NOTICE is given that the Hertfordshire County Council has made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to introduce new waiting restrictions in Hemel Hempstead. The Order will come into effect on Monday 5 December 2011.

#### STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING

## THE HERTFORDSHIRE (LONDON ROAD LINK ROAD, LONDON ROAD AND WEYMOUTH STREET, HEMEL HEMPSTEAD) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2011

The Hertfordshire County Council are proposing to introduce new waiting restrictions in Hemel Hempstead

The new restrictions include:-

- 'No waiting at any time' restrictions in London Road Link Road, London Road and Weymouth Street
- 'No waiting between the hours of 8.30am to 5.30pm Monday to Saturday restrictions in London Road Link Road

These restrictions form part of a planning consent associated with a new residential and health centre development in the locality and are intended to improve and maximise road safety, by preventing dangerous and obstructive vehicles parking thus allowing for adequate visibility splays and sightlines to be maintained for drivers of vehicles undertaking turning manoeuvres.

All the proposed measures have been subject to consultation with local and County Councillors representing the respective areas and Dacorum Borough Council. The local Police, Ambulance, Fire and Rescue Services, Hertfordshire County Council Passenger Transport Unit and local residents have also been consulted.

# THE HERTFORDSHIRE (LONDON ROAD LINK ROAD, LONDON ROAD AND WEYMOUTH STREET, HEMEL HEMPSTEAD) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2011

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order may be cited as "The Hertfordshire (London Road Link Road, London Road and Weymouth Street, Hemel Hempstead) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 2011" and shall come into operation on Monday 5 December 2011.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in those lengths of London Road Link Road, London Road and Weymouth Street, Hemel Hempstead as specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.30am to 5.30pm Monday to Saturday on those lengths of London Road Link Road, Hemel Hempstead as specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. (1) Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to
  - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
  - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or with permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and appointed by Dacorum Borough Council.
  - (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
  - (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
  - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

In this Article -

The expressions "universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal Service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

- (2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are -
  - (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
  - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
  - (d) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or

- (e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.
- 5. Nothing in Articles 2 or 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") so as to render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may be reasonably necessary
  - (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area; or
  - (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.
- 6. (1) Nothing in Articles 2 or 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedules 1 and 2 of this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
  - (2) In this Article -

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

"parking disc" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and

"relevant position" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

- 7. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 8. The provisions of the following Order are hereby revoked but only in so far as they are affected by the restrictions imposed by this Order:

The Borough of Dacorum (Hemel Hempstead) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Consolidation) Order 2003

9. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

#### **SCHEDULE 1**

<u>lengths of London Road Link Road, London Road and Weymouth Street,</u>
<u>Hemel Hempstead – no waiting at any time</u>

London Road Link Road (south east side)

from its junction with the south west kerbline of London Road south westwards for approximately 81.5 metres to its junction with the north east kerbline of Weymouth Street.

(north west side)

- (a) from its junction with the south west kerbline of London Road south westwards for approximately 40 metres to a point 35.5 metres north east of a point in line with the north east kerbline of Weymouth Street.
- (b) from a point 45 metres south west of a point in line with the south west kerbline of London Road south westwards for approximately 15 metres

to a point 20.5 metres north east of a point in line with the north east kerbline of Weymouth Street.

(c) from its junction with the north east kerbline of Weymouth Street north eastwards for 9.5 metres.

London Road (south west side)

- (a) from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of London Road Link Road north westwards for 8.5 metres.
- (b) from a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of London Road Link Road south eastwards for 15.5 metres.

Weymouth Street (north east side)

- (a) from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of London Road Link Road north westwards for 5 metres.
- (b) from a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of London Road Link Road south eastwards for 5.5 metres.

#### **SCHEDULE 2**

<u>lengths of London Road Link Road, Hemel Hempstead – no waiting 8.30am to 5.30pm</u>

<u>Monday to Saturday</u>

London Road Link Road (a) from a point 40 metres south west of a point in line with the south (north west side) west kerbline of London Road south westwards for 5 metres.

(b) from a point 9.5 metres north east of a point in line with the north east kerbline of Weymouth Street north eastwards for 11 metres.
