THE BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNCIL (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2021

Buckinghamshire Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of powers conferred by Sections 32–35C, 39, 44, 63A, 99, 100, 116 and Schedule 9 and having regard to Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") as amended, and under the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the Act of 2004") as amended and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:

PART I PRELIMINARY

Citation and commencement

1. This Order shall come into effect on 19 February 2021 and may be cited as the Buckinghamshire Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2021.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

"Authorised Officer"	means any person employed by the Council under a contract of service, or any other person authorised in writing by the Council to perform the function concerned;			
"Bank Holiday"	means the days specified in Section 1(1) of Schedule 1 of the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971 with the addition of New Year's Day or as appropriate 2 January and the first Monday in May subject to special circumstances of any year and also includes the common law holidays namely Good Friday and Christmas Day;			
"Barrier Controlled" / "Pay on Foot"	means a parking place controlled by barriers where payment is made on foot on return to the vehicle and before leaving the parking place;			
"Charging Days"	means those days when charges apply to waiting within a parking place but excludes any days identified in Schedule 1 as being free of charge;			
"Charging Hours"	means in respect of each parking place, those hours during which a vehicle may only be permitted to wait in the parking place upon payment of a charge, as specified in Schedule 1;			
"Civil Enforcement Officer"	means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council with a unique identification number to enforce the regulations in any parking place as defined by Section 76 of the Act of 2004;			

"Council"	means the Buckinghamshire Council;
"Daily Charge"	means the charge imposed by the C

means the charge imposed by the Council for parking in a parking place on any one day and for a specified period of time as specified by notice at each parking place and as identified in the scale of charges specified in Schedule 1;

"Disabled Person's Badge"

means a badge issued by any Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) Regulations 2000 or a badge having effect under those Regulations as if it were a Disabled Persons Badge;

"Driver"

in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"Electric Vehicle"

means an electric vehicle or hybrid vehicle propelled by one or more electric motors powered by a rechargeable battery;

Electric Vehicle Parking Bay

means a parking space within a parking place where there is a sign and/or surface marking which indicates the parking space is reserved for the charging of electric vehicles;

Electric Vehicle Charging Post

means apparatus which supplies electricity for the charging of electric vehicles:

Electric Vehicle Charging Point means the location at which an electric vehicle charging post is situated for the purpose of charging electric vehicles;

"Goods"

means either:

- (a) in the case of a motor vehicle any goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate; and
- (b) in the case of a goods vehicles and/or commercial vehicle any heavy or bulky goods of any description, and "delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any such goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection:

"Goods Vehicle" /
"Commercial
Vehicle"

means a class of motor vehicle, constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods, the unladen weight of which exceeds the weight specified for that class of vehicle under Note 2 to Schedule 1, and is not drawing a trailer;

"Hand-Held Device

means a wireless device used by a Civil Enforcement Officer which is programmed to interface with the telephone payment parking system;

"Identification Number" means the unique number being part of a Civil Enforcement Officer's uniform, which is unique within the Council's area to that Civil Enforcement Officer:

"Location Number"

means the unique number assigned to each parking place where the telephone payment system is operational;

"Loading / Unloading" refers to when a vehicle of the specified class is parked wholly in a parking place, or a parking bay, marked for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle;

"Motor Cycle"

has the same meaning as given in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and for the purposes of this Order excludes the following that shall be categorised as motor vehicles - motorised three wheelers, quad-bikes and motor cycles with a side-car or trailer;

"Motor Vehicle" or "Motor Car" has the same meaning as given in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"Owner"

In relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom the vehicle is kept. This is presumed to be the person in whose name the vehicle is registered at the material time, or the person who has use of the vehicle in the course of his / her employment and who is entitled to use the vehicle as though he / she were the registered keeper, or where a written agreement is in place, as defined by The Road Traffic (Owner Liability) Regulations 2000;

"Operational Vehicle"

means a vehicle being used by the Council or on behalf of the Council to perform Council functions;

"Parking"

Means any vehicle which is stationary in a parking place for any period of time whether the vehicle remains occupied or otherwise, whether the engine is disengaged or otherwise and whether in a designated parking bay or otherwise and "park", "parked", "wait" and "waiting" shall have the same meaning;

"Parking Area"

means any part of a parking place and may comprise a number of parking bays, or a reserved part of the parking place, or a floor of a multi-storey car park, or any combination of these parts;

"Parking Bay"

means an area of a parking place intended to be used for the parking of a single vehicle indicated by surface markings and/or signs;

"Parking Charge"

means any charge payable as set out in Schedule 1;

"Parking Disc"

has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(England) Regulations 2000 which is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of parking began;

"Parking Permit"

means any form of paper, or virtual, permit issued by the Council for waiting in a parking place set out in Schedule 1 under the terms applicable at the time of issue. A parking permit may include a season ticket, resident permit, business permit, or any other permit of a type and design issued by the Council;

"Parking Place"

means any area of land (including any structures thereon) specified by name in Column 2 of Schedule 1:

"Parking Ticket"

means a ticket issued by a ticket machine relating to any parking place identified in Schedule 1 that has ticket machines:

"Passenger Vehicle"

means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than 12 passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"Pay and Display Ticket"

means a parking ticket issued by a ticket machine located in a parking place after payment of the appropriate charge;

"Pay-By-Phone"

means the telephone payment parking system provided by the Council:

"Payment Card"

means a bank credit or debit card, e-purse card, discount card or pre-payment card, which can be used where such facility is advertised and provided in a parking place or for the payment of permit charges;

"Payment Voucher" / "Scratch Card" means a form of parking permit that requires removing / scratching off the covering film to enable the following data to be fully displayed at the time of use as evidence of payment of the parking charge:

- a) the parking place name;
- b) the date and, where required, the time within 5 minutes as to when the parking period commenced; and
- c) the vehicle registration mark;

"Penalty Charge"

means a charge set by the Council in accordance with Articles 39 and 40 of this Order. The appropriate penalty charge in force will be as shown on the notice board in the parking place where it applies;

"Penalty Charge Notice"

has the same meaning as in the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 or any subsequent legislation so enabling;

"Qualifying Applicant" means any applicant being entitled to apply for a parking permit or any other form of permission to use a parking area or parking bay in accordance with the terms and conditions of use of such permit or permission within a stated parking place or parking places;

"Relevant Legislation" means Part IV and Schedules 4 and 9 of the 1984 Act and Part 6 and Schedules 7–12 of the 2004 Act, and any subordinate legislation made thereunder;

"Relevant Position"

means:

 (a) in respect of a vehicle displaying a valid Disabled Persons Badge, the same as set out in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

- (b) in respect of a vehicle displaying a parking ticket or a parking permit;
 - (i) the ticket or permit is exhibited face up on the inside surface of the windscreen or in a position so that it can be easily seen and read from the front or side of the vehicle; or
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle that is not fitted with a transparent windscreen, the ticket or permit is exhibited face up on the front of the vehicle in a position so that it can be easily seen and read from the front or side of the vehicle:

For the purpose of this Order the face of a parking ticket is the side which exhibits the expiry time and the parking charge paid. The face of a permit is the side which exhibits data showing the expiry date and/or time.

"Restricted Area"

means any part of a parking place which is not a parking area or parking bay and is identifiable by appropriate signs and/or surface markings;

"Service Charge"

means:

- (a) in the case of the telephone payment parking system, the service charge payable to the service provider (in addition to the parking charge payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 36 of this Order) for using the telephone payment parking system; or
- (b) in the case of electricity supplied to electric vehicles at electric charging points, the service charge payable to the service provider (in addition to the parking charge payable in accordance with the provisions of Articles 34 and 36 of this Order) for the supply of electricity;

"Service Provider"

means:

- (a) in the case of the telephone payment parking system, the company authorised and appointed by the Council to operate, administer and maintain the payment of the parking charge using this system; or
- (b) in the case of electricity supplied to electric vehicles at electric charging points, the company authorised and appointed by the Council to operate and administer the supply of electricity at these points;

"Telephone Payment Parking System" means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of parking charges using telephone communications, or any other form of data communication, with the service provider in accordance with instructions indicated on signs at each parking place where the system is operational;

"Ticket Machine"

means an apparatus or device within the meaning of section 35(3) of the 1984 Act;

"Trailer"

means an unpowered vehicle whether or not drawn by a motor vehicle;

"Vehicle" means any motor car, motor cycle or other mechanically

propelled automobile;

"Virtual Parking

Permit"

means an electronic record of a, parking permit issued and confirmed by the Council to exempt a vehicle from a restriction in the provisions of this Order, under the terms

applicable at the time of issue; and

"Voucher" means a ticket issued by a ticket machine located in a

parking place with the wording "VOUCHER" and which is

labelled "Not valid for parking".

3. Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article, Part or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article, Part or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

- 4. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by, or as having effect by virtue of, any subsequent enactment.
- 5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if for the purposes of Section 21 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by this Order were Acts of Parliament thereby repealed.
- 6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as made under the Act of 1984, or under any other enactment.
- 7. Unless the context otherwise requires words denoting the singular shall include the plural and vice versa and words denoting persons shall include either gender, bodies corporate, unincorporated associations and partnerships.

PART II DESIGNATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

Designation of parking places

- 8. Each area of land or buildings specified in Column 2 of Schedule 1 and located in outline by the plans in Schedule 2 as a parking place may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles in such positions, on such days, during such hours, and at such charges as are specified in Schedule 1 and by notice at each parking place.
- 9. A vehicle permitted to wait in a parking place, or to make use of any part of a parking place may not be used for or in connection with the sale or exposing for sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place, or for or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of any person's skill or services.
- 10. Save as provided in Part VIII, a vehicle may not be permitted or caused to wait in a restricted area within a parking place. Access roads or areas with double yellow lines or hatched areas are designated restricted areas where waiting, parking and loading and unloading are all prohibited by this Order.

Class and position of vehicles

- 11. Where in the Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for the parking of vehicles of a specified class, only vehicles of the specified class may be permitted to park in the parking place.
- 12. No person shall permit a vehicle to park in a parking place, a parking area or parking bay if it is marked by appropriate signs and/or surface markings indicating parking is reserved for the use of:
 - Disabled badge holders unless the vehicle displays a valid Disabled Persons Badge in the relevant position and immediately before, or immediately after, the act of parking, the vehicle has been, or is about to be, used by the person(s) in respect of whom the Disabled Persons Badge has been issued. Where within a parking place the designated disabled bay is signed as having a time restriction, a parking disc must be displayed alongside the Disabled Persons Badge;
 - (2) Permit holders unless the vehicle displays a valid permit in the relevant position, or an electronic record exists, which is accessible by a hand-held device, of a permit valid for that vehicle, at and throughout the time the vehicle is parked;
 - (3) Electric vehicles unless the vehicle parked is an electric vehicle and is connected to the electric vehicle charging point and is continuously charging;
 - (4) Operational vehicles unless the vehicle parked is an operational vehicle;
 - (5) Vehicles not exceeding a specified weight and/or height and/or length, unless the vehicle parked does not exceed the specified weight and/or height and/or length;
 - (6) Motor vehicles loading or unloading unless the vehicle is carrying out loading or unloading and the vehicle does not park for more than the time permitted as indicated by signing or markings within the parking place or adjacent to the parking bay or any such longer period as a duly authorised officer of the Council may authorise;
 - (7) Goods vehicles, commercial vehicles or coaches unless the vehicle parked is a goods vehicle, commercial vehicle or coach and the parking charge as specified in Column 7 of Schedule 1 is paid;
 - (8) Motor cycles unless the vehicle is a motor cycle; and
 - (9) Market Traders on specific days or at specific times and at specified charges as signed on notices within the parking place unless the vehicle belongs to, or is being used by, a Market Trader and any Market Trader permit required in that parking place is displayed in the relevant position or a record exists which is accessible by a hand-held device of a valid permit being applicable to that vehicle at the time it is parked. Where Market Trader permit holders are also required to pay the daily parking charge the charge must be paid at a ticket machine at the start of waiting and the parking ticket must be displayed in the relevant position in the vehicle throughout the period of waiting.
- 13. The driver of a vehicle may not permit the vehicle to wait within the parking place in such a manner as to:
 - (1) obstruct vehicular access to, or egress from, the parking place or any parking bay or parking area in the parking place; or
 - (2) obstruct any footway, footpath or pedestrian access way in the parking place;

- (3) otherwise obstruct the free flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic within the parking place.
- 14. The driver of a vehicle may not permit the vehicle to wait in a parking place other than in a parking bay and in such a manner that any wheel of that vehicle is not located outside the markings defining the boundaries of that parking bay.
- 15. Where within a parking place the parking bays are not defined, the vehicle should be parked in such a position that does not obstruct any other user of, or the means of access to, or egress from, the parking place.
- 16. The driver of a vehicle may not permit the vehicle to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period of parking in that parking place or to return to park in that same parking place before any period of no return has expired, as specified in Column 5 of Schedule 1.
- 17. Within any parking place the Council reserves the right to introduce a maximum period for which a vehicle may be parked in specific bays by the use of appropriate signs and/or surface markings. The driver of a vehicle shall not wait or permit the vehicle to be parked in such bays for longer that the maximum period stated.
- 18. The driver of a vehicle may not permit the vehicle to wait in the parking place save for the purposes designated in, and as provided by, this Order.
- 19. The driver of a vehicle may not permit the vehicle to wait in the parking place with the engine running once in position in a parking bay and thereafter the engine shall not be started save for the purposes of changing the position of the vehicle in, or departing from, the parking place.
- 20. Where a height restriction applies at a parking place the driver of a vehicle shall not attempt to enter that parking place if the overall height of the vehicle including any roof racks, roof boxes, or any adaption to increase the height of the vehicle, exceeds the permitted height. Such height restrictions are stated at the entrance to the parking place.
- 21. Where a width restriction is installed at a parking place the driver of a vehicle shall not attempt to enter that parking place if the width of the vehicle exceeds the permitted width restriction. Such width restrictions are stated at the entrance to the parking place.

Loading and Unloading

22. Goods vehicles or commercial vehicles in Class 5 (exceeding 1525 kg unladen weight) may remain stationary for the purpose of loading or unloading at any premises accessed from parking places where such loading and unloading is permitted as identified in Column 7 of Schedule 1, provided that no such vehicle shall be left unattended for a period in excess of 10 minutes.

Use of rights of way in the parking place

23. Nothing in this Order shall authorise the Council or any Civil Enforcement Officer exercising powers hereunder to interfere with or restrict the free use of any right of way granted by the Council or any predecessor in title of the Council over the parking place or any part thereof.

PART III PARKING PERMITS

Parking permits

- 24. A parking permit is any form of valid permit, season ticket, pass, parking card, or any other form of document or record to the Council's design, either issued, or recorded as an electronic record on the telephone payment parking system, by or on behalf of the Council, that permits a vehicle to park within a parking place. A valid parking permit must either:
 - (1) be displayed in the relevant position on the vehicle at all times during which the vehicle is parked in the parking place; or
 - be a record of a valid permit accessible by a hand-held device, which does not require the permit so recorded to be displayed.

Valid permits

- 25. A qualifying applicant may on application to the Council purchase a parking permit in respect of a vehicle for a charge ascertained by reference to the charges specified in Column 6 of Schedule 1, or within the Notes to that Schedule.
- 26. A parking permit is valid only for the parking place or specific parking places in respect of which it was purchased, on specific days or at specific times if applicable and only up to the date of expiry shown on, or recorded electronically, in relation to that permit.
- 27. Parking permits are issued and must be used in accordance with the conditions of use applicable to the permit applied for. A permit holder shall abide by the terms and conditions stipulated by the Council from time to time for the use of the parking permit for the permit to remain a valid permit for the purposes of parking.
- A parking permit remains the property of the Council and must be surrendered on request. In such instances where a refund of the charge made for the parking permit is deemed appropriate by the Council, this will be provided in accordance with the Council's policies and an administration charge may apply.
- 29. The Council shall be entitled at its absolute discretion to restrict the number of parking permits which it will sell at any one time or over any particular period of time.

Dishonouring of payment made for a parking permit

30. Where a parking permit is issued to any person, or a record of a virtual parking permit is made in relation to any person, upon receipt of a payment made by cheque, debit or credit card and that payment is subsequently dishonoured that parking permit or virtual parking permit, as the case may be shall cease to be of any effect, and the Council may by notice in writing sent by ordinary first class post, or by email communication, to the address / email address stated on the application for the permit concerned, notify the holder that the permit is cancelled. The permit holder in the case of an issued permit shall be required to immediately surrender it to the relevant issuing authority within seventy-two hours of the dispatch of the aforementioned notice.

Validation of Payment Vouchers / Scratch Cards

31. (1) A payment voucher or scratch card is a form of parking permit that shall be valid when displayed in a vehicle in accordance with Article 24(1) in respect of a

particular period of waiting in a parking place in which such parking permit is valid on a particular day provided that the front face of the parking permit, in accordance with any instructions printed upon either face, shall have exhibited thereon:

- (a) the parking place in which the payment voucher or scratch card is valid for use:
- (b) in the case of a payment voucher or scratch card authorising waiting throughout the charging hours on any day, the date on which the vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place;
- (c) in the case of a payment voucher or scratch card authorising waiting for any period within the charging hours on any day, the date and time, to the nearest five minutes, at which the vehicle is first permitted to wait in the parking place; and
- (d) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the payment voucher or scratch card is to be used.
- (2) This form of parking permit shall not be valid in respect of a particular period of waiting in the parking place on a particular day if:
 - (a) more than one date or time is exhibited upon the front face of the payment voucher or scratch card or it is otherwise completed in such a manner as to render it impossible to determine the date, time or registration mark intended to be exhibited; or
 - (b) no date and/or time and/or registration mark is exhibited upon the front face of the payment voucher or scratch card; or
 - (c) the payment voucher or scratch card is completed other than in accordance with any instructions printed upon either face; or
 - (d) the payment voucher or scratch card is not valid for use in the parking place in which the vehicle is permitted to wait.
- 32. Once a payment voucher or scratch card is validated to include the registration mark of the vehicle in accordance with Article 30 (1), that permit may not be transferred to another vehicle.

PART IV CHARGES FOR PARKING

- 33. There are different types of payment systems operating in the parking places listed in Schedule 1 of this Order, all are subject to the scale of charges specified in Column 4. 6 or 7 of that Schedule.
 - a) Barrier operated / pay-on-foot (pay on departure);
 - b) Pay and Display (pay on arrival); and
 - c) Pay-By-Phone (pay on arrival).

Parking places are clearly marked at the entrance and within the parking place on notice boards as to which system or systems of payment applies.

Barrier Controlled (pay on departure)

34. The driver of a vehicle using a barrier controlled / pay-on-foot parking place shall proceed as follows:

- a) At the entry barrier either:
 - i. the vehicle registration mark will be logged by a camera; or
 - ii. the vehicle registration mark will be logged by a camera and a ticket will be issued; or
 - iii. you will be required to take a ticket or token; and

the barrier will open automatically to allow the vehicle to enter;

- b) Leave the parking place on foot and do not pay until you return to the parking place to leave;
- c) On return, visit the ticket machine and follow the instructions on the screen to either:
 - i. enter the vehicle registration; or
 - ii. insert the parking ticket or token and

the parking charge will be displayed;

- d) Pay the parking charge using any payment method available at the parking place and if a ticket or token was entered before payment take the dispensed ticket or token after payment;
- e) Upon exiting either:
 - i. wait at the barrier for the vehicle registration to be read and the barrier to be lifted; or
 - ii. present your ticket or token at the barrier to enable the barrier to be lifted;
- f) If a valid permit holder, a visit to the ticket machine is not necessary. The barrier will automatically lift upon exiting the parking place.

Barrier Controlled System - Unable to Pay

35. If the driver is not able to pay the parking charge referred to in Article 34(d) or the relevant daily charge set out in Schedule 1, an intercom connected to a call centre operator is available and the driver will be allowed to remove the vehicle from the parking place upon issue of a Penalty Charge Notice. The driver must supply to the call centre officer on duty at the parking place his or her name and address and the vehicle registration mark.

Pay and Display / Pay by Phone

- 36. Any person proposing to permit a vehicle to park in a parking place during the charging hours shall immediately upon entering the parking place:
 - (1) pay the appropriate charge for the proposed period of waiting in accordance with the scale of charges specified in Column 4, 6 or 7 of Schedule 1 as applicable, by obtaining a parking ticket from a ticket machine within the parking place, or by using the pay-by-phone facility;
 - (2) payment at ticket machines can be made in sterling by either coin denominations accepted by the machine or by a payment card. In the case of a ticket machine only accepting coins, or only accepting a payment card, the appropriate form of payment must be used;
 - (3) ticket machines do not give change and any overpayment shall not be refundable, nor shall it otherwise affect the operation of any provision of the Order;

- (4) parking tickets are valid for the period of issue and parking place of issue only. They are not transferable between vehicles, persons or parking places;
- (5) parking tickets are to be placed in the relevant position in the vehicle and should remain in that position for the duration of the parking time purchased;
- (6) in the event that the ticket machine produces a parking ticket on payment of the parking charge that has an attached tear-off voucher for a retail or leisure marketing scheme, only the parking ticket may be displayed in the vehicle and used as evidence that the parking charge has been paid;
- (7) pay-by-phone information signs and the relevant location number signs will be located in each parking place where pay-by-phone is in operation and will provide information in regard to the operation and use of pay-by-phone;
- (8) the payment of a parking charge using pay-by-phone relates only to the parking place as indicated by the location number displayed in the signs situated in that parking place;
- (9) in the event that one of the payment facilities at the parking place is unavailable for use for any reason and at any time during the charging hours then payment of the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges specified in Column 4, 6 or 7 of Schedule 1 shall be made by any other available alternative payment facility; and
- (10) in the event an electric vehicle is parked in a parking place the driver shall pay the appropriate charge for the proposed period of waiting in that parking place in accordance with the scale of charges specified in Column 4, 6 or 7 of Schedule 1 and in addition, any separate charge for supply of electricity which may also be payable to the service provider, in line with the supplier's terms and conditions for connecting to an electric vehicle charging point for the supply of electricity.

PROVIDED THAT no charge shall be payable:

- (1) in respect of the use of the parking place by a vehicle when waiting outside of the charging hours; or
- (2) in respect of the use of the parking place by a vehicle when waiting where a valid Disabled Person's Badge is duly displayed on the vehicle in accordance with Article 12(1) throughout the period during which that vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place; or
- (3) in respect of the use of the parking place by a vehicle when waiting where a parking permit valid for use in such parking place is duly displayed on the vehicle, or there is an electronic record of such a permit in accordance with Article 12(2) throughout the period during which that vehicle is permitted to wait in that parking place; or
- (4) in respect of the use of a parking bay within the parking place for the waiting of a motor cycle where the parking bay concerned is marked as being reserved for the use of motor cycles, or in those parking places as signed and indicated within Column 7 of Schedule 1, where motor cycles may wait in any parking bay free of charge.
- 37. The Council may from time to time determine not to collect a charge and/or charges at a parking place and information relating to a change in the collection of a charge/and or changes will be indicated on the parking place notice in the parking place where it applies.

Ĺ

38. The Council may from time to time grant written permission for vehicles to park at such times and in such parking places as it may deem expedient at a charge applicable at the time of application and/or issue.

PART V PENALTY CHARGES

- 39. Subject to the provisions of Part VIII, if at any time during the days and hours of operation of the parking place:
 - (1) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place, or to make use of any part of the parking place for or in connection with the sale or exposing for sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place, or for, or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of any person's skill or services; or
 - (2) a vehicle is permitted to wait, park, load or unload in a restricted area within the parking place; or
 - (3) a vehicle is permitted to wait in a parking bay designated as only being available for use by vehicles on which a valid Disabled Person's Badge is displayed in accordance with Article 12(1), and such a Disabled Person's Badge or, where applicable, the parking disc, is/are not so displayed; or
 - (4) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place, a parking area in the parking place or a parking bay designated as only being available for use by vehicles not exceeding a specified weight and/or height and/or length, and that vehicle exceeds the specified weight and/or height and/or length; or
 - (5) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place, a parking area or a parking bay designated as only being available for use by vehicles of a specified class, and that vehicle is not of the specified class; or
 - (6) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place in such a manner as to:
 - (a) obstruct vehicular access to or egress from the parking place or any parking bay in the parking place; or
 - (b) obstruct any footway, footpath or pedestrian access way in the parking place; or
 - (c) otherwise obstruct the free flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic within the parking place; and

the same shall constitute a higher level parking contravention for the purposes of the relevant legislation and a higher level penalty charge shall be payable to the Council in respect thereof.

- 40. Subject to the provisions of Part VIII:
 - (a) if at any time during the days and hours of operation of the parking place:
 - (1) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place other than in a parking bay, or in such a manner that any wheel of that vehicle is located outside the markings defining the boundaries of that parking bay; or
 - (2) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place with the engine running once in position in a parking bay or thereafter the engine is started save for the purposes of changing the position of the vehicle in, or departing from, the parking place; or
 - (3) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place if a period of less than a specified period of no return to that parking place has elapsed since the

- termination during the charging hours on the same day of the last period of waiting by that vehicle; or
- (4) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place contrary to the terms and conditions upon which a parking permit has been issued; or
- (5) a parking permit is displayed and purchased in accordance with this Order but the vehicle is permitted to wait in an area in a parking place or a designated parking bay where use of the parking permit is invalid;

OR

- (b) if at any time during the charging hours:
 - (1) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place for longer than the period for which advance payment has been made; or
 - (2) a valid parking ticket or valid parking permit is not purchased and either displayed, or recorded as a record accessible by a hand-held device, in accordance with the relevant provisions of Part II on any vehicle permitted to wait in the parking place; or
 - (3) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place for longer than the period for which payment has been made;

OR

- (c) save for the provisions of Articles 39 and 40(a) and (b):
 - (1) a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place for a purpose other than the designated purpose as provided by this Order;

the same shall constitute a lower level parking contravention for the purposes of the relevant legislation and a lower level penalty charge shall be payable to the Council in respect thereof.

- 41. A Penalty Charge Notice may be in such form as may from time to time be considered appropriate by the Council, provided that it shall display such information as may be required by the relevant legislation.
- 42. A Penalty Charge Notice shall be served by a Civil Enforcement Officer or otherwise in accordance with the relevant legislation.
- 43. Insofar as there may be any requirement that the identity of the Civil Enforcement Officer serving such a Penalty Charge Notice be set out in that notice, that requirement shall be deemed to have been met if the Civil Enforcement Officer inserts his Identification Number on the notice at the time at which he serves the notice.
- 44. The amount due in respect of a Penalty Charge shall be paid to the Council by means of cheque, postal order, debit or credit card payment or such other means of payment as may be acceptable to the Council. Payment shall be made at the office of any appointed agent of the Council as the Council may from time to time determine and as specified in the Penalty Charge Notice.
- 45. Where the date for payment of a penalty charge falls upon a day on which the specified place(s) for payment is closed, the period within which payment is to be made shall be extended until 23:59 hours on the next full day on which that place(s) is open to receive payment.
- 46. When a Penalty Charge Notice has been issued and attached to the windscreen of a vehicle no person other than the driver of the vehicle concerned (or a person

authorised by the driver of the vehicle in that behalf) shall remove that Penalty Charge Notice from the vehicle concerned, or otherwise interfere with it.

PART VI EVIDENCE

- 47. Payment of the charge specified in this Order for any period of waiting in the parking place shall be indicated by:
 - (1) the issue by a ticket machine located in the parking place of a parking ticket for use of the parking place indicating upon its face:
 - (a) payment of a sum which is not less than the appropriate charge for the proposed period of waiting in the parking place as specified in Schedule 1;
 - (b) the day and date of issue of the parking ticket; and
 - (c) the time at which the purchased period of waiting will expire; and display of that parking ticket in the manner specified in Article 36(5), or
 - (2) the display of a valid parking permit on the vehicle concerned in the manner specified in Article 24(1); or
 - (3) the details which shall appear on a hand-held device in the event that pay-by-phone or a virtual parking permit has been used.
- 48. Subject to and in addition to the provisions of Article 47 the expiry of any period of waiting for which a charge has been paid in respect of a vehicle permitted to wait in the parking place shall be indicated when there is displayed on that vehicle:
 - (a) a parking ticket issued by a ticket machine located in the parking place showing the day and time upon which the period for which payment has been made will expire, and either the day so shown is not the day upon which the vehicle is observed to be waiting in the parking place by a Civil Enforcement Officer, or if it is, the time of expiry shown upon the parking ticket is prior to the time at which the vehicle is observed to be waiting by a Civil Enforcement Officer; or
 - (b) a parking permit showing the date upon which the period for which payment has been made will expire, and the day upon which the vehicle is observed to be waiting in the parking place by a Civil Enforcement Officer is subsequent to that date, or
 - (c) a parking permit in the form of a payment voucher or scratch card showing the day and time upon which the period for which payment has been made will expire, and either the day so shown is not the day upon which the vehicle is observed to be waiting in the parking place by a Civil Enforcement Officer, or if it is the time of expiry calculated by reference to the time of arrival shown on the permit is prior to the time at which the vehicle is observed to be waiting by a Civil Enforcement Officer, and

in such circumstances it shall be presumed that the period of waiting for which payment has been made has expired, unless the contrary be proved.

49. Subject to and in addition to the provisions of Article 48 the expiry of any period of waiting for which a charge has been paid in respect of a vehicle permitted to wait in the parking place shall be indicated where the time of expiry shown upon a Handheld Device is prior to the time at which the vehicle is observed to be waiting by a Civil Enforcement Officer and, in such circumstances, it shall be presumed that the

- period of waiting for which payment has been made has expired, unless the contrary be proved.
- 50. If at any time a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place during the charging hours and:
 - (a) a valid parking ticket, parking permit, or Disabled Person's Badge, (as appropriate to the parking place in which the vehicle has been permitted to wait and the location of the vehicle in the parking place) is not displayed on that vehicle in accordance with the relevant provisions of Part II, or
 - (b) a parking permit in the form of a payment voucher or scratch card showing the day and time upon which the period for which payment has been made will expire is displayed on that vehicle, but the time at which the vehicle is observed to be waiting by a Civil Enforcement Officer is prior to the time of arrival shown upon that permit, or
 - (c) nothing appears on a hand-held device to indicate that payment of the parking charge has been made using pay-by-phone, or a record of a valid permit exists;

it shall be presumed that no charge for use of the parking place has been paid, unless the contrary be proved.

51. If at any time a vehicle is permitted to wait in the parking place during the charging hours and a parking ticket or a parking permit is displayed on that vehicle or an electronic record of such is accessible by a head-held device, in accordance with the relevant provisions of Part II and Part III, the particulars recorded upon the face thereof or within the electronic record, shall be deemed to be conclusive evidence as to the location of the parking place, the day and date of issue of the parking ticket or permit, the date and/or time of expiry of the period of waiting for which payment has been made, the charge paid and any other matters so recorded, unless the contrary be proved.

PART VII SUSPENSION OF USE OF THE PARKING PLACE AND/OR PARKING BAYS

- 52. The Council may by indication on site temporarily suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever it is considered reasonably necessary and for whatsoever period is considered reasonable:
 - a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - b) for the purpose of any works; in, over, under, or adjacent to the parking place or part thereof, inclusive of but not limited to; excavations, maintenance, improvements, utilities;
 - c) by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public, serious damage to the parking place or any adjoining premises, or any other emergency;
 - d) on any occasion on which it is likely that the parking place or parking bay will be required for the exclusive use of specific individual groups of persons or organisations, or for the parking of a particular class or classes of vehicle; or
 - e) for the purpose of any events authorised by the Council; or for any other such purposes as may be authorised by the Council.
- 53. A police officer in uniform may suspend the use of the parking place or part thereof when it is considered such suspension is reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety, or that such action is

- necessary by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public, serious damage to the parking place or any adjoining premises, or any other emergency.
- 54. Any person suspending the use of a parking place or thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 52 shall thereupon place in or adjacent to the parking place or relevant part thereof the use of which is suspended, a sign or notice indicating that its use by vehicles for the purposes of waiting is prohibited.
- 55. No person shall permit a vehicle to wait in the parking place or any part thereof during such period as there is a sign or notice placed in pursuance of Article 54, unless the vehicle is being used for emergency purposes by the fire, ambulance, police or armed services of the Crown, or the vehicle is so parked with the permission:
 - (1) of the person suspending the use of the parking place, or part thereof in pursuance of Article 52; or
 - (2) of a police officer in uniform.

PART VIII EXEMPTIONS FROM RESTRICTIONS ON WAITING

- 56. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order a vehicle may wait during the charging hours in any part of the parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
 - (1) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his/her control or to such waiting being necessary as a direct consequence of, or in order to avoid, an accident:
 - the vehicle is being used for fire, ambulance or police purposes or, of any utilities undertaking or other statutory public authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is permitted to wait;
 - (3) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction preventing or hindering the free flow of traffic in the parking place, or access to or egress from the parking place or a parking bay in the parking place;
 - (4) the vehicle is waiting:
 - (a) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is permitted to wait are being unloaded from the vehicle or, having been unloaded are being delivered to those premises; or
 - (b) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is permitted to wait or, having been so collected, are being loaded thereon.
- 57. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, an operational vehicle may wait for an unlimited period in any parking bay within the parking place marked as reserved for use by such vehicles, provided that the use of that parking bay has not been suspended and that the driver of that vehicle has been either been authorised by the Council or provided with a parking permit to make use of the parking bay concerned for such purposes.

58. No charge specified in Schedule 1 of this Order shall be payable in respect of any vehicle permitted to wait in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of Articles 56 or 57.

PART IX EQUIPMENT, SIGNAGE AND WORKS IN THE PARKING PLACE

- 59. The Council may install in the parking place such number of ticket machines and such other numbers and types of equipment as they consider necessary for the purpose of permitting vehicles to wait in the parking place pursuant to the provisions of this Order.
- 60. The Council may cause the limits of the parking place and of each parking bay in the parking place to be indicated by the placing and maintaining of such markings and/or writing on the surface of the parking place or parking bay, and/or signs located in, on or adjacent to the parking place or parking bay as they consider necessary for the purpose of permitting vehicles to wait in the parking place pursuant to the provisions of this Order.
- 61. The Council may:
 - (1) execute in the parking place such building operations and/or demolition or excavation works in or over or under or adjacent to any part of the parking place, or
 - place and maintain such markings and/or writing on the surface of the parking place, and/or such signs located in, on or adjacent to the parking place,

as it may consider necessary, whether for the purpose of permitting vehicles to wait in the parking place pursuant to the provisions of this Order, or for any other purpose.

PART X USE OF THE PARKING PLACE: ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

- 62. Where in the parking place signs are erected, or surface or other markings are laid for the purpose of:
 - (1) indicating the entrance to, or exit from, the parking place; or
 - (2) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place; or
 - (3) indicating the maximum speed permitted within;

no person shall drive or permit to be driven any vehicle;

- (a) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit so indicated; or
- (b) in a direction other than that specified; and
- (c) in excess of the maximum speed indicated;

as the case may be.

63. No person shall use any part of the parking place:

- (1) as a means of proceeding by vehicle between one highway and another (whether any such highway shall be maintainable at the public expense or otherwise), or
- (2) save with the prior written consent of the Council, as a means of vehicular access to any premises adjoining the parking place.

64. No person shall:

- ride or otherwise use any bicycle in the parking place save for the purposes of obtaining access to any area allocated by the Council for the parking of bicycles within the parking place;
- (2) permit any bicycle to wait in the parking place, other than in any area allocated by the Council for the waiting of bicycles within the parking place,

and in either case only during the days and hours of operation of the parking place, as specified in Schedule 1.

- 65. No person shall in the parking place:
 - (1) shout or sing;
 - (2) play a musical instrument;
 - (3) operate or permit to be operated, any radio, gramophone, amplifier, tape recorder, compact disc player or similar equipment;
 - (4) permit to be made any noise or otherwise behave to the disturbance or annoyance to users of the parking place, occupants of neighbouring premises, or passers-by.
- 66. No person shall in the parking place:
 - (1) use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear, or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned; or
 - (2) throw or discharge any missile to the danger or annoyance of any other person in or adjacent to the parking place.
- 67. No person shall, without the prior written consent of the Council, hold or take part in any display, public show, performance or exhibition in the parking place, or place any vehicle or equipment in the parking place in connection with the same.
- 68. No person shall, without specific permission from an authorised officer, climb any wall or fence in or enclosing the parking place, or any tree, barrier, railing, post or other structure in the parking place.
- 69. No person shall wilfully damage or deface:
 - (1) any wall, fence, barrier, railing, post or other structure or surface,
 - (2) any vehicle, plant, equipment or apparatus;
 - (3) any tree, bush, shrub or other soft landscaping; or
 - (4) any other item not aforementioned

in the parking place.

- 70. No person shall use any part of the parking place or any vehicle left in the parking place:
 - (1) for sleeping or camping purposes, or
 - (2) for eating or cooking purposes, or

- (3) save with the consent of the Council (which may be given upon such terms (including terms as to payment) as it considers to be appropriate):
 - (a) for the purpose of washing any vehicle, or
 - (b) for the purpose of servicing, modifying or repairing any vehicle or part thereof (other than as may be reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the parking place).
- 71. No person shall in the parking place:
 - (1) skate or use any skateboard or similar mechanical device, or
 - (2) play or take part in any ball game.
- 72. No person shall:
 - (1) use the parking place for the purpose of displaying or distributing advertising material, or
 - (2) place any advertising material on any vehicle left in the parking place, save with the prior written consent of the Council.
- 73. No person shall in the parking place:
 - (1) erect or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the prior written consent of the Council, or
 - (2) light or permit to be lit any fire.
- 74. No person shall in the parking place:
 - (1) intentionally obstruct any Civil Enforcement Officer in the proper execution of his duties, or
 - (2) intentionally obstruct any person carrying out any act which is necessary to the proper execution of, or authorised by, any contract made by the Council, or
 - (3) intentionally obstruct any other person in the proper use of the parking place.
- 75. No person shall in the parking place sound the horn of any vehicle or other similar instrument except when necessary as a warning when about to put the vehicle concerned in motion, or when changing the position or direction of the vehicle concerned, or otherwise with a view to protecting the health and safety of any person.
- 76. No person shall in the parking place permit to be emitted from a vehicle (whether continuously or intermittently) any noise originating from any fitment or alarm on the vehicle such as would cause disturbance or annoyance to users of the parking place, occupiers of premises in the neighbourhood, or passers-by, save that this Article shall not be deemed to have been breached if any fitment or alarm on the vehicle shall have been activated by any unauthorised person improperly tampering with the vehicle, but such unauthorised activation of the fitment or alarm shall not prohibit or prevent a Civil Enforcement Officer:
 - (1) immobilising the vehicle or causing it to be immobilised pursuant to the Relevant Legislation, or
 - (2) moving the vehicle or causing it to be moved within the parking place, or
 - (3) removing the vehicle or causing it to be removed from the parking place pursuant to the Relevant Legislation, or
 - (4) in the alternative making arrangements for that fitment or alarm to be rendered inoperable or silenced.

- 77. No person shall in the parking place drive or manoeuvre a vehicle in such a manner as would present a possible risk or danger to other users of the parking place.
- 78. Smoking is prohibited within all of the multi-storey car parks
- 79. The Council may remove any supermarket shopping trolleys left in any parking place, which will be stored by the Council until collected by the owner. An administration charge may be payable on return of the trolley.
- 80. The Council accepts no responsibility, ether at common law or under the Occupiers Liability Act 1957, or otherwise, for loss of or damage to vehicles or other property left in any of the Council's parking places

PART XI HOLDING AND USE OF DATA

81. Any data obtained by the Council for the purpose of, or in connection with, the issuing of a Penalty Charge Notice, or which is provided to the Council by any person subsequent to the service of the same may be held and used by the Council for the purposes of traffic management administration and/or the taking of legal proceedings or other enforcement action in respect of any contravention of this Order. This data may be used for these purposes by the Council, and/or their respective officers and agents, and may be disclosed to other law enforcement agencies for such purposes, when considered necessary by either authority for the prevention and detection of crime, or when otherwise required by law.

PART XII REVOCATIONS

Revocations

82. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Orders set out in Schedule 3 and any Orders amending those Orders are hereby revoked.






Swan Multi-Storey






Hughenden Park, Coates Lane
