

THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (THORPE ST ANDREW, HILLSIDE AVENUE)
(SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR/CLEARWAY) CONSOLIDATION ORDER, 2011

The Norfolk County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1), and 122 and parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 7th day of November 2011, and may be cited as The Norfolk County Council (Thorpe St Andrew, Hillside Avenue) (School Keep Clear/Clearway) Consolidation Order 2011.

2. In this Order –

Any reference to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning as in s76 of the 2004 Act;

"Driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in contravention of an Order, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left at that contravention;

"Penalty Charge" has the same meaning as in section 2 of the General Regulations 2007;

"Penalty Charge Notice" has the same meaning as in section 8 of the General Regulations 2007;

"School keep clear/Clearway" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1027.1 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

3. Save as is provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait along any of the school keep clear/Clearway on the north side of the U59575 Hillside Avenue from a point 92 metres west of its easternmost end westwards for a distance of 59 metres, on Monday to Friday from 0800 hrs to 0900 hrs and from 1430 hrs to 1600 hrs (excepting the month of August).

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall prohibit a person to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations:

(a) fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;

(b) in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

(c) building, industrial or demolition operations;

- (d) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (e) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road comprising or including that carriageway;
 - (f) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of road or side of roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (g) the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege.
 6. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any previous Order relating to the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.
