NOTICE is given that the Hertfordshire County Council has made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to introduce waiting restrictions in parts of Hemel Hempstead and Kings Langley as specified in the Schedule to this Notice. The Order will come into effect on Monday 3 October 2016.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from the date of this Notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR MAKING

THE HERTFODSHIRE (VARIOUS ROADS, HEMEL HEMPSTEAD AND KINGS LANGLEY) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2016

Hertfordshire County Council is proposing to improve road safety by introducing waiting restrictions in parts of Hemel Hempstead and Kings Langley.

The proposals will comprise of -

 'No waiting at any time' restrictions on parts of Belswains Lane, Teal Way, Kingfisher Drive, Mill Close, Frances Mews, Bunkers Lane, Red Lion Lane, Rose Lane and Lower Road, Hemel Hempstead and Nash Mills Lane, Kings Langley.

The waiting restriction measures are intended to address safety and access concerns that have arisen due to current on road parking habits at the various locations specified above in Hemel Hempstead and Kings Langley.

Therefore, it appears to the Highway Authority that it is necessary and expedient to make the Order in the interests of; avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians) and for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.

The proposal has been subject to consultation with local and County Councillors representing the area and Dacorum Borough Council. The local Police, Ambulance, Fire and Rescue Services, Hertfordshire County Council Passenger Transport Unit and Nash Mills Parish Council have also been consulted.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE HERTFORDSHIRE (VARIOUS ROADS, HEMEL HEMPSTEAD AND KINGS LANGLEY) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2016

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Hertfordshire (Various Roads, Hemel Hempstead and Kings Langley) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 2016" and shall come into effect on Monday 3 October 2016.
- Save as provided in Articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in those lengths of road in Hemel Hempstead and Kings Langley as specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to –
 - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
 - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform; or with permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and appointed by Dacorum Borough Council.
 - (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
 - (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
 - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

In this Article -

The expressions "universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal Service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011.

- (2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are -
 - (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
 - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
 - (d) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
 - (e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.

- 4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") so as to render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may be reasonably necessary -
 - (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area; or
 - (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.
- 5. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule of this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
 - (2) In this Article -

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

"parking disc" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and

"relevant position" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

- 6. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 7. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

SCHEDULE

lengths of road in Hemel Hempstead and Kings Langley – no waiting at any time

Hemel Hempstead

(south west side)

- Belswains Lane (a) from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Kingfisher Drive north westwards for approximately 23 metres to a point 5.5 metres south east of a point in line with the boundary between 262 and 264 Belswains Lane.
 - (b) from it's a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of Kingfisher Drive south eastwards for approximately 71.5 metres to a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Frances Mews.
 - (c) from a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of Frances Mews south eastwards for approximately 83 metres to a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Bunkers Lane.
 - (d) from a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of Teal Way south east wards for approximately 6.5 metres to a point 17.5 metres north west of a point in line with the boundary between 168 and 170 Belswains Lane.

(e) from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Teal Way north westwards for approximately 8 metres to a point 3.5 metres south east of a point in line with the boundary between 157a and 159 Belswains Lane.

- (north east side) (a) from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Mill Close north westwards for approximately 82 metres to a point 13.5 metres north west of a point in line with the boundary between 262 and 264 Belswains Lane.
 - (b) from a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of Mill Close south eastwards for approximately 122.5 metres to a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Bunkers Lane.

Teal Way (both sides)

from its junction with the south west kerbline of Belswains Lane south westwards for approximately 26 metres to a point 4.5 metres south west of a point in line with the southwest facia wall of 166 Belswains Lane.

Kingfisher Drive (both sides)

from its junction with the south west kerbline of Belswains Lane south westwards for approximately 18 metres to a point 9.5 metres north east of a point in line with the south west facia wall of 2 Kingfisher Drive.

Mill Close (both sides)

from its junction with the north east kerbline of Belswains Lane north eastwards for approximately 9 metres to a point 12 metres south west of a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of Nash Green.

Frances Mews (both sides)

from its junction with the south west kerbline of Belswains Lane south westwards for approximately 5 metres to a point 6 metres north east of a point in line with the south west facia wall of 292 Belswains Lane.

Bunkers Lane (north west side)

from its junction with the north east kerbline of Belswains Lane north eastwards for 5.5 metres.

(south east side)

from its junction with the north east kerbline of Belswains Lane north eastwards for 9.5 metres.

Red Lion Lane (north west side)

- (a) from a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of Lower Road south westwards for approximately 67 metres to a point in line with the projected north east kerbline of Rose Lane.
- (b) from a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of Rose Lane south westwards for approximately 111 metres to a point 40 metres south west of a point in line with the south west facia wall of 1 to 27 Mill House, Rose Lane.

(south east side)

from a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of Lower Road south westwards for approximately 40 metres to a point 36 metres north east of a point in line with the projected north east kerbline of Rose Lane.

Rose Lane (both sides)

from its junction with the north west kerbline of Red Lion Lane north westwards for approximately 3.5 metres to a point 3 metres south east of a point in line with the south east facia wall of 1 to 14 Phelps House, Rose Lane.

Lower Road (south west side)

- (a) from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Bunkers Lane south eastwards for approximately 206 metres to its junction with the projected north west kerbline of Red Lion Lane.
- (b) from a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of Red Lion Lane south eastwards for approximately 51 metres to a point 28 metres north

west of a point in line with the north west boundary of the Village Hall, Lower Road.

(north east side) (a) from a point in line with the projected south east kerbline of Bunkers Lane south eastwards for approximately 268 metres to a point 29 metres north west of a point in line with the north west boundary of the Village Hall,

Lower Road.

Access road into The Lodge

(north side)

from its junction with the north east kerbline of Lower Road north

eastwards for 12 metres.

(south side) from its junction with the north east kerbline of Lower Road north

eastwards for 15 metres.

Kings Langley

Nash Mills Lane (north west side)

from a point 40 metres south west of a point in line with the south west facia

wall of 1 to 27 Mill House, Rose Lane south westwards for 16 metres.
