**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (WHITSTABLE)
(TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES)
(AMENDMENT NO 2) ORDER 2011**

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL has made the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The effect of the Order is to further amend the Kent County Council (Whitstable) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) Order 2010 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Whitstable.

610	Herne Bay Road	New double yellow lines, junctions with Burnan Road and Kemp Road.
615	Swalecliffe Road	New double yellow lines at the junction with Southwood Road.
625	Northwood Road & Queen's Road	New double yellow lines at the junctions with Wynn Road, Manor Road, Graystone Road & Baddlesmere Road
640	Westmeads area	New double yellow lines at road junctions in Westgate Terrace, Station Road, Westmeads Road
677	Clifton Road & Portway	New double yellow lines at the junction of the two roads.
685	Vale Road	New double yellow lines at the junction with St James Gardens
695	Forge Lane	New double yellow lines at the junction with Essex Street.
697	St Andrews Close	Change single yellow lines to double yellow lines at the junction with Sydney Road & Saddleton Road.
710	Gordon Road	New double yellow lines at the junction with Windmill Road
720	Borstal Hill	New double yellow lines opposite the Fire Station.
730	Joy Lane	New double yellow lines at Valkyrie Avenue
999W	Various	New disabled persons' parking bays in Long Rock , Swalecliffe Court Drive and Belton Close.
W1	Railway Avenue	On the southern side. New residents' parking / one hour parking bays in Railway Avenue.

The order was made on 31st May and comes into force on 1st July. Full details are contained in the Order which, together with a statement of the Council's reasons for making the order, the relevant maps and a copy of any orders amended by the order may be examined at the Canterbury City Council Offices, Military Road, Canterbury, during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that any requirement of any such enabling Act or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with may within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made make application to the High Court for this purpose.
