## THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF CALDERDALE

# (WAITING AND LOADING AND PARKING PLACES) (SOWERBY BRIDGE) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2008

The Borough Council of Calderdale in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 53 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

## PART 1 GENERAL

### Citation

 This order may be cited as the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF CALDERDALE (WAITING AND LOADING AND PARKING PLACES) (SOWERBY BRIDGE) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2008 and shall come into operation on Monday 31 March 2008.

#### Interpretation

- 2.1 (a) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
  - (b) Where provision of this order is in conflict with a provision contained in a previous Order, the provisions of this Order shall prevail.
  - (c) Where a statute, statutory instrument, specification or regulations are referred to such reference shall include an amendment to or replacement thereof.
- 2.2 In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"the Act of 1984" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended);

"bus" means a vehicle which is adapted to carry more than eight passengers excluding the driver;

"carriageway" has the same meaning as in Section 329(1) of the Highways Act 1980;

"coach" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and constructed or adapted to carry more than eight passengers excluding the driver;

"the Council" means the Borough Council of Calderdale;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Regulation 2 of the Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle displaying a disabled persons' badge;

"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place:

"goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle or trailer which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden and is not drawing a trailer;

"licensed taxi" has the meaning as in section 13 of the Transport Act 1985;

"loading or unloading" means the waiting of a vehicle for the commercial purpose of the delivery of goods to or the receipt of goods from adjacent premises, the volume, weight or bulk of the goods being such that it would not be reasonable to expect the goods to be otherwise delivered or received;

"motor car" and "motor vehicle" have the same meanings respectively as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984;

"motor cycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an invalid carriage) with fewer than 4 wheels, of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms and has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984;

"owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;

"civil enforcement officer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place and to carry out such other functions as may be conferred by or under any enactment;

"PCSO" means a Police Community Support Officer authorised to carry out traffic duties:

"parking charge" means the sum(s) payable for the purchase of a Parking Ticket as set out in Article 88 hereof;

"parking place" means an area on a highway designed or authorised and described as a parking place by any of the various Articles or Schedules of this Order;

"parking period" means the period beginning from the time the vehicle was first left in the parking place and ending on the expiration of the period of time for which payment was made at the time of first leaving the vehicle;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of the vehicle;

"parking ticket" means a ticket dispensed by a ticket parking meter or a ticket issued by a person authorised by the Council on the payment of the initial charge;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than eight passengers, exclusive of the driver;

"permit" means a permit issued to a resident under the provisions of Article 82(1) of Part 4 of this Order;

"special permit" means a permit issued to any person under the provisions of Article 82(2) of Part 4 of the Order:

"permit holder" means a resident to whom a permit has been issued or other person to whom a special permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 82 of Part 4 of this Order;

"relevant position" in relation to the display of a disabled person's parking badge or disc has the same meaning as in Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"relevant position" in relation to the display of a parking ticket means in the case of a vehicle with a front windscreen the badge or parking ticket is exhibited thereon facing outwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; or in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge or parking ticket is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the motor vehicle;

"resident" means in relation to a parking place any person whose usual residence is at premises the postal address of which is defined opposite to that parking place in Column 4 of Schedules 9.50 to 9.61, 10.10 to 10.12 and 11.01 to 11.02 to this Order;

"telecommunications apparatus" or "apparatus" has the same meaning as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003:

"ticket machine" or "ticket parking meter" means any apparatus or device of a type or design approved in accordance with Section 35(3) or 46(2) of the Act of 1984 and installed to facilitate collection of the parking charge and dispense numbered tickets as evidence of payment of the parking charge and situated adjacent to the parking place to which it relates;

"trailer" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984;

"vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984;

# PART 2 WAITING & LOADING RESTRICTIONS

#### **CLEARWAYS**

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any verge or lay-by immediately adjacent to any of the main carriageways comprised in the roads specified in Schedule 1.01 to this Order for the purposes of selling goods from that vehicle unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.

  - (a) for a period longer than 3 hours or
  - (b) if a period of less than 3 hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same side or length of road.

- Save as provided in Articles 72 and 74 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8am to 6pm Monday to Saturday in the length of road specified in Schedule 8.23 to this Order unless such day falls upon a Bank Holiday
  - (a) for a period longer than 15 minutes or
  - (b) if a period of less than 1 hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same side or length of road.

# <u>Limited Waiting Monday to Saturday 8am – 6pm – waiting limited to 4 hours return</u> prohibited within 3 hours (Schedule 8.24)

- Save as provided in Articles 72 and 74 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8am to 6pm Monday to Saturday in the length of road specified in Schedule 8.24 to this Order unless such day falls upon a Bank Holiday
  - (a) for a period longer than 4 hours or
  - (b) if a period of less than 3 hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same side or length of road.

# EXEMPTIONS TO PART 2 WAITING & LOADING RESTRICTIONS

#### **Exemptions from Clearways**

- Nothing in Article 3 and 4 of this Order shall apply:-
  - (a) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting on any main carriageway referred to in that Article for so long as is necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road comprising or including the carriageway or the laying, erection or repair in or near such road of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003;
  - (b) to a vehicle waiting on any main carriageway whilst engaged in the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (c) to a vehicle if it is in the service of a Universal Service Provider and is being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000.

- (d) to a vehicle being used in the length of road so specified for police, ambulance, fire brigade, local authority or water authority when used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) to a vehicle waiting on any main carriageway referred to in that Article while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is opened or closed, it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise on that carriageway;
- (f) to a vehicle waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident or is required by law to stop.

## **Exemptions to Waiting and Loading Restrictions**

- Nothing in Article 5 to 70 of this Order shall prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait in the length of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary if:
  - (a) the vehicle\_cannot be conveniently used in any other road, is waiting to enable it to be used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road comprising or including the carriageway or the laying, erection or repair in or near such road of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003;
  - (b) the vehicle is in the service of a Universal Service Provider and it is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000.
  - (c) it is being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade, local authority or water authority purposes when used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
  - (d) the vehicle waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident or is required by law to stop;
  - (e) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal or delivery of furniture to or from any premises situate in the said length of road provided that notice is given 24 hours in advance to the Council's Parking Services and their consent obtained.
  - (f) the vehicle is waiting while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is opened or closed, it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise:
  - (g) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle.
  - (h) to enable the vehicle being a licensed hackney carriage to wait at a hackney carriage rank appointed by the Council.

- Nothing in Articles 6(a), 7a, 8a, 9a, 10a, 11a, 12a, 13a, 14a, 15(a), 16, 17(a), 21a and 25 to 46 of this Order shall prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait in the length of road during the days and times specified therein for so long as may be necessary:
  - (a) in connection with a wedding or funeral providing that it is not reasonably practical for the vehicle to wait otherwise;
  - (b) to deliver to or collect from or load or unload goods at any premises fronting on to the said length of road provided that no vehicle so engaged shall wait for longer than 30 minutes outside the same premises or such other period as a civil enforcement officer in uniform may authorise provided always that a police constable in uniform or a PCSO may at any time require the driver of a vehicle to move it if it is reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.
- Nothing in Articles 6(a), 7a, 8a, 9a, 10a, 11a, 12a, 13a, 14a, 15(a), 16, 17(a), 21a and 25 to 46 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road during the days and times specified therein
  - (a) for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same road or part of road on the same day)
  - (b) in the length of road specified in Schedule 8 to this Order if the vehicle displays in the relevant position
    - (i) in all cases a disabled person's badge
    - (ii) in the case mentioned in (a) above a parking disc

issued by any local authority in accordance with the provisions of Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended), or a badge having effect under those Regulations as if it were a Disabled Person's Badge and the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, marks on the parking disc the time at which the period of waiting began.

- 75 For the purpose of this Order "relevant position" means
  - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the parking ticket, parking permit or parking disc is exhibited thereon with the obverse face facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; or
  - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the parking ticket, parking permit or parking disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front of the vehicle.

### PART 3

### **PARKING PLACES**

#### Contravention

- (1) Each of the roads or parts of road specified in Schedules 9.01 to 9.07, 9.50 to 9.61 and 11.01 to 11.02 to this Order are authorised as a parking place for use, subject to the following provisions of this Order, for the parking during such hours on such days and in such positions as are specified in this Order of such classes of vehicles, also so specified.
  - (2) The number and situation of parking bays in each parking place shall be determined by the Council and the limits of each parking place shall be indicated by the Council on the carriageway and by appropriate traffic signs.
  - (3) Where in Schedules 9.01 to 9.07, 9.50 to 9.61 and 11.01 and 11.02 to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles for a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the specified class or in a position other than that specified.
  - (4) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait continuously in a parking place for longer than the maximum period specified in Schedules 9.01 to 9.07 and 9.50 to 9.61 to this Order.
  - (5) When a vehicle has left a designated limited waiting parking place after waiting therein the driver thereof shall not within the period specified in Schedules 9.01 to 9.07 and 9.50 to 9.61 after leaving it permit it to wait again in that parking place.
  - (6) Nothing in paragraphs (4) and (5) of this Article shall apply to a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a valid permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle whilst parked in the lengths of road specified in Schedules 9.50 to 9.61.
  - (7) Nothing in paragraphs (4) and (5) of this Article shall apply to a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge parked in a designated limited waiting parking place in Schedule 9.01 to 9.07 and 9.50 9.61.
  - (8) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place specified in Schedules 11.01 and 11.02 unless the vehicle displays in the relevant position a valid permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle.

### **Exemptions**

- 77. (1) Notwithstanding Article 76 of this Order, any vehicle may wait in a parking place for so long as may be necessary if:-
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid accident or is required by law to stop;
- (c) the vehicle is a vehicle used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or a vehicle in the service of a local authority which is being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) the vehicle is waiting to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of an obstruction to traffic;
- (e) the vehicle is in the service of a Universal Service Provider and is being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000;
- (f) the vehicle is waiting to enable it to be used for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any mains pipes or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003 or traffic sign;
- (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal or delivery of furniture to any premises situate in a parking place provided that notice is given 24 hours in advance to the Council's Parking Services and their consent obtained;
- (h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or of loading or unloading the vehicle at or from premises adjacent to the parking place and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than 30 minutes or such other period as a civil enforcement officer in uniform may authorise provided always that a police constable in uniform or a PCSO may at any time require the driver of a vehicle to move it if it is reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.
- (2) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Act of 1984.

### **Suspensions**

- 78. (1) The Council's Parking Services may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the convenience of the occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one

- office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from the premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository:
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions;
- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road containing a parking place may be thronged or obstructed; or
- (e) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003 or of any traffic sign or lighting column.
- (2) Parking Services upon the suspension of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article shall thereupon or as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or the part thereof the use of which is suspended a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (3) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any parking place or part of a parking place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or part of a parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (2) of this Article PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply to any vehicle being used for any purpose specified in Article 77 (c) or (d) of this Order left in the parking place or part of a parking place during any such period, or to any other vehicle so left if that vehicle was left with the permission (a) of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this article or (b) a civil enforcement officer in uniform.

### Other Conditions

- A driver of a vehicle shall not use the parking place
  - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road or the use of the road by other persons or
  - (b) so as to be a nuisance or
  - (c) when for preventing obstruction of the street the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking space and have exhibited notices of such closing on or near the parking place.
- 80 (a) The driver of the vehicle using the parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place;

- (b) Save as provided in sub-paragraph (i) and (ii) of this paragraph, no person shall use the vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near that road or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
  - (i) if the vehicle is of a type described in Article 76(1) and the goods are immediately delivered or taken into the premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is affected or
- (ii) the vehicle is one to which provision of Article 77 (h) applies.
- A civil enforcement officer or Police Officer in uniform may in any case of emergency move or cause to be moved any vehicle left in a parking place to any place he thinks fit.

### PART 4

### **PERMITS**

- 82 (1) Any resident whose usual residence is at premises specified in Column 4 of Schedules 9.50 to 9.61, 10.10 to 10.12 and 11.01 to 11.02 to this Order may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit under the Council's Parking Permit Scheme for the leaving of a vehicle of the class specified in Column 3 of said schedules in the parking place specified in the said Schedule and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form.
  - (2) Any person may apply to the Council for the issue of a special permit under the Council's Parking Permit Scheme for the leaving of a vehicle of the class specified in Column 3 of Schedules 9.50 to 9.61, 10.10 to 10.12 and 11.01 to 11.02 to this Order in the parking place specified in the said Schedule and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such a form.
  - (4) The Council may at any time require a permit holder or applicant for a permit to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of any application made to them for a permit as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them.
  - (5) On receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident may subject to provisos (i) and (ii) hereto, issue to the applicant a permit in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Council's Parking Permit Scheme either for the leaving in the parking place of a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article or for use in the length of road a vehicle to which such permit relates by the consent of the owner, other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward, provided that:
    - (i) subject to the provisions of Article 81 of this Order, the Council shall not issue a permit to any resident which would be valid for any period

- during which any other permit issued to that resident is or would be valid; and
- (ii) provided always that the issue of a permit to a resident shall not be construed as if any parking space in the parking place was reserved solely for the use of that permit holder.
- (6) On receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is the owner of a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph (2) of this Article, or the owner of a vehicle requiring a special permit may subject to provisos (i) and (ii) hereto, issue to the applicant one special permit for the leaving in the parking place of the vehicle to which such special permit relates by consent of the owner, other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward, provided that:
  - (i) subject to the provisions of Article 81 of this Order, the Council shall not issue a special permit to any person which would be valid for any period during which any other special permit issued to that person is or would be valid; and
  - (ii) provided always that the issue of a special permit to any person shall not be construed as if any parking space in the parking place was reserved solely for the use of the permit holder.
- 83 (1) A permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a permit to the Council on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
  - (2) (i) The Council may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder by sending the same by recorded delivery service to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, withdraw a permit entirely at its own discretion and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice;
    - (ii) A permit shall cease to be valid on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
  - (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-
    - (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
    - (b) the permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued;
    - (c) the withdrawal of such permit by the Council under the provisions of paragraph (b) of this Article;
    - (d) the vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified

in Column 3 of Schedules 9.50 to 9.61, 10.10 to 10.12 and 11.01 to 11.02 to this Order.

- 84 (1) If a permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and the Council, upon receipt of the permit shall issue a duplicate permit so marked.
  - (2) If a permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate permit and the Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the permit which it duplicates shall become invalid.
  - (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate permit and an application therefore as if it were a permit, or as the case may be, an application therefore.
- At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place there shall be displayed on the front or near side of the vehicle a valid permit issued in respect of that vehicle so that all the particulars on the face of the permit are readily visible from the front or near side of the vehicle.
- Where a permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 85 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.

# PAY AND DISPLAY (Schedule 10.01 to 10.12)

## Parking Places

- 87 (1) Each area of a highway described in Column 1 of Schedule 10.01 to 10.12to this Order is hereby designated as a parking place.
  - (2) Each parking place may be used, subject to the provisions of Articles 87 to 98 of this Order, for the leaving of vehicles of the class specified in Column 3 during the hours indicated in Column 6 on days specified in Column 5 of Schedule 10.01 to 10.12, such period hereinafter called the "restricted period".
  - (3) The number of situation of parking bays in each parking place shall be determined by the Council and the limits of each parking place shall be indicated by the Council on the carriageway and by appropriate traffic signs.

## Payment for Parking

88 (1) Subject to Articles 96 and 97 of this Order, no person may leave or cause any vehicle to be left in a parking place on any day, other than when such day falls on a Bank Holiday, during the restricted period except upon the payment of the sum of money for the period of parking that is required by the motorist and referred to in paragraph (4) of this Article.

- (2) The amount of parking time purchased and the payment required for that period described in paragraph (1) of this Article are hereinafter called respectively the "parking period" and the "parking charge".
- (3) Subject to Articles 96 and 97 of this Order, the maximum length of time for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place during the restricted period on payment of the parking charge, shall be as indicated, in relation to that parking place, in Column 7 of Schedule 10.01 to 10.12 to this Order.
- (4) (a) The parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place during the restricted period shall be the amount in relation to that parking place, and be dependent upon the parking period required by the motorist, provided that it is compliant with that specified in Column 8 of Schedule 10.01 to 10.12 to this Order.
  - (b) The parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place or parking bay or parking during the restricted period shall be as appropriate for the period required at that parking place or parking bay provided that the parking period(s) purchased shall not exceed the maximum period of waiting specified for that parking place or parking bay.
- (1) The parking charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in a parking place by the insertion in the parking meter relating to the parking place or parking bay in which the vehicle is left, of a coin, or coins of the denomination indicated on the parking meter or pre-paid parking card. The Parking meter will dispense a ticket that must be displayed in accordance with the provisions of this order.
  - (2) No person shall display on a vehicle left in a parking place during the restricted period, any ticket issued by a ticket parking meter relating to that parking place other than the ticket issued by such ticket parking meter upon payment of the parking charge in respect of that vehicle until the expiration of the restricted period.
  - (3) No person with intent to deceive shall, use or lend to, or allow to be used by any other person, any ticket issued by a ticket parking meter to them following their payment of the parking charge in respect of the vehicle.
  - (4) Save as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of Article 97 of this Order no vehicle which has been taken away from a parking bay in a parking place after the parking charge has been incurred shall, until the expiration of the period of prohibited return indicated in Column 7 of Schedule 10.01 to 10.12 in relation to that parking place, again be left in that parking place during the restricted period.

### Parking Meter tickets

- 90 (1) There shall be a parking meter installed on or in the vicinity of each parking place.
  - (2) The parking charge for the parking period for a vehicle left in a parking place at which a parking meter with clock is installed shall be indicated by the issue of a numbered ticket showing the date and time at which the parking period was

purchased, the time it expires and details of the parking charge made and showing such details shall be conclusive evidence of those facts for the purpose of this Order.

- (3) Upon payment of the parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place at which a parking meter with a clock is installed, the driver thereof shall exhibit on the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article, a ticket issued by the parking meter relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article.
- (4) The ticket referred to in paragraph (3) of this Article shall be so exhibited on the inside of and immediately behind the front windscreen of the vehicle so that the time and date of issue shown on the front of the said ticket is clearly visible.
- (5) Where a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the ticket from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
- (6) If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place during the restricted period no ticket is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article, it shall be assumed unless the contrary is proved that the payment has not been duly paid.

## Manner of Standing in Parking Places

Every vehicle left in a parking place during the restricted period shall so stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.

### Removal of Vehicles from Parking Places

A civil enforcement officer or Police Officer in uniform may in case of emergency move or cause to be moved vehicles left in a parking place to any place he thinks fit.

### Power to Suspend Use of Parking Places

- 93 (1) The Council's Parking Services may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water of electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003, traffic sign or parking meter;
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or

- dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository:
- (d) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.
- (e) On any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed.
- (2) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article shall thereupon:-
  - (a) place or cause to be placed over the parking meter relating to the parking place or parking bay hoods or other covers indicating that the use of the parking place or parking bay is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited; and
  - (b) place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to any part of that parking place which is not a parking bay and use of which is suspended a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (3) On any suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, any person duly authorised by the Council may temporarily remove any parking meter relating to any parking place or parking bay, as the case may be, that part thereof and any post, bracket or other support on which that parking meter is fitted and shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or parking bay a traffic sign giving the indication referred to in paragraph (2) (b) of this Article.
- (4) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article if the use of a parking place is suspended or any part thereof during the restricted period for any purposes in paragraph (1) of this Article except in paragraph (1)(a) of this Article a charge of 24 times the hourly rate shall be payable for each parking bay suspended in respect of each day or part day thereof during which use of the parking place or part thereof is suspended.
- (5) Subject to the proviso contained herein no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a parking place during such period as there is a cover notice or traffic sign within the parking place placed in pursuance of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Article.

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply to:-

- (i) any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, police or local authority purposes or for any purpose specified in Article 96(1)(a)(iv):
- (ii) any other vehicle if that vehicle is so left with the permission of the person who authorised suspension of use of the parking place or part thereof in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article, or a civil enforcement officer in uniform.

- 94 (a) The driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place when for preventing obstruction of the street the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking space and have exhibited notices of such closing on or near the parking place.
  - (b) The driver of the vehicle using the parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.

# Restriction of Use of Parking Places

- (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this Article no person shall use any vehicle while it is in a parking place during the restricted period in connection with the sale or offering for the sale of any goods or of his services in any capacity in or near the parking place, or carry out or permit the carrying out of any work of construction, cleaning, maintenance or repair except such as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved from the parking place.
  - (2) A person shall not be prevented under the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article from selling goods from a vehicle
    - (a) if the vehicle is of a type described in paragraph (2) of Article 87 and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected; or
    - (b) the vehicle is one to which provisions (viii) of paragraph (1)(a) of Article 96 or paragraph (1)(b) of Article 96 applies.

### Use of Parking Places during the Restricted Period without Payment

- 96 (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order relating to vehicles which are left in a parking place in accordance with those provisions any other vehicle may wait during the restricted period:-
  - (a) anywhere in a parking place if:
    - (i) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
    - (ii) the vehicle is waiting due to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
    - (iii) the vehicle is used for police, fire brigade, or ambulance purposes or a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of a local authority which is being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
    - (iv) the vehicle is waiting for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic:

- (v) the vehicle is in the service of a Universal Service Provider, and is being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000.
- (vi) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in paragraph (1)(b) of Article 93.
- (vii) The vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is in actual use in connection with the removal or delivery of furniture to any premises situate in a parking place provided that notice is given 24 hours in advance to the Council's Parking Services and their consent obtained.
- (viii) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and does not wait for more than 30 minutes or such other period as a civil enforcement officer in uniform may authorise provided always that a police constable in uniform or a PCSO may at any time require the driver of a vehicle to move it if it is reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.
- (b) anywhere in a parking place other than in a parking bay if goods are sold from the vehicle be a person who is licensed by the Council to sell goods from a stationary pitch situated in the parking place.
- (2) No charge specified in the foregoing provisions of Articles 87 to 95 of this Order shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Article.
- (3) Nothing in the provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any Regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Act of 1984.

### Exemptions from Charges

- 97 (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place or bay during the restricted period on which there is on the parking meter relating to that place or bay or in or adjacent to that place or bay a notice placed by any person authorised by the Council indicating that the meter is out of order, the vehicle will be exempt from the parking charge provided that -
  - (a) after the meter is repaired the vehicle is removed within a period not being longer than the maximum parking period relating to the appropriate parking place, and that
  - ((b) if the vehicle is not removed within that period the parking charge shall be treated as having been incurred and paid.

- (2) Any disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge issued by a local authority or any vehicle which displays a valid permit, for that parking place, issued by the Council shall if left in a parking place or parking bay during the restricted period be exempt from the payment of any charge or compliance with any time limit or prohibited return period in relation to the leaving of any vehicle in that parking place or bay prescribed in the foregoing provisions of this Order.
- (3) A motorcycle if left in a parking place or parking bay during the restricted period shall be exempt from the payment of any charge or compliance with any time limit or prohibited return period in relation to the leaving of any vehicle in that parking place or bay prescribed by the foregoing provisions of this Order.
- (4) A vehicle, which is left in a parking place in according with the provisions of this Article, shall stand in accordance with the provisions of Article 91 of this Order.

## <u>Installation of Parking Meters</u>

- 98 The Council may -
  - (a) provide parking meters or such other ticket machines or apparatus as may be required by this Order for the purposes of that parking place; and
  - (b) carry out such other work as is authorised by this Order or is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

### PART 6

# OTHER PARKING PLACES (Schedules 12.01 to 12.08, 13.01, 14.01 to 14.12 and 16.01 to 16.09)

### Contraventions

- 99 (1) The lengths of road specified in Schedules 12.01 to 12.08, 13.01, 14.01 to 14.12 and 16.01 to 16.09 to this Order are authorised to be used as parking places for such classes of vehicles, for such purposes, in such positions, on such hours, on such days as are specified in the said schedules.
  - (2) Where in Schedules 12.01 to 12.08, 13.01, 14.01 to 14.12, 16.01 and 16.03 to 16.09 to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the specified class or in a position other than that specified.
  - (3) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place described in Schedule 14.01 to 14.12 unless it is engaged in loading and unloading goods.

- (4) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait or stop in a parking place specified in Schedule 16.02 unless the vehicle is a police vehicle.
- (5) The number and situation of parking bays in each parking place shall be determined by the Council and the limits of each parking place shall be indicated by the Council on the carriageway and by appropriate traffic signs.

# **Exemptions**

- 100 (1) Notwithstanding Article 99 of this Order, any vehicle may wait in a parking place for so long as may be necessary if:-
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle:
  - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid accident or is required by law to stop;
  - (c) the vehicle is a vehicle used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or a vehicle in the service of a local authority which is being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (d) the vehicle is waiting to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of an obstruction to traffic:
  - (e) the vehicle is waiting to enable to be used for the purpose of any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any mains pipes or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003, or traffic sign;
  - (f) the vehicle is in the service of a Universal Service Provider and is being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000:
  - (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal or delivery of furniture to any premises situate in a parking place provided that notice is given 24 hours in advance to the Council's Parking Services and their consent obtained;
  - (h) the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or of loading or unloading the vehicle at or from premises adjacent to the parking place and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than 30 minutes or such other period as a civil enforcement officer in uniform may authorise provided always that a police constable in uniform or a PCSO may at any time require the driver of a vehicle to move it if it is reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.

(2) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Act of 1984.

### **Suspensions**

- 101 (1) The Council's Parking Services may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the convenience of the occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from the premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions;
  - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road containing a parking place may be thronged or obstructed; or
  - (e) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Section 405 of the Communications Act 2003 or of any traffic sign or lighting column.
  - (2) Parking Services upon the suspension of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article shall thereupon or as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or the part thereof the use of which is suspended a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
  - (3) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any parking place or part of a parking place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or part of a parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (2) of this Article PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply to any vehicle being used for any purpose specified in Article 100 (c) or (d) of this Order left in the parking place or part of a parking place during any such period, or to any other vehicle so left if that vehicle was left with the permission (a) of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this article or (b) a civil enforcement officer in uniform.

### **Other Conditions**

- (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road or the use of the road by other persons or
- (b) so as to be a nuisance or
- (c) when for preventing obstruction of the street the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking space and have exhibited notices of such closing on or near the parking place.
- The driver of the vehicle using the parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- Save as provided in sub paragraph (i) and (ii) of this paragraph, no person shall use the vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near that road or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
  - (I) If the vehicle is of a type described in Article 99(1) and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is affected: or
  - (ii) the vehicle is one to which provision of Article 100(1)(h) applies
- A civil enforcement officer in uniform or a police constable in uniform may in any case of emergency move or cause to be moved any vehicle left in a parking place to any place he thinks fit.

# PART 7 SCHOOL ENTRANCE CLEARWAY (Schedule 15.01 and 15.02)

106 In this part of the Order, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, that is to say:-

"prohibited area", means any area of a specified road which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1027.1 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"specified hours" means the hours between and on;

"specified road" means any road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

- Save as provided in Article 108 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during the specified hours in a prohibited area within the roads or part lengths of roads specified in Schedules 15.01 and 15.02 to this Order.
- Nothing in Article 107 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a prohibited area -

- (a) if the vehicle is being used for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (b) if the vehicle is being used in the service of the Council in exercise of statutory powers or duties and whilst being so used in such service it is necessary for the vehicle to wait in that prohibited area;
- (c) in any case where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop, or is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident, or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside their control;
- (d) if the vehicle is being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.
- The Council are satisfied that, for facilitating the passage of vehicular traffic on the specified roads, it is requisite that section 3(1) of the Act of 1984 should not apply in relation to this part of the Order.
- In so far as any provision of this part of the Order conflicts with a provision which is contained in an Order existing at the time when this Order comes into operation and which imposes a restriction or prohibition on waiting by vehicles or grants an exemption from such restriction or prohibition, the provision of this Order shall prevail.

# PART 8 REVOCATION OF EXISTING ORDERS

111 The Order or Orders specified in Column 1 of the Schedule of Revocations to this Order are hereby revoked to the extent specified in relation thereto in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

## PART 9 GENERAL

- The prohibitions or restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any Regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
- For the avoidance of doubt any reference in this Order to a length of road shall be deemed to be a reference to more than one length of road where the context requires it.
- Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall restrict a Police Constable in Uniform from performing his duties if an emergency situation arises.
- 115 This Order shall come into operation on the 31 March 2008 and may be cited as "The Borough Council of Calderdale (Sowerby Bridge) Consolidation Order 2008".
