

**The County of Cornwall (Falmouth) (Acacia Road and Oakfield Road)
(One-Way) Order 2023**

THE CORNWALL COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as 'the Act of 1984') and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into force on the 8th day of *November* 2024 and may be cited as "The County of Cornwall (Falmouth) (Acacia Road and Oakfield Road) (One-Way) Order 2023".
2. Unless expressly stated to the contrary, any reference in this Order to:
 - (a) any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated or re-enacted by, or as having effect by virtue of, any subsequent enactment;
 - (b) a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order; and
 - (c) any reference to a length or lengths of road, is a reference to a length or lengths of road in Cornwall.
3. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

"enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and

"Map Tiles" means the plans, including their keys, contained in the Schedule to this Order, which identify the lengths of road, sides of any length of road, or points between or on any length of road to which the prohibitions and restrictions contained within this Order apply, as well as any exceptions or time periods applicable to these and, except where provided for under any provision of this Order, are to be read in addition to and not in derogation of each other.
4. Save as provided in Article 5, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in any of the lengths of road identified on the Map Tiles as One Way, other than in the direction specified on those plans.

5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to enter or proceed in the lengths of road referred to in those Articles if the vehicle is being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.

Map page indicator

Shows current map number against total and indicates if the legend is split over multiple pages eg. 2a, 2b, 2c

Change type

Indicates whether restrictions have been Added, Modified or Removed

Coloured spots

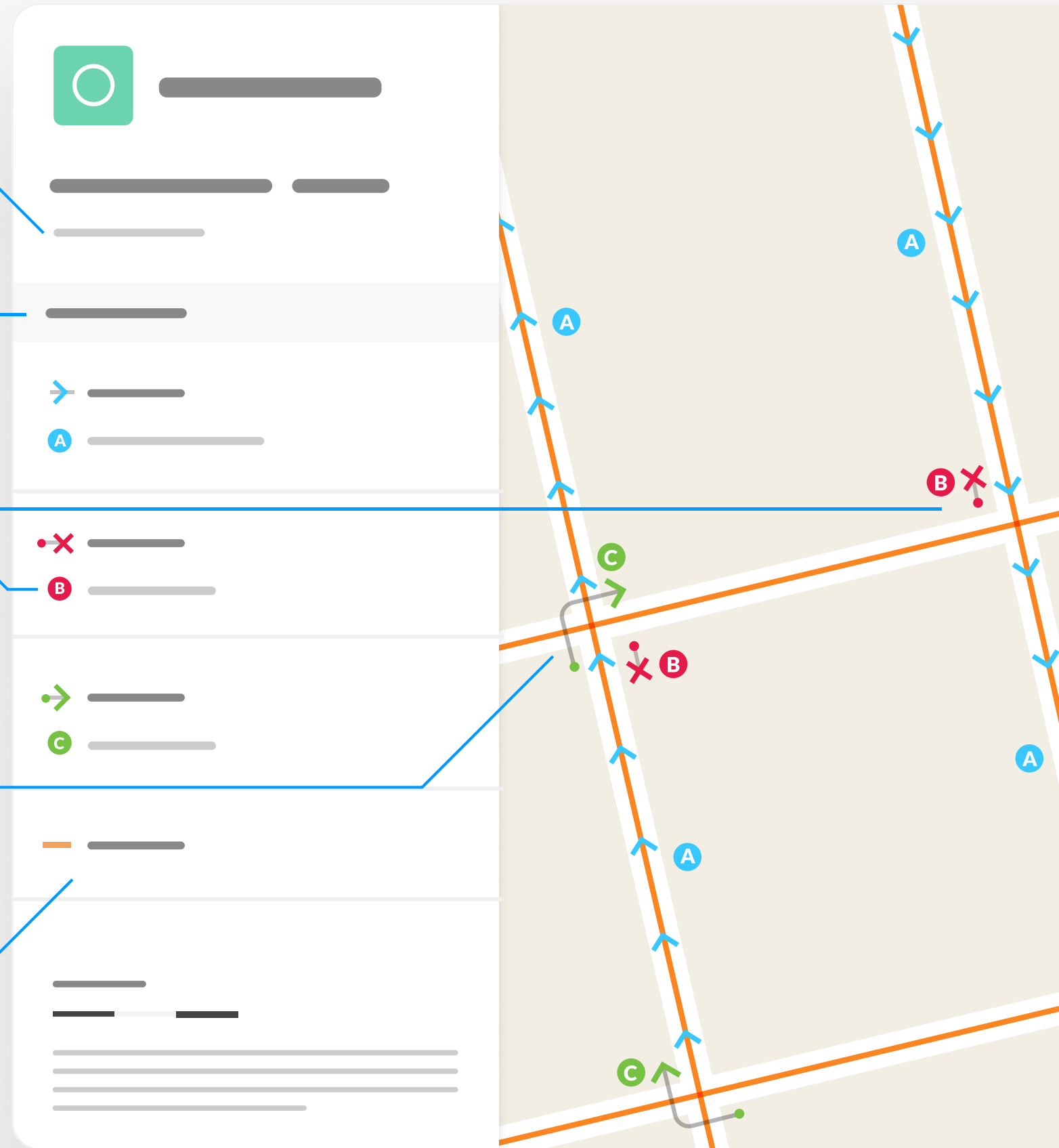
Restrictions with different attributes are marked with a lettered spot

Turn directions

Prohibited and prescribed turns start from the spot and end at the arrow to indicate the direction of travel

Restriction durations

Where no hours are specified the restriction applies at all times
