# THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL <br> (HERNE BAY) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2011 

The Kent County Council, in exercise of their powers under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

PART A

## GENERAL

## CITATION, COMMENCEMENT and REVOCATIONS

1 (1) This Order be cited as the Kent County Council (Herne Bay) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2011 and shall come into force on $18^{\text {th }}$ November, 2011.
(2) The Orders set out in the first column of the Table shall be modified or revoked to the extent specified in the second column of the Table

## INTERPRETATION

2 (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
"24 hour period" means from midnight on one day to midnight on the following day.
"the Act of 1984" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
"the Council" means the Kent County Council;
"buses" has the same meaning as in Regulation 22(2) of the Traffic signs Regulations and General directions, 2002, and "bus" shall be construed accordingly;
"Business Parking Permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Part K of this Order and "business permit holder" means a person to whom such a permit has been issued;
"caravan" has the same meaning as in Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act 1960, s 29(1) namely "any structure designed or adapted for human habitation which is
capable of being moved from one place to another (whether being towed, or by being transported on a motor vehicle or trailer) and any motor vehicle so designed or adapted, but does not include (a) any railway rolling stock which is for the time on rails forming part of a railway system: or (b) a tent."
"chargeable hours" means between the hours and on the days specified in an item in the fifth column of the Table to Article 58 appropriate to the parking place described in the Schedule mentioned in the corresponding item in the second column of that Table;
"charged parking place" means a parking place referred to in the Ninth Schedule to this Order;
"delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods include checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;
"disabled person" and "disabled person's badge" have the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended)
"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge and which is a vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 to be included in an Order under the Act of 1984, has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case may be, has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers;
"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;
"goods" includes postal packets of any description;
"goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description or a trailer so constructed or adapted;
"hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 and The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976;
"invalid carriage" means a mechanically propelled vehicle of which the weight unladen does not exceed 254 kilograms and which is specially designed and constructed, and not merely adapted, for the use of a person suffering from some physical default or disability and is used solely by such a person;
"junction" means the junction of the respective kerb lines of the roads referred to and, where appropriate, measurements shall be taken from the point of intersection of the respective kerb lines as projected;
"legally qualified medical practitioner" has the same meaning as in section 52 of the Medical Act 1956;
"licensed taxi" has the same meaning as in section 13 (3) (a) of the Transport Act 1985;
"local bus" means a public service vehicle used for the provision of a local service not being an excursion or tour;
"local service" has the meaning given in section 2 of the Transport Act 1985;
"Market Trader's Permit" means a permit for the parking of Market Traders' vehicles specified in Part K to this Order.
"medical practitioner" has the same meaning as "legally qualified medical practitioner";
"motor cycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an invalid carriage) with fewer than 4 wheels, of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms;
"owner", in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;
"parking attendant" has the same meaning as in section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and by virtue of Section 76 Traffic Management Act 2004 a parking attendant appointed under section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 is a civil enforcement officer in relation to parking contravention;
"parking charge" has the meaning assigned to it by section 46(1) of the Act of 1984; "parking disc" means a device which-
(a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue, if issued on or after 1st April 2000 or orange, if issued before that date;
(b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
(c) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun.
"parking period" for a vehicle left in a charged parking place shall be determined by reference to the relevant Table to Article 58;
"parking permit" means
(a) a Residents' Parking Permit; or
(b) a Business User Permit;
(c) a Market Traders Permit.
"parking place" means an area on a highway designated or authorised and described as a parking place by any of the various Articles or Schedules of this Order;
"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;
"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver, and not drawing a trailer;
"relevant position" means:-
1 - In the case of a Disabled Person's Badge -
(a) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if it is displayed in the manner described in Regulation 12 of the Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended)
(b) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
(ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

2 - In the case of any other badge or permit -
A vehicle displays any other badge or permit in the relevant position if:-
(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the item is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen;
(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the item is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.

3 - In the case of a parking ticket -
A vehicle displays a parking ticket in the relevant position if the item is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.
"resident" means a person that has permanent occupation or continual occupation for a considerable time in relation to a property, that property being the persons settled or usual abode and the postal address of which is in a street or part of a street described in the Fourth Schedule to this Order
"Residents' Parking Permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Part K of this Order and "residents' permit holder" means a person to or for whom such permit has been issued;
"road" means the full width - including any footway or verge - of any length of highway or of any other road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which a road passes;
"restricted road" means any of the roads, lengths of road or sides of road specified in the First or Second Schedules to this Order:-

PROVIDED ALWAYS that the expression "restricted road" shall not for the purposes of this Order include any designated parking place or any authorised parking place described in the various Schedules to this Order and not suspended under the provisions of Article 50;
"ticket machine" means apparatus designed eitherc
(i) to indicate whether any charge has been paid and whether the period for which it has been paid or any further period has elapsed, or
(ii) to indicate the time and to issue tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the period in respect of which it has been paid;
"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under, section 64 of the Act of 1984;
"vehicle" means a motor vehicle or a trailer and "motor vehicle" and "trailer" have the same meaning as in section 136 of the Act of 1984;
"vehicle of the permitted class" means a motor car, a motor cycle or an invalid carriage and " motor car", " motor cycle" and "invalid carriage" have the same meaning as in section 136 of the Act of 1984;
"Visitors' Parking Permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Part L of this Order and "visitors' permit holder" means a person to or for whom such permit has been issued;
"Zone" means Parking Zone as defined under the provisions of Article 64.
(2) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires:-
(a) any reference to a numbered Article or a numbered Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order;
(b) any reference to a numbered or lettered paragraph or sub-paragraph is a reference to the paragraph or sub-paragraph bearing that number or letter in the Article or Schedule or (in the case of a sub-paragraph) paragraph in which the reference occurs; and
(c) any reference to a Table, or to a numbered Table, is a reference to the Table, or to the Table bearing that number, in the Article or Schedule in which that reference occurs.
(3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment;
(4) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made under or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 or by or under any other enactment;
(5) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.


#### Abstract

PART B

Prohibitions and Restrictions on the waiting of vehicles or the loading or unloading of vehicles


## NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

3 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any restricted road specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

## NO WAITING 8.30AM - 6.00PM MONDAY - SATURDAY

4 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of $8.30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and $6.00 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on Mondays to Saturdays, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday being a public holiday, in any restricted road specified in Part 1 of the Second Schedule to this Order.

## NO WAITING 11.00 AM - 12 NOON MONDAY-FRIDAY

5 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 11.00 a.m. and 12 noon on Mondays to Fridays, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday being a public holiday, in any restricted road specified in Part 2 of the Second Schedule to this Order.

## NO WAITING 8.30 AM - 9.30AM AND 2.30PM - 3.30PM MONDAY-FRIDAY

6 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.30 am and 9.30 am or between 2.30 pm and 3.30 pm on Mondays to Fridays, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday being a public holiday, in any restricted road specified in Part 3 of the Second Schedule to this Order.

## NO WAITING MIDNIGHT - 8.30AM and 6.00PM - MIDNIGHT (Heavy goods vehicles).

7 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any goods vehicle the gross weight of which exceeds 5 tonnes to wait between the hours of midnight and 8.30am or between the hours of 6.00pm and Midnight on any day any restricted road specified in the Table.

## PROHIBITION ON LOADING AND UNLOADING

8 (1) Nothing in Article 45 (Exemption for loading and unloading of goods) shall apply so as to render it lawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait for the purposes of loading or unloading in any of the lengths of restricted road described in columns 2 and 3 of an item in the Table at the times specified in the corresponding column 4.

## PART C

## Prohibition of Stopping on entrance markings.

## PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON ENTRANCE MARKINGS

9 (1) Save as provided in Article 11 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or remain at rest during the specified hours on a school entrance marking
(2) Save as provided in Article 11 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or remain at rest at any time on an entrance marking used outside a fire, police or ambulance station, or a hospital, as specified in Part B of the Tenth Schedule.

10 Except as otherwise provided in Article 11 of this Order, if any provision of Article 9 of this Order conflicts with a provision of any other Article in this Order which grants an exemption from the provision, the provision of Article 8 shall apply.

11 Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on an entrance marking -
(a) if the vehicle is being used for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
(b) to enable the vehicle to be used for any of the following purposes and whilst being so used it is necessary for the vehicle to wait on the school entrance marking -
(i) in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
(ii) for the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, of any of the said lengths of road; or
(iii) for the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the said lengths or sides of road of any sewer or any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications.
(c) in any case where the person in control of the vehicle
(i) is required by law to stop;
(ii) is obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident;
(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.
(iv) causes the vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

## INTERPRETATION

12 In Article 9 (1) of the Order,
"specified hours" means between 8.00am 5.00 on Mondays to Fridays during school term time;
"school term time" means those days of the year which have been determined as school days by the Kent County Council, the Education Authority, in accordance with section 21 of the Education (No. 2) Act 1986;
"school day" has the same meaning as in section 65 of the Education (No. 2) Act 1986.
"school entrance marking" means an area of carriageway of a specified road outside a school which is comprised within the road marking prescribed in Diagram 1027.1 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002, and indicated by the sign prescribed in diagram 642.2A in Schedule 2 of those Regulations.
"specified road" means any road or length of road or side of road specified in Part 1 of the Seventh Schedule.

In Article 9 (2) of the Order,
"entrance marking" means an area of carriageway of a specified road outside a fire, police or ambulance station, or a hospital, which is comprised within the permitted variant road marking prescribed in Diagram 1027.1 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002, and indicated by the sign prescribed in diagram 642.2A in Schedule 2 of those Regulations.
"specified road" means any road or length of road or side of road specified in Part 2 of the Seventh Schedule.

## PART D

## Prohibition of Stopping on Taxi Ranks

## PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON TAXI RANKS

13 Save as provided in Article 13 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle other than a taxi to stop or remain at rest during the period indicated on a taxi rank.

14 Except as otherwise provided in Article 13 of this Order, if any provision of Article 12 of this Order conflicts with a provision of any other Article in this Order which grants an exemption from the provision, the provision of Article 12 shall apply.

15 Nothing in Article 13 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on a taxi rank -
(a) if the vehicle is being used for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
(b) to enable the vehicle to be used for any of the following purposes and whilst being so used it is necessary for the vehicle to wait on the taxi rank -
(i) in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
(ii) for the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, of any of the said lengths of road; or
(iii) for the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the said lengths or sides of road of any sewer or any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications.
(c) in any case where the person in control of the vehicle
(i) is required by law to stop;
(ii) is obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident;
(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.
(iv) causes the vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

PART D
TAXI RANKS

## INTERPRETATION

16 In this Part of the Order,
"period indicated" means between the times indicated on the sign to Diagram 650.1 of the Traffic Signs Directions and General Regulations placed in conjunction with the taxi rank road marking;
"taxi rank" means any road or length of road or side of road appointed as a stand for hackney carriages by Canterbury City Council in local legislation made under section 63 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, and described in the Table.
"taxi rank road marking" means an area of carriageway of a specified road which is comprised within the road marking prescribed in Diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

# PART E <br> Designation and Use of Parking Places 

## DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES

17 Each area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway described in the Fourth, Fifth and Ninth Schedules to this Order and, unless otherwise so described, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.0 metres, is designated as a parking place at all times.

18 The limits of each parking place and the limits of any parking space shall be indicated by a road marking appropriate to the position in which a vehicle may park.

19 Nothing in Article17 of this Order shall restrict the power of a police constable or of the Council to suspend any parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 50.

## PARKING PLACES WITH TICKET MACHINES

20 (1) Save as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during the chargeable hours in a charged parking place unless it is a vehicle of the permitted class and unless the parking charge has been paid.

PROVIDED ALWAYS payment of the parking charge shall be indicated by the vehicle displaying in the relevant position a parking ticket issued by the ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle has been left.
(2) SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during the chargeable hours in a charged parking place for longer than the parking period paid for on payment of the parking charge.
(3) No vehicle which has been taken away from a parking space in a charged parking place during the chargeable hours after a parking charge has been incurred, shall until the expiration of four hours from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the chargeable hours.
(4) Nothing in this article shall apply in respect of
(a) any vehicle which is waiting in a charged parking place in accordance with Part G of this Order; or
(b) a vehicle which is displaying in the relevant position
(i) a valid Parking Permit issued, or
(ii) a valid Visitors' Parking Permit validated
in respect of that vehicle for the Zone in which that Parking Place is situated.

## RESIDENTS' EXCLUSIVE PARKING PLACES

21 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle which is not displaying in the relevant position a valid Parking Permit for the Zone in which that Parking Place is situated to wait at any time in any of the parking places specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

RESIDENTS' SHARED PARKING PLACES - PARKING PERIOD 4 HOURS
22 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle, other than a vehicle which is displaying in the relevant position
(i) a valid Parking Permit issued, or
(ii) a valid Visitors' Parking Permit validated
in respect of that vehicle for the Zone in which that Parking Place is situated, to wait between the hours of 8.30 am and 6.00 pm on all days from 1st October to 31st March, in any of the parking places described in the Ninth Schedule to this Order:-
(i) for a longer period than four hours, or
(ii) if a period of less than four hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in any of the parking places specified in the Ninth Schedule.

## RESIDENTS' SHARED PARKING PLACES - PARKING PERIOD 1 HOUR

23 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle, other than a vehicle which is displaying in the relevant position
(i) a valid Parking Permit issued, or
(ii) a valid Visitors' Parking Permit validated
in respect of that vehicle for the Zone in which that Parking Place is situated, to wait between the hours of $8.30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and $6.00 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on Mondays to Saturdays, in any of the parking places described in the Fifth Schedule to this Order:-
(i) for a longer period than one hour, or
(ii) if a period of less than one hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in any of the parking places specified in the Fifth Schedule in that length of road.

PART E
DESIGNATED PARKING PLACES

## CONDUCT OF PARKING PLACES

24 PROVIDED ALWAYS that the provisions of Part H of this Order shall apply to any designated parking place and, in the event of any contravention of, or non-compliance with, a provision of Part H of this Order, the person responsible shall be guilty of an offence.

## ADMINISTRATION OF PARKING SCHEMES

25 (1) The administration of any Residents' Permit Parking Scheme shall be in accordance with the provisions of Part K of this Order.
(2) The administration of any Residents' Visitors' Permit Parking Scheme shall be in accordance with the provisions of Part $L$ of this Order.
(3) The administration of any Business Permit Parking Scheme shall be in accordance with the provisions of Part K of this Order.

## INTERPRETATION

26 In this part of the Order any reference to a prohibition of parking applies during each " 24 hour period"

## PART F

## Authorisation and Use of Parking Places

## AUTHORISATION OF PARKING PLACES

27 Each area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway described in the Sixth Schedule to this Order and, unless otherwise so described, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.0 metres, is authorised as a parking place.

28 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway described in the Table to Article 36 and, unless otherwise so described, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.7 metres, is authorised as a loading place for goods vehicles.

29 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway described in the Eighth Schedule to this Order and, unless otherwise so described, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.7 metres, is authorised as a parking place for disabled persons vehicles only.

30 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway described in the Table to Article 91 of this Order and, unless otherwise so described, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.0 metres, is authorised as a parking place for motor cycles only.

31 The limits of each parking place and the limits of any parking space shall be indicated by a road marking appropriate to the position in which a vehicle may park.

32 Nothing in Articles 27 to 30 of this Order shall restrict the power of a police constable or of the Council to suspend any parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 50 of this Order.

## USE OF AUTHORISED PARKING PLACES

## Parking places limited to 1 hour waiting time (waiting limit applies between 8.30am and 6.00 pm on Mondays to Saturdays)

33 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and $6.00 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on Mondays to Saturdays, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday being a public holiday, in any of the parking places specified in Part 1 of the Sixth Schedule to this Order
(i) for a longer period than 1 hour, or
(ii) if a period of less than 1 hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in that length of road.

## Parking places limited to 3 hours waiting time (waiting limit applies between 8.30am and 6.00 pm on Mondays to Saturdays)

34 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of $8.30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and $6.00 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on Mondays to Saturdays, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday being a public holiday, in any of the parking places specified in Part 2 of the Sixth Schedule to this Order
(i) for a longer period than 3 hours, or
(ii) if a period of less than 3 hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in that length of road.

## Parking places with no limit on waiting time

35 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle other than a vehicle of the permitted class to wait in any of the parking places described in Part 3 of the Sixth Schedule.

## Use of Goods Vehicle Loading Places

36 SAVE as provided in Article 47 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.30am and 6.00pm on Mondays to Saturdays, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday being a public holiday, in any of the parking places specified in the Table to Article 36 unless it is a goods vehicle and loading or unloading is taking place.

## USE OF MOTOR CYCLE PARKING PLACES

40 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the parking places specified in the Table to Article 91 of this Order unless it is a motor cycle.

## USE OF DISABLED PERSONS VEHICLE PARKING PLACES

41 SAVE as provided in Part G of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the parking places specified in the Eighth Schedule to this Order unless it is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge.

## CONDUCT OF PARKING PLACES

42 PROVIDED ALWAYS that the provisions of Part H of this Order shall apply to any authorised parking place and, in the event of any contravention of, or non-compliance with, a provision of Part H of this Order, the person responsible shall be guilty of an offence.

## PART G

## Exemptions from prohibitions and restrictions

## EXEMPTION FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES

43 Nothing in this Order shall apply to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.

## EXEMPTION FOR H M COASTGUARD

44 Nothing in Articles 3 or 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle used by HM Coastguard to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in an item in column 4 of the Table on the side of the road specified in that item in column 3 in the road named in the corresponding item in column 2.

## EXEMPTION FOR LOADING AND UNLOADING OF GOODS

45 (1) Nothing in Parts B, E or F of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any restricted road or in any parking place for so long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle.
(2) Notwithstanding anything paragraph (1) of this Article the driver of a vehicle waiting for the purposes of delivering or collecting goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle shall move the vehicle on the instruction of a police constable in
uniform whenever such moving may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.

## EXEMPTION FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES

46 Nothing in Part B of this Order shall apply to a licensed taxi, whilst plying for hire upon a duly authorised cab rank appointed by the Canterbury City Council in accordance with the provisions of section 63(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 or any modification or re-enactment of the same for the time being in force and standing wholly within the limits of the marking prescribed in diagram 1028.2 of Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

## GENERAL EXEMPTION FROM PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

47 Nothing in Parts B, E, or in Articles 33 or 34 of Part F, of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any restricted road, or in any part of a parking place if the use of that parking place has not been suspended, for so long as may be necessary -
(a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or to unload therefrom personal luggage;
(b) to enable a medical practitioner, or to enable a Midwife, a District Nurse or a Health Visitor registered under the Nurses, Midwives and Health Visitors Act 1979, to make a house call on a patient;
(c) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
(d) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
(i) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
(ii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, of any of the said lengths of road; or
(iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the said lengths or sides of road of any sewer or any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications.
(e) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
(f) to enable the vehicle to be used for a purpose authorised and described on a permit issued by the Council provided such permit is displayed on the vehicle in the appropriate position.
$(\mathrm{g})$ to enable the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
(h) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of road.
(i) to enable the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths or sides of road for so long as waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
(j) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being required by law to stop; or being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or in order to avoid an accident.

## DISABLED PERSONS' VEHICLES

48 Nothing in Articles 3 to 6 of Part B of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the roads, lengths of road or sides of road referred to in any of the said Articles 3 or 5 for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle that length of road).

49 Nothing in Part E of this Order, or in Articles 33 or 34 of Part F of this Order, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons' vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons' badge to wait without limit of time in any of the parking places referred to in the said Part E, or Articles 33 or 34 of Part F.

## PART H

## Conduct of Parking Places

## SUSPENSION OF PARKING PLACES

50 (1) The Council may, by Notice or by Order, suspend the use of any parking place or any part thereof
(a) if it is satisfied that use of that parking place should be restricted or prohibited by reason that works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the road, or by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the highway, or
(b) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety; or
(c) for preventing obstruction of the streets on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed.
subject to such conditions or exceptions as they consider necessary.
(2) A constable, or a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the chief officer of police, may suspend for no longer than seven days the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary -
(a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety; or
(b) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling-house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository; or
(c) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
(d) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that the Council or the police constable in uniform in suspending the use of a parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Article shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or the part thereof the use of which is suspended such traffic signs as are necessary to indicate that waiting by vehicles is prohibited. may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof for not more than seven days in order to prevent or mitigate congestion or obstruction of traffic, or danger to or from traffic, in consequence of extraordinary circumstances.

PROVIDED ALSO that any person suspending the use of a parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Article shall place or cause to be placed in or
adjacent to that parking place or the part thereof the use of which is suspended such traffic signs as are necessary to indicate that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.

## MISCELLANEOUS CONDITIONS

51 A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place
(a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining a road or the use of a road by other persons or so as to be a nuisance;
(b) when such parking place has been closed in accordance with the provisions of the preceding Article of this Order.

52 A driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.

53 No person shall
(a) sell, offer or exhibit for sale or hire any vehicle while it is in a parking place, or
(b) use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skills in handicraft or services in any capacity.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that this Article shall not be deemed to prohibit persons employed in connection with a licensed public service vehicle or a licensed taxi operation from plying for hire or accepting passengers for hire in accordance with any regulation or condition under which the service is required by law to operate.

54 While it is in a parking place no vehicle shall receive any work of construction, cleaning, maintenance or repair except such as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved from the parking place.

## MOVEMENT AND REMOVAL OF VEHICLES

55 (1) When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of or non-compliance with any of the provisions of this Order a police constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place.
(2) In case of an emergency a police constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter the position of that vehicle in the parking place; or remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place to any place he thinks fit.

56 Any person altering the position of a vehicle in, or removing a vehicle from, a parking place by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.

## SAFE CUSTODY OF VEHICLES REMOVED FROM PARKING PLACES

57 When a police constable or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 55 of this Order he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle

## PART J

## Parking Charges and Method of Payment

## PARKING CHARGES

58 (1) The parking charge and the parking period for a vehicle left in a designated parking place referred to in the Schedule or Part of the Schedule referred to in an item in the second column of the Table shall be determined by reference to the corresponding items in the third and fourth columns of the Table.

(2) No parking period for a designated parking place referred to in an item in the second column of the Table above shall exceed the maximum length of time mentioned in the corresponding item in the fourth column.

## TICKET MACHINES TO BE INSTALLED AT PARKING PLACES

59 (1) There shall be a ticket machine on or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in the Seventh Schedule to this Order.
(2) No parking charge shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a designated parking place during the chargeable hours if
(a) at the time the vehicle was left in that parking place there was a ticket machine relating to that parking place a notice placed by any person duly authorised by the Council indicating that the ticket machine relating to that parking place is out of order; and
(b) there is no other ticket machine available to be used for that parking place; and
(c) the vehicle is removed within two hours of the ticket machine being rectified.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that if any such vehicle is not removed within that period the parking charge shall be treated as having been incurred and paid at the time when the vehicle was left in the parking place and all the provisions of this Order shall apply accordingly.

## PAYMENT OF PARKING CHARGE

60 (1) The parking charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in a parking place referred to in the Ninth Schedule by the insertion in the ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left of coins to the value of the parking charge.
(2) Payment of the parking charge for any vehicle left during the chargeable hours in a parking place referred to in the Ninth Schedule shall be by the issue by the ticket machine relating to that parking place of a numbered parking ticket indicating the amount of parking charge which has been paid, and by the exhibition of that parking ticket on that vehicle in the relevant position.
(3) No parking charge shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a designated parking place during the chargeable hours in accordance with the provisions of Part G of this Order.

## INDICATION OF EXPIRY OF PARKING PERIOD

61 The expiry of the parking period for which the parking charge has been paid for a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in the Ninth Schedule shall be indicated when there is exhibited on the vehicle a parking ticket issued by the ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left showing the day and time of payment of the charge, and the time shown on the clock on the said ticket machine is more than the duration of the parking period later than the time shown on that parking ticket.

## INDICATIONS BY TICKET MACHINES AND PARKING TICKETS AS EVIDENCE

62 If at any time when a vehicle is left in a parking place during the permitted hours the clock on the ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left and on the parking ticket exhibited on the vehicle give the indication given in the preceding Article, it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the parking charge has been duty paid, and the parking period for which payment was made by the parking charge has already expired.

## INSERTION OF ADDITIONAL COINS

63 (1) No person shall insert in the ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left any coins additional to those inserted by way of payment of the parking charge in respect of that vehicle.
(2) No person shall display on any vehicle left in a parking place referred to in the Fourth Schedule during the chargeable hours any parking ticket subsequent to the parking ticket that was displayed at the time the vehicle was first left in the parking place unless the provisions of Article 20(3) have first been complied with.

# PART K <br> Provisions Relating to Parking Permits. 

## PARKING ZONES

64 (1) For the purposes of administering parking schemes the Council shall define by name and unique reference code such parking zones as are necessary.
(2) The names, unique reference codes and addresses of premises which comprise each parking zone shall be as detailed in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR RESIDENTS' PERMITS

65 Any resident who is the owner of a vehicle of the following class that is to say a passenger vehicle, a goods vehicle having a gross weight not exceeding 3500 kilograms, or a motor cycle with or without a sidecar may apply to the Council for the issue of a Residents' Parking Permit for the Zone in which that Resident lives and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the appropriate remittance.

## APPLICATIONS FOR RESIDENTS' PERMITS

66 On receipt of any application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this part of the Order and of the appropriate remittance the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of the class specified in the previous Article may issue to the applicant one Residents' Parking Permit for the leaving of the vehicle to which such Residents' Parking Permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward in a parking space in any parking place to which such Residents' Parking Permit relates.

## CHARGES FOR RESIDENTS' PERMITS

67 "appropriate remittance" means a remittance for the sum of: $£ 50.00$ for the twelve month period commencing on the first day of any month for a period of one year for a Permit which is valid for one or more of the designated parking places referred to in the Fourth, Fifth and Ninth Schedules to this Order.

PROVIDED ALSO that for any permit surrendered a sum equal to one quarter of the annual remittance shall be refunded for each quarter of that year which is remaining.

## NUMBERS OF RESIDENTS' PERMITS TO BE ISSUED

68 The Council shall not be required to issue for any zone a greater number of Residents' Parking Permits than the number of designated parking spaces available in that zone;

PROVIDED ALWAYS, however, that it shall be entirely within the Council's discretion in such circumstances whether or not additional Residents' Parking Permits beyond the number of designated parking spaces available may be issued.

## TRANSFER OR SURRENDER OF RESIDENTS' PERMITS

69 (1) A Residents' Parking Permit shall not be assigned or transferred to any person except as hereinafter provided but may be surrendered at any time to the Council and shall be surrendered in the event of the Resident ceasing to reside in any of the Streets in the Parking Zone for which the Residents' Parking Permit in question was issued.
(2) A Residents' Parking Permit shall be available for use only on the vehicle in respect of which it is issued but in the event of the permit holder disposing of such vehicle he shall be entitled to have the Parking Permit issued for the remainder of the twelve month period in respect of any substitute vehicle and the Council, upon being satisfied as to the change of vehicles shall upon shall upon payment of a fee of $£ 10$ and the surrender of the current permit issue a replacement permit and upon such issue the current permit shall become invalid.

## RESTRICTION ON NUMBER OF RESIDENTS' PERMITS TO BE HELD

70 No Resident or household shall be entitled to more than one Residents' Parking Permit.
PROVIDED ALWAYS that it shall be entirely within the Council's discretion to issue on an annual and non-renewable basis additional Residents' Parking Permits beyond the number referred to in this Article if it appears to the Council that all persons likely to require a Residents' Parking Permit have had sufficient opportunity of making application and that the total number of Residents' Parking Permits which may be issued for the parking zone in question has not been exceeded.

## LOST OR DESTROYED PERMIT

71 If a permit is lost or destroyed the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate and the Council, upon being satisfied as to the loss or destruction shall upon payment of a fee of $£ 10$ issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the permit which it duplicates shall become invalid.

## BUSINESS USER PARKING PERMITS

## BUSINESS USER PARKING ZONES

72 (1) For the purposes of administering a Business User permit scheme, the Zones shall be the same as for the Residents Parking Scheme.
(2) A Business User Parking Permits will only be valid in the Parking Zone in which the business, to which the permit has been allocated, is located.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR BUSINESS USER PARKING PERMITS

73 (1) Any business located in the Parking Zone, having commercial vehicles with a gross weight not exceeding 3500 kilograms, used solely for purposes associated with the business and having insufficient available off street parking either within the premises or nearby, may apply to the Council for 'Business User Parking Permit(s)', subject to compliance with the current 'Conditions of Use' of such permits. Such applications shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the appropriate remittance.
(2) A business users parking permit will not be issued for any vehicle which has any outstanding penalty charge notices issued against it.
(3) in this Part of the Order
"maximum gross weight" means -
(a) in the case of a motor vehicle not drawing a trailer or in the case of a trailer, its maximum laden weight;
(b) in the case of an articulated vehicle, its maximum laden weight (if it has one) and otherwise the aggregate maximum laden weight of all the individual vehicles forming part of that articulated vehicle; and
(c) in the case of a motor vehicle (other than an articulated vehicle) drawing one or more trailers, the aggregate maximum laden weight of the motor vehicle and the trailer or trailers drawn by it;
and
"maximum laden weight" has the same meaning as in The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions, 2002.

## APPLICATIONS FOR BUSINESS USER PARKING PERMITS

74 On receipt of any application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this part of the Order and of the appropriate remittance the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a business located within the Parking Zone, or is a person applying on behalf of and with the consent of such a business, and the vehicle(s) meets the conditions described above and all other details relating to eligibility, may issue to the applicant such Business User parking permit(s) for use only by the business to which such permit(s) has been allocated and for use only within Parking spaces within which the business is located.

## CHARGES FOR BUSINESS USER PARKING

75 "appropriate remittance" in relation to Business User Parking Permits means the sum of $£ 120$ for the twelve month period commencing on the first day of any month for a period of one year for a Permit which is valid for one or more of the designated parking places referred to in the Fourth, Fifth and Ninth Schedules to this Order.

PROVIDED ALSO that for any permit surrendered a sum equal to one quarter of the annual remittance shall be refunded for each quarter of that year which is remaining..

## TRANSFER OR SURRENDER OF BUSINESS USER PARKING PERMITS

76 (1) A Business User Parking Permit shall not be assigned or transferred to any person or business, but may be surrendered at any time to the Council and shall be surrendered in the event of the Business ceasing to be located within the Parking Zone to which such permit has been issued.
(2) A Business User Parking Permit shall be available for use only on the vehicle in respect of which it is issued but in the event of the Business disposing of such vehicle or of the vehicle ceasing to be used in connection with the Business he shall be entitled to have the Parking Permit issued for the remainder of the twelve month period in respect of any substitute vehicle and the Council, upon being satisfied as to the change of vehicles shall upon shall upon payment of a fee of $£ 10$ and the surrender of the current permit issue a replacement permit and upon such issue the current permit shall become invalid.

## LOST OR DESTROYED PERMIT

77 If a permit is lost or destroyed the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate and the Council, upon being satisfied as to the loss or destruction shall upon payment of a fee of $£ 10$ issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the permit which it duplicates shall become invalid.

## MARKET TRADERS PERMITS

## MARKET TRADERS PERMITS

78 Any Market Trader may apply to the Council for a Market Traders Permit for his vehicle. The application will be made on a form issued by the Council.

79 The Council will require the Market Trader to demonstrate that he is trading in Herne Bay Market and that the vehicle is essential for loading goods to or from his stall.

80 The permit will exempt the holder from the provisions of Part E provided that the vehicle is parked so as not to cause obstruction or danger to other road users.

81 The Council will be entitled to terminate all rights granted by the permit if there is any contravention of the provision of this Order

CHARGES FOR MARKET TRADERS PARKING PERMITS

82 "Appropriate remittance" in relation to Market Traders Parking Permits means the sum of $£ 32$ for the twelve month period commencing from the date of application. A permit may be issued for minimum period of 3 months up to a period of one year for a permit which is valid for one or more of the Designated Parking Places referred to in the Table.

PROVIDED ALSO that for any permit surrendered a sum equal to one quarter of the annual remittance shall be refunded for each quarter of that year which is remaining.

## VERIFICATION OF PARTICULARS

83 The Council may at any time require an applicant for a Parking Permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of that application as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them.

## TERMINATION OF RIGHTS

84 The Council shall be entitled to terminate all rights granted by the Parking Permit if at any time there is any contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order and in such circumstances the residents' permit holder shall not be entitled to any refund whatsoever of any amount paid in respect of such Parking Permit, Without Prejudice, however, to any other rights of the Council against the residents permit holder in respect of the breach of condition giving rise to the termination of the rights granted by that Parking Permit.

## LOST OR DESTROYED PERMIT

85 If a permit is lost or destroyed the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate and the Council, upon being satisfied as to the loss or destruction shall upon payment of a fee of $£ 10$ issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the permit which it duplicates shall become invalid.

## PART L

## VISITORS PARKING PERMITS

## VISITORS PARKING PERMITS

86 Any resident may apply to the Council for the issue of one or more books of Visitors' Parking Permits for a vehicle or vehicles of the classes described in Article 65 of this Order and belonging to a person or persons visiting that resident and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the appropriate remittance.

87 "appropriate remittance" means a remittance for the sum of $£ 1.60$ for each permit applied for.
88 On receipt of any application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this part of the Order and of the remittance specified the previous Article the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident shall issue to the applicant one or more Visitors' Parking Permits for the leaving of a vehicle belonging to or being used by a person visiting that resident in a parking space in any parking place in the Parking Zone to which such Visitors' Parking Permit relates.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that the Council may, at its absolute discretion limit the number of Visitors' Parking Permits that are issued at any one time in respect of a particular household and may require the production and surrender of used Visitors' Parking Permits before issuing a further permit or permits.

89 The Council may at any time require an applicant for a Visitors' Parking Permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of that application as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them.

90 A Visitors' Parking permit shall be valid on a particular day as if it were a Resident' Parking Permit issued by the Council pursuant to Part L of this Order and will remain valid until 10.30am on the day after the day on which the Visitors' Parking Permits were validated, provided that the permit has been inscribed with the registration mark of the vehicle and no other writing or remark.

## PART M

## Motor Cycle Parking Places

## AUTHORISATION OF MOTOR CYCLE PARKING PLACES

91 Each of the parts of road described in the Table is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for bicycles propelled by mechanical power and not having a sidecar attached thereto.

94 The provisions of Part H shall apply to Motor Cycle Parking Places.

(c) between points 3 metres east of a point opposite the common boundary of 38 \& 39 Central Parade and 8 metres east of the junction with William Street
(d) between a point 3 metres west of a point opposite the common boundary of 75 \& 76 Central Parade and a point opposite the common boundary of $84 \& 85$ Central Parade
(e) between a point opposite the common boundary of 86 \& 87 Central Parade and 1 metre east of a point opposite the common boundary of 93 \& 94 Central Parade
(f) from a point 12 metres west of the junction with Richmond Street tap 2 metres east of a point opposite the common boundary of 106 \& 107 Central Parade
(g) from a point 10 metres west of the junction with Dolphin Street to a point 6 metres east of a point opposite the common boundary of. 121 \& 122 Central Parade
(h) between points 13 metres and 37 metres east of the junction with Pier Avenue
(i) from a point 39 metres west of the junction with Pier Avenue to a point 53 metres east of a point in line with the western flank wall of 141 Central Parade
(j) between points 31 metres and 40 metres east a point in line with the western flank wall of 141 Central Parade
(k) between points 21 metres east and 35 metres west a point in line with the western flank wall of 141 Central Parade
(2) On the southern side
(a) from a point 7 metres west of a point in line with the common boundary of 8 Central Parade and 1-3 Saxon Place to 20 metres east of the junction with East Street.
(b) between points 2 metres west of the western boundary of. 24 Central Parade and the common boundary of 34/35 Central Parade
(c) between points 3 metres east of the common boundary of 38/39 Central Parade and 5 metres east of the western boundary of. 42 Central Parade
(d) from a point in line with the western boundary of 141 Central Parade for a distance of 75 metres in an easterly direction.
