(LOADING BAY) ORDER 2015

The Derbyshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1 CITATION

This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty-fifth day of May Two Thousand and Fifteen and may be cited as "The Derbyshire County Council (Sough Lane, Calver) (Loading Bay) Order 2015".

2 INTERPRETATION

In this Order:-

- 2.1 "Motor Vehicle" means any mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads.
- 2.2 "Cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle or a cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case a Motor Vehicle.
- 2.3 "Vehicle" for the purposes of this Order means a "Motor Vehicle" or "Cycle".
- 2.4 "Public Service Vehicle" has the meaning ascribed to it by Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981, that is to say it shall mean a motor Vehicle (other than a tramcar) which —
- (i) being a Vehicle adapted to carry more than eight passengers, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward; or
- (ii) being a Vehicle not so adapted, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward at separate fares in the course of a business of carrying passengers.
- 2.5 "Goods" means goods or burden of any description.
- 2.6 "Goods Vehicle" means a Motor Vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of Goods or a trailer so constructed or adapted, as in Section 192(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988.

- 2.7 "Loading and Unloading" means the transference, from or to a Vehicle, to or from premises, of Goods.
- 2.8 "CEO" means Civil Enforcement Officer and has the same meaning as in Section 76 of The 2004 Act.
- 2.9 The 2004 Act" means the Traffic Management Act 2004.
- 2.10 "Loading Bay" means a bay marked in accordance with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002, which is provided for the waiting of a Vehicle for the purpose of delivering or collecting Goods or Loading or Unloading the Vehicle as specified under the provisions of this Order.

3 LOADING BAY

- 3.1 The area of highway specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be designated a Loading Bay for Goods Vehicles only for the Loading and Unloading of Goods at any time.
- 3.2 Nothing in this Order shall render it unlawful for a Goods Vehicle to load and unload in the Loading Bay provided that such a Vehicle is parked within the limits of the bay.

4 GENERAL EXEMPTIONS

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (i) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
- (a) building, industrial or demolition operations;
- (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road; or
- (d) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (ii) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (iii) the Vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in The Postal Services Act 2000;

- (iv) the Vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (v) Goods to be Loaded or Unloaded from a Goods Vehicle.
- 5 EFFECT OF ORDER
- 5.1 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

SCHEDULE

LOADING BAY

Sough Lane, Calver

North side

From a point 5 metres east of its junction with B6001 in an easterly direction for a distance of 16 metres.
