OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES ORDER 2013

The Council of the Chiltern District in the County of Buckingham (hereinafter referred to as the "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Parking Act 1989 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as the "the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and all other enabling powers and with the consent of the Buckinghamshire County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, HEREBY MAKES the following Order:-

- 1 (1) This Order shall come into operation on the 31st day of October 2013 and may be cited as the Chiltern District Council Off-Street Parking Places Order 2013.

- (2) The Chiltern District Council (Off-Street Parking Places)(Consolidation) Order 2012 is hereby revoked upon the coming into operation of this Order.

- 2 (1) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order, and any reference in this Order to "the Schedule" or a numbered part is a reference to the Schedule or the part as the case may be to this Order.

- (2) In this Order:-

"ANPR" means the Automatic Number Plate Recognition technology provided by the Council.

"ANPR Trial" means a set period during which the Council will install, test and monitor the use of ANPR in any of the parking places contained in Part I of the Schedule of this Order. An ANPR Trial will not be required before ANRP can be introduced on a permanent basis in any of the parking places but will be undertaken where it is considered, by the Council, to be appropriate.

"Bank Holiday" means the days specified in Section 1(1) of Schedule 1 of the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971 with the addition of New Year's Day or as appropriate 2 January and the first Monday in May subject to special circumstances of any year and also includes the common law holidays namely Good Friday and Christmas Day.

"charging hours" means in respect of the parking place, those hours during which a vehicle may only be permitted to wait in the parking place upon payment of a charge, as specified in Column 3, Column 5 or Column 6 of Part I of the Schedule.

“civil enforcement officer” means a person provided by the Council for the purpose of supervising parking places situate within the Chiltern District and enforcing the restrictions imposed by this Order pursuant to Section 63A of the Act.

“Council” means Chiltern District Council.

“credit card” means a card or similar thing issued by any person, use of which enables the holder to defer the payment by him of the charge for parking a vehicle.

“debit card” means a card or similar thing issued by any person, use of which by the holder causes the charge for parking a vehicle to be paid by the electronic transfer of funds from any current account of his at a bank or other institution providing banking services.

“disabled person’s badge” means a badge in the form prescribed by Regulation 11 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 which has not ceased to be in force and which is displayed in accordance with Regulation 12 thereof or any replacement badge issued under Regulation 7 and any Regulations from time to time amending or replacing the same.

“driver” in relation to a mechanically propelled vehicle means the person who at the material time is entitled to the possession and use of such vehicle under the terms of a hiring agreement entered into with a vehicle-hire firm and has signed a statement of liability acknowledging his liability in respect of any parking contraventions involving the vehicle during the currency of the hiring agreement and in respect of whom the owner of the vehicle has in response to a Notice to Owner served on him by the Council made representations on the grounds specified by Regulation 4(4)(d) of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) Representations and Appeals Regulations 2007 and the Council has accepted those representations.

“electric vehicle” means a Class 7 vehicle as defined in Part III of the Schedule of this Order.

“electric vehicle parking bay” means any area of a parking place as indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place and is provided for the leaving of a Class 7 vehicle only.

“electric vehicle charging post” means apparatus which supplies electricity for the charging of electric vehicles.

“electric vehicle charging point” means the location at which an electric vehicle charging post is situated for the purpose of the charging of electric vehicles.

Slip Rule amendment to the Chiltern District Council Off-Street Parking Places Order 2013

It has come the Council's attention that the Chiltern District Council Off-Street Parking Places Order 2013 ('the Order') dated 22 October 2013 contains a printed typographical error.

Under Article 2(2) of the Order the definition of "penalty charge" refers to "Article 5(2)". This is incorrect and has been amended to read "Article 6(2)" under the Slip Rule.

"enforcement authority" means Chiltern District Council.

"hand-held device" means a wireless hand-held computer used by a civil enforcement officer which is programmed to interface with the telephone payment parking system.

"location identification number" means the unique number assigned to each parking place where the telephone payment parking system is operational.

"material time" means the time when the contravention giving rise to the penalty charge is said to have occurred.

"owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person at the material time by whom the vehicle is kept which in the case of a vehicle registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 is presumed (unless the contrary is proved) to be the person in whose name the vehicle is registered at the material time.

"parking bay" means any area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place;

"parking charge" means the appropriate charge payable as set out in Column 3, Column 5 or Column 6 of Part I of the Schedule to this Order in the manner prescribed by Article 4 of this Order.

"parking place" means any area of land together with the respective accesses thereto specified by name in Column 1 of Part I of the Schedule and shown hatched in black for the purpose of identification only on the plans attached provided by the Council under Section 32(1) of the Act for use as a parking place.

"Pay by Phone" means the Telephone Payment Parking System provided by the Council.

"penalty charge" means a charge set by the Council in accordance with Article 4(2) of this Order. The appropriate penalty charge in force will be as shown on the 'Pay and Display' Notice in the parking place where it applies.

"penalty charge notice" means a penalty charge notice issued or served by a civil enforcement officer or posted by the enforcement authority pursuant to the provisions of Section 78 of the 2004 Act, the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 and complying with Article 6 of this Order.

“reduced penalty charge” means a 50 per cent reduction of the penalty charge provided payment is received by the Council not later than the last day of the period of 14 days beginning with the date on which the penalty charge notice is served.

“registered keeper” means the person in whose name the vehicle was registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994.

“Reserved spaces” means a marked parking bay specifically reserved for use, by the designated Season Ticket holder only, available on payment of the required fee and the period for which the relevant Season Ticket is valid.

“season ticket” means a ticket or other printed document issued by the Council, to the owner of a specified vehicle, for use in such parking place as is shown on the ticket, and in accordance with Column 5 of Part I of the Schedule, during the period for which it is issued and is not transferable between parking places, save as provided in paragraph 13 of Part II of the Schedule hereto.

“service charge” means the charge payable to the service provider (in addition to the parking charge payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 4(8) to Article 4(12) of this Order for vehicles using the telephone payment parking system.

“service provider” means the company authorised and appointed by the Council to operate, administer and maintain the payment of parking charges using the telephone payment parking system.

“Telephone Payment Parking System” means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of parking charges using telephone communication with the service provider in accordance with instructions indicated on signs located at each parking place where the system is operational.

“ticket” means a ticket issued by a ticket machine located in a parking place identified in Part I of the Schedule of this Order.

“vehicle(s)” means the class of vehicle as defined in Part III of the Schedule of this Order.

USE OF LAND AND PARKING PLACE

- 3 (1) Each area of land specified by name in Column 1 of Part I of the Schedule may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place only for such classes of vehicles in such positions, on such days, during such hours and at such charges and subject to such Special Conditions as are specified in relation to that area in Parts I, II, III and IV of the Schedule PROVIDED THAT:

- (a) The Council may by indication on site temporarily withdraw such parking place or any part thereof from such use;
- (b) All other conditions save that requiring payment shall be observed by the driver of any vehicle which displays a Disabled Person's Badge.

(2) Where in Parts I, II and III of the Schedule a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not wait or permit it to be left in that parking place unless it is of the class and in the position so specified.

(3) Where, within a parking place, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a parking bay is available only for a vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge, the driver of any vehicle not displaying the said badge shall not wait or permit it to be left in that parking bay.

CHARGES AT PARKING PLACES

4 (1) Save as in Article 3(1)(b) and hereinafter provided, no vehicle shall wait or be left in a parking place during the hours that charges for parking as referred to in Column 3 of Part I of the Schedule are to be paid (hereinafter referred to as "the charging hours") without the owner or driver thereof having first paid the appropriate charge as set out in the said Column 3, Column 5 or Column 6 of Part I of the Schedule (hereinafter referred to as "the parking charge") in the manner prescribed by this Article.

(2) The Council may from time to time determine not to collect a charge and/or charges at a parking place and information relating to a change in the collection of a charge and/or charges would be indicated on the "Pay and Display" and/or the "Car Park Charges" Notice in the parking place where it applied.

(3) The parking charge shall be payable by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins, bank notes, credit card, debit card, or other approved electronic transaction cards or otherwise as directed into the apparatus or device provided, being an apparatus or device approved in accordance with Section 35 of the Act, and the provisions of Section 35A of the Act shall apply in respect of such apparatus and/or ANPR where it is being used as a payment system.

(4) The owner of a vehicle may on application to the Council purchase a season ticket in respect of that vehicle for a parking charge ascertained by reference to the charges specified in Column 5 of Part I of the Schedule and that season ticket shall be only valid in such parking place as specified thereon in accordance with Column 4 of Part I of the Schedule during the period for which it is issued and is not transferable between parking places, save as provided in paragraph 15 of Part II of the Schedule hereto.

(5) Any ticket issued on payment of the parking charge hereinbefore referred to in paragraph (3) of this Article or any season ticket issued in accordance with paragraph (4) of this Article shall be displayed in a conspicuous position inside the vehicle in order that the ticket can be read from the outside of the vehicle in respect of which it was issued whilst it is left in the parking place. A vehicle shall not be left in a parking place if it displays an expired ticket or expired season ticket.

(6) The Council may from time to time grant written permission for vehicles to park at such times and in such parking places as it may deem expedient at a charge applicable at the time of application and/or issue.

(7) Tickets issued on payment of the parking charge are only available for use in the parking place where issued and are not transferable either between parking places or users of the car park provided that season tickets issued in respect of a particular car park may also be used in the parking places as outlined in paragraph 15 of Part II of the Schedule hereto.

(8) In addition to the provisions of Article 4(1) to Article 4(7) of this Order each parking place referred to in Part I of the Schedule of this Order may also be used, where applicable, for such classes of vehicles in such positions, on such days, during such hours on payment of the relevant parking charge including Season Ticket parking charges using Pay by Phone.

(9) Pay by Phone information signs and the relevant Location Identification Number signs will be located in each parking place where Pay by Phone is in operation and will provide information in regard to the operation and use of Pay by Phone.

(10) The payment of a parking charge using Pay by Phone will relate only to the parking place as indicated by the location identification number displayed on the location identification number sign situated in the parking place.

(11) Where a vehicle has been left in a parking place operating Pay by Phone an indication that the relevant parking charge including Season Ticket parking charges has been made in respect of that vehicle using Pay by Phone together with an indication of the parking periods for which payment has been made shall appear on the hand-held device.

(12) Without prejudice to the provisions of Article 4(1) to Article 4(7) and Paragraph 2(ii) of Part II of the Schedule of this Order if at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Part I of the Schedule of this Order no indication appears on a hand-held device that payment of the parking charge has been made using Pay by Phone, or a hand-held device indicates that the payment period for which payment was made using Pay by Phone has expired it shall be presumed (as the case may be and unless the contrary is proved) that either:

- (a) the parking charge has not been duly paid in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 4 of this Order; or
- (b) the parking period for which payment was made using Pay by Phone has expired

and in either case a civil enforcement officer may serve a penalty charge notice.

(13) The Council may determine to use ANPR as a payment system in any of the parking places contained in Part I of the Schedule of this Order on a trial and/or permanent basis.

(14) Payment of a parking charge using ANPR will be as outlined in Article 4(1) to Article 4(4) and Article 4(6) to Article 4(7) of this Order.

(15) In addition to the provisions of Article 4(1) to Article 4(4) and Article 4(6) to Article 4(7) of this Order payment of parking charges using ANPR may also be paid using Pay by Phone in accordance with the provisions of Article 4(8) to Article 4(10) of this Order.

USE OF AUTOMATIC NUMBER PLATE RECOGNITION ('ANPR') AT PARKING PLACES

5 (1) ANPR may be used in any of the Parking Places contained in Part I of the Schedule of this Order for either a Trial Period(s) and/or on a permanent basis.

(2) Before an ANPR Trial commences details of the ANPR Trial will be published as follows:

- (a) a Notice in the relevant Parking Place(s).
- (b) on the Council's website.
- (c) available for public inspection at the Council Offices, King George V House, King George V Road, Amersham, Bucks HP6 5AW during normal office hours.
- (d) any other method(s) deemed appropriate and/or required.

(3) Details of the payment requirements and method(s) of payment available, during an ANPR Trial, will be published as outlined in Article 5(2) above.

(4) Before the introduction of ANPR on a permanent basis, in any of the Parking Places contained in Part I of the Schedule of this Order, details will be published as outlined in Article 5(2)(a) to (d) above.

PENALTY CHARGE AT PARKING PLACE

- 6 (1) Subject to the provisions of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 in respect to a vehicle where there has been committed in relation to that vehicle a parking contravention within paragraph 4 of Schedule 7 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 (parking contraventions outside Greater London) in a civil enforcement area outside Greater London and/or the provisions of this Order a penalty charge is payable by the owner or driver of the vehicle to the Council in accordance with Article 7 of this Order.

(2) Penalty charges including any discounts or surcharges thereto shall be of such levels as are from time to time set by the Council in accordance with the provisions of Section 77 and Part 3 of Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and the Schedule to the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges) (England) Order 2007 ('the Guidelines Order') made by the Secretary of State under Paragraph 8 of Part 3 of Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004. All off-street parking contraventions are prescribed as either Higher Level or Lower Level contraventions in respect of which different penalty charges apply at the levels described in Table 1 of the Schedule to the Guidelines Order as Band 1 or Band 2. In relation to both the Higher Level and Lower Level contraventions the Council may in its absolute discretion set the level of penalty charge at either the Band 1 or Band 2 level PROVIDED that the Council will publish the level of charges in a newspaper circulating in the locality not less than 14 days before such charges shall come into force.

NOTICE WHERE CONTRAVENTION OF THIS ORDER (PENALTY CHARGE NOTICE)

- 7 (1) A penalty charge notice may be in such form as may from time to time be considered appropriate by the Council, provided that it displays the information required by the Schedule to the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 and Part 2 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) Representations and Appeals Regulations 2007.

(2) The penalty charge, reduced penalty charge and charge payable after service of a charge certificate shall be in the following amounts:

- (a) In respect of any contravention the penalty charge payable shall, subject to Articles 7(2)(b) and 7(2)(c) of this Order, be the amount from time to time set by the Council in accordance with Article 6(2) of this Order and payment shall be received by the Council not later than the last day of the period of 28 days beginning with the date on which the penalty charge notice is served.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 7(2)(a) of this Order a reduced penalty charge shall be payable PROVIDED payment is received by the Council not later than the last day of the period of 14 days beginning with the date on which the penalty charge notice is served.

(c) On the issue of a charge certificate in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 21 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 the penalty charge shall be increased by 50 per cent.

(3) For the avoidance of doubt the reference in Articles 7(2)(a) and 7(2)(b) of this Order to payment being received by the Council not later than the last day of the period of 28 or 14 days (as the case may be) shall be interpreted to mean that payment must be received by the Council by no later than 00.00 hours on the last day of the said period of 28 or 14 days.

(4) The penalty charge, reduced penalty charge and charge payable after service of a charge certificate (as appropriate) shall be paid to the Council in cash or by means of cheque, postal order, credit card or debit card payment or any other means of payment acceptable to the Council. Payment shall be made at Customer Services, Council Offices, King George V House, King George V Road, Amersham or to such other office as the Council may from time to time determine or an agent appointed by the Council or by using the Council's Telephone Payment System or Online at www.chiltern.gov.uk as specified in the penalty charge notice.

(5) Where a penalty charge has been incurred due to a parking contravention a civil enforcement officer may attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position or hand to the driver of the vehicle a penalty charge notice which complies with the requirements of Regulation 9 and Schedule to the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007.

(6) Where a penalty charge has been incurred a penalty charge notice may be issued by post by the enforcement authority if the owner of the vehicle drives the vehicle away before the civil enforcement officer has issued a penalty charge notice or the civil enforcement officer has been prevented from issuing a penalty charge notice, such a penalty charge notice shall comply with the requirements of Regulation 10 and the Schedule to the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007.

(7) Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, the Schedule to the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007, Part 2 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) Representations and Appeals Regulations 2007 and the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges) (England) Order 2007 shall have effect with respect to penalty charges, notices to owners and other matters supplementing the provisions of Article 7 of this Order.

OTHER PROVISIONS

8 The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine, except when about to change the position of the vehicle, in or to depart from the parking place.

9 (1) Unless the Council's prior written consent is obtained, no person in a parking place shall:-

- (a) drive any vehicle or otherwise than for the purpose of leaving it in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place;
- (b) use a vehicle, while it is in the parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of skills or services;
- (c) erect or cause to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or structure or other thing;
- (d) light or cause or permit to be lighted any fire;
- (e) display or distribute or cause to be displayed or distributed any notice, leaflet, handbill, booklet, book or other item;
- (f) maintain, repair, service or wash any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable the vehicle to depart from the parking place;
- (g) drive any vehicle and cause it to wait, in a parking place, without displaying a valid ticket, in accordance with Article 4 of this Order.

(2) No person in a parking place shall:-

- (a) sound any horn or similar instrument except when necessary for the safety of persons or vehicles in the parking place;
- (b) shout or make or permit any noise or otherwise behave to the disturbance or annoyance to users of the parking place, occupants of neighbouring premises or passers-by;
- (c) use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct likely to cause, or causing, a breach of the peace;
- (d) use any part of the parking place or any vehicle in it for sleeping, cooking or camping purposes;

- (e) use any part of the parking place for skating (using in-line or roller skates), skateboarding or cycling;
 - (f) engage in any other activity which causes disturbance or annoyance to users of the parking place, occupants of neighbouring premises or passers-by.
- 10 (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in a position other than in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 hereof a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position is in accordance with the said provisions.
- (2) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, or is abandoned, a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may remove the vehicle from that parking place or arrange for such removal and the Council shall be entitled to recover as a civil debt from any person responsible such charges in respect of the removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle as the Council may require in accordance with Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.
- (3) For the purpose of meeting the requirements of an emergency, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police officer in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a parking place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place.
- (4) Any person altering, or causing the alteration of, the position of a vehicle by virtue of paragraph (1) of this Article, or removing, or causing the removal of, a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary.
- (5) Any person removing or arranging for the removal of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article, shall make such arrangements as he considers to be reasonably necessary for the safety of the vehicle in the place to which it is removed.
- 11 (1) Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:
- (a) indicating where parking is prohibited, or
 - (b) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place, or
 - (c) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place,

no person shall leave a vehicle in a place where parking is indicated to be prohibited or drive or permit to be driven any vehicle:-

(i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance, or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated, or

(ii) in a direction other than so specified.

(2) Any person in a parking place shall comply with any reasonable direction by a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police officer in uniform whether as to the driving or positioning of a vehicle or otherwise and shall upon request provide his name and address and the name and address of the owner of the vehicle which he or she is driving.

12 The Council accepts no responsibility, either at common law or under the Occupiers Liability Act 1957, or otherwise, for loss of or damage to vehicles or other property left in any of the Council's parking places.

SCHEDULE

PART II

1 COUNCIL OFFICES, CHILTERN AVENUE, AMERSHAM PARKING PLACE

- i) On weekdays Monday to Friday inclusive the parking place shall be utilised for parking by users authorised by Chiltern District Council and no other person during the period specified, except where expressly provided for in writing.
- ii) Except as provided by paragraph (i) hereto the parking place may be used by the public on weekdays Monday to Friday inclusive between the hours of 5.30 pm and midnight at no charge.
- iii) The parking place may also be used by the public on Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays without any restriction on the length of period of parking and at no charge.

2 CIVIC CENTRE PARKING PLACE, AMERSHAM

- i) A driver shall not cause a motor vehicle to wait or permit it to be left in the parking place for more than three hours in any period of 4 hours during the period 7.30 am to 6.00 pm on Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- ii) A driver using the Civic Centre Car Park, for a period of half an hour, may do so free of charge but shall obtain a free ticket from the ticket machine and display it in their vehicle in accordance with Article 4 of this Order.

3 CHILTERN AVENUE PARKING PLACE, AMERSHAM

A driver shall not cause a vehicle to wait or permit it to be left in the parking place for more than one five hour period per ticket purchased during the period 7.30 am to 6.00 pm on Monday to Saturday inclusive.

4 CATLINGS PARKING PLACE, CHESHAM

A driver shall not cause a vehicle to wait or permit it be left in the parking place for more than one four hour period during the period 7.30 am to 4.00 pm on Monday to Saturday inclusive.

5 STAR YARD PARKING PLACE, CHESHAM

A driver shall not cause a vehicle to wait or permit it be left in the parking place for more than one three hour period during the period 7.30 am to 6.00 pm on Monday to Saturday inclusive.

6 SNELLS WOOD, LITTLE CHALFONT PARKING PLACE

- i) A driver shall not cause a vehicle to wait or permit it to be left in the parking place for more than one five-hour period per ticket purchased during the period 7.30 am to 6.00 pm on Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- ii) A fixed number of permits which are not transferable between parking places but are transferable between the users to whom the permits have been issued are available for use by local residents or local businesses in the parking place, without time restriction, at the same charge as a Group B Season Ticket.

7 THE CHILTERN POOLS, AMERSHAM

- i) The parking place may only be used by customers of The Chiltern Pools, Amersham.
- ii) A driver shall not cause a vehicle in Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 to wait or permit it to be left in the parking place for more than one three-hour period per ticket purchased during the period 7.30 am to 6.00 pm on Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- iii) A driver shall not cause a vehicle in Class 6 to wait or permit it to be left in the designated marked bay for Class 6 vehicles in the parking place for more than 2 hours.

8 VEHICLES EXCEEDING 1525 kg IN UNLADEN WEIGHT (CLASS 5) AND PASSENGER CARRYING VEHICLES (CLASS 6)

Vehicles which exceed 1525 kg unladen weight and passenger carrying vehicles with a capacity of over 12 seats may park between the hours of 6.00 pm and 7.30 am only, Monday to Sunday inclusive, at a charge of £6.00 at the following parking places:

9 ELECTRIC VEHICLES (CLASS 7)

Electric Vehicles (Class 7) may be left in an electric vehicle parking bay, whilst charging or not charging the vehicle, at the following parking places:

- a) Multi-Storey Car Park, Amersham
- b) Church Lane Car Park, Chalfont St Peter
- c) Albany Place Car Park, Chesham
- d) Water Meadow Car Park, Chesham
- e) Link Road Car Park, Great Missenden

The appropriate parking charge must be paid, in accordance with this Order, and as indicated in the parking place.

10 AMERSHAM MULTI-STOREY CAR PARK

- i) A number of reserved spaces are available to specifically, designated season ticket holders for their exclusive use on payment the charge set out in accordance with Column 5 of Part I of the Schedule.
- ii) A section of the Car Park is reserved for London Underground Staff who display a valid London Underground permit.
- iii) Smoking is prohibited within the Multi-storey complex.
- v) Members of the public may not park:
 - a. in a space specifically reserved for designated season ticket holders.
 - b. in the section of the parking place reserved for London Underground Staff.

11 AMERSHAM OLD TOWN CAR PARK, AMERSHAM PARKING PLACE

Vehicles with a width in excess of 2 metres (6ft 6ins) are not permitted to use the parking place as the entrance and exit are restricted by the use of rising bollards.

12 SYCAMORE ROAD, AMERSHAM PARKING PLACE

Market Traders' vehicles may be parked in the parking place on Tuesdays only at a charge of £4.00 per day.

13 WATER MEADOW, CHESHAM PARKING PLACE

Market Traders' vehicles may be parked in the parking place on Wednesdays and Saturdays at a charge of £4.00 per day.

14 LOADING AND UNLOADING

Vehicles in Class 5 (exceeding 1525 kg unladen weight) may remain stationary in the following car parks for the purpose of constant and reasonable loading or unloading at any premises accessed from the said car parks provided that no such vehicle shall be left unattended for a period in excess of 10 minutes. The Car Parks where such loading and unloading is permitted are Star Yard, Chesham; Catlings, Chesham; the Access Road which forms part of the Saffron Meadow Car Park, Chesham; Albany Place, Chesham; Water Meadow, Chesham; Sycamore Road, Amersham; Blizzards Yard, Chalfont St Giles; Church Lane, Chalfont St Peter.

15 INTER-AVAILABILITY OF SEASON TICKETS

Season tickets issued in respect of a parking place in Group A may be used in any parking place in Groups A, B, C or D. Season tickets issued in respect of a parking place in Group B may be used in any parking place in Groups B, C or D. Season tickets issued in respect of a parking place in Group C may be used in any parking place in Groups C or D. Season tickets issued in respect of a parking place in Group D may be used in any parking place in Group D only.
