(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2010

The Derbyshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act, and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1 CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT

This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty-fourth day of September Two thousand and Twelve and may be cited as "The Derbyshire County Council (Station Road and Rupert Street, Ilkeston) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2010".

2 INTERPRETATION

In this Order:-

- 2.1 "Vehicle" means any mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads.
- 2.2 "Public Service Vehicle" has the meaning ascribed to it by Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981, that is to say it shall mean a motor vehicle (other than a tramcar) which –
- (i) being a Vehicle adapted to carry more than eight passengers, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward; or
- (ii) being a Vehicle not so adapted, is used for carrying passengers for hire or reward at separate fares in the course of a business of carrying passengers.
- 2.3 "Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
- 2.4 "Disabled Person's Vehicle" means a Vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position as set out under Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
- 2.5 "The 2004 Act" means Traffic Management Act 2004.
- 2.6 "CEO" means Civil Enforcement Officer and has the same meaning as in Section 76 of the 2004 Act.
- 2.7 "Goods" means goods or burden of any description

2.8 "Loading and Unloading" means the transference, from or to a Vehicle, to or from premises, of Goods.

3 WAITING RESTRICTIONS

3.1 Save as provided in articles 4, 5 and 6 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a CEO, cause or permit any Vehicle to wait at any time on any day on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

4 GENERAL EXEMPTIONS

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (i) a person to board or alight from the Vehicle;
- (ii) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
- (a) building, industrial or demolition operations;
- (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road; or
- (d) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any Electronic Communications Line;
- (iii) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (iv) the Vehicle of a universal service provider (as defined in Section 4 of The Postal Services Act 2000) to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail;
- (v) the Vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of road;
- (vi) any Vehicle, other than a privately owned Vehicle, which is being used as an official Vehicle for the purposes of a wedding (bridal vehicle) or a funeral (hearse and cortege) at a Church or place of worship
- (vii) the Vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;

or

(viii) Goods to be Loaded or Unloaded from the Vehicle.

5 DISABLED PERSONS' EXEMPTIONS

- 5.1 Nothing in Article 3.1 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the Vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).
- 5.2 A Vehicle displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle.
- 5.3 A Vehicle displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the Vehicle.
- 5.4 A Vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
- (i) in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the Vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a Vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the Vehicle".

6 PUBLIC SERVICE VEHICLES

6.1 Nothing in Article 3 shall apply to a Public Service Vehicle.

7 EFFECT OF ORDER

7.1 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

8 REVOCATIONS OF PREVIOUS ORDERS

8.1 Any permanent Traffic Regulation Orders made prior to this Order, insofar as they relate to the waiting restrictions on Station Road, Ilkeston on the south side between Cranmer Street and Taylor Street and on the north side between King Street and John Street and between Blake Street and Canal Street are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

Station Road, Ilkeston

South side

From a point 4 metres east of its junction with Rupert Street in a westerly direction to a point 4 metres west of its junction with Rupert Street, a distance of 14 metres.

From a point 82 metres east of its junction with Alvenor Street in a westerly direction to a point 10 metres west of its junction with Taylor Street, a distance of 160 metres.

From a point 10 metres east of its junction with Cranmer Street in a westerly direction to its junction with Chalons Way, a distance of 168 metres.

North side

From a point 4 metres east of its junction with Canal street in a westerly direction to a point 4 metres west of Canal Street, a distance of 11 metres.

From a point 3 metres east of its junction with Blake Street in a westerly direction to a point 4 metres west of its junction with John Street, a distance of 70 metres.

From a point 10 metres east of its junction with King Street in a westerly direction to its junction with Chalons Way, a distance of 150 metres.

Rupert Street, Ilkeston

West side

From its junction with Station Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 4 metres.

East side

From its junction with Station Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 4 metres
