# THE HERTFORDSHIRE (LANGLEY HILL, LOVE LANE, TYLERS CLOSE AND COMMON LANE, KINGS LANGLEY) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND PROHIBITION OF STOPPING) ORDER 2004

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order may be cited as "The Hertfordshire (Langley Hill, Love Lane, Tylers Close and Common Lane, Kings Langley) (Restriction of Waiting and Prohibition of Stopping) Order 2004" and shall come into operation on Monday 20 September 2004.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 7 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in those lengths of road in Kings Langley specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 7 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 8 am and 10 am Monday to Friday or between 3 pm and 4:30 pm Monday to Friday on those lengths of road in Kings Langley specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait between the hours of 8.00am and 5.00pm Monday to Friday during school term time in those lengths of road in Kings Langley specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.

In this Article -

"school term time" has the meaning – as those days of the year which have been determined by the education authority as school days in accordance with the provisions of Section 32 of The Education Act 2002.

- 5. (1) Nothing in Articles 2, 3 or 4 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to
  - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, ambulance or Police purposes.
  - (b) Anything done with the permission of or at the direction of -
    - (i) a police officer in uniform;
    - (ii) a traffic warden;

- (iii) in respect of any of the lengths of road in the restricted area which are in a special parking area designated under Part II of the Road Traffic Act 1991 or Schedule 3 to that Act, a parking attendant appointed under section 63A of the Act of 1984;
- (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
- (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
- (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

## In this Article -

the expressions "universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

- (2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are -
  - (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
  - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
  - (d) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
  - (e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.
- 6. Nothing in Articles 2 or 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") so as to render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may be reasonably necessary
  - (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area; or
  - (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.

7. (1) Nothing in Articles 2 or 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road restricted by those Articles for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).

# (2) In this Article -

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631: 1970), coloured orange or blue, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means

- i) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-
  - a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or
  - in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle;
- ii) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
  - a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
  - b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
- 8. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

## **SCHEDULE 1**

# lengths of road in Kings Langley - no waiting at any time

- Love Lane (a) from a point 19 metres south east of the southern boundary of (south west side) Lavender Cottage north westwards then south westwards into the entrance drive of Kings Langley School, a distance of 16 metres.
  - (b) from a point 5 metres north of the south eastern boundary of Lavender Cottage southwards then south westwards into the entrance drive of Kings Langley School, a distance of 16 metres.

Common Lane (north side)

from a point 1 metre west of a point opposite the boundary between Brambles and Heathdene eastwards for 15 metres.

## SCHEDULE 2

# <u>lengths of road in Kings Langley –</u> no waiting 8 am to 10 am and 3 pm to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday

- Love Lane (a) from its junction with the south eastern kerbline of Tylers Close (north east side) south eastwards to a point in line with the south eastern boundary of 1 Love Lane, a distance of 80 metres.
  - (b) from its junction with the north western kerbline of Tylers Close north westwards then northwards for 63 metres.

Tylers Close from its junction with the north eastern kerbline of Love Lane (south east side) north eastwards for 28.5 metres.

(north west side) from its junction with the north eastern kerbline of Love Lane north eastwards for 36.5 metres.

#### **SCHEDULE 3**

lengths of road in Kings Langley – no stopping or waiting on School Keep Clear markings

Monday to Friday 8:00am to 5:00pm during school term time

Love Lane (west side)

- (a) from a point 5 metres north of the south eastern boundary of Lavender Cottage northwards for 26 metres.
- (b) from a point 19 metres south east of the southern boundary of Lavender Cottage south eastwards for 25.5 metres.


Common Lane from a point 24.5 metres south east of the boundary between (north east side) Brambles and Heathdene south eastwards for 25 metres.





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#### STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING

THE HERTFORDSHIRE (LANGLEY HILL, LOVE LANE, TYLERS CLOSE AND COMMON LANE KINGS LANGLEY) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2004

THE HERTFORDSHIRE (LANGLEY HILL, LOVE LANE, COMMON LANE, BARNS LANE, TYLERS CLOSE, BARNSWAY, HIGHFIELD AND CONISTON ROAD KINGS LANGLEY) (20MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2004.

ROAD HUMPS NOTICE (LANGLEY HILL, LOVE LANE, CHIPPERFIELD ROAD, COMMON LANE, VICARAGE LANE, BARNES LANE AND CONISTON ROAD, KINGS LANGLEY) 2004

The Hertfordshire County Council is proposing to create a 20-mph zone to complement a recently completed safety scheme on the East Side of Kings Langley. Due to the number of schools in the area the focus of the zone is to reduce speeds in the area and enhance road safety particularly for children attending the schools. It is also seeking to reduce the risk potential for injury related vehicle/pedestrian collisions.

To achieve an improvement in road safety the council intend to implement a number of proposals, these include:

- The introduction of a 20-mph zone.
- The introduction of speed control measures including Speed Cushions, Flat Top Road Humps and junction speed tables.
- The introduction of waiting restrictions to prevent inappropriate or inconsiderate parking.
- The introduction of prohibition of stopping restrictions on 'School Keep Clear' markings to render them enforceable.

All of the proposed measures have the support of local and County Councillors representing the area and Dacorum Borough Council. The Police, Fire and Rescue services and Hertfordshire County Council Passenger Transport Unit have been consulted.
