## THE BOROUGH OF CHRISTCHURCH OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES CONSOLIDATION ORDER ORDER 2017

The Borough Council of Christchurch ("the Council") in exercise of the powers of the Council under Sections 32, 35, 35A, B and C and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and under Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act and with the consent of Dorset County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act hereby make the following Order:-

### PART I

### **DEFINITIONS, COMMENCEMENT AND REVOCATION**

### 1.0 DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 In Parts II and III of this Order except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the following meanings:
  - 1.1.1 "Approved" means approved by the Secretary of State pursuant to the Act (if so required).
  - 1.1.2 "authorised position" means the position specified in Column (2) of Part 1 of the First Schedule.
  - 1.1.3 "Authorised Vehicle" means a vehicle specified in Column (3) of Part I of the First Schedule and complying with any height restriction imposed by the Council and shall include electrically propelled vehicles intended or adapted for use on roads.
  - 1.1.4 "Bus" means a vehicle adapted to carry more than 8 passengers exclusive of the driver.
  - 1.1.5 "Caravan" is as defined in Section 29 of the Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act 1960.
  - 1.1.6 "Civil Enforcement Officer" means any person duly authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise the Parking Place or a Police Constable in uniform.
  - 1.1.7 "Coach" means a vehicle adapted to carrying more than 18 passengers exclusive of the driver.
  - 1.1.8 "Disabled Driver" means (i) any person driving an invalid carriage or (ii) any person driving an Authorised Vehicle displaying a badge issued in accordance with the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended.

- 1.1.9 "Disabled Person" means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended:
- 1.1.10 "Disabled Persons Badge" has the same meaning as in Regulation 2 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended.
- 1.1.11 "Disabled Persons Parking Disc" has the same meaning as in Regulation 8(5) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended.
- 1.1.12 "Disabled Persons Vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge.
- 1.1.13 "Driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the said vehicle or responsible for the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place. The registered keeper of the said vehicle shall be deemed to have been the driver unless evidence to the contrary is shown.
- 1.1.14 "Goods Vehicle" means a motor vehicle or trailer constructed or adapted for use for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden of any description.
- 1.1.15 "Hackney Carriage" has the same meaning as in Section 38 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847:
- 1.1.16 "Heavy Commercial Vehicle" is as defined in Section 138 of the Act.
- 1.1.17"Heavy Motor Car" is as defined in Section 136(3) of the Act.
- 1.1.18 "Invalid Carriage" is as defined by Section 136(5) of the Act.
- 1.1.19 "Motor Car" is as defined in Section 136(2)(a) of the Act.
- 1.1.20 "Motor Cycle" is as defined in Section 136 (4) of the Act.
- 1.1.21 "Notice to Owner" means the form produced by the Council headed "Notice to Owner/Keeper/Hirer".
- 1.1.22 "Off-Street Plans" means the plans annexed to this Order headed "Off-Street" Plans.

- 1.1.23 "Owner" means the person by whom the vehicle is kept and used and in determining for the purposes of this Order who was the owner of the vehicle at the time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 and where the vehicle is the subject of a hiring agreement or hire purchase agreement "Owner" includes the person entitled to possession of the vehicle under the agreement.
- 1.1.24 "Owner of Business Premises" means a person who is the sole proprietor or partner of business premises situated in the Borough of Christchurch but excluding Company Shareholders.
- 1.1.25 "Parking Bay" means the part of the Parking Place marked out for the leaving of an Authorised Vehicle.
- 1.1.26 "Parking Disc" means a disc issued by a local authority complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No 4631:70), and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.
- 1.1.27 "Parking Permit" means a permit issued in accordance with the provisions of Article 5.0.
- 1.1.28 "Parking Place" means any area of land specified by name in Column (1) of the First Schedule and more particularly shown on the Off-Street Plans for use as a Parking Place.
- 1.1.29 "Passenger Vehicle" means a vehicle adapted to carry more than 8 passengers exclusive of the driver.
- 1.1.30 "Penalty Charge" means the penalty charge specified in Article 10.0.
- 1.1.31 "Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued in accordance with Article 10.2 or 11.2.

- 1.1.32 "Public Service Vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981.
- 1.1.33 "Public Service Vehicle Orders" means any Orders made by the Council or its predecessors in relation to restrictions on roads within the administrative area of the Borough of Christchurch relating to public service vehicles, hackney carriage vehicles and taxis.
- 1.1.34 "Resident of the Borough" means a person who is resident within the Borough of Christchurch and whose name would normally appear on the Electoral Register prepared for the said Borough.
- 1.1.35 **"Season Ticket**" means a ticket issued in accordance with the provisions of Article 5.0.
- 1.1.36 "Taxi" means any vehicle licensed as a Hackney Carriage in accordance with Section 37 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847
- 1.1.37 "Ticket Machine" means an apparatus of an approved type and design being an apparatus designed to issue parking tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the day and time at which the charge was paid.
- 1.1.38 "Trailer" includes where the context allows a Caravan and for the purposes of this Order the Trailer and the Vehicle by which it is conveyed shall be deemed to be separate Vehicles and the Driver of the Vehicle shall be deemed to be the Driver of the Trailer.
- 1.1.39 "**Verge**" means any area of highway that is not a carriageway, cycle track, footway, footpath or is not surfaced.

### 1.2 Further Provisions relating to Interpretation

- 1.2.1 For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a Disabled Person's Badge and where applicable a Parking Disc in the relevant position when and only when:-
  - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from the outside of the vehicle or where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or fascia the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle; or
  - (ii) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the parking disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from the outside of the vehicle or where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or fascia the parking disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.
- 1.2.2 For the purposes of this Order, a vehicle shall be deemed to wait if for more than two minutes in the same place any one part of the parking place is below any part of the vehicle or its load (if any) throughout the period exceeding two minutes whether or not the vehicle is moved during the period.
- 1.2.3 For the avoidance of doubt reference to a "Vehicle" in this Order includes a Bus, Coach, Goods Vehicle, Hackney Carriage, Heavy Commercial Vehicle, Heavy Motor Car, Invalid Carriage, Motor Car, Motorcycle, Motorcycle with sidecar, Passenger Vehicle, Public Service Vehicle, Taxi or a Trailer as appropriate.
- 1.3 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 1.4 References in this Order to an Article means the Article so numbered in Part II of this Order.

### 2.0 COMMENCEMENT

- 2.1 This Order shall come into operation on the first day of August of the year Two Thousand and Seventeen.
- 2.2 The restrictions imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or any other enactment.

### 3.0 REVOCATION

- 3.1 The Borough of Christchurch (Off-Street Parking Places) (Consolidation of Orders) 2012 and The Borough of Christchurch (Off-Street Parking Places) Consolidation of Order) (Amendment No 1) Order 2012 are revoked from the Commencement Date.
- 3.2 All previous variation and amendment orders made by the Council in respect of off-street parking places specified in the Schedules to this Order are hereby revoked from the Commencement Date.

### 1.0 USE OF THE PARKING PLACE

- 1.1 Subject to the following provisions of this Order, the Parking Place specified by name in Column (1) of Part I of the First Schedule may be used as a Parking Place for Authorised Vehicles in such positions on such days during such hours and on payment of such charges as are specified in relation to such Parking Place in Part I of the First Schedule.
- 1.2 Where in Part I of the First Schedule, a Parking Place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Place unless it is of the specified class.
- 1.3 The Driver of a vehicle shall not (except with the written consent of the Council) permit it to wait in any Parking Place in such a position that it causes or is likely to cause an obstruction to other users of the Parking Place or that it is not in accordance with the requirements of this Order.
- 1.4 The Driver of a vehicle shall not (except with the written consent of the Council) permit it to wait in any Parking Place in a Parking Bay or Bays marked "Reserved" whether by a word or words painted on the ground or by any notice standing or otherwise displayed adjacent to the Parking Bay(s).
- 1.5 The Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a Parking Bay or Bays that are marked in words or symbols as only available for the "disabled" whether by a word or words painted on the ground or by any notice standing or otherwise displayed adjacent to the Parking Bay(s) unless there is a Disabled Persons Badge displayed in the relevant position and the Disabled Person to whom the badge was issued accompanies the vehicle.

- 1.6 The Driver of a vehicle shall not (except with the written consent of the Council) permit it to wait in a Parking Bay or Bays marked as being reserved for "High Vehicles" whether by a word or words painted on the ground or by any notice standing or otherwise displayed adjacent to the Parking Bay(s) and for the purposes of this Order a High Vehicle shall be deemed to be a vehicle which exceeds the height which enables it to pass clearly under any height barrier constructed by the Council in accordance with Article 2.2.
- 1.7 A vehicle drawing a Trailer may wait in the Parking Place unless there is a sign in the Parking Place to the contrary. The provisions of this Order shall apply to a "Trailer" as they apply to a "vehicle" or "Authorised Vehicle" where the context allows.
- 1.8 Subject to Article 1.9 an Authorised Vehicle must be parked wholly within a Parking Bay.
- 1.9 In the event that due to the size of an Authorised Vehicle more than one Parking Bay is required, the Driver must park the vehicle within the required number of Parking Bays only and pay the appropriate charges for each Parking Bay occupied in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- 1.10 The Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a Parking Bay or Bays marked as being reserved for Motorcycles whether by a word or words painted on the ground or by any notice standing or otherwise displayed adjacent to the Parking Bay(s) unless it is a Motor Cycle.
- 1.11 The Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a Parking Bay or Bays marked as being reserved for Boat Users whether by a word or words painted on the ground or by any notice standing or otherwise displayed adjacent to the Parking Bay(s) unless they are using the Slipway/attached to a boat trailer. The Driver of an Authorised Vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the said Parking Bay(s) for a

period longer than that marked by a word or words painted on the ground or by any notice standing or otherwise displayed adjacent to the Parking Bay(s).

1.12 The Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in any Parking Bay or Bays that are reserved for the use of electric vehicles whilst recharging that vehicle from an electric vehicle charging point unless the Driver is using the electric vehicle charging point to recharge that vehicle.

### 2.0 COUNCIL'S POWERS

- 2.1 Nothing in Article 1.0 shall restrict the power of the Council to close to the public the whole or any part of the Parking Place either temporarily or permanently.
- 2.2 Nothing in Article 1.0 shall restrict the power of the Council to construct access barriers in any Parking Place either temporarily or permanently.

### 3.0 MAXIMUM PERIOD OF WAITING

- 3.1 The Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the Parking Places known as Avon Beach, Avon Run Road, Southcliffe Road, Steamer Point, Highcliffe Cliff Top and Highcliffe Castle for longer than twenty four hours continuously between 01 October and 31 March inclusive without the prior written consent of the Council.
- 3.2 Subject to Article 3.1, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the Parking Places called Avon Beach, Southcliffe Road, Steamer Point and Highcliffe Castle overnight in accordance with times displayed at notice boards at each of these Parking Places.

- 3.3 Between 01 April and 30 September inclusive the holder of a Season Ticket or Parking Permit shall not permit the vehicle to wait in the Priory Car Park for longer than four hours unless the holder has obtained the prior written consent of the Council.
- 3.4 The Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in the Highcliffe Castle Car Park for longer than four hours without the prior written consent of the Council.

### 4.0 CHARGES

### 4.1 General

Subject to Article 15.0, the Driver of an Authorised Vehicle shall pay the appropriate charge in accordance with the parking charges specified in Part I of the First Schedule provided that:-

- (a) the charge shall apply whether or not the Driver or passenger(s) remains with the vehicle within the Parking Place; and
- (b) where in a Parking Place it is indicated by notice that in respect of any day or any specified part of a day no charge will be made or such lesser charge than that specified in the First Schedule will be made, then the charge (if any) shall be such lesser charge.

### 5.0 SEASON TICKETS AND PARKING PERMITS

5.1 The Council may on an application of the Owner or Driver of an Authorised Vehicle issue a Season Ticket or Parking Permit in respect of that Authorised Vehicle on payment of the charge specified in Part II of the First Schedule.

5.2 Subject to Article 2.0, a Season Ticket or Parking Permit so issued shall be valid in respect of such of the Parking Places described in Part II of the First Schedule as is specified thereof during the period for which it is issued.

### 6.0 METHOD OF PAYMENT OF CHARGES

- The driver of an Authorised Vehicle shall immediately after the vehicle has stopped in an authorised position within the Parking Place for the purpose of waiting therein proceed immediately on foot to a ticket machine and pay the appropriate charge as specified in Part I of the First Schedule and (unless Article 7.1 (c) applies) return immediately to the vehicle to display the ticket as described in Article 7.0.
- 6.2 Subject to Article 6.1, the appropriate charge specified in Part I of First Schedule shall be paid by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins into the Ticket Machine provided (and where more coins than one are required they shall be inserted in the Ticket Machine immediately one after the other) or where provision is made for payment by mobile telephone using a credit or debit card by following the instructions displayed on the ticket machine fascia.
- 6.3 Subject to any maximum period of waiting in force in respect of a Parking Place, further tickets in payment of the relevant parking charge for any subsequent period may be purchased or a further payment may be made using the mobile telephone system (where available) at any time before the expiry of the period for which the parking charge has been paid.
- 6.4 The driver shall ensure that each parking ticket purchased shows that the whole of the parking charge has been paid in accordance with the information shown on the Ticket Machine and/or notice board situated in the Parking Place.

If at the time when a vehicle is left in the Parking Place there is no Ticket Machine at that Parking Place or all the Ticket Machines at that Parking Place carry notices upon them by a person duly authorised by the Council indicating that they are not in use or out of order, the Driver of that vehicle shall pay the parking fee for use of that Parking Place on demand by any duly authorised officer or servant of the Council for which he shall receive a ticket or tickets. Article 7.0, 10.0 and 14.0 shall apply to any such ticket or tickets as though they were a ticket or tickets purchased in accordance with Article 4.0.

### 7.0 DISPLAY OF TICKETS

- 7.1 Any ticket or tickets issued including a Season Ticket or Parking Permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued in the following manner
  - (a) in the case of an Authorised Vehicle which is fitted with a transparent windscreen, by sticking the ticket or tickets to the inside surface of the windscreen or by displaying the parking ticket on the dashboard of the vehicle so that it is facing forwards and can be clearly seen from the front of the vehicle
  - (b) in the case of an Authorised Vehicle which is not fitted with a transparent windscreen by affixing one half of the ticket (torn vertically) on the front of the vehicle so that it is facing forwards and can easily be seen from the front of the vehicle the other half of the ticket to be retained by the driver and produced on demand.
  - (c) The driver of an Authorised Vehicle using the method of payment of the appropriate charge specified in Part I of the First Schedule by mobile telephone may park without displaying a valid ticket, because reference to electronic proof

of payment of the appropriate fee will be the means of confirming compliance.

### 8.0 NON-TRANSFER OF TICKETS

- 8.1 It shall be an offence for the Driver of a vehicle using the Parking Place in Column (1) of Part I of the First Schedule to display any ticket other than the current ticket or tickets issued and each ticket purchased shall be valid on date of purchase only (except Mudeford Quay, Mayors Mead and Avon Run Road where tickets are purchased for more than twenty four hours and Saxon Square, Bank Close, Bridge Street, Pit Site, Bargates, Wick Lane and Bypass where tickets are purchased for an overnight parking period).
- 8.2 Each parking ticket shall be valid only for the vehicle for which it was purchased and shall not be valid if the ticket is transferred to another vehicle and in the event that the vehicle is parked in another Parking Place or Places on the same date as that shown on the parking ticket then the parking ticket shall not be valid in that Parking Place or Places.

### 9.0 DAMAGED OR FOREIGN COINS

No person shall insert in any ticket machine in the Parking Place any bent or damaged or foreign coins by way of payment of the charge in respect of a vehicle.

### 10.0 LIABILITY TO AND AMOUNT OF PENALTY CHARGE

- 10.1 Subject to Article 13.2, the Owner of a vehicle shall be liable to pay a Penalty Charge in the following circumstances:-
  - (a) if an Authorised Vehicle is left in the Parking Place and no payment was made;

- (b) if an Authorised Vehicle is left in the Parking Place for longer than the period for which payment was made;
- (c) if an Authorised Vehicle is left in the Parking Place for longer than the maximum period of waiting as referred to in Articles 1.11 and 3.0;
- (d) if a vehicle is left in a Parking Bay specified as being for Season Ticket or Parking Permit holders only and in respect of which a valid Season Ticket or Parking Permit has not been issued;
- (e) if a vehicle other than an Authorised Vehicle as described in Part I of the First Schedule is left in the Parking Place;
- (f) if an Authorised Vehicle is left in any position other than an authorised position;
- (g) if an Authorised Vehicle is left in a parking place and the ticket issued is not displayed in accordance with Article 7.0 (unless Article 7.1 (c) applies);
- (h) if a vehicle other than an Authorised Vehicle is left in a Parking Bay contrary to Articles 1.4, 1.6, 1.7, 1.10 & 1.11;
- (i) if a vehicle is left in a Parking Place contrary to the requirements of Article 19.0;
- (j) if a vehicle which does not fall within the categories specified in Article 26.4(d) is parked in an area reserved for Disabled Drivers in accordance with Article 26.4(d);
- (k) where there is any other contravention of Articles 1.0, 3.0, 4.0, 8.0, 16.0, 17.0, 18.0, 20.0, 22.0, 24.0 and 26.0.
- 10.2 Where a vehicle has incurred a Penalty Charge a Civil Enforcement Officer shall attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a Penalty Charge Notice which shall include the following particulars:-
  - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence the number of trade plate carried by the vehicle;
  - (b) the time at which the Civil Enforcement Officer observed that the Penalty Charge had been incurred;

- (c) the grounds on which the Civil Enforcement Officer believes that a Penalty Charge is payable with respect to the vehicle;
- (d) a statement that a Higher Penalty Charge or Lower Penalty Charge is required to be paid and the amount required;
- (e) that the Penalty Charge must be paid before the end of the period of 28 days beginning with the date of the Penalty Charge Notice;
- (f) that if the Penalty Charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Penalty Charge Notice, the amount of the Penalty Charge will be reduced by 50 per cent;
- (g) that if the Penalty Charge is not paid before the end of the 28 day period, a Notice to Owner may be served by the Council on the person appearing to them to be the Owner of the vehicle (which may involve the Council contacting the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency for details of the registered keeper); and
- (h) the address to which payment of the Penalty Charge must be sent
- 10.3 The level of Penalty Charge shall be the higher level penalty charge or the lower level penalty charge as set by the Council under Part 6 of The Traffic Management Act

### 11.0 MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR WHICH AN AUTHORISED VEHICLE MAY BE LEFT AFTER PENALTY CHARGE INCURRED

- 11.1 Subject to Article 29.0 the period for which an Authorised Vehicle may be left in the Parking Place after the Penalty Charge has been incurred shall not exceed twelve hours and the Driver of the vehicle shall not leave it in the Parking Place for longer than that.
- 11.2 If an Authorised Vehicle is left in the Parking Place for more than the said period after the Penalty Charge has been incurred, it shall be the duty of a Civil Enforcement Officer to attach to the Authorised Vehicle in a conspicuous position a further Penalty Charge Notice which shall include the particulars mentioned in Article 10.2 and the following additional particulars, namely the time at which he or she first noticed that the Authorised Vehicle had been left in the Parking Place for more than the prescribed period after the Penalty Charge had been incurred.

### 12.0 RESTRICTIONS ON REMOVAL OF TICKETS AND PENALTY CHARGE NOTICES

- 12.1 When the ticket or tickets have been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with Article 7.0, no person shall remove the ticket or tickets from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the Parking Place.
- 12.2 Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Articles 10.2 or 11.2, no person not being the Driver of the vehicle or person duly authorised by the Council shall remove the Penalty Charge Notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the Driver.

#### 13.0 MANNER OF PAYMENT OF PENALTY CHARGE

- 13.1 The Penalty Charge shall be paid to the Council in accordance with the instructions on the Penalty Charge Notice.
- 13.2 Provided that if the Twenty-Eight day period expires upon a day on which the Council offices are closed, the period within which payment of the Penalty Charge shall be paid to the Council shall be extended until 1pm on the next full day on which the Council offices are open.
- 13.3 Provided that if within fourteen days following the date on which the Penalty Charge Notice is issued, the Driver tenders to the Council the Penalty Charge sum reduced by 50 per cent, then such sum or sums may be accepted by the Council in satisfaction of the Penalty Charge.

### 14.0 INDICATIONS BY TICKET MACHINES AND TICKETS AS EVIDENCE

Unless the contrary is proved:-

- 14.1 If at any time an Authorised Vehicle is left in a Parking Place without any parking ticket displayed indicating payment of the appropriate charge in accordance with Article 6.0, it shall be presumed that no parking charge has been paid in respect of that vehicle unless payment has been made using the mobile telephone system.
- 14.2 If at any time while an Authorised Vehicle is left in the Parking Place, there is displayed on the Authorised Vehicle a ticket or tickets issued by a Ticket Machine indicating the day and the time of issue of the ticket or tickets and the time indicated on the Ticket Machine clock shows that the period for which the ticket or tickets are valid has expired, it shall be presumed that the charge specified in Article 6.0 has been duly paid for the Authorised Vehicle and that the period for which the payment was made by the charge has already expired.

unless a further payment has been made using the mobile telephone system.

- 14.3 If at any time there is waiting in a Parking Place a vehicle whereon there is displayed one or more parking tickets but such ticket or tickets represent payment of a charge less than the charge prescribed in the First Schedule in respect of the Parking Place for the class to which the said vehicle belongs, it shall be presumed that no parking charge has been paid in respect of the vehicle so waiting.
- 14.4 If at any time there is waiting in a Parking Place a vehicle whereon there is displayed one or more parking tickets purchased from a Parking Place other than the Parking Place in which the vehicle is waiting, it shall be presumed that no parking charge has been paid in respect of that vehicle.
- 14.5 Without prejudice to Article 8.2, if at any time there is waiting in a Parking Place a vehicle whereon there is displayed one or more parking tickets or a Parking Permit purchased for display on a vehicle other than the vehicle so waiting, it shall be presumed that no parking charge has been paid in respect of that vehicle.
- 14.6 If at any time while an Authorised Vehicle is left in the Parking Place there is displayed on the Authorised Vehicle a ticket or tickets issued by a Ticket Machine indicating the day and the time of expiry of the ticket or tickets and the time indicated on the Ticket Machine clock shows that the period for which the ticket or tickets are valid has expired more than twenty four hours later than the time on the ticket those indications shall be:-
  - (a) evidence that the vehicle was left in the Parking Place for longer after the Penalty Charge had been incurred than the time authorised by Article 11.1;

(b) evidence that the charge was incurred for longer after the Penalty Charge had been incurred than the time authorised by Article 11.1.

### 15.0 EXEMPTION FROM CHARGES

Except where expressly provided therein, Articles 1.0 to 14.0 shall not apply to:-

- 15.1 pedal cycles,
- 15.2 solo motor cycles left in Parking Places, provided they are parked so as not to occupy a Parking Bay or obstruct a Parking Bay or a pedestrian or vehicular access aisle, and
- any vehicle being a vehicle for disabled persons and which is exempt from vehicle excise duty by virtue of paragraphs (18) or (19) of Schedule 2 to the Vehicles Excise and Registration Act 1994.

### 16.0 SPEED OF VEHICLES

No person shall in the Parking Place drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle at a speed which exceeds ten miles per hour or such lesser speed as shall be reasonable according to the circumstances of the case at the time.

### 17.0 RESTRICTION ON CLASS OF VEHICLE USING PARKING PLACE AND ON MANNER OF PARKING

- 17.1 Subject to Article 15.0 no vehicle other than a vehicle specified in Column (3) of Part I of the First Schedule shall be left in the Parking Place and no vehicle shall be left in a position other than that specified in Column (2) of Part I of the First Schedule.
- 17.2 No person shall cause or permit a Mobile Home to be left in a Parking Place.

### 18.0 DRIVERS TO SWITCH OFF ENGINE OF AUTHORISED VEHICLE

The Driver of a vehicle using the Parking Place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the Parking Bay and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle or to depart from a Parking Place.

### 19.0 AUTHORISED VEHICLES IN PARKING PLACES TO BE IN SATISFACTORY CONDITION

The Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in the Parking Place if the vehicle is in such condition as to be likely to cause a danger to other users of the Parking Place or damage to the surface condition of the Parking Place.

### 20.0 DRIVER NOT TO SOUND THE HORN OF VEHICLE IN PARKING PLACE

The Driver of a vehicle using the Parking Place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument in or attached to the vehicle, except that the Driver may sound the horn in or attached to the vehicle for the purpose of giving any necessary warning when the vehicle is in motion.

### 21.0 VEHICLE IN PARKING PLACE NOT TO BE DRIVEN EXCEPT FOR ENTERING OR LEAVING

No person shall except with the permission of any person duly authorised by the Council drive a vehicle in the Parking Place except in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of entering and departing from the Parking Place and driving a vehicle around the Parking Place in accordance with the provisions of this Order for the purpose of locating an available Parking Bay.

#### 22.0 PROHIBITION OF LOUD SPEAKERS ETC

No person shall in the Parking Place operate any wireless, loud speaker or similar device in or fixed or connected to a vehicle, wantonly shout or otherwise make any loud noise likely to cause disturbance or annoyance to the users of the Parking Place or residents of premises in the neighbourhood.

### 23.0 ANTI – SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

No person shall in the Parking Place act in a manner that caused or was likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more persons not of the same household as the defendant.

### 24.0 RESTRICTIONS ON THE USE OF AN AUTHORISED VEHICLE IN THE PARKING PLACE

No person shall use any part of the Parking Place or a vehicle left in the Parking Place

- 24.1 for camping purposes or overnight sleeping;
- 24.2 for cooking or sanitary purposes;
- 24.3 for the purpose of carrying out any work of washing, maintenance or repair to a vehicle parked thereon except such as may be reasonably necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved from the Parking Place; or
- 24.4 in connection with the sale of any article to any person in or near the Parking Place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of any goods or of the skill or services of any persons unless authorised by the Council in writing.

### 25.0 PROHIBITION OF PASSAGE THROUGH CAR PARK

No person shall use the Parking Place as a means of through passage for vehicles proceeding from one road to another or to a further length of the said road.

### 26.0 DIRECTIONS FOR TRAFFIC TO BE FOLLOWED

When in the Parking Place, signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:-

- 26.1 Indicating the entrance to or the exit from the Parking Place,
- 26.2 Indicating that a vehicle using the Parking Place shall proceed in a specified direction within the Parking Place,
- 26.3 Indicating an area reserved for Season Ticket or Parking Permit holder, or
- 26.4 Indicating an area reserved for Disabled Drivers,

no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle

- (a) so that it enters the Parking Place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the Parking Place otherwise than by an exit so indicated.
- (b) in a direction other than that specified,
- (c) so that it enters the area reserved for Season Ticket or Parking Permit holders unless it is an authorised vehicle in respect of which a Season Ticket or Parking Permit has been issued and a Season Ticket or Parking Permit is displayed in accordance with Article 7.0 as the case may be, or
- (d) so that it enters the area reserved for Disabled Drivers, unless the vehicle is either:-
  - (i) an Invalid Carriage or
  - (ii) an Authorised Vehicle left by the Driver thereof who is a person to whom there has been issued a Disabled

Persons Badge provided such a badge is displayed on the vehicle in a position as required by the Regulations as aforesaid

### 27.0 RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF THE PARKING PLACE

Without prejudice to the other provisions of this Order when in a Parking Place no person shall:-

- 27.1 Erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building, skip, stall or other structure for any purpose whatsoever or deposit materials or excavate any surfaces without the prior written consent of the Council.
- 27.2 Light or cause or permit to be lit any fire or barbecue.
- 27.3 Carry out any trade or business activity or charitable activity without the prior written consent of the Council.
- 27.4 Affix or attach posters, bills or any advertising material whatsoever to either the walls or structure of the Parking Place or to any vehicle parked in the Parking Place or distribute leaflet or advertising material of any kind.
- 27.5 Ride or use a skateboard, roller skates or boots or similar thing or things.
- 27.6 Play or participate in any informal or organised game sport or recreation in a Parking Place without the prior written consent of the Council.
- 27.7 Use the Parking Place for the purpose of campaigning for political or other purposes.

- 27.8 Damage or deface any furniture, sign, surface or structure or vehicle by means of graffiti or other action.
- 27.9 Hold or take part in any organised picnic without the prior written consent of the Council.
- 27.10 Carry out or permit to be carried out to the vehicle any work of cleaning, construction, alteration or maintenance or repair except such repair as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved from the Parking Place.
- 27.11 Cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in such a manner in a Parking Place as to cause or be likely to cause an obstruction to other users of the Parking Place.
- 27.12 Wantonly shout make any loud noise or otherwise cause a disturbance or annoyance to users of the Parking Place or residents of premises in the neighbourhood.
- 27.13 Cause or permit to be thrown down, dropped or otherwise deposited and left any waste, litter or detritus.
- 27:14 Cause or permit to be carried out the recording of numbers or particulars of any users and or vehicles using the Parking Place without the prior written consent of the Council.

### 28.0 APPLICATION OF ENACTMENT

Sub-Sections (4) and (6) of Section 47 of the Act shall apply to the Parking Places as if it was a Parking Place provided on the highway.

#### 29.0 REMOVAL ETC OF VEHICLES FROM A PARKING PLACE

- 29.1 When a Civil Enforcement Officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions of Articles 1.0, 3.0, 4.0, 7.0, 8.0, 11.0, 17.0, 19.0, 27.10 and 27.11 have been contravened in respect of any vehicle left in the Parking Place, he or she may remove the said vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the said Parking Place.
- 29.2 When an Authorised Vehicle is waiting in the Parking Place in contravention of Article 17.0, any person duly authorised by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply therewith.
- 29.3 A Civil Enforcement Officer may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency to any place he or she thinks fit any vehicle left in the Parking Place.

### 30.0 MANNER OF REMOVAL OF VEHICLES FROM THE PARKING PLACE

Any person removing or altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of Article 29.0 may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he or she may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he or she may think necessary to enable him or her to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.

### 31.0 SAFE CUSTODY OF VEHICLES REMOVED FROM THE PARKING PLACE

When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from the Parking Place by virtue of Article 29.0, he or she shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle following such removal. Sections 101 and 102 of the Act shall be applicable by the Council in respect of the vehicle insofar as the Council shall desire.

This order may be cited as The Borough Of Christchurch (Off-Street Parking Places) (Consolidation of Orders) Order 2017
