(PRINCIPAL) (No 1) ORDER 2018

DERBY CITY COUNCIL ("the Council"), in exercise of its powers under Sections 32,

35(1), 35(3) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the

Act") and under the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and of all other

enabling powers in that behalf and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in

accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, makes the following Order:

1. This Order, revokes those off street parking places traffic regulation orders

within the area of Derby where Derby City Council is Highway Authority as

listed in schedule 1, and replaces with this order which may be cited as the

Derby City Council (Off street Parking Places) (Principal) (No1) Order 2018

and shall come into operation on 13th May 2019.

2. (1) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article

bearing that number in this Order and any reference in this Order to a

"Schedule" is a reference to a Schedule to this Order.

(2) In this Order:

"Charge"

has the meaning ascribed to it by

Article 4(1)

"Charging Hours"

means any period specified in

Column 5 the Second

Classification: OFFICIAL

Schedule in respect of which a charge or a scale of charges is specified in Column 6 thereof.

"Civil Enforcement Officer"

or on behalf of the Council
under section 76 of the 2004
Act to supervise and control
vehicles in any Parking Place.

"Disabled Person's Badge"

has the same meaning as in
 The Local Authorities Traffic
 Orders (Exemptions for
 Disabled Persons) (England)
 Regulations 2000.

"Disabled Person's Vehicle"

 has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic
 Orders (Exemption for
 Disabled Persons) (England)
 Regulations 2000.

"Driver"

- in relation to a vehicle means
the person driving the vehicle
at the time when it was left in
the Parking Place, and unless
proved otherwise will be
deemed to be the registered
keeper of the vehicle at the

"Electric Vehicle(s)"

time the Penalty Charge Notice is issued under Article 6(2).

means a vehicle which uses
electricity as a source of power
for propulsion and includes a
vehicle which in addition uses,

- "Hand Held Device"
- means a wireless hand held computer used by the Civil Enforcement Officers or other designated officer, which is programmed to interface with the Council's parking permits system and electronic payment system.

"Location Identification Number"

by the Council to a Pre Parking
Place for the purpose of
identification of that Parking
Place in relation to the
payment of the Parking Charge
for that Parking Place using
Pay by Phone.

Classification: OFFICIAL

"Location Identification Number

Traffic Sign"

means a sign or Traffic Sign
displaying the Location
Identification Number for Pre
Parking Places and such other
information and instructions as
the Council thinks fit for the
purposes of making payment
of a Parking Charge using Pay
by Phone.

"Motor Cycle"

means a mechanically
 propelled vehicle (not being an invalid carriage as defined in Section 136(4) of the Act) with less than four wheels of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms.

"Owner"

in relation to a vehicle means
the person by whom such
vehicle is kept and used.

"Parking Area"

means any area of a Parking
 Place which is provided for the
 leaving of a vehicle and
 indicated by markings on the
 surface of the Parking Place.

Classification: OFFICIAL

"Parking Ticket"

means a ticket issued by a

Ticket Machine or by the

Council on the payment of the

Charge pursuant to Article

4(1).

"Pay by Phone"

means the Telephone Payment
 Parking System provided by
 the Council for payment of
 Parking Charges.

"Pedal Cycle"

means a cycle not being propelled by mechanical power.

"Penalty Charge" and

"Reduced Penalty Charge"

means a charge set by the

Council pursuant to the

provisions of section 77 of the

2004 Act which is to be paid to
the Council within 28 days
beginning with the date of the

Penalty Charge Notice, or 14
days in the case of a Reduced
Penalty Charge, following the
issue of a Penalty Charge

Notice. Without prejudice to

the Council's ability to change

Classification: OFFICIAL

those charges the current charges at the time of this order are set out in the Third Schedule.

"Penalty Charge Notice"

 means a notice issued or served by a Civil Enforcement
 Officer pursuant to the section
 78 of the 2004 Act and
 regulations or provisions made
 thereunder.

"Permit"

 means a permit issued by the Council under the provisions of Article 6(1) of this Order and includes an invalid Permit and Valid Permit.

"Season Ticket(s)"

means a season ticket issued
 by the Council under the
 provisions of Article 6(1) of this
 Order and includes an invalid
 Season Ticket and Valid
 Season Ticket.

"Telephone Payment System" means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of Parking Charges using

Classification: OFFICIAL

telephone communication with the service provider in accordance with instructions indicated on signs located at each Parking Place or Parking Area where the system is operational.

"Ticket Machine"

means an apparatus designed
to indicate the time and issue
tickets indicating the payment
of the Charge referred to in
Article 4(1) and the period in
respect of which the charge
has been paid.

"Valid Parking Ticket"

means a ticket issued which is
displayed in the Relevant
Position on a vehicle parked in
a Pre Pay Parking Place to
which that Parking Charge
relates and where the period
indicated has not expired or
passed.

"Valid Pay by Phone

Payment"

- means subject to Articles 4(5) and 4(6) a payment of a

Classification: OFFICIAL

Charge using Pay by Phone

that has not expired or passed.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it

applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

USE OF LAND AND PARKING PLACE

3. (1) The area of land specified by name in Column 1 of the Second Schedule

may be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a Parking

Place for such classes of vehicles in such positions on such days and during

such hours as are specified in relation to that area in the Second Schedule.

provided that nothing in this Order shall prevent the Council from closing or

suspending a Parking Place or any part of it for any such purpose as it

considers appropriate including for the purposes of carrying out works of

repair, renewal or maintenance.

(2) (i) Where in the Second Schedule a Parking Place is described as available

for vehicles of a specified class or prescribing a specified position for a

specified class of vehicle to park within the Parking Place the Driver of a

vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Place unless it is of the

class and in the position so specified.

(ii) Where within a Parking Place there is a sign or surface marking which

indicates that a Parking Area is available only for a Disabled Person's

Vehicle the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking

Area unless it is a Disabled Person's Vehicle displaying a Disabled

Person's Badge.

Classification: OFFICIAL

(iii) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position when:

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forward on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.
- (3) Where within a Parking Place there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that a Parking Area is available only for Electric Vehicles the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Area unless the vehicle uses electricity as a source of power for propulsion.
- (4) When a Parking Place is described in Column 4 and 5 of the Second Schedule as operating on certain days or during certain times, the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Place on any other day or at any other time without the Council's permission.

AMOUNT OF INITIAL CHARGE AT PARKING PLACES

4. (1) When a vehicle is left in a Parking Place during the Charging Hours the Driver shall, subject to Paragraph 2 of this Article, pay the appropriate Charge in accordance with the scale of charges specified in Column 6 of the Second Schedule as relating to that Parking Place.

Classification: OFFICIAL

(2) No Charge shall be payable by a Driver of a vehicle left in a Parking Place

designated in the Second Schedule that is exempt by Article 22 or where a

Valid Season Ticket acquired in accordance with Article 23 or a Valid Permit

issued by Derby City Council is displayed in accordance with Article 5.

METHOD OF PAYMENT

(3) The Charge referred to in Article 4(1) shall be payable by:

(a) the purchase of a Valid Parking Ticket by the inserting the appropriate

monies into a Ticket Machine provided for the purpose of issuing Parking

Tickets for the relevant Charge for that Parking Place; or

(b) where available paying the appropriate Charge by means of Pay by

Phone in accordance with Article 4(4).

PAY BY PHONE

(4) Where the service is available Charges may be paid by using Pay by Phone

following the instructions on the Location Identification Number Traffic Sign

and such other instructions as may be given by the Council when making

payment.

Payment of a Charge using Pay by Phone will relate only to the Parking

Place as indicated by the Location Identification Number displayed on the

Location Identification Number Traffic Sign situated at the Parking Place.

(6) Subject to Article 22 (exemptions), and in the absence of the display of a

Valid Parking Ticket pursuant to Article 5, if at any time while the vehicle is

left in a Parking Place no indication appears on a Hand Held Device that

Classification: OFFICIAL

payment of the relevant Charge has been made using Pay by Phone or a

Hand Held Device indicates that the payment period for which payment was
made using Pay by Phone has expired it shall be presumed that either:

- the relevant Charge has not been duly paid in respect of the vehicle
 in accordance with the provisions of Article 4(1); or
- (b) the parking period for which payment was made using Pay by Phone has expired and in either case a Civil Enforcement Officer may serve a Penalty Charge Notice.
- 5. (1) Any Parking Ticket issued on payment of the Charge referred to in Article 4.1, any Season Ticket or Permit issued pursuant to Article 6 and any Disabled Persons badge shall be displayed on the vehicle as follows:
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle which is fitted with a front windscreen by sticking the ticket to the inside surface of the windscreen so that it is facing forward and can be easily seen from the front of the vehicle; or
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle which is not fitted with a front windscreen by sticking the ticket on the front of the vehicle so that it is facing forward and can be easily seen from the front of the vehicle.
 - (2) The Parking Ticket, Season Ticket, Permit or Disabled Persons badge shall not be valid unless so displayed.

Classification: OFFICIAL

PERMITS AND SEASON TICKETS

Issue, Charges and use of Permits

6. (1) The Council may as it considers appropriate issue Permits and Season

Tickets with such limitations as the Council may determine to permit a driver

of a vehicle to use a Parking Place.

(2) The charges for Permits and Season Tickets (if any) shall be as set out in

the Third Schedule of this Order, or as, from time to time, amended or varied

by the Council or its authorised officers. The Council may waive such

charges for any Permit or Season Ticket as it may consider appropriate.

VALID PERMITS

(3) A Valid Permit or Valid Season Ticket is a Permit or Season Ticket which

has been duly issued by the Council under Article 6(1) and which has not

been withdrawn under Article 6(4) and is being used in accordance with the

terms and conditions subject to which the permit is issued.

WITHDRAWAL OF PERMITS AND SEASON TICKETS

The Council having granted a Permit or Season Ticket may withdraw the

right to use a Permit or Season Ticket at any time, without payment of

compensation.

CONTRAVENTIONS

7. (1) Subject to the exemptions in Article 22 no vehicle shall be left in a Parking

Place during the Charging Hours either:

without a Valid Parking Ticket, Valid Season Ticket, Valid Permit or (a)

Disabled Persons badge being displayed in accordance with Article

5; or

without a Valid Pay by Phone Payment: or (b)

(2) Subject to the exemptions in Article 22 no vehicle shall be left in a Parking

Place in contravention of any Article of this Order.

PENALTY CHARGES

8. (1) If a vehicle is left in a Parking Place in contravention of or in non-compliance

with any Article of this Order a Penalty Charge shall be payable for each day

of the said contravention or non-compliance and/or the vehicle may be

removed from that location.

(2)In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge is payable, a

Penalty Charge Notice showing the information required pursuant to section

78 of 2004 Act or any regulation or provision made thereunder may then be

issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform.

(3) Subject to paragraph (5) of this Article if a vehicle is left after a Penalty

Charge has been incurred, a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or a person

acting under his direction may attach to the vehicle an immobilisation device

and a notice in accordance with the requirements of section 79 of the Traffic

Management Act 2004 and that vehicle shall only be released from the

device on payment of the Penalty Charge, or as the case may be a Reduced

Penalty Charge, along with such release fee as may be required by the

Council.

(4) Subject to paragraph (5) of this Article where a Civil Enforcement Officer has removed or caused to be removed a vehicle in accordance with paragraph(1) of this Article:-

- (a) they shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle;
- (b) the Council shall be entitled to recover from the person responsible such charges in respect of the removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle as it might prescribe from time to time, (without prejudice to the Council's powers to alter those charges the current charges are set out in the Fourth Schedule);
- (c) the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended shall apply to the disposal of any such vehicle removed by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to this Article.
- (5) Nothing in paragraphs (3) and (4) of this Article shall apply in respect of a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a valid Disabled Person's Badge issued by any local authority.
- (6) A Penalty Charge can be discharged by the driver of a vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge has been incurred paying a Reduced Penalty Charge to the Council in the amount and manner prescribed on the Penalty Charge Notice (or the rear thereof) so as to reach the Council within the period ending at 4.00 pm on the 14th day following the day on which the Penalty Charge was incurred.
- (7) If the Penalty Charge is not discharged in accordance with Article 8(6) above then the Penalty Charge shall be discharged by the driver of a vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge has been incurred paying the full amount

of the Penalty Charge in the amount and manner prescribed on the Penalty

Charge Notice (or the rear thereof) so as to reach the Council within the

period ending at 4.00 pm on the 28th day following the day on which the

Penalty Charge was incurred.

In the event that either of the said 14th or 28th days referred to in paragraphs

(5) and (6) of this Article falls upon a day on which the council offices referred

to as the place of payment on the Penalty Charge Notice are closed, the

period within which payment of the Penalty Charge or Reduced Penalty

Charge shall be made, shall be extended until 4.00 pm on the next full day on

which the said offices are open.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

9. The Driver of a motor vehicle using a Parking Place shall stop the engine as

soon as the vehicle is in position in the Parking Place and shall not start the

engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart

from the Parking Place.

10. No person shall use a vehicle while it is in a Parking Place in connection with

the sale of any article to persons in or near the Parking Place or in connection

with the selling or offering for hire of his skills or services without the written

consent of the Strategic Director of Communities and Place.

No person shall use any part of a Parking Place or any vehicle left in a Parking

Place for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other

than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the Parking

Place.

Classification: OFFICIAL

12. The Driver of a vehicle using a Parking Place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the Parking Place.

- 13. The Driver of a vehicle drawing a trailer shall not permit the vehicle or trailer to wait in a Parking Place unless they have been disconnected and for the purpose of this Order the vehicle and trailer shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the Driver shall be deemed to be the Driver of each of the vehicles.
- 14.(1) If a vehicle is left in a Parking Place in a position other than in accordance with the provisions of Article 3(2) a person authorised by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position is in accordance with the provisions.
 - (2) If a vehicle is left in a Parking Place in contravention of any of the foregoing provisions of this Order a person authorised by the Council may remove the vehicle from that Parking Place or arrange for its removal.
 - (3) In an emergency a person authorised by the Council or a Police Constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a Parking Place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from a Parking Place.
 - (4) Any person altering or causing the alteration of the position of a vehicle by virtue of Paragraph (1) of this Article or removing or causing the removal of a vehicle by virtue of Paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such a manner as they may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed.

Classification: OFFICIAL

(5) Any person removing or arranging for the removal of a vehicle by virtue of Paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article shall make such arrangements as he considers to be reasonably necessary for the safety of the vehicle in the place to which it is removed.

- **15.** Where in a Parking Place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:
 - (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the Parking Place; or
 - (b) indicating that a vehicle using the Parking Place shall proceed in a specified direction within the Parking Place;then no person shall drive or permit to be driven any vehicle:
 - (i) so that it enters the Parking Place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the Parking Place otherwise than by an exit so indicated; or
 - (ii) in a direction other than so specified.
- No person shall, except with the permission of a person authorised by the Council, drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in a Parking Place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the Parking Place or for the purpose of departing from the Parking Place in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- 17. No person shall knowingly exhibit on any vehicle any parking ticket which has been altered, defaced, mutilated or added to or upon which the figures or particulars have become illegible.
- 18. No person shall, use any part of a Parking Place or any vehicle left in the Parking Place for sleeping or camping purposes.
- 19. No person shall play or take part in any game in a Parking Place.

20. No person shall use the Parking Place as a means of passage proceeding from one road to another road.

21. No person shall in a Parking Place erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written consent of the Strategic Director of Communities and Place.

EXEMPTIONS

- 22. A vehicle of any type specified in this Article which is left in a Parking Place specified in Schedule 2 (Part 2) shall be exempt from any payment specified in Articles 4.
 - (i) a Motor Cycle or Pedal Cycle

SEASON TICKETS

23. The Owner of a vehicle may on an application to the Council acquire a season ticket for a particular Parking Place if such are issued by paying the charge specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

SUSPENSION OF ORDER

24. The Council shall be entitled to suspend any or all of the provisions of this Order on such occasions and for such purposes as it sees fit.
