

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL ("the Council") in exercise of the powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4(1) of the Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and having regard to Section 122 of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

- Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order no person shall, except upon
 the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a
 civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to stop or remain
 and rest in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to stop or remain at rest in the length of road specified therein:
 - if the vehicle is being used for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (2) if the vehicle is being used in the service of an Undertaker (as defined in the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991) a local authority or the Environment Agency in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and whilst being so used in such service it is necessary for the vehicle to wait in the length of road;
 - if the vehicle is being used for police, fire brigade, or ambulance purposes; or
 - (4) In any case where the person in control of the vehicle
 - a) is required to stop by law
 - b) is obliged to stop as to prevent an accident; or
 - is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control.

- 3. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any verge or layby immediately adjacent to any of the carriageways comprised in the road specified in the Schedule to this Order for the purpose of selling goods from that vehicle.
- This Order may be cited as "The Buckinghamshire County Council (U156 4. Haddenham Business Park Access Road, Haddenham) (24 Hour Clearway) Order, 2009" and shall come into operation on 26th August 2009.

THE BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (LINK ROAD BETWEEN U156 HADDENHAM BUSINESS PARK ACCESS ROAD AND THAME ROAD, HADDENHAM) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER, 2009

Buckinghamshire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of the powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and having regard to Section 122 of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

1. (1) In this Order

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act;

"parking disc" has the meaning given by Regulation 8(5) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Undertaker" has the same meaning as in Section 48 of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
 - (a) a disabled person's badge issued on or after 1 April 2000 in a relevant position if -
 - (i) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle, or
 - (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or

fascia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle,

so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle;

- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position if -
 - (i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle, or
 - (ii) where a vehicle does not have a dashboard or fascia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle,

so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

- 2. Save as provided in Articles 3 and 4 hereof no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. (1) Nothing in Article 2 hereof shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstructions to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction

of the said lengths or road; or

- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of an Undertaker or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- 4. (1) Nothing in Article 2 hereof shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
- 5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
- 6. This Order may be cited as "The Buckinghamshire County Council (Link Road between U156 Haddenham Business Park Access Road and Thame Road, Haddenham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 2009" and shall come into

operation on 26th August 2009.
