

Moving Vehicle Restriction

Key to Specific Exemptions

1. A vehicle being used in the case of an emergency by the Fire, Ambulance or Police Services.
2. A vehicle if it cannot be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in conjunction with any of the following operations, (within the City Centre pedestrianised area, with prior knowledge and authority of the City Council) namely:
 - a. building, engineering or demolition operations;
 - b. the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - c. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length of road; or
 - d. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to such length of road or any sewer or any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
3. A vehicle required for the carrying out of works on the lengths of road or adjacent premises, where the vehicle is required for the delivery or collection of materials or goods which cannot reasonably be carried by hand (within the City Centre pedestrianised area with the prior knowledge and authority of the City Council).
4. A vehicle being used for the purposes of delivering or collecting postal packages as defined in section 125 Postal Services Act 2000.
5. Subject to any specific label on the Map, a vehicle gaining access and egress to and from specified premises or locations as indicated on the map, during times indicated on the Map and in accordance with the requirements and subject to fronting the said roads or as specified on the map (time purpose restriction and other restriction permits) other than gaining access to or egress from premises accessible only from said road.
6. A vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently used for such purposes in any road, to be used in the service of a Local Authority, Water Company or statutory undertaker in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties (within the City centre pedestrianised area, with prior knowledge and authority of the City Council) .
7. A vehicle, designed or adapted for the conveyance of bullion and similar securities, used in the course of deliveries.
8. A vehicle being used in the course of a funeral or wedding procession, within the City Centre pedestrianised area, with prior knowledge and authority of the City Council.
9. During the Operative Period of the prohibition of vehicles in The Strand vehicles gaining access for the delivery of goods or items from premises in The Strand, St. James Street, Corn Market or The Wardwick are exempt from the Victoria Street and Albert Street (bus lanes & prohibitions of driving) restrictions.
10. A vehicle being used for the conveyance of goods and merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road.
11. Vehicle used for the purpose of agriculture or in connection with land adjacent to the lengths of road or conveyance or haulage of timber felled on that land.
12. By the Highway Authority for the area or its agents for the purposes of winter maintenance cover.
13. A vehicle being used for the tuition or tests pursuant to Part III of the Heavy Goods Vehicles (Driving Licences) Regulations 1977.
14. A vehicle being used as a Public Service Vehicle.
15. A vehicle being used in the course of military operations.
16. A vehicle in excess of 16'9" high and using the high load route via
 - Duffield Road and Broadway to avoid that section of the A38 between the Kedleston Road flyover and the Duffield Road roundabout
 - to proceed along Uttoxeter Road (B5020) from its junction with the Royal Derby Hospital roundabout to its junction with the roundabout at Etwall Road / Ladybank Road junction.
17. Except for access for Goods Vehicles, access to off street premises, disabled parking bays, taxi rank and for community transport and public service vehicles.
