BLACKPOOL BOROUGH COUNCIL THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (ANCHORSHOLME - PART) (PERMIT PARKING) ORDER 2017

THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (hereafter referred to as "the Council") under Section 1, 2, 3, 4, 45, 46, 53 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereafter referred to as the 'Act of 1984), the Traffic Management Act 2004 and The Road Traffic (permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Borough of Blackpool) Order 2003 (Statutory Instrument No 2677) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police pursuant to Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and all other enabling powers hereby made the following Order.

COMMENCEMENT AND CITATION

1. THIS Order shall come into operation on the **15th September 2017** and may be cited as "THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (ANCHORSHOLME - PART) (PERMIT PARKING) ORDER 2017

INTERPRETATIONS

<u>2.</u> <u>IN</u> this Order except where the content otherwise expressly requires the following words or expressions shall have these meanings assigned to them;-

"a person authorised by the Council" means a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform;

"car-derived van" has the same meaning as in the Act of 1984;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person in uniform authorised by the Council to supervise any parking place;

"disabled person's badge" shall have the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended by the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2000 that has not ceased to be in force:

"disabled persons parking disc" means a device which:-

a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue;

- b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
- c) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period has begun as described in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled persons vehicle" means a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in accordance with the circumstances prescribed in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended;

"dual purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as The Motor Vehicles (Type Approval) (Great Britain) Regulations 1984;

"goods" includes postal packets of any description;

"household" means:

- (a) a house which has its own address listed within Schedule 4 to this order and
- (b) a self-contained flat which has its own address listed within Schedule 4 to this order and which has planning permission for such use.

"invalid carriage" has the same meaning as in Section 136 (5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"light commercial vehicle" means a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight of not more than 3.5 tonnes, designed for the commercially carriage of goods including materials and tools;

"large goods vehicle" means a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight over 3.5 tonnes;

"motor caravan" has the same meaning as The Motor Vehicles (Type Approval) (Great Britain) Regulations 1984;

"motor cycle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers or their effects and adapted to carry not more than 12 passengers exclusive of the driver and not drawing a trailer;

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued or served by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 containing the provisions therein required;

"permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 15 to Article 21 of this Order;

"permit holder" means a person to whom a permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 15 to Article 21 of this Order:

"permit parking place" means an area on a highway designated as a parking place by Article 11 to this Order:

"permitted vehicle" means a passenger vehicle, car-derived van, dual purpose vehicle, invalid carriage or motor cycle. For the avoidance of doubt "permitted vehicle" does not include the following, motor caravan, light commercial vehicles and large commercial vehicle.

"premises" includes land and building;

"relevant position" shall have the following meanings:-

- 1. on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle so that the font of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- 2. where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- 3. on the windscreen so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; and
- 4. in each case for the avoidance of doubt so that no letter, numeral or symbol on the front of the badge is obscured.

"resident" means a person whose usual place of residence is a household;

"servicing" means the conveyance of equipment, goods or merchandise to or from a premise or for carrying out maintenance works to a premise;

"Universal Service Provider" shall have the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000:

"vehicle" shall not be taken to include non-motor vehicles;

"visitor" means a person who calls at or visits the premises of a resident;

The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 as amended or by or under any other enactment;

The masculine includes the feminine and vice versa.

Any reference in this Order to a statute or regulation shall be construed to such stature or regulation as the same may have been or may from time to time be amended or re-enacted.

NO WAITING PROHIBTIONS

3. SAVE as provided in Article 6 to Article 10 of this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 1 to this Order.

NO LOADING AND UNLOADING PROHIBITONS

4. SAVE as provided in Article 6 to Article 9 of the Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any length of road described in Schedule 2 of this Order during any of the time periods specified therein for the purpose of loading or unloading goods.

WAITING RESTRICTIONS

- <u>5.</u> (a) SAVE as provided in Article 6 to Article 10 of this Order and paragraph (b) of this Article no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road described in column (i) of the table in Schedule 5 to this Order on the days specified in column (ii) and during the times specified in column (iii) therein.
- (b) NOTHING in paragraph (a) of this Article shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in a length of road described therein between the hours and on the days referred to in Schedule 5 hereto if that period of waiting does not exceed the length of time specified in

column (iv) and that vehicle does not return to the same length of road until the minimum time specified in column (v) of the table in Schedule 5 has elapsed.

EXEMPTION FROM NO WAITING PROHIBITIONS, NO LOADING / UNLOADING PROHIBITIONS AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS - EMERGENCY

<u>6.</u> <u>NOTHING</u> in Article 3 to Article 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1, Schedule 2 and Schedule 5 of this Order for so long as may be reasonably necessary if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties in an emergency situation.

EXEMPTION FROM NO WAITING PROHIBITIONS, NO LOADING / UNLOADING PROHIBITIONS AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS - GENERAL

- <u>7.</u> <u>NOTHING</u> in Article 3 to Article 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1, Schedule 2 and Schedule 5 to this Order for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984:
 - (d) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;

- (e) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;
- (f) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.

EXEMPTION FROM NO WAITING PROHIBITIONS, NO LOADING / UNLOADING PROHIBITIONS AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS - DISPENSATION CERTIFICATE

- <u>8.</u> <u>NOTWITHSTANDING</u> any of the provisions contained within Article 3 to Article 5 of this Order, the Council may at its discretion (including requiring an administration fee) issue a dispensation certificate allowing a specific vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1, Schedule 2 and Schedule 5 to this Order.
- <u>9.</u> <u>A</u> dispensation certificate issued in accordance with Article 8 of this Order may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid. Notification of such cancellation shall be in writing to the holder of the dispensation certificate at any address that the Council believes to be that persons address and the dispensation certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.

EXEMPTION FROM WAITING PROHIBITIONS AND WAITING RESTRCTIONS — DISABLED PERSONS' VEHICLES

- 10. NOTHING in Article 3 and Article 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 and Schedule 5 of this Order on the days and during the times specified therein in relation to that length of road:-
 - (a) if the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge and a disabled persons parking disc which said disc is (i) exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle or (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that in either case, when marked to show the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle, on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, for a period not exceeding three hours and not being a period separated by an

interval of less than **one hour** from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day.

(b) If the vehicle is an invalid carriage.

AUTHORISATION AND USE OF STREET PARKING PLACES

DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES

- 11. EACH area on a highway which is described in Schedule 3 to this Order is designated as a permit parking place subject to the following provisions of this Order for use between the days and time periods specified therein (hereafter referred to as "the days and hours of operation"), other than those lengths of roads:-
 - (a) Specified in Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 to this Order; or
 - (b) Where waiting is not permitted as indicated by a traffic sign placed in pursuance of Article 34 of this Order.

and subject to the provisions of this Order, by permitted vehicles and light commercial vehicles only.

- 12. SAVE as provided in Article 36 to this Order, no person shall leave or cause any vehicle to wait within the permit parking place during the days and hours of operation unless there is displayed on that vehicle a valid permit that relates to that vehicle (or in the case of a permit issued under Articles 16 to 20 of this Order is a permit being used for the purpose specified in the relevant Article for that permit) and the permit is displayed in accordance with Article 29.
- 13. THE use of the permit parking place otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order is a parking contravention.

VEHICLES FOR WHICH PARKING PLACES ARE DESIGNATED

14. THE permit parking place may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving during the days and hours of operation such vehicles specified in Article 15 to Article 20 of this Order that display in the manner specified in Article 29 of this Order a valid permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle.

PERMITS

RESIDENT PERMIT

15. ANY resident, who is the owner of a permitted vehicle, may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit for the leaving of that permitted vehicle during the days and hours of operation in the permit parking place designated by this Order.

VISITOR PERMIT

16. ANY household may apply to the Council for the issues of a visitors permit for the use by a visitor's vehicle subject to that vehicle being a permitted vehicle, for the leaving of that permitted vehicle during the days and hours of operation in the permit parking place designated by this Order; provided that only one such permit will be issued per household.

CARER PERMIT

<u>ANY</u> resident subject to the conditions approved from time to time by the Council may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit for the leaving of a permitted vehicle during the days and hours of operation in the permit parking place designated by this Order, provided that the permit is being used by a Carer who is attending that resident and that only one such permit will be issued per household.

MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL AND PASTORAL PERMITS

- 18. ANY person who satisfies the Council that he or she is:-
 - (a) A fully registered doctor as defined in section 55 of the Medical Act 1983;
 - (b) A registered medical practitioner who providers medically associated services;
 - (c) A health care professional providing professional service within a list of professions approved from time to time by the Council; or
 - (d) A minister of religion providing pastoral services to residents.

may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit for the leaving during days and hours of operation a vehicle in the permit parking place designated by this Order.

BUSINESS PERMITS

- 19. ANY person who satisfies the Council that he or she:-
 - (a) Occupies or runs a business from a business premises which is located at a postal address specified in Schedule 4 to this order; and
 - (b) Does not have sufficient off street parking facilities; and
 - (c) Can demonstrate that it is necessary for the efficient operation of the business for a vehicle to be parked within the permit parking place;

may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit for the leaving of a permitted vehicle or light commercial vehicle during the days and hours of operation in the permit parking place and any such application shall be made in the form issued by and obtained from the Council and shall include such particulars and information required by the Council, provided that no more than two Business Permits shall be issued to a business or business premises at any one time.

TRADE PERMITS

- 20. ANY person who satisfies the Council that:-
 - (a) he or she is carrying out work at a premises which is located at a postal address specified in Schedule 4 to this order;
 - (b) can demonstrate that the vehicle is needed at the address for the efficient conduct of trade or service;

may apply to the Council for the issue of a trade permit for the leaving of that vehicle during the days and hours of operation in the permit parking place designated by this Order; provided that the permit shall be valid for a period not exceeding 14 days.

APPLICATION FOR ISSUE OF PERMITS

<u>21.</u> <u>THE</u> Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made to it as it may reasonably require to verify any particulars of information given to it.

ISSUE OF PERMITS

<u>22.</u> <u>ON</u> receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of Article 15 to Article 21 of this order, and of the fee specified in Article 26 of this Order, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant meets the criteria set out here for issue of a permit, shall issue the appropriate permit by post, provided that, subject to the provisions of Article 24 of this Order, the Council shall not issue a permit to any resident which would be valid for any period during which any other permit issued to that resident is or would be valid.

SURRENDER, WITHDRAWAL AND VALIDITY OF PERMITS

23. (1) A permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a permit to the Council on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.

(2) THE Council may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder by delivery by hand or by the sending of the same by the recorded delivery service to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council that any one of the events set out in paragraphs (3) of this Article has occurred and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice, such receipt, if the notice is sent by the recorded delivery service, to be deemed to have occurred in the normal course of post.

(3) THE events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-

- (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
- (b) in the case of a permit issued under Article 17 the permit holder ceasing to be a carer;
- (c) in the case of a permit issued under Article 18 the permit holder ceasing to be a medical professional or a minister;
- (d) in the case of a permit issued under Article 19 the permit holder ceasing to be a business;
- (e) in the case of a permit issued under Article 20 the permit holder ceasing to require the permit for the conduct of trade;
- (f) the permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued;
- (g) the withdrawal of such permit by the Council under the provisions of paragraph(2) of this Article;
- (h) the vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is no longer a permitted vehicle;
- (i) the issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 24 of this Order;
- (j) the permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions or paragraph (4) of this Article.

(4) ALL permits issued in accordance with Article 15 to Article 19 shall be issued for a maximum period of one year and shall, whenever issued, be valid only until and including the next 30th day of September or until the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article, whichever is the earlier.

(5) WHERE a permit is issued to any person upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured, the permit shall cease to be of any effect and the Council shall by notice in writing served on the person to whom such permit was issued by delivery by hand or by the sending of the same by the recorded delivery service to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address

believed to be that person's place of abode, require that person to surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice, such receipt, if the notice is sent by the recorded delivery service, to be deemed to have occurred in the normal course of post.

- (6) THE visitor's permit shall be surrendered in the event of the permit holder ceasing to be a resident.
- (7) THE Council may at any time require a permit holder to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of any permit issued by it as it may reasonably require.
 - (8) A permit remains at all times the property of the Council and is not for resale.

APPLICATION FOR AN ISSUE OF A DUPLICATE PERMIT

- 24. (1) IF a permit is accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate permit and the Council, upon the receipt of the permit, if such receipt is accompanied by an application for a duplicate permit, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the original permit shall become invalid.
- (2) IF a permit is lost, accidentally destroyed or mutilated, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate permit, and the Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, and upon receipt of an application for a duplicate together with a payment of the fee specified in Article 26 of this Order, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the original permit shall become invalid.
- (3) THE provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate permit and an application therefore as if it were a permit.

FORM OF PERMITS

- 25. (1) A permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
 - (a) with reference to a permit issued under the provisions of Article 15, and Article 18 to Article 20 the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued (provided that in exceptional circumstances and at the discretion of the Council the vehicle registration mark may be omitted).
 - (b) the date after which, subject to the provisions of Article 23 (4) of this Order, the permit shall no longer be valid;
 - (c) an authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council; and
 - (d) the identifying abbreviation 'ANCH'.

AMOUNT OF CHARGE AT PARKING PLACE

<u>26.</u> <u>THE</u> charge in connection with the issue of a permit for the leaving of a vehicle in the parking place designated by this Order shall be the sum of £12.50 (Twelve pounds and Fifty pence) or such other sum as may from time to time be determined by the Council.

PAYMENT OF THE CHARGE IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUE OF PERMITS

- 27. (1) THE charge in respect of the issue of a permit for the leaving of a vehicle in the permit parking place shall be payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 15 to Article 20 of this Order.
- (2) NO person shall be entitled to a refund of the charge paid in respect of the issue of a permit in any circumstances whatsoever.

REPLACEMENT OF PERMITS ON CHANGE OF VEHICLE

<u>28.</u> <u>WHEN</u> a resident surrenders his permit because he has ceased to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued he may obtain, free of charge, a replacement permit in respect of the vehicle with which he has replaced the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued so long as the replacement vehicle is a permitted vehicle.

DISPLAY OF PERMITS

- 29. A permit issued under the provisions of this Order shall be displayed:-
 - (a) In the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen on the near side thereon and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forwards so that the particulars referred to in Article 25 of this Order are legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
 - (b) In the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the particulars referred to in Article 25 of this Order are legible from the outside of the vehicle.

RESTRICTION ON THE REMOVAL OF A PERMIT

<u>30.</u> <u>WHERE</u> a permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 25 and Article 29 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.

PLACING OF TRAFFIC SIGNS

31. THE Council shall:-

- (a) cause appropriate traffic signs to be placed and maintained to indicate the extent of the restrictions described in Schedule 1, Schedule 3 and Schedule 5 of this Order.
- (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for:
 - i. the purpose of the satisfactory operation of the permit parking place and
 - ii. the purposes of the satisfactory operation of this Order.

CONTROLS AND MOVEMENT OF VEHICLES IN PARKING PLACES

- <u>32.</u> (1) IF a vehicle is left or abandoned in an area of highway or in any location whatsoever to which any provision of this Order applies in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order a penalty charge notice shall be issued and a charge made payable and/or the vehicle may be removed from that location.
- (2) IN the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable notice showing the relevant information may then be issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with Section 78 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, Parking Contraventions (England) (General regulations 2007 and Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) Representations and Appeals Regulations 2007.
 - (3) Where a Civil Enforcement Officer has removed or caused to be removed a vehicle in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article (or any other provisions of this Order:-
 - (a) He shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle;
 - (b) The Council shall be entitled to recover from the person responsible such charges is respect of the removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle as it might prescribe from time to time:
 - (c) The provisions of the Road Traffic Act 1984 as amended shall apply to the disposal of any such vehicle removed by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to this Article.
- <u>33.</u> A Police Constable in uniform, a Civil Enforcement Officer, or any person duly authorised by the Council may in case of emergency move or cause to be moved to any place he thinks fit, any vehicle left in the permit parking place.

POWER TO SUSPEND USE OF PARKING PLACES

- 34. (1) NOTWITHSTANDING the preceding provisions of this Order the Council's authorised office may suspend or cause to be suspended the use of the permit parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspensions reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) the purposes of facilitating the safe movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place howsoever defined in this Order or the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the permit parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus or traffic sign;
 - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the permit parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling-house to another or the removal of furniture from one such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
 - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of filming or some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
 - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the permit parking place at times of weddings or funerals or other special occasions.
- (2) A Police Constable in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty four hours the use of the permit parking place or any part thereof whenever he or she considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) ANY person suspending the use of the permit parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to any part of that permit parking place the use of which is suspended by a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) WHENEVER the permit parking place is suspended in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article then the Council may charge an administration fee to the person or body requesting the suspension in respect of that parking place or part thereof suspended from use.
- (5) NO person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of the permit parking place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article provided that this paragraph shall not apply to a vehicle for so long as may be necessary:-
 - (a) being used for Fire and Rescue Services, Ambulance or Police purposes; or

- (b) being used for the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
- (c) waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident; or
- (d) waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; or
- (e) left in such permit parking place with the permission:
 - i. of the person suspending the use of the parking place or the part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article;
 - ii. of a police constable in uniform;
 - iii. of a Civil Enforcement Officer.

<u>RESTRICTION OF USE OF VEHICLES AT PARKING PLACES</u>

- <u>35.</u> (1) NO person shall use any vehicle, while it is in the permit parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to any person in or near the permit parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill or his services in any other capacity, provided that nothing in this paragraph shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle if the vehicle is a permitted vehicle or light commercial vehicle and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected and the vehicle immediately leaves the permit parking place.
- (2) THE driver of a vehicle using the permit parking place shall stop the engine of the vehicle as soon as the vehicle is in the proper position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicles in or to depart from the parking place.

WAITING OF OTHER VEHICLES IN PERMIT PARKING PLACES

- 36. (1) NOTWITHSTANDING the provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait in any part of the permit parking place if the use has not been suspended for so long as may be necessary if:-
 - (a) the vehicle is waiting to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid accident;
 - (c) the vehicle is a vehicle used for Fire and Rescue Service purposes or an Ambulance, or a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of a Local

- Authority or a vehicle in the service of a Police Force in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) the vehicle is waiting to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (e) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is waiting to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in paragraph (1)(b) of Article 34 of this Order;
- (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling-house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- (g) the vehicle is in actual use at premises adjacent to the permit parking place in connection with a wedding or a funeral.
- (2) ANY vehicle waiting in the permit parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be exempt from the acquisition and the display of a permit referred to in this Order.
- (3) EXCEPT as provided in the foregoing provisions of this Article and in Article 37 to this Order no person shall cause or permit a vehicle in respect of which a valid permit is not in force in relation to that vehicle to wait in the permit parking place during the days and hours of operation.
- (4) NOTHING in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be in contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Act 1984.

PERMIT PARKING PLACE - DISPENSATION CERTIFICATE

37. NOTWITHSTANDING any of the foregoing provisions of this Order, the Council may at its discretion (including requiring an administration fee) issue a dispensation allowing a specific vehicle to wait in the permit parking place including a suspended permit parking place during the days and hours of operation of any restriction or prohibition to the contrary.

REVOCATIONS AND AMENDMENTS

38. THE Orders specified in column (i) of the table in Schedule 6 to this Order are hereby revoked to the extent specified in column (ii) of the said Schedule.
