Local Authority or a vehicle in the service of a Police Force in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- d. the vehicle is waiting to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- e. the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is waiting to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in paragraph (1)(b) of Article 28 of this Order;
- f. the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling-house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- g. the vehicle is in actual use at premises adjacent to a parking place in connection with a wedding or a funeral.
- (2) ANY vehicle waiting in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be exempt from the payment of any charge specified or the acquisition and the display of a Permit referred to in this Order.
- (3) EXCEPT as provided in the foregoing provisions of this Article and in Article 29 to this Order no person shall cause or permit a vehicle in respect of which a valid Permit is not in force in relation to that vehicle to wait in a parking place at any time.
- (4) NOTHING in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be in contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Act 1984.
- 28. (1) THE Council's authorised office may suspend or cause to be suspended the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspensions reasonably necessary:
 - a. the purposes of facilitating the safe movement of traffic or promoting its safety
 - b. for the purpose of any building operation demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place howsoever defined in this Order or the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus or traffic sign

- c. for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to a parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling-house to another or the removal of furniture from one such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository
- d. on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of filming or some special attraction that any street will be throughd or obstructed
- e. for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals or other special occasions.
- (2) A Police Constable in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he/she considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) ANY person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to any part of that parking place the use of which is suspended by a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) WHENEVER a parking place is suspended in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article then the Council may charge an administration fee to the person or body requesting the suspension in respect of that parking place or part thereof suspended from use.
- ______(5) NO person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a parking place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article provided that this paragraph shall not apply to a vehicle for so long as may be necessary; (a) being used for Fire and Rescue Services, Ambulance or Police purposes or (b) left in such parking place with the permission (i) of the person suspending the use of the parking place or the part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article (ii) of a police constable in uniform (iii) of a Civil Enforcement Officer
- 29. NOTWITHSTANDING any of the foregoing provisions of this Order, the Council may at its discretion (including requiring an administration fee) issue a dispensation allowing a specific vehicle to wait in a parking place including a suspended parking place during the hours of operation of any restriction or prohibition to the contrary.
- 30. - 40. THE Order shall come into operation on the 28th March 2014 and may be cited as "THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (VARIOUS ROADS) (VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS) AND (REVOCATIONS) No4 ORDER 2013"
