THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (VARIOUS ROADS) (VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS) AND (REVOCATIONS) No2 ORDER 2013

THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (hereafter referred to as 'the Council') under Section 1, 2, 3, 4 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereafter referred to as the 'Act of 1984), the Traffic Management Act 2004 and The Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Borough of Blackpool) Order 2003 (Statutory Instrument No 2677) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police pursuant to Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and all other enabling powers hereby propose to make the above Order.

 IN this Order except where the content otherwise expressly requires the following words or expressions shall have these meanings assigned to them;-

"a person authorised by the Council" means a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer.

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person authorised by the Council to supervise any parking place.

"disabled person's badge" shall have the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended by the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2000 that has not ceased to be in force.

"disabled persons parking disc" means a device which:-

- a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue;
- b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
- c) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period has begun as described in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

"disabled persons vehicle" means a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in accordance with the circumstances prescribed in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended.

"invalid carriage" means the same as in Section 136 (5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

"motor car" shall have the same meaning as in Section 185 of the Road Traffic Act 1998.

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued or served by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 containing the provisions therein required.

"relevant position" shall have the following meanings:-

- (a) on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle so that the font of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- (c) on the windscreen so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle; and
- (d) in each case for the avoidance of doubt so that no letter, numeral or symbol on the front of the badge is obscured.

'servicing' means the conveyance of equipment, goods or merchandise to or from a premise or for carrying out maintenance works to a premise.

"Universal Service Provider" shall have the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

"vehicle" shall not be taken to include non-motor vehicles.

- 2. SAVE as provided in Article 3 or Article 4 of this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. NOTHING in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 to this Order for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;

- (b) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;
- (c) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (e) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
- (f) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;
- (g) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.
- 4. NOTHING in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 to this Order if:-
 - (a) the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a disabled persons badge and a disabled persons parking disc which said disc is (i) exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle or (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that in either case, when marked to show the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle, on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, for a period not exceeding three hours and not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day.
 - (b) the vehicle is an invalid carriage.

- 5. (a) SAVE as provided in Article 6 no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 2 or Schedule 3 of this Order on the days and during the times specified therein.
- (b) NOTHING in Article 5(a) shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in a length of road described therein if that period of waiting does not exceed fifteen minutes and that vehicle does not return until a minimum of thirty minutes has elapsed since the termination of the previous period of waiting of the same vehicle in the same length of road.
- 6. NOTHING in Article 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 2 and Schedule 3 to this Order for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (h) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (i) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;
 - (j) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
 - (k) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
 - (m) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;
 - (n) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.

- <u>7.</u> THE Borough of Blackpool (Various Locations) (Taxi Stands) Order 2012 shall have effect as though the provision contained in Schedule 4 to this Order were originally contained in and formed part of the First Schedule of the 2012 Order.
- 8. THE said Order of 2012 shall be in full force and effect as though the provisions of Article 7 and Schedule 4 hereto had originally formed part of the said Order or 2012.
- 9. SAVE as provided in Article 10 of this Order no person except under the direction or with the permission of a person authorised by the Council shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 5 of this Order for the purpose of loading or unloading.
- 10. NOTHING in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;
 - (c) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (e) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
 - (f) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;

- (g) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.
- 11. (a) SAVE as provided in Article 12 and Article 13 no person except under the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 6 of this Order on the days and during the times specified therein.
- (b) NOTHING in Article 11(a) shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in a length of road described therein if that period of waiting does not exceed **one hour** and that vehicle does not return until a minimum of **two hours** has elapsed since the termination of the previous period of waiting of the same vehicle in the same length of road.
- 12. NOTHING in Article 11 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;
 - (c) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (e) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
 - (f) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;

- (g) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.
- 13. NOTHING in Article 12 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 6 to this Order if:-
 - (a) the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a disabled persons badge and a disabled persons parking disc which said disc is (i) exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle or (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that in either case, when marked to show the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle, on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, for a period not exceeding one hour and not being a period separated by an interval of less than two hours from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day.
 - (b) the vehicle is an invalid carriage.
- 14. (a) SAVE as provided in Article 15 and Article 16 no person except under the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer or a police constable in uniform shall cause or otherwise permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road described in Schedule 7 of this Order on the days and during the times specified therein.
- (b) NOTHING in Article 14(a) shall render it unlawful for a motor car to wait in a length of road described therein if that period of waiting does not exceed **one hour** and that motor car does not return until a minimum of **two hours** has elapsed since the termination of the previous period of waiting of the same motor car in the same length of road.
- 15. NOTHING in Article 14 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload there from their personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is being used by the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance Service or Police Service in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and in an emergency;
 - (c) if the vehicle, not being a passenger carrying vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;

- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection or alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in the Second Schedule to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (e) if the vehicle is bearing a livery which is used by a Universal Service Provider and the vehicle is engaged in the collection and/or delivery of letters in accordance with statutory duty for the provision of services for the conveyance of letters;
- (f) if the vehicle is waiting only while a gate or barrier is opened or closed to allow access or departure to or from adjacent premises;
- (g) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control, or the driver has been told to wait by a police constable in uniform, or such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident.
- 16. NOTHING in Article 14 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 7 to this Order if:-
 - (c) the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a disabled persons badge and a disabled persons parking disc which said disc is (i) exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle or (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that in either case, when marked to show the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle, on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began, for a period not exceeding **one hour** and not being a period separated by an interval of less than **two hours** from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day.
 - (d) the vehicle is an invalid carriage.
- 18. THE no waiting at any time restrictions, the no waiting Monday Friday 10am 4pm restrictions and the no waiting Monday Friday 10am 4pm restrictions contained in Part 1 of the Second Schedule of The Borough Of Blackpool (Various Roads) (Consolidation Of Waiting Restrictions, On Street Parking Places, Residents' Parking Places, And Protection Of Bus

Stops) Order 2003 are revoked insofar only as the lengths of road specified in Schedule 8 hereto are concerned.

- 19. THE no waiting at any time restrictions contained in the First Schedule of The Borough Of Blackpool (Various Roads) (Various Restrictions) And Revocation Order 2004 are revoked insofar only as the lengths of road specified in Schedule 9 hereto are concerned.
- <u>20.</u> THE no waiting at any time restrictions contained in the Schedule to The Borough Of Blackpool (Various Roads) (Prohibition Of Waiting) No.3 Order 2004 are revoked insofar only as the lengths of road specified in Schedule 10 hereto are concerned.
- <u>21.</u> <u>THE</u> no waiting at any time restrictions contained in the First Schedule of The Borough Of Blackpool (Bond Street Area Scheme) (Various Restrictions) Order 2009 are revoked insofar only as the lengths of road specified in Schedule 11 hereto are concerned.
- <u>22.</u> <u>THE</u> Loading only bay Mon-Sat 8am-6pm 15 minutes, no return within 30 minutes restrictions contained in Schedule 3 of The Borough Of Blackpool (Central Drive District Centre) (Various Restrictions) And (Revocation) Order 2010 are revoked insofar only as the lengths of road specified in Schedule 12 hereto are concerned.
- 23. THE no waiting at any time restrictions contained in the First Schedule of The Borough Of Blackpool (Various Roads) (Various Restrictions) And (Revocations) No2 Order 2011 are revoked insofar only as the lengths of road specified in Schedule 13 hereto are concerned.
- <u>24.</u> IF a vehicle is left or abandoned in a length of road or in any location whatsoever to which any provision of this Order applied in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable and/or the vehicle may be removed from that location.
- 25. NOTWITHSTANDING any of the foregoing provisions of this Order the Council may at its discretion (including requiring and administration fee) issue a dispensation allowing a specific vehicle to wait in a length of road or any other location whatsoever to which any provision of this Order applies during the hours of operation of any restriction or prohibition to the contrary.
- <u>26.</u> <u>THIS</u> Order shall come into operation on the 28th March 2014 and may be cited as "THE BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL (VARIOUS ROADS) (VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS) AND (REVOCATIONS) No2 ORDER 2013"
