

THE CARMARTHENSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES)
CONSOLIDATION ORDER 2004

Carmarthenshire County Council (hereinafter called “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Section 35(1) and (3) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, (“the Act”) as amended by the Parking Act 1989 and by the Road Traffic Act 1991 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Office of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

1. CITATION

This Order shall come into operation on the First day of February 2004 and may be cited as The Carmarthenshire County Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2004.

2. INTERPRETATION

- (i) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order, and any reference in this Order to a numbered schedule is to the schedule to this order which is so numbered.
- (ii) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (iii) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, or re-enacted by, or as having effect by virtue of, any subsequent enactment.
- (iv) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:

“Charging Days” means those days which are specified in schedule 2 of this order for each parking place respectively.

“Charging Hours” means the period which is specified in the schedules included with this order for each parking place respectively.

“The Council” means Carmarthenshire County Council.

“Disabled Persons’ Badge” means a badge issued by any Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) ((Wales) Regulations 2000 or a badge having effect under those regulations as if it were a disabled person’s badge.

“Owner” means the person by whom the vehicle is kept. In determining who was the owner of a vehicle at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994.

“Parking Attendant” means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise parking places and enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order.

“Parking Bay” means any area in a parking place marked on the surface of the parking place by lines, studs or other indications, which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle.

“Parking Charge” means the charge prescribed in schedule 3 of this Order to be paid for vehicles left in a parking place.

“Parking Place” means an area of land specified in schedule 2 of this Order included with this order and provided by the Council pursuant to Section 32(1) of the 1984 Act for the purpose of vehicle parking which includes all entrances and egresses therefrom and not closed (in part or in whole) by a Notice erected thereon by authority of the Council.

“Penalty Charge” and “Reduced Penalty Charge” means a charge set by the Council under the provisions of section 66 of the Road Traffic Act 1991 and with the approval of the Secretary of State for Wales which is to be paid to the Council within 28 days beginning with the date of the notice, or 14 days in the case of a reduced penalty charge, following the issue of a penalty charge.

“Penalty Charge Notice” means a notice issued or served by a parking attendant pursuant to the provisions of section 66 of the Road Traffic Act 1991.

“Relevant Position” means

- (a) in the case of a vehicle which is fitted with a transparent windscreen, by attaching the parking ticket to the inside surface of the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be easily seen and read from in front of the vehicle or alternatively behind a nearside window; or
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a transparent windscreen, by attaching the parking ticket in a conspicuous position on the front of the vehicle.

“Season Ticket” means a ticket purchased from the Council, subject to certain conditions, valid for the period specified on the ticket for use in parking places specified on the ticket.

“Ticket Machine” means an apparatus of a type and design, approved by the Secretary of State for Wales, for the purpose, inter alia, of this Order, being apparatus designed to indicate the time by a clock, and to issue parking tickets which show that a payment has been made of an amount, or for a period specified thereon, and which specify the date and the time at which the vehicle must leave the parking place.

“Ticket” or “Tickets” shall be construed as reference to a ticket or tickets purchased from a ticket machine by the insertion therein of an appropriate coin or coins.

“Vehicle” means any vehicle whether or not it is in a fit state for use on roads and includes any chassis, with or without wheels, appearing to form or have formed part of such a vehicle and any load carried by or anything attached to such a vehicle. “Vehicle” shall include caravans and trailers. For the purpose of this Order the term Vehicle shall include “Motor Vehicle”, “Motor Car”, “Trailer”, “Motor Cycle” and “Invalid Carriage” as defined in

section 136 of the Act and a “caravan” as defined in the Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act 1960;

- (v) Sub-sections (4) and (5) of Section 47 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 shall apply to the parking places as if they were parking places provided on a highway.

3. USE OF PARKING PLACES

- (i) Each parking place may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation thereto in schedule 2 of this Order.
- (ii) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a bay marked for Disabled Persons unless the vehicle displays a valid Disabled Person's Badge in the manner prescribed by Regulation 12 of the Disabled Person's (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000 and the vehicle is being driven or used by the person to whom the badge is issued.
- (iii) Nothing in this article shall prohibit a vehicle on which a valid Disabled Persons Badge is displayed from being parked in any other bay provided the vehicle is of the class permitted by or under this order to park in such other parking bay.
- (iv) Nothing in this order shall prevent the Council by notice displayed in the parking place
 - (a) from closing the parking place or any part thereof for any period; and/or
 - (b) from setting aside the parking place or any part or parts thereof on all days or on certain days or during certain parts of days for use only by particular vehicles.
- (v) The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall not leave the vehicle in any position in the parking place in which it will obstruct access to or egress from that parking place (including any emergency access or egress) or to any premises adjoining the parking place or obstruct the access roads within the parking place or park on double yellow or diagonal yellow lines.
- (vi) The driver of a vehicle whilst in a parking place shall comply with any instructions given to him or her by a Car Park Attendant as to the manner of parking of the vehicle and shall remove the vehicle from the parking place on being required by the Attendant to do so.

4. POSITION OF VEHICLES

- (i) Motorcycles and pedal cycles permitted in the parking places identified in schedule 2 and specified in Article 3 of this order shall be positioned in bays (if any) specifically provided for motorcycles and pedal cycles on the parking place.
- (ii) All other vehicles permitted to wait in the parking places identified in schedule 2 and specified in Article 3 of this Order shall be positioned in any other bays marked on the parking place.

- (iii) If the dimensions of a vehicle authorised by this Order to be parked exceed those of a single bay, that vehicle shall be parked wholly within the limits of the smallest number of adjoining parking bays required.

5. MANNER OF PARKING OF TRAILERS

The driver of a vehicle drawing a trailer shall not permit the vehicle or the trailer to wait in a parking place unless they have been disconnected, and for the purposes of this Order the vehicle and the trailer shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the driver of the leading vehicle shall be deemed to be the driver of both of the vehicles.

6. USE OF VEHICLES IN PARKING PLACES

- (i) No person shall use a vehicle or a trailer, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale or attempted sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place, or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services, unless duly authorised by the Council in writing so to do.
- (ii) No person shall use a vehicle or a trailer, while it is in a parking place as a dwelling or for any domestic or sanitary purpose.
- (ii) The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in a position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.

7. REPAIR OF VEHICLES IN PARKING PLACES

No person shall, while a vehicle is in a parking place, permit the carrying out of any work of maintenance or repair thereto except such as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved from the parking place.

8. MAXIMUM PERIOD OF WAITING

The maximum periods of waiting in the parking places and limitations on returning to them shall apply as specified in schedule 2 of this order.

9. REMOVAL OF A VEHICLE FROM PARKING PLACES

Where a person duly authorised by the Council is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in any article of this Order have been contravened, or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place, he/she may, under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986, remove the vehicle or cause it to be removed from the parking place, and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

10. MOVEMENT OF VEHICLES IN A PARKING PLACE IN EMERGENCIES

- (i) A Police Constable in uniform or any other person duly authorised by the Council may, in case of emergency, move or cause to be moved, vehicles left in a parking place to any place he/she thinks fit.
- (ii) Where a vehicle is left in a parking place in a position other than that specified in Article 4 and schedule 2, a Police Constable in uniform or any other person duly

authorised by the Council may move the vehicle or cause it to be moved to a position which complies with that specified in Article 4 and the schedules included with this order.

11. MANNER OF MOVING VEHICLES

Any person moving or removing a vehicle in accordance with Articles 9 or 10 may do so by towing or driving the vehicle, or in such other manner as he may think necessary, and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he/she may think necessary to enable him or her to move or remove it as aforesaid.

12. SAFE CUSTODY OF VEHICLES

When a person authorised by the Council removes a vehicle or causes it to be removed from a parking place in accordance with Articles 10 and 11 of this Order, he/she shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

13. DIRECTION IN WHICH VEHICLES MUST BE DRIVEN

No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on any length of road or aisle in any parking place contrary to the directions given by the appropriate carriageway markings or signs.

14. ENTRY AND EXIT

The driver of a vehicle shall not cause it to enter a parking place at a point marked "No Entry" or to leave a parking place at a point marked "No Exit".

15. "PAY AND DISPLAY" PARKING TICKETS

The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place indicated in schedule 2 of this Order shall purchase a valid parking ticket at the price and for the period indicated in Schedule 3 of this Order and exhibit the parking ticket on the vehicle in the relevant position.

16. A parking ticket used in a parking place indicated in schedule 2 of this Order shall only be a valid parking ticket if:

- (i) it has been purchased from a ticket machine in the parking place where the vehicle is left;
- (ii) it is exhibited on the vehicle in a relevant position: AND
- (iii) it has been purchased in accordance with the provisions that in the parking places specified in schedule 2 of this Order, one ticket per vehicle shall be valid either:
 - (a) for the number of hours or for the period specified on the ticket commencing, if purchased during charging hours, at the time of purchase or if purchased outside charging hours, at the beginning of the next following period of charging hours; OR
 - (b) from the time of purchase or if purchased outside charging hours from the beginning of the next following period of charging hours to the expiry time

specified on the ticket so however that no such ticket shall be valid after the vehicle has exceeded in any one period of charging hours the maximum period of waiting (if any) specified in Article 9 hereof;

17. RESTRICTION ON REMOVAL OF PARKING TICKETS

When a parking ticket or season ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of Article 17(ii), no person shall remove the parking ticket or season ticket from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place.

18. PEDAL CYCLES AND MOTOR CYCLES

The driver of a motorcycle or a pedal cycle, which is left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place in the position, specified for such vehicles, as specified in Article 4, and in schedule 2 of this Order, shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket.

19. DISABLED PERSONS' VEHICLES

- (i) The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place, indicated in schedule 2 of this Order shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket for the first three hours of waiting if the vehicle is a vehicle which displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the manner prescribed by Regulation 12 of the Disabled Person's (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000 and the vehicle is being driven or used by the person to whom the badge is issued
- (ii) The restrictions imposed by Article 8 of this Order shall apply to vehicles displaying a Disabled Person's Badge as described in paragraph (i) of this Article after the expiry of the initial 3 hours free parking.

20. ABSENCE OF TICKET MACHINE

If at the time when a vehicle is left in a parking place specified in the schedules included with this order during the charging hours there is no ticket machine at the parking place, or all the ticket machines at that parking place carry notices placed upon them by a person duly authorised by the Council indicating that they are out of order, the charge shall be payable on demand to the Car Park Attendant or other person authorised to receive such a payment by the Council. In the absence of such arrangements, the driver of that vehicle shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket.

21. SEASON TICKETS

- (i) Season tickets shall be available for the parking places as specified in schedule 2 of this order but each season ticket shall be valid only for the parking place or places specified upon it.
- (ii) The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a relevant parking place as specified in schedule 2 of this Order shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket if there is displayed in the relevant position a valid season ticket purchased from the Council.

- (iii) The price of a season ticket shall be in accordance with Schedule 3 of this Order.

22. CONTRAVENTIONS

If a vehicle is left in a parking place specified in the schedules included with this order during the charging hours without complying with the requirements of this Order, a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable. A Penalty Charge Notice showing the information required by the Road Traffic Act 1991 may then be issued by a Parking Attendant in accordance with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act 1991.

23. NOTICE OF PENALTY CHARGE

- (i) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a Parking Attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a Notice which shall include the following particulars:
 - (a) the grounds on which the Parking Attendant believes that a penalty charge is payable with respect to the vehicle;
 - (b) the amount of the penalty charge which is payable;
 - (c) that the penalty charge must be paid before the end of the period of 28 days beginning with the date of the Notice;
 - (d) that if the penalty charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Notice, the amount of the penalty charge will be reduced by a proportion specified from time to time by the National Assembly for Wales;
 - (e) that if the penalty charge is not paid before the end of the 28 day period a Notice to the Owner may be served by the Local Authority on the person appearing to them to be the owner of the vehicle;
 - (f) the address to which payment of the penalty charge must be sent.
- (ii) A Penalty Charge Notice fixed to a vehicle in accordance with this section shall not be removed or interfered with except by or under the authority of:
 - (a) the owner, or person in charge of, of the vehicle;
 - (b) the Authority for the place in which the vehicle in question was found.

24. RESTRICTION ON REMOVAL OF NOTICES

Where a Notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 23, no person who is not a Parking Attendant or some other person duly authorised by the Council shall remove the Notice from the vehicle, until the vehicle has been removed from the parking place.

25. PAYMENT OF PENALTY CHARGE

- (i) The owner of a vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge has been incurred shall pay the penalty charge to the Council EITHER by cheque or postal order which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the Directorate of Technical Services of

the Council within 28 days of the issue of the penalty charge OR by cheque, postal order, in cash, by credit card or debit card in person at any Council office which accepts such payment OR as indicated on the Penalty Charge Notice not later than as aforesaid.

- (ii) If the penalty charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Notice, the amount of the penalty charge will be reduced by the specified proportion.
- (iii) If the owner fails to pay the penalty charge by the end of the 28 day period, a Notice to Owner may be served; and if the charge is then not paid within a further 28 days it may be increased by 50% on the issue of a Charge Certificate in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 6 of Schedule 6 of the 1991 Act.
- (iv) Continuing failure to pay may result in a judgement in the County Court against the owner to enable the Council to recover payments due.

26 OTHER PROVISIONS

- (i) The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall not drive the vehicle:
 - (a) recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to other users of that parking place, or without due care and attention or without reasonable consideration for other users of that parking place, or
 - (b) other than for the purpose of leaving the vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purposes of departing from the parking place.
- (ii) No person shall in a parking place:
 - (a) cause any nuisance, annoyance or inconvenience to the Council, its officers, servants or agents or to any other person whatsoever; or
 - (b) use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace, or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned.
- (iii) In a parking place, no person shall:
 - (a) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written consent of the Council.
 - (b) light or cause or permit to be lit any fire.
- (iv) no person shall bring any inflammable or other dangerous substances (other than that contained in a fuel tank of a vehicle) into the parking place.
- (v) When in respect of any parking place, a notice is displayed indicating that the parking place is full occupied or closed, no driver shall drive or attempt to drive his vehicle into such a parking place.
- (vi) No person other than an officer of the Council or its duly authorised agent shall affix any notice or advertisement to any part of the parking place or to any fence enclosing

the parking place or to any vehicle waiting in a parking place without first obtaining the written consent of the Council.

- (vii) No person shall leave any trolley, basket on wheels or other similar receptacle designed for the carrying of merchandise nor any other article of any kind whatsoever in a parking place.
- (viii) No person shall leave a child, animal or other living creature in any vehicle waiting in the parking place nor shall cause or permit the same to roam or play in the parking place.
- (ix) No person shall wilfully or carelessly damage or interfere in any way with the fabric or structure or equipment of the parking place which for the avoidance of doubt shall include the ticket machine situated thereon or any apparatus or device provided therein.
- (x) Any person causing damage in contravention of paragraph (ix) of this Article shall be liable for the cost incurred by the Council making good the damage.

27 The Council, its servants or agents, shall not be responsible for any loss or damage howsoever occasioned to any person or thing entering, within or leaving the parking place.

28. REVOCATIONS

All those Orders (relating to off-street parking places) specified in Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked.
