THE COUNTY OF CUMBRIA (VARIOUS ROADS, CARLISLE URBAN AND RURAL AREA)(CONSOLIDATION AND MINOR AMENDMENT OF TRAFFIC REGULATIONS) (ORDER 2001) VARIATION ORDER (NO. 19) 2007

The County Council of Cumbria in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (4), 19, 32, 35, 35A, 38, 45, 46, 47, 49, 51, 53 and 64 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Cumbria in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into operation on 20 August 2007 and may be cited as The County of Cumbria (Various Roads, Carlisle Urban and Rural Area) (Consolidation and Minor Amendment of Traffic Regulations) (Order 2001) Variation Order (No. 19) Order 2007
- For the purposes of this Order the expression "the 2001 Order" shall mean The County
 of Cumbria (Various Roads, Carlisle Urban and Rural Area) (Consolidation and Minor
 Amendment of Traffic Regulations) Order 2001
- 3. The 2001 Order shall have effect as though: -
 - (a) The following was added as Part XA and Articles 28A to 28C: -

PART XA

NO WAITING EXCEPT FOR PERMIT HOLDERS "P" ONLY

28A. Save as provided in Article 28B, no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Parking Attendant, cause or permit a vehicle, other than a vehicle which is displaying a valid permit which reads "the holder is authorised to park in Parking Zone P Only", to wait at any time, on any day, in the lengths of road specified in columns 1 to 3 inclusive of Schedule XXIXA to this Order.

Exemptions

28B. Nothing in Article 28B to this Order shall apply to vehicles whose drivers have been given permission by a Police Constable in uniform.

Manner in which Police vehicles may wait

- 28C. The driver of a vehicle being used for Police purposes shall not permit it to wait in the parking places specified in Schedule XXIXA to this Order unless the vehicle is parked in the manner specified in column 4 of the said Schedule.
- (b) Schedule XXIXA hereto was added as Schedule XXIXA thereto.
