

**THE CITY OF CARLISLE**  
**(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2001**

The Council of the City of Carlisle (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of powers contained in Sections 32 and 35 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers in that behalf and with the consent of the Cumbria County Council given under Section 39(3) of the Act of 1984 and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby made the following Order:-

1. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
  - 1.01 "Appropriate Manner" in relation to the display of prepaid tickets and permits means in such a position:-
    - (a) inside the vehicle and in such a manner that date and time symbols or permit details thereon are clearly visible from the front or side of the vehicle;
    - (b) attached to a trailer around a beam as close to the towing hitch as possible;
  - 1.02 "Caravan" means a trailer constructed to include living accommodation and equipment;
  - 1.03 "Commercial Vehicle" means any mechanically propelled vehicle which is constructed or adapted for the carriage of goods;
  - 1.04 "Contract Parking Permit" means a permit for the parking of a specified vehicle in a specified car park or car parks for a specified period in accordance with Schedule 2 improper use of which will render the same void.
  - 1.05 "Councillors Parking Permit" means a permit issued to an elected Councillor of the Council for the parking of a specified vehicle in a specified car park.
  - 1.06 "County Council Staff Parking Permit" means a permit issued by Cumbria County Council to staff employed by Cumbria County Council for the parking of a specified vehicle in a specified car park improper use of which will render the same void.
  - 1.07 "Current" in relation to a vehicle licence means valid on the Relevant Date;
  - 1.08 "Director of Environment and Development" means the officer employed in that post or any equivalent post by the Council;
  - 1.09 "Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000 or any amendment to or re-enactment of the same.

- 1.10 "Driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it entered the parking place;
- 1.11 "Golf Parking Permit" means a permit for the parking of a vehicle in the Swifts Bank Car Park issued to a user of the Swifts golf course and driving range.
- 1.12 "Hackney Carriage" means any hackney carriage for the time being licensed by the Council;
- 1.13 "Heavy Motor Car" means any vehicle as defined in Section 136(3) of the Act of 1984;
- 1.14 "Marked Bay" means a bay marked on the surface of a parking place within which a vehicle may park;
- 1.15 "Minibus" means a small passenger carrying motor vehicle not exceeding 5.5m in length capable of carrying more than 8 but not more than 16 passengers whether or not the same is either a motor car or a heavy motor car as the case may be;
- 1.16 "Motor Car" means any motor car within the meaning of Section 136(2) of the Act of 1984 with the exception of a commercial vehicle;
- 1.17 "Motor Caravan" means a motor vehicle not exceeding 5.5m in length which provides fixed sleeping arrangements whether or not the same is either a motor car or a heavy motor car as the case may be;
- 1.18 "Motor Cycle" means any vehicle as defined in Section 136(4) of the Act of 1984;
- 1.19 "Motor Vehicle" means any vehicle as defined in Section 136(1) of the Act of 1984;
- 1.20 "Owner" has the same meaning as in the Act of 1984;
- 1.21 "Parking Place" means any car park provided by the Council off a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place;
- 1.22 "Parking Disc" means an approved device which is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.
- 1.23 "Pay and Display" means a system of payment for parking of motor vehicle used at car parks where pre-paid tickets must be obtained and be displayed in the appropriate manner within the vehicle;
- 1.24 "Penalty Charge" means a Penalty Charge as specified in clause 23(1) hereof.
- 1.24 "Penalty Charge Notice" means a Penalty Charge Notice as specified in clause 23(2) hereof.
- 1.26 "Pre-paid Ticket" means a ticket obtained from the automatic ticket issuing machine for collecting charges installed at any of the parking places referred to in the Second Schedule hereto;

- 1.27 "Private Light Goods Vehicle" means a motor vehicle as defined in Section 138(3) of the Act of 1984 as a goods vehicle but not exceeding 1.5 tonnes unladen weight or in the alternative as specified in Schedule 1 to this order in relation to certain car parks where different weight requirements apply;
- 1.28 "Public Service Vehicle" means a vehicle which is constructed or adapted to carry more than eight passengers;
- 1.29 "Registered Keeper" means the person in whose name the vehicle was registered under the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971;
- 1.30 "Relevant Date" means the date upon which any vehicle is or was parked in any parking place referred to in this Order or upon which any event occurs or occurred in breach of any of the provisions of this Order or to which this Order relates;
- 1.31 "Relevant Position" means:-

**In the case of a disabled person's badge –**

- (a) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-
- i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or
  - ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle;

**In the case of any Parking Disc a vehicle displays a Parking Disc in the relevant position if:-**

- i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
- ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

**In the case of any other badge as follows –**

- i) in the case of a vehicle with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards and immediately behind the windscreen;
- ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.

- 1.32 "Residents' Parking Permit" means a non transferable permit for a specified vehicle for residents who live in the vicinity of the car park for the parking of a motor car in residents' car parking spaces, belonging to the Council; improper use of which will render the permit void;
- 1.33 "The Sands" means The Parking Place at The Sands as more particularly described in column 1 ("Situation of Parking Places") of the First Schedule hereto.
- 1.34 "Special Events Parking Permit" means a permit for the parking of a specified vehicle in a specified car park for a specified period or a specified date in respect of a special event; improper use of which will render the same void.
- 1.35 "Staff Parking Permit" means a permit issued to staff employed by organisations approved by the City Council by the Director of Environment and Development for the parking of a specified vehicle in a specified car park on specified days improper use of which will render the same void.
- 1.36 "Swifts Bank" means The Parking Place at The Swifts Bank as more particularly described in column 1 ("Situation of Parking Places") of the First Schedule hereto.
- 1.37 "Temporary Parking Permit" means a permit for the parking of a specified vehicle in a specified car park for specified date or dates for the parking requirements of guests or visitors to the Council; improper use of which will render the same void.
- 1.38 "Trailer" means a trailer as defined in Section 136(1) of the Act of 1984;
2. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall restrict the power of the Council to close any Parking Place or any part thereof when such Parking Place or part thereof is required for any purpose of the Council or for any purpose authorised by the Council.
3. Each of the places specified in column 1 ("Situation of Parking Places") of the First Schedule to this Order is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a Parking Place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that Parking Place in the said Schedule.
4. Where, in the First Schedule to this Order, a Parking Place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, or during a specified period (including any provisions specifying particular positions or periods for specified classes of vehicle) no vehicle shall be parked in that Parking Place otherwise than in strict accordance with such provisions.
5. No vehicle shall be left in a Parking Place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in the First Schedule to this Order in relation to that Parking Place.
6. No Parking Place or any part thereof shall be used when such Parking Place or part thereof has been closed by the Council in accordance with Article 2 hereof.

7. No Hackney Carriage shall use a Parking Place unless approved in writing by the Director of Environment and Development.
8. No vehicle shall use a Parking Place unless there is, in relation to the use of that vehicle by any person who drives it within that Parking Place, such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of Part VI of the Road Traffic Act 1972.
9. Where, in a Parking Place, signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:-
  - (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the Parking Place; or
  - (b) indicating that a vehicle using the Parking Place shall proceed in a specified direction within the Parking Place;no vehicle may be driven:-
  - (i) so that it enters the Parking Place otherwise than by an entrance, or leaves the Parking Place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated; or
  - (ii) in a direction other than that specified as the case may be.
10. No vehicle shall:-
  - 10.1. park on any yellow line within a car park nor cause any obstruction;
  - 10.2. park in a Marked Bay which has been reserved by markings, signage, cones or other suitable indications for the parking of vehicles of a specified class unless the vehicle falls within that class;
  - 10.3. park in a Marked Bay at The Sands in respect of which the maximum time for parking is indicated by signs as not exceeding 15 minutes for longer than the said period.
11. Except in accordance with any right of way which may exist or with the permission of the Council or of any person duly authorised by the Council:-
  - (a) no Parking Place may be used as a means of passage for proceeding from one road to another road;
  - (b) no vehicle may be driven in a Parking Place other than for the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the Parking Place, changing its position in the Parking Place or departing from the Parking Place.
12. The engine of a vehicle using a Parking Place shall be stopped as soon as the vehicle is in position in the Parking Place and the engine shall not be started except when the position of the vehicle in the Parking Place is about to be changed or the vehicle is about to depart from the Parking Place.
13. No horn or other similar instrument may be sounded on a vehicle using a Parking Place except when the position of the vehicle in the Parking Place is about to be changed or the vehicle is about to depart from the Parking Place.

14. No vehicle shall be used while it is in a Parking Place in connection with the sale of any thing to persons in or near the Parking Place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of the skill or services of any person PROVIDED ALWAYS that this Article shall not be deemed to prohibit the use of any vehicle in a Parking Place for or in connection with the sale of any thing or commodity in any case where the written consent of the Council has been obtained.
15. No vehicle shall be sold, offered or exhibited for sale whilst it is in a Parking Place.
16. No work of building, construction, cleaning, engineering, maintenance or repair of any nature shall be carried out in a Parking Place, except such as may be necessary to enable a vehicle to be moved from the Parking Place, nor shall any plant, equipment or materials be deposited in a Parking Place other than with the written consent of the Director of Environment and Development and payment of such fee as may be determined by the Director of Environment and Development.
17. No vehicle left in a Parking Place may be used for sleeping, camping, eating or cooking purposes.
18. No caravan shall use a Parking Place unless otherwise stated.
19. No trailer shall use a Parking Place, unless otherwise stated.
20. No minibus or motor caravan shall use a Parking Place unless otherwise stated.
21. Whenever a vehicle occupies any Parking Places in respect of which fees are to be paid in accordance with the Second Schedule hereto, a prepaid ticket or a combination of prepaid tickets shall be purchased when the vehicle enters the said Parking Place in respect of the period (not being longer than the maximum period permitted in that Parking Place) during which the vehicle is intended to be parked in that Parking Place calculated in accordance with the Second Schedule hereto and such prepaid ticket or tickets shall be exhibited on the vehicle in the Relevant Position throughout the said period, unless a valid permit (as described in Article 1 of this Order) is on display so it can be clearly seen by a parking attendant.
22. Where the parking of a vehicle in any Parking Place is authorised by a prepaid ticket or tickets under the provisions of Article 21 hereof such vehicle shall not be left in the Parking Place for longer than the period permitted by the prepaid ticket or tickets.
23. (1) If there is any contravention of any of the provisions of Articles 3 to 22 inclusive to this Order then, and in any such case, a Penalty Charge shall be payable to the Council under and subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, the amount of the Charge being any amount recommended by the Secretary of State for the time being and approved by Members of the Council.

- (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge may have been incurred it shall be the duty of a Parking Attendant/Parking Supervisor employed by the Council, to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a Penalty Charge Notice which in addition to such particulars as are required by statute shall include the following particulars:-

- (a) Vehicle registration number
- (b) Make of vehicle
- (c) Colour of vehicle
- (d) Detailed location of vehicle (eg name of car park, or other description of Parking Place)
- (e) Contravention code and description of contravention
- (f) Time of issue
- (g) Date
- (h) Penalty Charge Notice number
- (i) Attendants number
- (j) Attendants signature

Provided that the requirements of this paragraph shall not apply to a breach of this Order if the vehicle is removed from the Parking Place before the Penalty Charge Notice can be completed or affixed to the vehicle or given to the person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle.

- (3) Subject to Paragraph (4) hereof the Penalty Charge shall be paid to the Council in cash or by credit or debit card, cheque, banker's draft, money order or postal order in each case crossed and made payable to Carlisle City Council which shall be delivered or sent by post to the City Treasurer, Carlisle City Council, Civic Centre, Rickergate, Carlisle, Cumbria, CA3 8QG, within 28 days of the day on which the Penalty Charge was incurred.
- (4) In the event of payment being received by the City Treasurer as aforesaid within 14 days of the day of the date of the Penalty Charge Notice under 23(2) above (provided that if the fourteenth day falls upon a day on which the City Treasurer's department is closed the period within which payment of the penalty charge as provided herein shall be extended until 5.00 pm on the next full day on which the said department is open whether or not this date is shown on the Penalty Charge Notice left on the vehicle indicating that a Penalty Charge is payable) the amount of the penalty charge shall be reduced to an amount recommended by the Secretary of State for the time being and approved by the Council; the said payment shall be accepted in full settlement of the Penalty Charge payable under the terms hereof.
- (5) Payment of the Penalty Charge (whether or not the same is reduced under the provisions of Paragraph (4) hereof) will not exonerate any person from payment of any expenses recoverable in respect of the removal and disposal of the vehicle pursuant to the provisions of Articles 28, 29 and 30 of this Order and any statutory provisions for the time being in force or from any claim to damages which the Council may have in

respect of damage incurred in relation to the parking of the vehicle howsoever arising.

- (6) If the Penalty Charge is not paid after a minimum of 56 days and a Charge Certificate is issued, the Penalty Charge payable will be increased to an amount recommended by the Secretary of State for the time being and approved by of the Council.
24. Nothing in Articles 5 or 21 shall apply in respect of a vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority.
25. Nothing in Article 21 shall apply in respect of:-
  - (a) a motor car which displays in the appropriate manner a current Residents' Parking Permit if the vehicle is parked at any time in a Parking Place within a zone named on the Residents' Parking Permit in accordance with Article 1 of this Order.
  - (b) a vehicle which displays in the appropriate manner a current: Contract Parking Permit, Councillors Parking Permit, County Council Parking Staff Permit, Special Events Parking Permit, Staff Parking Permit, Temporary Parking Permit if the vehicle is parked at such times and in such Parking Places as are specified on the said Permit.
  - (c) a vehicle which displays in the appropriate manner a current Golf Parking Permit if the vehicle is parked at any time in a Marked Bay at the Swifts Bank.
26. Nothing in Article 21 shall apply in respect of a Motor Cycle which is parked in a section of a Parking Place reserved for the parking of a Motor Cycle free of charge.
27. It is hereby directed under the provisions of paragraph (c) of Sub-section (3) of Section 35A of the Act of 1984 that the provisions of Sub-sections (4) to (6) of Section 47 of the Act of 1984 shall apply to this Order save that references in the said Sub-section to "this section" shall be construed as references to Section 35A of the Act of 1984.
28. When a vehicle is left in a Parking Place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Articles 4, 5, 6, 7, 14, 17, 19 or 20 of this Order a Police Constable or a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that Parking Place.
29. Any person removing a vehicle by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and make take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it as aforesaid.
30. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a Parking Place by virtue of Article 29 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.



31. Where, in this Order, the hours of operation and/or the maximum period for which a vehicle may wait are stated, no vehicle shall exceed the stated period unless with the written authority of the Director of Environment and Development.
32. (a) Save as hereinafter provided, a Residents' Parking Permit shall not be assigned or transferred by an Owner to any other person but may be surrendered at any time to the Council when the Owner shall be entitled to receive the refund of a sum representing the full months unexpired portion of the Residents' Parking Permit.
- (b) In the event of (i) any Owner wishing to transfer a Residents' Parking Permit from one motor car to another or (ii) any Owner seeking a replacement of a Residents' Parking Permit following its loss or destruction; then on application to the Council and upon payment of an Administration Fee such transfer or replacement will be effected with any Residents' Parking Permit previously issued to such Owner deemed to be surrendered and of no effect.
- (c) The Council shall be entitled to terminate all rights granted by the Residents' Parking Permit if at any time there is any contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order and in any such circumstances the Owner shall not be entitled to any refund whatsoever without prejudice to any other right of action the Council may have whether under this Order or otherwise.
- (d) Where the owner of a vehicle has been issued with a Residents Parking Permit for a site with gated access arrangements, a key to the gate will be provided by the Council subject to the payment of a deposit. The owner will be responsible for the safe keeping of the said key, which, if lost or damaged, will render the owner liable for all costs of replacement. Failure on the part of the Permit holder to secure the access after use will constitute a breach of Article 33(c) of this Order. The deposit shall be refundable upon the safe return of the said key.
33. The registered keeper at the relevant date shall, pursuant to the provisions of Section 35A(3)(a) of the Act of 1984, be deemed to be responsible for any contravention of or non-compliance with this Order unless the registered keeper can prove in any proceedings:-
- (a) that the registered keeper was neither the owner nor the keeper of the vehicle on the relevant date; or
- (b) that the vehicle was being used on that date without the consent of the registered keeper.

Provided that the Council shall be entitled to proceed against any other person whom the Council proves to be either the owner or the keeper or the driver of the vehicle at the relevant date instead of the registered keeper.

34. Any vehicle using or remaining in any Parking Place shall be at the owner's or driver's risk and the Council, its agents, officers or employees shall not be liable for loss or damage to it or to its contents or accessories howsoever arising including any damage caused directly or indirectly as a result of a vehicle removal under the provisions of Article 28 hereof.
35. The City of Carlisle (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1977 and all Orders made thereunder are hereby revoked from 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 2001.
36. This Order shall come into operation on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 2001 and may be cited as the "City of Carlisle (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2001".
