The Council of the Borough and County of the Town of Poole, the Highway Authority in exercise of its power under Section 1(1), 1(3), 1(3A), 2(1), 4(1), 4(2), 4(3), 5, 32, 35, 35A, 36, 47, 49, 53, 63A, 65, 66 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (herein under referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:

- 1. The Poole (Various Roads and Parking Places) (Consolidation of Orders made for the Regulation of On and Off-Street Parking Places) Order No.11 be amended as follows:
  - A. The following shall be added to Schedule No. 7.14 (Disabled Driver Parking Bay On-Street Parking Place Only) from the Order:

i	Croft Road	south side	from a point 33 metres south of its iunction with Cranbrook Road	for a distance of 6 metres in a westerly direction
			Juniotion with Oranbrook Road	

- 2. Save as hereby amended The Poole (Various Roads and Parking Places) (Consolidation of Orders Made for the Regulation of Traffic, On and Off Street Parking Places) Order No. 11 shall remain in full force and effect.
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty Fourth Day of September of the Year Two Thousand and Thirteen and may be cited as: The Poole (Traffic Management) (Croft Road) (Amendment No. 63) Order 2013.
