

CITY OF COVENTRY
(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2005

The Council of the City of Coventry ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act ") as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991("the 1991 Act" and under the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure)(England and Wales) Regulations 1996 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, makes the following Order:

PART I
GENERAL

Citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 4th day of April 2005 and may be cited as the City of Coventry (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2005

Revocation

2. The City of Coventry` (Off Street Parking Places) Order 2001 is hereby revoked.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the following expressions shall have the following meanings:

"the Council" means Coventry City Council or any body or organisation duly appointed and acting as the agent(s) of Coventry City Council in the control and maintenance of its off-street parking places, and more specifically includes "C V One Limited" registered in England and Wales under Company No.04323910;

"disabled person's badge" means a badge in the form legally prescribed and issued by a local authority for display on a motor vehicle driven by a disabled person, or used for the carriage of a disabled person or of several disabled persons, or any duplicate badge so issued;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge and which is a vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting has been or is _

to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case may be, used for carrying disabled person(s) as passenger(s);

"driver" means any person driving or in charge of a vehicle at any time whilst entering, within, or leaving a parking place;

"duty pass" means a pass issued by the Council to staff who require parking facilities in order to carry out their duties efficiently;

"goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description or a trailer so constructed or adapted;

"immobilisation device" means any device or appliance designed or adapted to be fixed to a vehicle for the purpose of preventing it from being driven or otherwise put in motion;

"invalid carriage" means a mechanically propelled vehicle of which the weight unladen does not exceed 254 kilograms and which is specially designed and constructed, and not merely adapted, for the use of a person suffering from some physical default or disability and is used solely by such a person;

"motor car" means a mechanically propelled vehicle, not being a motor cycle or an invalid carriage, which is constructed itself to carry a load or passengers and which complies with the specifications given in Section 136 (2) of the Act of 1984;

"motor cycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an invalid carriage) with fewer than four wheels, of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms;

"motor vehicle" means subject to section 20 of the Chronically Sick, and Disabled Persons Act 1970 (which makes special provision with respect to invalid carriages) a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads;

"owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom such vehicle is kept. In determining who was the owner of a vehicle at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the vehicle Excise Registration Act 1994;

"parking attendant" means a person duly authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise parking places and enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order;

"parking bay" means any area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a motor vehicle and is indicated by markings on the surface of that parking place;

"parking place" means a place specified in Column (1) of Schedules 1 to 3, where vehicles may park;

"parking ticket" means a ticket issued by a ticket machine pursuant to this Order;

"pay station" means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State for Transport for the purpose inter alia of this order being apparatus designed to receive payment in respect of pay on foot parking;

"pay and display" in relation to a parking place means a parking place where the driver makes payment by the insertion of the appropriate sum of coins into a ticket machine whereby a ticket is issued and must be exhibited in accordance with Article 38 of this Order;

"pay on foot" in relation to a parking place means a parking place where the driver makes payment of the amount due according to Article 36 of this Order, to a machine situated in the vicinity of the exit of the parking place, allowing exit of the vehicle to be facilitated;

"penalty charge" means the charge set by the Council under the provisions of the 1991 Act;

"relevant position" means:

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the appropriate pay and display ticket, staff duty pass or season ticket is exhibited with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen;
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the appropriate pay and display ticket, staff duty pass or season ticket is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle so that the details on the ticket, pass or badge are legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (c) in respect of a disabled person's badge, the badge is displayed in accordance with Regulation 12 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"season ticket" means a ticket purchased from the Council valid for the period and for use in parking places specified on the ticket;

"trailer" means a vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle;

"ticket machine" means an apparatus of a type and design, approved by the Secretary of State for Transport, for the purpose, inter alia, of this Order, being apparatus designed to indicate the time by a clock, and to issue parking tickets which show that a payment has been made of an amount, or for a period specified thereon, and which specify the date and either the time of such payment, or the time at which the vehicle must leave the parking place.

4. Except where the context requires otherwise, any reference in this Order to an Article or Schedule shall be construed as a reference to that Article or Schedule in this Order.
5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

PART II

USE OF PARKING PLACES

Designation of parking places

6. The parking places specified in Schedules 1 to 3 of this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving of all vehicles except vehicles exceeding 1525kg unladen weight and vehicles adapted to carry more than 8 passengers exclusive of the driver.

Use of parking places

7. Where in Schedules 1 to 3 a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in that parking place unless it is of the class and in the position so specified.
8. Where within a parking place there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a parking bay is available only for a permit holder or season ticket holder no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in that parking bay unless it displays_

in the relevant position a current parking permit or season ticket issued by the Council for that vehicle to wait in the said place.

Disabled persons parking bays

9. Where within a parking place there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a parking bay is available only for a disabled person's vehicle no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in that parking bay unless it is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge.

Position of vehicles

10. Vehicles permitted to wait in the parking places specified in Schedules 1 to 3 and Article 6 shall be positioned so that:
 - (i) motor cycles shall be left entirely within bays (if any) marked "motor cycles";
 - (ii) all other vehicles permitted to wait in the parking places as specified in Schedules 1 to 3 shall be left entirely within any other bays marked on the surface.
11. A driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to wait in such a position so as to prevent or obstruct access to or from a parking place or its use by other persons or so as to prevent or obstruct access to or from any parking bay or its use by other persons.

Parking uses only

12. No person shall except with the permission of a person authorised by the Council in that behalf drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in a parking place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.

Direction of travel of vehicles

13. The driver of any motor vehicle in a parking place shall comply with any instructions given, whether orally by a person duly authorised by the Council, by direction signs, or by any other manner provided as to the route to be followed within the parking place.
14. When an automatic barrier is raised or lowered to permit a motor vehicle into a parking place, the driver shall proceed through without unreasonable delay, and shall proceed through in the prescribed direction and in accordance with any signals displayed at the entrance or exit of a parking place.

Car park full

15. When in respect of any parking place a notice is displayed at the entrance indicating that the parking place is fully occupied, no person shall take or attempt to take a vehicle into that parking place.

Restrictions of use of vehicles

16. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking bay, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the motor vehicle in, or to depart from, the parking bay.
17. No person shall use a motor vehicle, or a trailer, whilst it is in a parking place, for the purpose of any trade, business, profession, or employment (whether paid or unpaid and whether for profit or otherwise).
18. No person shall use, for any period of time, a motor vehicle, or trailer, whilst in a parking place for camping or as a place of residence or for any domestic purpose.
19. No person shall use a motor vehicle within a parking place to ply for hire or accept passengers for hire.
20. No person shall take any vehicle carrying inflammable or dangerous substances which might cause damage by fire or explosion, or which might endanger human life by toxic or other effects (other than in a fuel tank supplying the engine of the vehicle) on to any parking place.
21. No person shall carry out or permit to be carried out any work of cleaning, maintenance or repair to a motor vehicle while it is in a parking place unless it is necessary to enable the motor vehicle to be moved from the parking place or without prior written consent of the Council.

Other provisions

22. No person shall cause or take part in any gathering or demonstration, or cause any unreasonable or unnecessary noise so as to disturb or be a nuisance to users of a parking place or residents in the neighbourhood of a parking place.

23. No person shall, within any parking place, throw down, drop, or otherwise deposit or dispose of, any litter or soil or otherwise debase any part of any parking place.
24. No person other than a person duly authorised by the Council shall fix to any part of a parking place, or to any fence enclosing a parking place, or to any vehicle parked in a parking place, any notice or any advertisement or other literature, nor shall any person, other than a person duly authorised by the Council, distribute or display any notice, advertisement or other literature within any parking place without the prior written consent of the Council.
- Any person who contravenes this article will be liable for the cost of any damage caused to Council property and the cost to the Council in removing such notices, advertisements or other literature.
25. In those parking places where stairways, lifts or designated pedestrian ramps are provided for the purpose of gaining access to or egress from an upper level, no person shall gain access to or egress from an upper level by any means other than by such stairways, lifts or designated pedestrian ramps.
26. Any person who damages in any way or interferes with the fabric or structure or equipment of any parking place, shall be liable to the Council for the cost of repairing that damage.
27. No person shall use any parking place for the playing of any game, the riding of pedal cycles or the riding of any skateboard, roller blades or skates except where specific provision is made.

Liability

28. The Council shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to any motor vehicle or to any property contained in the motor vehicle from any cause whatsoever unless caused by the Council's own negligence, whilst entering, within or leaving a parking place.

Movement and removal of vehicles

29. When a motor vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of Articles 8 or 9 of this Order, any person authorised by the Council may move the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved so that it complies with the requirements of the Order and neither such a person nor the Council shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the vehicle or to

any property contained within that vehicle where arising from, or in consequence of, the removal of the vehicle unless it was caused by the Council's own negligence.

30. When a motor vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of Articles 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 58 of this Order or in the event of an emergency, any person authorised by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place and neither such a person nor the Council shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the vehicle or to any property contained within that vehicle where arising from, or in consequence of, the removal of the vehicle unless it was caused by the Council's own negligence.
31. Any expenses incurred by the Council in removing a vehicle within or from any parking place shall be recoverable by the Council from the driver or owner of the vehicle as a contract or civil debt.
32. Any person removing a motor vehicle in accordance with Articles 29 or 30 may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he / she may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he / she may think reasonably necessary to remove it and in doing so shall provide for the safe keeping of the vehicle.
33. Where a vehicle has been removed from a parking place in accordance with Article 30, the Council may dispose of it in accordance with Article 66.

Immobilisation

34. If a vehicle is left after a penalty charge has been incurred, a parking attendant in uniform or a person acting under his direction may attach to the vehicle an immobilisation device and a notice in accordance with the requirements of section 69(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Act 1991 and that vehicle shall only be released from the device on payment of the penalty charge, or as the case may be a reduced penalty charge, along with such release fee as may be required by the Council.

PART III

CHARGES FOR PARKING

Charge

35. Any person leaving a vehicle in a parking place specified in Schedules 1 to 3 in respect of which there is a charge specified in Schedules 4 to 8 during the charging hours shall pay the appropriate charge for the corresponding period of waiting on that day as specified in Schedules 4 to 8.

Pay on foot

36. The parking places described as pay on foot car parks in Schedules 1 to 3 shall be controlled by entry and exit barriers. The driver of a vehicle shall gain entry to such parking places by taking a ticket at the entry barrier. This ticket shall be submitted to a pay station at the end of the parking period and validated by making a payment in accordance with the parking tariffs shown respectively for the said parking places in Schedules 4 to 8. The validated ticket shall then be used to operate the exit barrier.
37. In the event that the driver of a vehicle is unable to produce a ticket through loss or any other cause whatsoever exit may be achieved by applying to C V One Limited and making payment as instructed at the full daily rate specified in Schedules 4 to 8 for each day or part thereof during which the vehicle has been left in the parking place.

Pay and display

38. The driver of a vehicle left during the charging hours in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place described as a Pay and Display car park in Schedules 1 to 3 shall purchase a valid parking ticket at the price and for the period indicated in Schedules 4 to 8 and exhibit the parking ticket on the vehicle in the relevant position at all times that the vehicle is in the parking place.
39. A parking ticket used in a parking place described as a Pay and Display car park in Schedules 1 to 3 shall only be a valid parking ticket if:
- (i) it has been purchased from a ticket machine in the parking place where the vehicle is left;
 - (ii) it is exhibited on the vehicle in the relevant position: and

(iii) .it has been so purchased and displayed so that one ticket per vehicle shall be valid for the number of hours or for the period specified on the ticket commencing if purchased during charging hours at the time of purchase or if purchased outside charging hours at the beginning of the next following period of charging hours.

40. The charge in a pay and display car park referred to in Article 35 shall be payable by the purchase of a valid parking ticket by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins into the ticket machine situated on the parking place.

Period of waiting

41. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a pay and display parking place specified in Schedules 1 to 3 for longer than the period for which payment was made.

Expiry of time period

42. The expiry of the period for which the charge specified for pay and display car parks in Schedules 1 to 3 has been paid shall be indicated when there is exhibited on the vehicle a valid parking ticket and the time shown on the clock of the said ticket machine is later than the time at which the period for which a charge has been paid expired.

Failure to pay charge

43. If at any time while a vehicle is left in a pay and display parking place no valid parking ticket is displayed in the relevant position, the relevant charge shall be deemed not to have been paid unless the contrary is proved.

Indications as evidence

44. The indications given by any ticket machine or any parking ticket issued by it shall be treated as evidence of the facts which the ticket machine or parking ticket purports to record.

Restriction on removal of parking tickets

45. When a parking ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle no person shall remove the parking ticket from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place.

Tickets non-transferrable

46. The parking ticket referred to in Article 39 shall not be valid if it has been transferred from one vehicle to another.

Absence of ticket machine

47. If at the time when a vehicle is left in a parking place described as a pay and display car park in Schedules 1 to 3 during the charging hours there is no ticket machine at the parking place, or all the ticket machines at that parking place carry notices placed upon them by a person duly authorised by the council indicating that they are out of order, the driver of that vehicle shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket.

Motor cycles

48. The driver of a motor cycle which is left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place in the position specified for such vehicles (if any) as specified in Article 10 and Schedules 1 to 3, shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket.

Disabled persons' vehicles

49. The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place described in Schedules 1 to 3 shall be exempt,
- (a) from paying for parking in a pay on foot car park, and
 - (b) from purchasing a pay and display parking ticket ,
- if the vehicle is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge.

Season tickets

50. Season tickets shall be available as specified in Schedule 9 but each season ticket shall be valid only as specified on the season ticket conditions of use document.
51. The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provision of this Order in a parking place described as a Pay on Foot car park in Schedules 1 to 3 shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket for any period in respect of which a valid season ticket /key card used in accordance with the season ticket conditions of use document and has been used to gain access through the entry and exit barriers.
52. The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place described as a pay and display car park in Schedules 1 to 3 shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket if there is displayed in the relevant position a valid

season ticket purchased from the Council and used in accordance with the season ticket conditions of use document.

53. The price of a season ticket shall be as specified in Schedule 9.

Duty passes

54. The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in a parking place shall be exempt from payment of any pay on foot charge and from purchasing a pay and display ticket if there is displayed in the relevant position a valid duty pass issued by the Council.
55. A duty pass shall not be used by any person other than the City Council employee(s) to whom it was authorised for use and the duty pass is only valid if it is being used in compliance with the conditions specified for its use.

PART IV

SUSPENSION OF PARKING PLACE

Power to close parking places

56. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Council by notice, sign or barrier displayed in the parking place:
- (a) from closing the parking place or any part thereof for any period; and/or
 - (b) from setting aside the parking place or any part or parts thereof on all days or on certain days or during certain parts of days for use only by particular vehicles or organisations.
57. Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of Article 56 shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a notice or traffic sign indicating that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
58. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place or any part thereof during such periods that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended or during such period as there is in or adjacent thereto a notice or traffic sign placed by or on behalf of the Council in pursuance of the preceding Article.

PART V

CONTRAVENTIONS AND PENALTY CHARGE

Contraventions

59. If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of or without complying with any Article of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable and/or the vehicle may be removed from that location or parking place

Penalty charge notice

60. Where a penalty charge may have been incurred it shall be the duty of the parking attendant to issue a penalty charge notice which shall include the information required by the 1991 Act.

Payment of the penalty charge notice

61. The owner of the vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge has been incurred shall pay the penalty charge to the Council as indicated on the penalty charge notice.

Indications as evidence

62. The particulars given in the penalty charge notice attached to a vehicle in accordance with this Article shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such penalty charge.

Restriction on removal of a penalty charge notice

63. When a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with any of the foregoing provisions of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, a police constable in uniform, a parking attendant or some other person duly authorised by the Council shall remove the penalty charge notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

PART VI

ABANDONED VEHICLES

Removal of a vehicle from parking places

64. Where a person duly authorised by the Council is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in this Order have been contravened, or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place, he / she may, under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986, remove the vehicle or cause it to be removed from the parking place, and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

Disposal of vehicles abandoned in parking places

65. Where a vehicle is considered by the Council to be abandoned in a parking place the following provisions shall apply.

- (i) The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of a vehicle which has been, or could at any time be, removed from a parking place pursuant to Article 30, if the vehicle appears to have been abandoned, provided that this power of disposal shall not be exercisable unless the Council has taken such of the following steps as are applicable to the vehicle in question, and there has elapsed a period of six weeks beginning with the taking of the first of those steps.
- (ii) Where the vehicle carries a registration mark the Council shall ascertain from the appropriate body the name and address of the person who is the Registered Keeper of the vehicle pursuant to the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971, unless the Council is satisfied that the true owner of the vehicle has identified himself to it.
- (iii) The Council shall, where it is by virtue of paragraphs (ii), (iv) and (v) of this Article, aware of the name and address of a person who it appears may be the owner of the vehicle, send a Notice to that person at that address stating that it is the intention of the Council to sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle (which shall be sufficiently described in the Notice) on or after a specified date (which shall not be less than two weeks from the date of the Notice and in any event not earlier than six weeks from the date of the first step taken by the Council under this Part of this Order) unless it is in the meantime removed by or on behalf of that person from

such place as is specified by the Council in the said Notice or from such place as may be subsequently notified in writing by the Council to that person.

- (iv) If any person to whom a Notice is sent in accordance with paragraph (iii) of this Article informs the Council of the name and address of some other person who he alleges may be the owner of the vehicle, a Notice stating the particulars mentioned in the last preceding Article shall be sent to that other person and to any further person who the Council may in consequence of the sending of the Notice to the said other person be led to believe may be the owner of the vehicle.
- (v) Where a vehicle does not carry a registration mark the first step to be taken by the Council shall be to apply in writing to the Chief Officer of Police in whose area the parking place is situated enquiring whom that officer considers is the owner of the vehicle and the address of that person.
- (vi) The Council shall then make such further enquiries as to ownership as it thinks fit.
- (vii) Upon the sale of a vehicle by the Council, the Council shall apply the proceeds of sale in or towards the satisfaction of any costs incurred by it in connection with the disposal thereof and of any charge or payment to which it is entitled.
- (viii) In the event that any such costs incurred by the Council in connection with the disposal of the vehicle are not satisfied by virtue of the last preceding Article, the Council may recoup those costs from the person who was the owner of the vehicle immediately before it was removed from the parking place, provided that that person was sent by the Council a Notice under paragraph (iii) of this Article.
- (ix) Any sums received by the Council on a sale of a vehicle shall, after deducting any sum applied thereabouts by virtue of paragraph (vii) of this Article, be payable within a period of one year from receipt hereof to any person to whom, but for such sale, the vehicle would have belonged and insofar as any such sums are not claimed within the said period they shall be paid into the General Rate Fund of the Council.
- (x) Where under the foregoing provisions of this Order a Notice is required to be or may be sent to a person the Notice shall be sent by recorded delivery post.
