

THE COUNTY OF CUMBRIA (VARIOUS ROADS, BARROW-IN-FURNESS)
(CONSOLIDATION AND MINOR AMENDMENT OF
TRAFFIC REGULATIONS) (ORDER 2001) VARIATION ORDER (NO.1)-2002

The County Council of Cumbria in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (4), 19, 32, 35, 35A, 38, 45, 46, 47, 49, 51, 53 and 64 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Cumbria in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on 15th July 2002 and may be cited as The County of Cumbria (Various Roads, Barrow-in-Furness) (Consolidation and Minor Amendment of Traffic Regulations) (Order 2001) Variation Order (No. 1) Order 2002
2. For the purposes of this Order the expression "the 2001 Order" shall mean The County of Cumbria (Various Roads, Barrow-in-Furness) (Consolidation and Minor Amendment of Traffic Regulations) Order 2001
3. The 2001 Order shall have effect as though:-
 - (a) The lengths of road specified in Schedule VII "Prohibition of Waiting At Any Time" to this Order were added as item numbers 1090, 1091 and 1092 to Schedule VII thereto;
 - (b) The lengths of road specified in Schedule XLIV "Residents Only Parking Place (At All Times)" to this Order were added as Schedule XLIV thereto;
 - (c) The lengths of road specified in Schedule XLV "Residents Only Parking - Place Monday - Saturday, 8.00 am - 6.00 pm" to this Order were added as Schedule XLV thereto;
 - (d) The lengths of road specified in Schedule XLVI "Limited Waiting Parking Place, Monday - Saturday, 8.00 am - 6.00 pm, Waiting Limited to 30 Minutes, No Return within 1 Hour" to this Order were added as Schedule XLVI thereto;
 - (e) Article 2(1) the entry relating to "prescribed hours", 31(a) was amended to include reference to Schedule XLIV and 31 (b) was amended to include reference to Schedules XLV and XLVI;
 - (f) The following was inserted as Article 7(5):-

"Save as provided in Article 23, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 am and 6.00 pm on any day other than a Sunday, in the lengths of road or sides of road specified in Schedule XLVI:-

 - (a) for a longer period than 30 minutes; or

(b) if a period of less than one hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same length of road”.

(g) The following was inserted as Article 7(6):-

“Save as provided in Article 23A, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, at any time, on any day, in the lengths of road or sides of road specified in Schedule XLIV”.

(h) The following was inserted as Article 7(7):-

“Save as provided in Article 23A, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 am and 6.00 pm, on any day other than a Sunday, at any time, on any day, in the lengths of road or sides of road specified in Schedule XLV”.

(i) Article 8 was amended to include reference to Schedules XLIV, XLV and XLVI also;

(j) The following was added as Article 23A:-

“Nothing in Articles 7(6) and 7(7) of this Order shall apply to a vehicle waiting during the prescribed hours in a parking place specified in Schedules XLIV and XLV to this Order if the vehicle is

- (a) waiting only so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to enable goods or merchandise to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (b) waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid accidents;
- (c) a vehicle used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of a local authority or water authority which is being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) waiting to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (e) in the service of or employed by the Post Office and is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle, or, having been unloaded therefrom, or are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or is in use in

connection with the servicing of posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting;

- (f) being used by a statutory undertaker or its contractor in connection with any building operation or demolition, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act, 1984;
 - (g) in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwellinghouse to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
 - (h) in actual use in connection with the removal of a coffin containing the remains of a deceased person to or from premises situate on or adjacent to that parking place;
 - (i) if goods are being sold or offered or exposed for sale from a vehicle by a person who is licensed by a local authority to sell goods from a stationary vehicle on a pitch situated in a parking place;
 - (j) displaying in the relevant position a valid resident's permit.
- (k) The following was added as Part XXIIIA and Articles 86A- 86P inclusive:-

PART XXIIIA

APPLICATION FOR RESIDENTS ONLY PARKING PERMITS

"86A(i) A resident of Even Numbers 4 to 30 and Odd Numbers 1 to 23 Warwick Street, Barrow-in-Furness and No. 1 West View Road, Barrow-in-Furness, who is the owner or registered keeper of a vehicle, being:-

- (i) a motor vehicle;
- (ii) a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods of any description the overall length of which does not exceed 5.00 metres and the overall height of which does not exceed 2.28 metres;
- (iii) a motor cycle with or without a side-car; or
- (iv) an invalid car,

may apply to the Council for the issue of a resident parking permit in respect of that vehicle for the residents only parking place specified in Schedule XLIV hereto .

(ii) A resident of Even Numbers 144 to 156 Abbey Road, Even Numbers 2 to 38, Even Numbers 42 to 98, Even Numbers 132 to 202, Odd Numbers 145 to 199 inclusive of Park Avenue, Barrow-in-Furness, and No. 79 Lorne Road, Barrow-in-Furness, who is the owner or registered keeper of a vehicle, being:-

- (i) a motor vehicle;
- (ii) a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods of any description the overall length of which does not exceed 5.00 metres and the overall height of which does not exceed 2.28 metres;
- (iii) a motor cycle with or without a side-car; or
- (iv) an invalid car,

may apply to the Council for the issue of a resident parking permit in respect of that vehicle for the residents only parking place specified in Schedule XLV hereto .

86B. Any application made in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article shall include such particulars as the Council may from time to time require.

86C. The Council may require an applicant for a permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in support of their application as may be reasonably required by the Council to verify any particulars or information given to it by the applicant.

86D. Any resident who is unable to provide the Council with such information as it may reasonably require in connection with his application may apply to the Council for the issue of a visitors permit under the provisions of Article 86I.

86E. Residents permits are not transferable nor do they have any effect outside the street specified on that permit.

Issue of Permits

86F. Upon receipt of an application for a parking permit made in accordance with Article 86A hereof the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is either the owner or registered keeper of a vehicle referred to in his application, shall issue a parking permit for that vehicle to the applicant.

86G. A parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 86F shall allow the vehicle in respect of which the permit is issued to park in any of those parking places listed in Schedule XLIV and XLV to this Order as the Council shall, at its discretion, think fit for the applicant's needs.

86H. Subject to the provisions of Articles 92 and 101, the Council shall not be obliged to issue a residents parking permit to an applicant for such a permit if two or more residents parking permits have previously been issued to any person or persons (as the case may be) residing at the same address as the applicant and at least two of those permits are valid at the time an application under Article 86A is made.

PART XXIII

APPLICATION FOR VISITOR'S PARKING PERMITS

86I. Any resident may apply to the Council for the issue to him of one or more parking permits for any vehicles belonging to and used by persons visiting that resident being vehicles of the types referred to in Article 86A.

86J. An application for a permit under Article 86I shall include such information and particulars as the Council may from time to time require and the Council shall be under no obligation to consider any application which is not made in accordance with the provisions of this article.

86K. The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit under Article 86I to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of their application as the Council may reasonably require in order to verify any information or particulars given to them by the applicant.

Issue of Permits

86L. Upon receipt of an application for a parking permit under Article 86I the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident shall issue a parking permit or permits (as the case may be) for the vehicles referred to in that application to the applicant.

86M. A parking permit issued under the provisions of Article 86L shall allow those vehicles in respect of which the permit was issued to park in any of those parking places listed in Schedules XLIV and XLV to this Order as the Council shall at its

discretion think fit for the needs of the applicant and his visitors.

86N. The Council may, at its absolute discretion, limit the number of visitors parking permits to be issued to any particular household at any one time and may require any used visitors parking permits to be produced and surrendered before any further permits are issued.

86O. A visitors parking permit shall be valid on any particular day or days (as the case may be) if and only if the date in question and the registration mark of the vehicle on which the permit is displayed are shown in such manner as may be required by the Council.

86P. Where an application for a visitors parking permit is made under Article 86I that application shall be treated as an application under Article 86A save that:-

- (1) any visitors parking permit issued pursuant to an application under Article 86I shall only be valid for a maximum period of one month; and
- (2) only one such visitors parking permit may be issued to any one resident"

4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

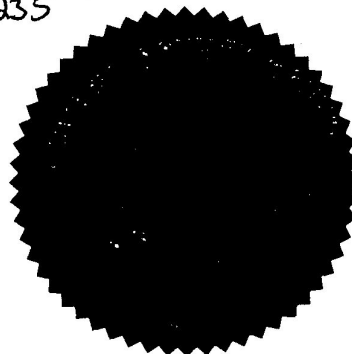

- (2) Park Avenue, Barrow-in-Furness, the north-east side from a point 10 metres north-west of its junction with Lorne Road for a distance of 10 metres in a north-west direction
- (3) Park Avenue, Barrow-in-Furness, the south-west side from a point 3 metres south-east of its junction with Back Abbey Road to a point 3 metres north-west of its junction with Back Greengate Street
- (4) Park Avenue, Barrow-in-Furness, the south-west side from a point 5 metres south-east of its junction with Back Abbey Road to a point 5 metres north-west of its junction with Back Greengate Street

4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

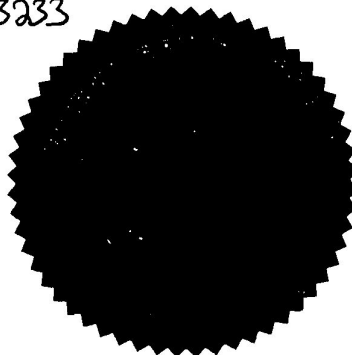

1. Barrow Borough Council hereby gives notice that on 17th August 2001 it made the above named Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
2. The Order will become operative on 3rd September 2001 and the effect of the Order will be to:-
 Amend the Off-Street Parking Places Orders detailed in the Schedule below to take account of the provisions of the Road Traffic Act 1991 and the Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Areas) (County of Cumbria) (Borough of Barrow-in-Furness) Order 2001, which comes into force on 3rd September 2001 and introduces a system of decriminalised parking enforcement throughout the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness.
