# THE DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 (WYE STREET, BUXTON)

# (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING AND LOADING BAY) ORDER 2010

The Derbyshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("the Act"), Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

## 1 CITATION

This Order shall come into operation on the Fourteenth day of June Two thousand and Ten and may be cited as "The Derbyshire County Council (Wye Street, Buxton) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading and Loading Bay) Order 2010".

#### 2 INTERPRETATION

In this Order:-

- 2.1 "Vehicle" means any mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads.
- 2.2 "Public Service Vehicle" has the meaning ascribed to it by Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981, that is to say it shall mean a motor vehicle (other than a tramcar) which —
- (i) being a vehicle adapted to carry more than eight passengers, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward; or
- (ii) being a vehicle not so adapted, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward at separate fares in the course of a business or carrying passengers.
- 2.3 "Disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
- 2.4 "Disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position as set out under Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
- 2.5 "The 2004 Act" means Traffic Management Act 2004.
- 2.6 "CEO" means Civil Enforcement Officer and has the same meaning as in Section 76 of the 2004 Act.
- 2.7 "Goods" means goods or burden of any description;
- 2.8 "Goods Vehicle" means a motor Vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or a trailer so constructed or adapted, as in Section 192(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988;

- 2.9 "Loading and Unloading" means the transference, from or to a Vehicle, to or from premises, of goods;
- 2.10 "Loading Bay" means a space in a Specified Parking Place which is provided for the waiting of a Vehicle for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or Loading or Unloading the Vehicle as specified under the provisions of this Order.

# 3 WAITING RESTRICTIONS

3.1 Save as provided in articles 4, 5 and 7 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day on the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.

# 4 GENERAL EXEMPTIONS

- 4.1 Nothing in Articles 3, 6 and 7 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (i) a person to board or alight from the vehicle, unless a Loading Prohibition is in force;
- (ii) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
- (a) building, industrial or demolition operations;
- (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (c) the maintenance, improvement of reconstruction of the said lengths of road; or
- (d) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (iii) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (iv) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in The Postal Services Act 2000;
- (v) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road;
- (vi) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated or adjacent to the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
- (vii) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;

or

(viii) goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle, unless a Loading Prohibition is in force.

# 5 DISABLED PERSONS' EXEMPTIONS

- 5.1 Nothing in Article 3.1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).
- 5.2 A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.
- 5.3 A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
- 5.4 A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle".

# 6 PROHIBITION OF LOADING

6.1 Save as provided in Article 4 to this Order no Vehicle, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform shall load when a loading prohibition is in force on the roads or sides of the roads at any time for the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2.

## 7 LOADING BAY

Save as provided in article 4 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any day, except for goods vehicles loading and unloading, on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

# 8 PUBLIC SERVICE VEHICLES

8.1 Nothing in Article 3 shall apply to a Public Service Vehicle.

## 9 EFFECT OF ORDER

9.1 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

# 10 REVOCATION OF PREVIOUS ORDER

- 10.1 "The Derbyshire County Council Derbyshire Dales and High Peak Parking, Waiting and Loading Prohibitions and Restrictions Order 2009" is hereby revoked insofar as it relates to No Waiting at Any Time on Wye Street (southern spur).
- 10.2 Any permanent Traffic Regulation Orders made prior to this Order, insofar as they relate to the lengths of road listed below, insofar as they relate to the prohibitions and restrictions listed below, are hereby revoked.

# SCHEDULE 1

# NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

#### Wye Street, Buxton

North side

From a point 12 metres west of its junction with New Wye Street in a westerly direction for its entire length.

South side

From a point 8 metres west of its junction with New Wye Street in a westerly direction for its entire length.

## Wye Street, (southern spur), Buxton

East side

From its junction with Wye Street for its entire length.

# SCHEDULE 2

# NO LOADING OR UNLOADING AT ANY TIME

# Wye Street, Buxton

North side

From a point 12 metres west of its junction with New Wye Street in a westerly direction for its entire length.

South side

From a point 8 metres west of its junction with New Wye Street in a westerly direction for its entire length.

# Wye Street,(southern spur), Buxton

East side

From its junction with Wye Street for its entire length.

# **LOADING BAY**

# Wye Street, (southern spur), Buxton


West side
