DERBY CITY COUNCIL (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) (PRINCIPAL) ORDER 2012

ARTICLE 1

Derby City Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47,49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), the Road Traffic Act 1991 ("the 1991 Act"), the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1.1 This Order may be cited as the Derby City Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Principal) Order 2012 and shall come into operation on 2nd July 2012.
- 1.2 This Order has the effect of consolidating the Derby City Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting)(Conversion to Map Based Schedule) (No.1) Order 2007 ("the Principal Order") with subsequent orders that have amended or modified the Principal Order, without any change to the length of roads affected under those orders.

ARTICLE 2 - DEFINITIONS

2.1 In this Order:-

"the Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) or any replacement legislation thereof

"the 2004 Act" means The Traffic Management Act 2004 (as amended) or any replacement legislation thereof

"Ambulance Service" means the Ambulance Trust Service of such other ambulance service appointed to act in cases of emergency by the National Health Service.

"Article" means an article of this Order or where indicated part thereof unless otherwise stated.

"Business Parking Permit" means a Permit issued by the Council in accordance with Article 9

"Business Visitors Parking Permit" means a Permit issued by the Council in accordance with Article 9.

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means an officer of the Council or such other person duly authorised by the Council pursuant to section 76 of the 2004 Act to issue and attach notices to vehicles in accordance with Article 14.

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" means a vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge.

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

"Event" means an event for the purpose of general recreation, sport, leisure or entertainment to which the public have access to with or without payment held at the Pride Park Stadium, Derby involving the use of the main viewing stadium and pitch.

"Footway" has the same meaning as in section 329 Highways Act 1980.

"Hackney Carriage" means a vehicle licensed and being lawfully used as a Hackney Carriage under the provisions of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 and the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976

"Hackney Carriage Stand" means a stand duly appointed under section 63 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976

"the Map" means for the purpose of this Order the map, plans and associated index attached at schedule 4...

"Match Day" means a day on which a football match or Event to which the public have access to with or without payment is held at the Pride Park Stadium, Derby

"Motor Cycle", "Moped" and "Motor Vehicle" have the same meanings as in the Road Traffic Act 1988.

"Motor Vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 185(1) Road Traffic Act 1988

"No Return Restriction" shall have the meaning ascribed to it under Article 2.2.

"Operative Hours" has the meaning ascribed to it in Article 10.1.

"Owner" has the same meaning as in section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.

"Parked" the term "parked" as used in the PCN Codes shall be deemed hereby to include the term "wait" as used in this Order

"Parking Charge" has the meaning ascribed by it in Article 7.3.

"Parking Place" or "Parking Area" means a place or area identified or designated for parking of Vehicles under Articles 6.1; 7.1; 8.1, 9.1 and 10.1 of this Order.

"Parking Ticket" means a ticket issued by a Ticket Machine or by the Council on the payment of the Parking Charge (pursuant to Article 7.3).

"Penalty Charge" and "Reduced Penalty Charge" means a charge set by the Council pursuant to Part 6 of the 2004 Act and the respective regulations which is payable to the Council following the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice (set out in schedule 3 of this order).

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued or served by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions of Part 6 of the 2004 Act and the respective regulations containing the particulars therein required.

"PCN Codes" means the codes and related description in schedule 2 of The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges) (England) Order 2007 or any amendments or replacement codes thereof.

"Permit" means a permit issued by the Council under the provisions of Article 12 of this Order and includes an invalid Permit and Valid Permit.

"Permit Holder" means a person holding a Valid Permit.

"Prescribed Hours" the term 'prescribed hours' as used in the PCN Codes shall mean any period or time prescribed by virtue of any Article in this Order, including any times prescribed on the Map.

"the Principal Order" means for the purpose of this Order the Derby City Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting)(Conversion to Map Based Schedule) (No.1) Order 2007

"the Principal Order's Map" means for the purpose of this Order the map, plans and associated index constituting Schedule 4 of the Principal Order and referred to in the definition of that order as "the Map"

"Reduced Penalty Charge" (for the definition see under Penalty Charge)

"Relevant Position"

- (a) In relation to the display of Disabled Person's Badge, has the same meaning as that ascribed to it in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 so that the relevant details can be seen from outside the Vehicle.
- (b) In relation to the display of Permits or any other items required to be displayed by this Order other than a Disabled Persons Badge means

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a windscreen, a position on the inside surface of the windscreen with the obverse side facing forward and on the part of the windscreen nearest the kerb;
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, a conspicuous position on the side of the vehicle nearest the kerb:

so that the relevant details can be seen from outside the vehicle.

"Residents' Parking Permit" means a Permit issued by the Council in accordance with Article 10 of this Order.

"Residents' Visitors Parking Permit" means a Permit issued by the Council in accordance with Article 10.

"Restricted Street" as used in the PCN Codes shall mean any street or road or length of street or road where a restriction or prohibition is imposed by virtue of any Article under this Order.

"Road" has the same meaning as section 192 Road Traffic Act 1988 "Schedule" means a schedule of this Order unless otherwise stated.

"Ticket Machine" means an apparatus designed to indicate the time and issue tickets indicating the payment of the Parking Charge referred to in Article 7.3 and the period in respect of which the charge has been paid which if required is of a type and design approved or meeting the requirements of the relevant Secretary of State.

"Telegraphic Line" has the same meaning as the expression "Telecommunication Apparatus" (which expression has the same meaning as that ascribed to it in the Telecommunications Act 1984).

"Traffic Sign" means a sign prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under Section 65 of the Act or any replacement thereof.

"Water Company" means a company appointed under the provisions of section 6 of the Water Industry Act 1991 or such other body as may be appointed by virtue of statute to carry out the functions therein specified of water or sewerage undertaker.

"Valid Parking Ticket" means a ticket issued which is displayed in the Relevant Position on a vehicle parked in a Pay and Display Parking Place to which that Parking Charge relates and where the period indicated has not expired or passed.

"Valid Permit" has the meaning ascribed to it in Article 12.3.

- "Vehicle" means a carriage or conveyance including a caravan or trailer in or on which persons or goods are transported.
- 2.2 Interpretation of meaning of "no return" restriction Where the Map refers to "no return" within a stated period in relation to any length of road it means that a vehicle which has been parked on the length of road shall not return to any part of that said road where the restriction applies at any time within that stated period [for example where in the Map it refers to Limited Waiting (20 Mins No Return 1 Hour) (Mon-Sat 8am-6pm) it means, subject to any applicable exemptions, that a Vehicle may not wait for longer than 20 minutes between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the relevant lengths of road or to cause or permit that Vehicle to return to any part of that said road where the restriction applies at any time within sixty minutes of the last period that vehicle was waiting on any part of the said road].
- 2.3 <u>Interpretation of time periods</u> A reference in this Order to a period of time shall unless otherwise stated be inclusive of the first time, date or day mentioned and be inclusive of the last time, date or day mentioned.
- 2.4 A reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article having that number in this Order.
- 2.5 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

ARTICLE 3 - PROHIBITION, RESTRICTION AND LIMITED WAITING

No Waiting/Limited Waiting Prohibition

- 3.1 Save as indicated on the Map or save as provided in Article 11 (general exemptions, disabled exemption and permit holder exemption) of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait on the roads or sides of the roads identified on the Map;
- 3.1.1 as "No Waiting" for the periods indicated on the Map, or
- 3.1.2 as "Limited Waiting" during the times and period indicated on the Map otherwise than in accordance with the permitted waiting time and the No Return Restriction indicated on the Map.

ARTICLE 4 - PROHIBITION/RESTRICTION OF LOADING/UNLOADING

Prohibition/Restriction of Loading and Unloading

- 4.1 Save as indicated on the Map or save as provided in Article 4.2 (boarding and alighting) it is unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle (including a Disabled Person's Vehicle) in relation to the sides and lengths of road identified as "No Loading" on the Map during the periods identified on the Map to be used for the purposes of the delivery or collection of goods or for such vehicle to be loaded or unloaded.
- 4.2 It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait or stop on a side or length of road to which Article 4.1 of this Order relates only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable person to board or alight from the Vehicle.

ARTICLE 5 - PROHIBITION OF STOPPING

Prohibition of Stopping

5. Save as indicated on the Map it is unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle (including a Disabled Person's Vehicle) to stop on the sides and lengths of road identified as "No Stopping" on the Map during the periods identified on the Map.

ARTICLE 6 - PARKING PLACES: DISABLED PARKING

Disabled Parking

- 6.1 The areas of land identified on the Map and therein designated "Disabled Badge Holders Only" (which for the purpose of the standard PCN Codes is referred to as a "designated disabled parking place") may be used, subject to the following provisions of this part of the order and of Article 13 (Suspension of Parking Places) as parking places for Disabled Person's Vehicles in such positions, during such periods and for such hours as identified on the Map.
- 6.2 Save as provided in Article 11.1 (general exemptions but excluding disabled exemption and permit holder exemption) of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Motor Vehicle to wait at any time on any day on the lengths of roads identified in Article 6.1 of this Order other than subject to Article 6.3 and 6.4 a Motor Vehicle, being used by the person to whom a Disabled Person's Badge is issued, which is waiting in accordance with such period, limitation and terms as may be indicated on the Map, and which displays in the Relevant Position;
- 6.2.1 a valid Disabled Person's Badge, and
- 6.2.2 a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began)

Limited to 3hrs No Return 1hr unless Map indicates otherwise

6.3 In the absence of such a period of waiting referred to in Article 6.2 being indicated on the Map the period of this Order shall not exceed three hours, and the exemption provided by Article 6.2 shall not apply to any Motor Vehicle where such vehicle has waited on the same day on the length of road to which the restriction relates unless an interval of at least one hour has passed since that vehicle last waited on the said length of road.

ARTICLE 7 - PARKING PLACES: ON STREET (PAY AND DISPLAY)

Designation of Parking Places (Pay and Display Parking Place - On Street)

7.1 The sides and lengths of roads identified on the Map as "Pay & Display" (and hereinafter referred to as a "Pay & Display Parking Place") are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this part of the order and of Article 13 (Suspension of Parking Places) as parking places for Motor Vehicles or such classes of Vehicles, in such positions and on such days and during such hours and subject to such restrictions, prohibitions or requirements as identified on the Map.

General Restrictions on Use of Parking Places

- 7.2 Save as indicated on the Map or save as provided in Article 11 (general exemption, disabled parking and permit holder exemption) of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Motor Vehicle (other than a Motorcycle) to wait on any Pay & Display Parking Place;
- 7.2.1 unless before leaving the vehicle the Parking Charge payable for that parking place as specified in Article 7.3 has been paid, and
- 7.2.2 unless a Valid Parking Ticket is displayed in accordance with Article 7.4.

Parking Charges

- 7.3 Subject to Article 7.2 the Parking Charge shall be as set out in Schedule 1 of this Order or as, from time to time, amended or varied by the Council or its authorised officers pursuant to 46 or 46A of the Act.
- 7.4 Every Motor Vehicle left in a Pay & Display Parking Place as designated and identified under Article 7.1 of this Order shall display in the Relevant Position a Valid Parking Ticket so that the details showing the period for which the Parking Charge paid relates and the time of expiry of the Parking Ticket is clearly visible from outside the vehicle

ARTICLE 8 - PARKING PLACES: MEDICAL STAFF PARKING

Parking for Medical Staff (Doctor Permit Parking Places)

- 8.1 The parking places identified on the Map and thereby designated as "Doctor Permit Holders Only" (and hereinafter referred to as a "Doctor Permit Parking Place") may only be used in accordance with the following provisions of this part of the order and of Article 13 (Suspension of Parking Places).
- 8.2 Save as indicated on the Map or save as provided by Article 11.1 (*general exemption excluding disabled and permit holder exemptions*) of this Order, no person, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, other than a qualified medical practitioner, district nurse or a midwife whilst providing an emergency call-out facility from premises situated near the Doctor Permit Parking Place, shall cause or permit any Motor Vehicle to wait at any time on any day on a Doctor Permit Parking Place.

ARTICLE 9 - PARKING PLACES: LOADING BAYS

- 9.1 The parking places identified on the Map as "Loading Only" and thereby designated (and hereafter referred to as a "Loading Only Bay") may only be used in accordance with the following provisions of this part of the Order and of Article 13 (Suspension of Parking Places of this Order.
- 9.2 Save as indicated on the Map or save as provided by Article 11.1 (general exemption but excluding disabled and permit holder exemptions) of this Order, no person, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer shall cause or permit any Motor Vehicle to use or park in a Loading Only Bay on the days and times denoted on the Map other than a Motor Vehicle being Loaded and Unloaded or used for the delivery or collection of goods, and such vehicle must not to remain in the Loading Only Bay longer than is reasonably necessary to complete that function and provided that when the aforementioned purposes have been completed the vehicle must immediately proceed out of that length of road.
- 9.3 The use permitted by Article 9.2 shall not permit waiting to enable goods or materials to be sold or purchased.

ARTICLE 10 PARKING PLACES: PERMIT HOLDERS ONLY

Designation of Parking Places

10.1 The sides and lengths of roads identified on the Map as "Permit Holders Only" (and hereinafter referred to as a "Permit Holders Parking Place") are authorised to be used, subject to Article 13 (Suspension of Parking Places) and the following provisions of this Part of this Order, as parking places for such classes of Vehicles, and on such days and during such hours as

identified on the Map ("hereinafter referred to as the "Operative Hours") and in such positions identified on the Map.

Limits on Parking in Parking Place

10.2 Save as indicated on the Map or save as provided in Article 11.1, 11.2 and 11.3 (general exemption, disabled parking) of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any Motor Vehicle (other than a Motorcycle) to wait in a Permit Holders Parking Place unless a Valid Permit is displayed on the vehicle in the Relevant Position.

ARTICLE 11 - EXEMPTIONS

General Exemptions

- 11.1 It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait or stop on a side or length of road to which Articles 3.1; 6.2; 7.2; 8.2; 9.2 and 10.2 of this Order relate only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable;
- 11.1.1 person to board or alight from the Vehicle;
- the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely;
- building, engineering or demolition operations;
- 11.1.2.2 the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- 11.1.2.3 the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the such length of road; or
- the laying, erection alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to such length of road of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be in the service of a Local Authority or a Water Company in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- the Vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 125 Postal Services Act 2000;
- the Vehicle to wait or stop at or near to any premises situated or adjacent to such length of the road, for so long as such waiting or stopping by that Vehicle in connection with any wedding or funeral;

- 11.1.6 the Vehicle to be used in the case of an emergency by the Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Services, or by an Ambulance Service or by the police services;
- 11.1.7 any Hackney Carriage to wait within any duly authorised Hackney Carriage Stand;
- the Vehicle to be used for collection or delivery or for the loading or unloading of goods from the vehicle (this exemption shall only apply so far as necessary to enable loading/unloading or the collection/delivery of goods where such is being carried out in an expeditious and reasonable manner and for no other purpose whatsoever and in particular does not permit waiting to enable goods to be sold or purchased);
- 11.1.9 the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used by a qualified medical practitioner, a district nurse or a midwife displaying a duly recognised healthcare parking permit to visit premises nearby.

Disabled Exemptions

- 11.2 It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle to wait or stop on a side or length of road to which Article 3.1.1 of this Order relate
- 11.2.1 for a period not exceeding 3 hours if;-
- the Vehicle displays in a Relevant Position a valid Disabled Person's Badge and a parking disc;
- the time at which the period of waiting commenced is marked on the parking disc; and
- 11.2.1.3 a period of at least 1 hour separated the commencement of the period of waiting from any previous period of waiting on that length of road on the same day.
- 11.3 It is not unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle to wait or stop on a side or length of road to which Articles 3.1.2, 7.2 and 10.1 of this Order relate for any period if the vehicle displays in a Relevant Position a valid Disabled Person's Badge.

Permit Holder Exemption

11.4 Nothing in Articles 3.1 and 7.2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle which clearly displays in a Relevant Position a Valid Permit to wait in those lengths of road and for such periods as specified in the Permit where signs and/or markings are in place indicating that Permit Holders are exempt.

ARTICLE 12 PERMITS

Issue, Charges and use of Permits

- The Council may as it considers appropriate issue Permits with such limitations as the Council may determine to enable persons;
- 12.1.1 to wait in any road regulated by Article 10 (Permit Holders Parking Place), or
- to wait in any other road restricted or regulated by Articles 3.1.2 and 7 of this Order ("Permit Holder Exemption").
- 12.2 The charges for Permits shall be as set out in Schedule 2 of this Order, or as, from time to time, amended or varied by the Council or its authorised officers. The Council may waive such charges for any Permit as it may consider appropriate.

Valid Permits

12.3 A Valid Permit is a Permit which has been duly issued by the Council under Article 12.1 and which has not been withdrawn under Article 12.4 and is being used in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which the permit is issued.

Withdrawal of Permits

12.4 The Council having granted a Permit may withdraw the right to use a Permit at any time, without payment of compensation.

ARTICLE 13 SUSPENSION OF PARKING PLACES

Suspension of Parking Places

- 13.1 The Council or any person authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a Parking Place or any part to any class or classes of Vehicles thereof whenever such suspension is considered necessary on a side or length of road to which Articles 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 of this Order relate:-
- 13.1.1 for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- 13.1.2 for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the Parking Place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the Parking Place or the laying, erection, alterations, removal or repair in or adjacent to the Parking Place of any road, Traffic Sign, sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus, within the meaning of Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984

- 13.1.3 for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the Parking Place on any occasion of the removal of furniture, or at times of weddings or funerals, or on other occasions where the Council or other authorised person considers appropriate.
- 13.1.4 on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street or Road will be throughd or obstructed, or
- 13.2 Police Constable in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty four hours the use of a Parking Place or any part thereof whenever such suspension is considered reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- 13.3 Any person suspending the use of the Parking Place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 13.1 or paragraph 13.2 shall as soon as reasonably practicable cause to be placed in or adjacent to that Parking Place or part thereof a sign or notice indicating that waiting by Vehicles is prohibited.
- 13.4 No person shall cause or permit a Vehicle to be left in any Parking Place or part of a Parking Place;-
- 13.4.1.1 during such period as there is in or adjacent to that Parking Place or part thereof a sign or notice placed in pursuance of paragraph 13.3; or
- 13.4.1.2 in the case of being advised by a Police Officer in uniform or Civil Enforcement Officer of the suspension during such time indicated that the suspension will be in effect.
- 13.5 Nothing in paragraph 13.4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Vehicle to wait in a suspended Parking Place if the Vehicle is waiting with permission of:
- 13.5.1.1 The person suspending the use of the Parking Place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph 13.1, or
- 13.5.1.2 A Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
- 13.6 Suspension of a Parking Place in accordance with the provisions of Article 13 shall not give rise to any right of compensation or reimbursement to Permit Holders.

ARTICLE 14 - GENERAL

Derogation and Precedence over other Orders

14.1 The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any Regulations

- made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
- 14.2 Where the provisions of any Order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 which imposes any prohibition or restriction on waiting by Vehicles or grant any exemption from such prohibition or restriction relate to a length of road designated as a Parking Place in this Order the provisions of the Parking Place in this Order shall prevail.

ARTICLE 15 - REVOCATIONS

15. This Order hereby revokes the Principal order and all subsequent traffic regulation orders that have had the affect of amending or modifying the Principal Order or the Principal Order's Map.
