(PROHIBITION OF WAITING, WAITING RESTRICTIONS AND LOADING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2010

The Derbyshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1 CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT

1.1 This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty-fifth day of October Two thousand and Ten and may be cited as "The Derbyshire County Council (Bernard Street and Railway Street, Glossop) (Prohibition of Waiting, Waiting Restrictions and Loading Restrictions) Order 2010".

2 INTERPRETATION

In this Order:-

- 2.01 "the County Council" means Derbyshire County Council.
- 2.02 "Carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of Vehicles, as in Section 329(1) of the Highways Act 1980;
- 2.03 "Pavement" means the remainder of the surfaced highway that is not constructed and used as Carriageway;
- 2.04 "Owner" in relation to a Vehicle, means the person by whom such Vehicle is kept and used;
- 2.05 "Vehicle" means any mechanically propelled Vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads;
- 2.06 "Public Service Vehicle" has the meaning ascribed to it by Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981, that is to say it shall mean a motor vehicle (other than a tramcar) which —
- (i) being a Vehicle adapted to carry more than eight passengers, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward; or
- (ii) being a Vehicle not so adapted, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward at separate fares in the course of a business or carrying passengers;

- 2.7 "Pedal Cycle" means a cycle (which has the same meaning as that ascribed to it in Section 192 of The Road Traffic Act 1988);
- 2.8 "Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
- 2.9 "Disabled Person's Vehicle" means a Vehicle displaying Disabled Persons Badge in the relevant position as set out under Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
- 2.10 "CEO" means Civil Enforcement Officer and has the same meaning as in Section 76 of The 2004 Act;
- 2.11 "The 2004 Act" means the Traffic Management Act 2004;
- 2.12 "Electronic Communications Apparatus", "Electronic Communications Network" and any "Electronic Communications Line" shall have the same meaning as in the Communications Act 2003;
- 2.14 "Goods" means goods or burden of any description;
- 2.15 "Goods Vehicle" means a motor Vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or a trailer so constructed or adapted, as in Section 192(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988;
- 2.17 "Loading and Unloading" means the transference, from or to a Vehicle, to or from premises, of "Goods";
- 2.19 "Relevant Position" in relation to: -
- (i) The display of a Disabled Person's Badge, has the same meaning as that ascribed to it in The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
- 2.21 "Traffic Sign" means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised or having the effect pursuant to Section 64 of the Act;
- 2.22 "Parking Bay" and "Parking Space" means a part of a Parking Place marked out or provided for the leaving of a Vehicle of the classes specified in this Order under the provisions of this Order.

3 WAITING RESTRICTIONS

- 3.1 Save as provided in articles 4, 5.1 and 8 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a CEO, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait at any time on any day on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3.2 Save as provided in articles 4, 5.2 and 8 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, or a CEO, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait between the hours of 9am and 6pm on any day (other than a Sunday) for longer than 40 minutes (no return within 1 hour) on the length of road specified in Schedule 4 to this Order.

4 GENERAL EXEMPTIONS

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (i) a person to board or alight from a Vehicle, unless a Loading Prohibition is in force.
- (ii) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
- (a) building, industrial or demolition operations;
- (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (c) the maintenance, improvement of reconstruction of the said lengths of road; or
- (d) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any Electronic Communications Line;
- (iii) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (iv) the Vehicle of a universal service provider (as defined in Section 4 of The Postal Services Act 2000) to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail;
- (v) the Vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road;
- (vi) any Vehicle, other than a privately owned Vehicle, which is being used as an official Vehicle for the purposes of a wedding (bridal vehicle) or a funeral (hearse and cortege) at a Church or place of worship;
- (vii) the Vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (viii) goods to be loaded or unloaded from the Vehicle, unless a Loading Prohibition is in force.

5 DISABLED PERSONS' EXEMPTIONS

- 5.1 Nothing in Article 3.1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the Vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).
- 5.2 Nothing in Article 3.2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article.

- 5.3 A vehicle displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle;
- 5.4 A vehicle displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
- 5.5 A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the Vehicle".

6 PROHIBITION OF LOADING

6.1 Save as provided in Article 4 no Vehicle, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a CEO, shall load when a loading prohibition is in force on the roads or sides of the roads at any time for the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

7 DISABLED PERSONS PARKING BAY

- 7.1 The Parking Bay specified in Schedule 3 is available only for a Disabled Person's Vehicle, the driver of a Vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that Parking Bay unless it is a Disabled Person's Vehicle with a valid and correctly displayed Disabled Persons Badge.
- 7.3 Nothing in this Order shall render it unlawful for a Disabled Person's Vehicle to wait in a Disabled Badge holder's only Parking Bay provided that such a Vehicle is parked within the limits of the bay.

8 PUBLIC SERVICE VEHICLES

8.2 Nothing in Article 3, shall apply to a Public Service Vehicle.

9 EFFECT OF ORDER

9.1 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

10 REVOCATIONS OF PREVIOUS ORDERS

10.1 Any permanent Traffic Regulation Orders made prior to this Order, insofar as they relate to the lengths of road listed below, insofar as they relate to the prohibitions and restrictions listed below, are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE 1

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

Bernard Street, Glossop

South side

From its junction with Railway Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 19 metres.

From a point 37 metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 22 metres.

From a point 103 metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 7 metres.

From a point 110 metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a southerly direction for a distance of 3 metres.

From a point 115.5metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 4 metres.

From a point 115.5 metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a southerly direction for a distance of 2.5 metres.

SCHEDULE 2

NO LOADING AT ANY TIME

Railway Street, Glossop

East side

From its junction with Henry Street in a southerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

From its junction with Henry Street in a northerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

West side

From its junction with Bernard Street in a southerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

From its junction with Bernard Street in a northerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

Bernard Street, Glossop

South side

From a point 37 metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 22 metres.

SCHEDULE 3

DISABLED BAY

Bernard Street, Glossop

South side

From a point 19 metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 18 metres.

SCHEDULE 4

LIMITED WAITING MON-SAT 9AM TO 9PM 40 MINUTES NO RETURN WITHIN 1 HOUR

Bernard Street, Glossop

South side

From a point 59 metres from it's junction with Railway Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 44 metres.
