(ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle,

so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle;

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position if -

4. Save as provided in Article 13 hereof no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or remain at rest at any time in the length of road specified in Schedule 6 to this Order

5. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the area of road specified in Schedule 7 to this Order is authorised to be used as a parking place to provide a parking space for a disabled persons' vehicle.

6. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking place unless:-

(1) it is a disabled person's vehicle; and

(2) it is parked wholly within the limits of a parking space; and

(3) a disabled person's badge is displayed in the relevant position on the vehicle

7. No person shall use a disabled person's vehicle while it is in the parking place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near that parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services

8. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a disabled person's vehicle is the left

 - (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (h) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of road;
- (2) Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 hereof shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle:-

16. This Order may be cited as "The Buckinghamshire County Council (Various Roads, Gerrards Cross) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order, 2005", and shall come into operation on 11th July 2005.

SCHEDULE 1

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME ON ANY DAY

Lengths of road in Gerrards Cross in the County of Buckinghamshire

Bulstrode Way – South West Side

From its junction with Packhorse Road continuing in a north-westerly direction to a point 58 metres north west of its junction with Packhorse Road.

East Common – West Side

From a point 59 metres south of its junction with Mill Lane continuing to a point 5 metres south of the northern common boundary fence of Galleywood and Brindgwood.

Oak End Way – South Side

From its junction with Amersham Road continuing in a westerly direction to a point 40 metres west of its junction with Amersham Road.

Orchehill Avenue – North Side

From a point 15 metres west of the centre line of its junction with Latchmore Grove continuing in a westerly direction to a point opposite the common boundary of Place House and Northholme.

Orchehill Avenue – North West Side

From a point 15 metres north east of the centre line of Norgrove Park continuing to a point 31.7 metres west of its junction with Packhorse Road.

Oval Way – North West Side

From its junction with Packhorse Road in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 22 metres.

Oval Way – South East Side

From its junction with Packhorse Road in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 20 metres.

South Park Crescent – South Side

From its junction with Packhorse Road continuing in an easterly direction to a point 25 metres.

From a point 63 metres east of its junction with Packhorse Road continuing in an easterly direction to a point 80 metres east of its junction with Packhorse Road.

South Park Drive – East Side

From its junction with South Park Crescent continuing in a north-easterly direction to a point 22 metres north of its junction with South Park Crescent.

South Park Drive – West Side

From its junction with South Park Crescent continuing in a north-easterly direction to a point 21 metres north of the common boundary between No.1 and No.3 South Park Drive.

Length of road in Gerrards Cross in the County of Buckinghamshire

Latchmore Grove – West Side

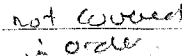
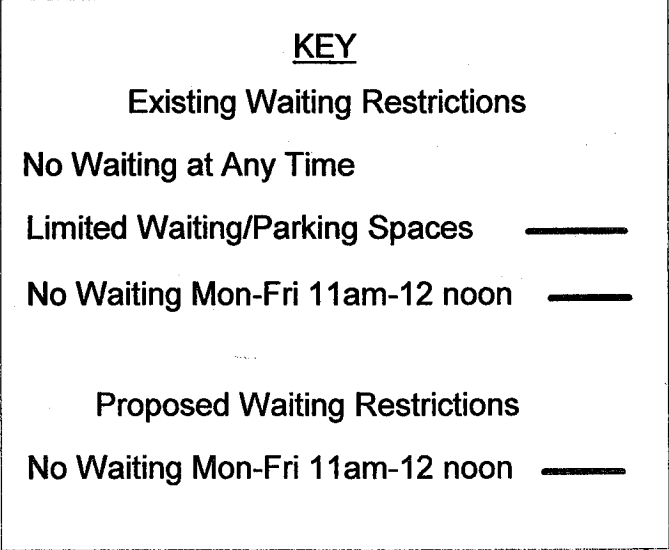

From a point 59 metres south of its junction with Mill Lane continuing to a point 5 metres south of the northern common boundary fence of Galleywood and Brindgwood.

Oak End Way – South Side

From its junction with Amersham Road continuing in a westerly direction to a point 40 metres west of its junction with Amersham Road.
