



**The North Dorset District Council
(Off-Street Parking Places)(Consolidation)
Order 2017**

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North Dorset District Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 35, 35A, B and C and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the Act of 1984), the relevant powers under Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and all other enabling powers, in accordance with Regulation 21 of the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 and after consultation with the Chief Constable of the Dorset Police and with the consent of the County Council of Dorset in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order (hereinafter referred to as “this Order”).

Part I

General

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 31st day of July 2017 and it may be cited as the North Dorset District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2017.
2. The ‘North Dorset (Off-Street) Parking Places Order 2014’ (as amended) is hereby revoked and the provisions of that revoked Order (and of all amendments subsequently made to that Order) are re-enacted within this Order, without any changes of substance having been made, other than those necessary to update the provisions concerning the methods by which the charges for the use of Parking Places may be made, to reflect the various payment options which are now available.
3. This Consolidation Order is made without prejudice to other Orders or similar provisions which remain in full force or effect. Where a provision of this Order conflicts with a provision of any other Order the provisions of this Order shall prevail.
4. Nothing in this Order shall restrict the powers of the Council to suspend the whole or part of this Order, and any variations made to this Order, either temporarily or permanently.
5. Nothing in Part 2 of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform.

Definitions

In this Order, unless otherwise stated, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

“**the Act of 1984**” means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or any replacement, successor or amending legislation.

“the Act of 2004” means the Traffic Management Act 2004 or any replacement, successor or amending legislation.

“Caravan” means any structure designed or adapted for human habitation which is capable of being moved from one place to another (whether being towed, or by being transported on a motor vehicle or trailer) and any motor vehicle so designed or adapted, but does not include;

- (a) any railway rolling stock which is for the time being on rails forming part of a railway system or
- (b) any tent.

“Caravanette” or **“Motor Home”** means a vehicle under 3050kg in weight that has been constructed or adapted for the purposes of eating, sleeping or cooking.

“Civil Enforcement Officer” means an individual employed either directly or indirectly by the Local Authority for the area in which the Parking Place is, for the purposes of Section 76 of the Act of 2004.

“Coach” means a Public Service Vehicle as defined by Section 1(1)(a) of the Public Passengers Vehicles Act 1981, which is a vehicle constructed or adapted to carry more than eight passengers, and used for carrying passengers for hire or reward.

“Credit card” means a card or similar thing issued by any person, use of which enables the holder to defer the payment by him of the charge for parking a vehicle.

“Day” means a continuous period of twenty-four hours from midnight to midnight except where the context otherwise admits.

“Debit card” means a card or similar thing issued by any person, use of which by the holder causes the charge for parking a vehicle to be paid by the electronic transfer of funds from any current account of his at a bank or other institution providing banking services

“Disabled Person” means a Disabled Person of a description prescribed by Regulation 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended) or any re-enactment thereof.

“Disabled Persons Badge” means a badge which was:

- (a) issued, or has effect as if issued, to a Disabled Person or an institution under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended) or under Regulations having effect in Scotland or Wales under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970, and
- (b) has not ceased to be in force

“Disabled Persons Vehicle” means a Motor Vehicle which:

- (a) displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge at all times whilst parked in a Parking Place. If the parking of the vehicle is subject to a maximum stay time limit, then a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the Vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) must also be displayed in the Relevant Position at all times whilst parked, and
- (b) is, in each case, a vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting in a Parking Place, has been or is to be driven by a Disabled Person or, as the case may be, has been or is to be used for the carrying of Disabled Persons as passengers.

“Dispensation” means an authorisation, issued by the Council, on approval of an application and in return for a fee (if demanded) to be determined by the Council, allowing a specified vehicle to be parked within one of the Parking Places specified in Schedule 1 to this Order, in contravention of one or more of the regulations pertaining to the use of that Parking Place, subject to such terms and conditions as the Council may consider appropriate.

“Driver” means either the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the Parking Place or the Owner of the vehicle at the time the vehicle was so left.

“Excursion or Tour” has the meaning given in section 137(1) of the Transport Act 1985.

“Front Side” means, the side which, in relation to the exhibition of:

- (a) A Disabled Persons Badge;
Shows the wheelchair-users symbol, the expiry date and the serial number of the Badge,
- (b) A Parking Disc;
Can be set to show the vehicles time of arrival,
- (c) A Parking Ticket;
Shows the details pertaining to that period of Pay and Display parking (the purchase time and/or expiry time of the ticket, the amount paid etc.),
- (d) A Permit, a Season Ticket or a Dispensation;
Shows the period of validity of that item and which also details those parking places or parking zones within which it is valid for use,
- (e) A Scratchcard Permit;
Shows within which parking places or parking zones it is valid for use and upon which the driver of the vehicle is required to mark (in accordance with the terms and conditions of the scheme under which it was issued and in accordance with the instructions given on the Scratchcard Permit) the period of waiting which is required.

“Immobilisation Device” has the same meaning as in Section 104 (9) of the Act of 1984

“Invalid Carriage” means a mechanically propelled vehicle of which the weight unladen does not exceed 254 kilograms and which is specially designed and constructed and not merely adapted, for the use of a person suffering some form of defect or disability and is used solely by such a person.

“Local Authority” means a County Council, District Council, the Council of the Isles of Scilly, a London Borough Council or the Common Council of the City of London.

“Local Bus” means a Public Service Vehicle used for the provision of a Local Service not being an Excursion or Tour.

“Local Service” has the meaning given in section 2 of the Transport Act 1985.

“Lorry” means a Motor Vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden of any description or a trailer so constructed or adapted and includes a heavy commercial vehicle (a lorry having an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes) as defined in Section 138 of the Act of 1984.

“Market Trader” means a person who is offering goods or services for sale to members of the public under the terms of an agreement from time to time in force made between the Council and the operator of the market (which definition shall include a car boot sale) within a Parking Place.

“Minibus” means a small bus constructed or adapted for the purpose of carrying eight or more passengers.

“Motor Car” means a mechanically propelled vehicle, not being a Motorcycle or an Invalid Carriage, which is constructed itself to carry a load or passengers and the weight of which unladen:-

- (a) if it is constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects, is adapted to carry not more than seven passengers exclusive of the Driver and is fitted with tyres of such type as may be specified in regulations made by the Secretary of State, does not exceed 3050 kilograms,
- (b) if it is constructed or adapted for use for the conveyance of goods or burden of any description, does not exceed 3050 kilograms, or 3500 kilograms if the vehicle carries a container or containers for holding for the purposes of its propulsion any fuel which is wholly gaseous at 17.5 degrees Celsius under a pressure of 1.013 bar or plant and materials for producing such fuel,
- (c) does not exceed 2540 kilograms in a case not falling within sub-paragraph (a) or (b) above,
- (d) Is not a Public Service Vehicle.

“Motor Cars Towing Trailers” and **“Motor Cars Towing Caravans”** mean a Motor Car which is either attached to a Caravan or a Trailer or which has been used to either tow a Caravan or Trailer into a Parking Place or to alter the position of a Caravan or Trailer within a Parking Place.

“Motor Cycle” means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an Invalid Carriage), with fewer than four wheels of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms.

“Motor Home” or **“Caravanette”** means a vehicle under 3050kg in weight that has been constructed or adapted for the purposes of eating, sleeping or cooking.

“Motor Vehicle” means, subject to Section 20 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970 (which makes special provision with respect to Invalid Carriages), a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads.

“Motor Vehicles Towing Trailers” and **“Motor Vehicles Towing Caravans”** mean a motor vehicle which is either attached to a Trailer or Caravan or which has been used to either tow a Caravan or Trailer into a Parking Place or to alter the position of a Caravan or Trailer within a Parking Place.

“Owner”, in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom the vehicle is kept, which in the case of a vehicle registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 (c. 22) is presumed (unless the contrary is proved) to be the person in whose name the vehicle is registered.

“Parking Bay or Parking Space” means an area within a Parking Place delineated by surface markings within which a Motor Vehicle may be positioned and parked.

“Parking Disc” means a device which

- (a) Is issued by a local authority to be used only in conjunction with a valid Disabled Persons’ Badge;
- (b) Is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun; and
- (c) Having been set by either the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle to show the time at which the period of waiting began, is to be displayed on the vehicle in the Relevant Position (with the side showing the “time of arrival” clearly legible from outside of the vehicle) and is to remain so displayed until such time as the vehicle departs that parking place

“Parking Place” means any area of land specified by name in Schedule 1 to this Order.

“Parking Ticket” means a valid parking charges ticket purchased from a Ticket Machine or Civil Enforcement Officer.

“Penalty Charge” and **“Reduced Penalty Charge”** mean, a charge set out by the Council under the provisions respectively of Sections 72 and 77 and of Schedule 9 of the Act of 2004, issued in accordance with Section 78 of the Act of 2004 and in accordance with guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport, which is to be paid in the manner described in the Penalty Charge Notice within 28 days of the date of the notice or 14 days (21 days if imposed on the basis of a record produced by an approved device) of the date of the notice in the case of a Reduced Penalty Charge.

“Penalty Charge Notice” means a notice issued pursuant to the provisions of Section 78 of the Act of 2004 in respect of a contravention which is subject to civil enforcement under the provisions of Section 73 and of Schedule 7 to that Act.

“Permit, or Scratchcard Permit” means a parking permit issued by the Council under the provision of article 2.15 of this Order on approval of an application and in return for a fee (if demanded) to be determined by the Council, subject to such terms and conditions as the Council may consider appropriate.

“Permit Holder” means a person to whom a Permit has been issued under the provisions of article 2.15 of this Order.

“Public Service Vehicle” means a vehicle as defined in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981.

“Relevant Position” means, in relation to a Disabled Persons Badge, a Parking Disc, a Permit or Scratchcard Permit, a Season Ticket, a Dispensation or a Parking Ticket;

- (a) Exhibited on the front windscreen, or on the dashboard or fascia, of the vehicle OR
- (b) Where the vehicle either does not have a front windscreen, dashboard or fascia, or, where it would be impracticable to exhibit the Badge, Disc, Permit, Dispensation or Ticket as provided in paragraph (a) above, exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle,

so that the details on the Front Side of the Badge, Disc, Permit, Dispensation or Ticket are clearly legible from outside of the vehicle or, in the case of a motorcycle, from beside the vehicle.

“Season Ticket” means a parking Season Ticket issued by the Council under the provisions of Article 2.16 of this Order in return for a fee to be determined by the Council and subject to such terms and conditions from time to time as the Council may consider appropriate.

“Season Ticket Holder” means a person to whom a Season Ticket has been issued under the provisions of article 2.16 of this order.

“Shopmobility Scheme” means a service provided under the terms of an agreement currently in force between the service provider and the Council, whereby Disabled Persons may hire for use Class 2 or Class 3 invalid carriages as are defined in ‘The Use of Invalid Carriages on Highways Regulations 1988.

“Solo Motor Cycle” means a Motor Cycle without a side car and having two wheels.

“Taxi” means a vehicle licensed under Section 37 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 or any replacement or successor legislation.

“Ticket Machine” means an apparatus or device designed to issue Parking Tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the date and time at which the charge was paid.

“Trailer” means a vehicle drawn by a Motor Vehicle.

“Vehicle” means a vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads.

In the event that no definition of a term or wording is shown herein, the Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Part 2

Use of Parking Places

General regulations

- 2.1** Each area of land specified by name in Schedule 1 to this Order may be used, subject to compliance by the Driver of a Motor Vehicle with the following provisions of this Order, as a Parking Place for such classes of vehicle, in such positions, on such days, during such hours and on payment of such charges as are specified in relation to that Parking Place in the appropriate Schedule.
- 2.2** The Council may, at its discretion, either waive charges or issue a Dispensation and nothing in this order shall restrict the power of the Council to close to the public the whole, or any part of a Parking Place, either temporarily or permanently, or restrict the power of the Council to vary, either temporarily or permanently, the days or hours of operation of a Parking Place, the scale of charges pertaining to the use of a Parking Place or the classes of vehicle, or the specific users, permitted to use the whole or any part of a Parking Place.
- 2.3** Any road or part of a road used for the purpose of access to, or exit from, a Parking Place specified in Schedule 1 to this Order and which is not included in a highway maintainable at the public expense, shall be deemed to be included within the said Parking Place and the terms of this Order shall apply to it.
- 2.4** (a) The classes of vehicles permitted to use a Parking Place and the position in which they must wait within that Parking Place are specified in Schedule 1 of this Order.
- (b) Despite the generality of paragraph 2.4(a) above, in addition, a Parking Place or certain areas or Parking Bays within a Parking Place may be marked as being reserved for the exclusive use of specific persons, Motor Vehicles or classes of vehicle, for use by vehicles being used for specified purposes, or for use only by vehicles which do not exceed a maximum weight and/or height and/or length. The markings may be in the form of surface markings or erected signs, may include common abbreviations and/or symbols and the restriction should be taken to apply at all times unless otherwise stated.
- (c) Where in Schedule 1 to this Order a Parking Place, an area within a Parking Place or a Parking Bay within a Parking Place, is described as available for the parking of specific Motor Vehicles or classes or sizes of vehicle, for parking by specific persons or for the parking of vehicles in specific positions, or where such restrictions have been marked in accordance with paragraph 2.4(b) above, a Driver shall not permit a vehicle to wait in that Parking Place which is:
- (i) Not the specified Motor Vehicle or of the specified class of vehicle, or

- (ii) Not the Motor Vehicle of the user for whose use a Parking Bay has been reserved, or
- (iii) In excess of the maximum height and/or weight and/or length of vehicle permitted
- (iv) In a position other than that specified,

Unless the Driver has obtained the prior authority of any person so authorised by the Council.

- (d) In the case of Parking Bays reserved for use by Disabled Persons Vehicles, a valid Disabled Persons Badge and Parking Disc (with the Disc set to show the time at which the period of waiting began) must be displayed, in the Relevant Position, on any Motor Vehicle parked within those bays and must remain so displayed until such time as the Motor Vehicle leaves that Parking Bay.

2.5 (a) Wherever Parking Bays are provided Motor Vehicles shall be positioned wholly within the markings of the Parking Bay.

- (b) Subject to the foregoing provisions or, in the event that the Parking Place does not have marked Parking Bays, no person shall cause a Motor Vehicle to wait within a Parking Place in a position in which a Civil Enforcement Officer may reasonably claim that it is causing an obstruction to either other users of, or to the operation of, that Parking Place.

2.6 Wherever within a Parking Place it has been indicated, either by the use of surface markings or erected signage, that access to an area within that Parking Place is forbidden, or is restricted to certain persons, vehicles or classes of vehicle, or vehicles being used for specified purposes, no person shall enter that area unless they are either:

- (a) A person or the Driver of a Motor Vehicle so authorised by the surface markings or signage to do so; or
- (b) a person who has obtained the prior authority to do so of any person so authorised by the Council.

2.7 Wherever within a Parking Place it has been indicated, either by the use of surface markings in the forms of double yellow lines or yellow hatching or by the use of erected signs, that parking in a specific place, or within an area within that Parking Place, is not permitted, the Driver of a Motor Vehicle (including a Disabled Persons Vehicle) shall not permit it to wait in that place or area unless given prior permission to do so by a Civil Enforcement Officer.

2.8 Wherever within a Parking Place it has been indicated, either by the use of surface markings or erected signage, that there is a restriction/prohibition relating to the use of that Parking Place, or to the use of an area or parking bay within that Parking Place, the Driver of a Motor Vehicle (including a Disabled Persons Vehicle) shall not permit it to wait in that place or area in contravention of that

restriction/prohibition, unless given prior permission to do so by a Civil Enforcement Officer.

2.9 Subject to articles 2.2 and 2.15 of this Order;

- (a) The Driver of a Motor Vehicle shall not permit it to wait in any Parking Place specified in Schedule 1 to this Order for longer than the stated maximum waiting period shown for that particular Parking Place. If it is further specified that, upon leaving, a Motor Vehicle is prohibited from returning to that Parking Place within a specified period of time, the driver shall not permit his/her Motor Vehicle to return within that period.
- (b) Wherever within a Parking Place it has been indicated, either by the use of surface markings or erected signage, that an area of, or a Parking Bay/ Parking Space within, a Parking Place is subject to a maximum waiting period, the driver of a Motor Vehicle shall not permit it to wait within that area, Bay or Space for longer than the indicated maximum waiting period. If it is further indicated by the surface markings or erected signage that return to that area, Bay or Space is prohibited within a specified period of time, the driver shall not permit his/ her Vehicle to return within that period.

2.10 A Driver of a Motor Vehicle shall not use a Parking Place when it has been closed by the Council or any part of a Parking Place which has been closed by the Council.

Payment of parking charges

2.11 The Driver of a Motor Vehicle using any of the Parking Places specified in Schedule 1 of this Order shall:-

- (a) If the Parking Place is subject to Pay and Display and/or Pay via Mobile Phone charges,
 - (i) immediately upon parking the Motor Vehicle, pay the required parking charge in accordance with the scale of charges relating to that Parking Place specified in Schedule 1 to this Order,
 - (ii) The charge referred to in paragraph (i) above shall be payable either;
 - (1) By following the instructions relating to the purchase of a Parking Ticket displayed upon the Ticket Machine provided for such purpose and inserting the appropriate payment into the Ticket Machine in order to obtain a Parking Ticket, **or**
 - (2) In the case of such Ticket Machines as have been designed, or adapted to accept such payments, by following the instructions relating to the purchase of a Parking Ticket displayed upon the Ticket Machine and making of a credit/debit card payment in order to obtain a Parking Ticket, **or**

- (3) Where it is indicated that such payments are accepted, by making the payment by credit/debit card via mobile phone in accordance with the instructions provided. In this case, a Parking Ticket will not be obtained, the following provisions regarding the display of Parking Tickets will therefore not apply. Where this method of payment is used, reference to electronic proof of purchase will be the means of confirming compliance with the provisions of this Order with regards to the payment of parking charges.

In the case of (2) and (3) above, where payment of the parking charge is made using a credit/debit card, an additional transaction fee may also be payable.

In all three cases, payment is to be made in accordance with the instructions which are displayed, provided that, if at any time when a Motor Vehicle is left in any Pay and Display Parking Place;

- (iii) a Driver is unable to obtain a Parking Ticket from a Ticket Machine, or a Ticket Machine carries a notice upon it stating that the Ticket Machine is out of order, the Driver of the Motor Vehicle shall proceed to pay the specified charge at one of the other Ticket Machines within that Parking Place or, where such payments are accepted, shall pay the parking charge via mobile phone,
- (iv) every Ticket Machine within that Parking Place carries a notice stating that it is out of order, if there is a Civil Enforcement Officer in the Parking Place, the driver shall pay him/her the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges or, where such payments are accepted, shall pay the parking charge via mobile phone.
- (v) a Driver is unable to pay the parking charge via mobile phone, then they shall pay the specified charge by purchasing a Parking Ticket from one of the Ticket Machines within that Parking Place. If every Ticket Machine within that Parking Place carries a notice stating that it is out of order, if there is a Civil Enforcement Officer in the Parking Place, the driver shall pay him/her the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges.
- (b) If a Parking Place which is subject to Pay and Display charges has no Ticket Machine but has a Civil Enforcement Officer, pay to him/ her the appropriate charge, or, where such payments are accepted, shall pay the parking charge via mobile phone.
- (c) If the Parking Place is subject to 'Pay on Exit' parking charges, immediately prior to removing their vehicle from the Parking Place, pay the appropriate charge, in accordance with the scale of charges and the permitted methods of payment indicated, in respect of the amount of time for which their vehicle has been within that Parking Place.

And in each case those charges apply in respect of each individual Motor Vehicle and of each individual Trailer or Caravan (if permitted to use the Parking Place) attached to, or towed into that Parking Place by, that Motor Vehicle.

If the Parking Place has marked Parking Bays, those charges apply for each individual Parking Space occupied (or partially occupied) by the Motor Vehicle and for each individual Parking Space occupied (or partially occupied) by any form of Trailer or Caravan which may be, or may have been, towed by or attached to that Motor Vehicle.

In Parking Places where trailers or caravans are permitted, either separate Parking Tickets must be purchased by the driver of the towing vehicle in respect of the Motor Vehicle and of the trailer or caravan towed by it, and all of the Parking Tickets so purchased must be displayed on the Motor Vehicle in the Relevant Position, or, where such payments are accepted, payment via mobile phone, or on exit, must include the parking charges due in respect of both the towing vehicle and of the trailer or caravan.

- 2.12** The payment of the parking charge in accordance with paragraph 2.11 above shall permit a vehicle to be parked within that parking place if and so long as the following conditions are satisfied;
- (a) The Motor Vehicle and any form of Trailer or Caravan which may be, or may have been, towed by or attached to that Motor Vehicle are within the specified class of vehicle permitted to use that Parking Place.
 - (b) The parking charge paid and any Parking Ticket purchased is not transferable to any other person or vehicle. It shall not be transferable for use in any other parking place unless specifically authorised in Schedule 1 to this Order.
 - (c) The parking charges specified in Schedule 1 to this Order are for the parking of one Motor Vehicle, trailer or caravan only.
 - (d) The Motor Vehicle and/or any Trailer or Caravan towed by it must not be parked in such a manner as to contravene any of the other provisions of this Order.
 - (e) In the case of Pay and Display parking;
 - (i) The time paid for in accordance with the scale of charges, either via mobile phone, or as calculated from the date and time of purchase indicated on the Parking Ticket displayed on the vehicle has not expired (or the expiry time indicated on the Parking Ticket has not elapsed, as the case may be).
 - (ii) The Parking Ticket purchased in respect of that period of parking is displayed in the Relevant Position, with all of the details shown on its Front Side, including its time of purchase and/ or expiry and the amount paid for it, clearly legible from outside of the Motor Vehicle. (This condition does not apply if the parking charge has been paid via mobile phone)

- (iii) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle other than one which either has displayed upon it (in the Relevant Position) a Parking Ticket valid for use in that Parking Place at that time, or, where such payments are accepted, one for which the pay and display parking charge in respect of the parking of that vehicle, in that parking place, at that time, has been paid via mobile phone, to wait within a Parking Place during such hours as that Parking Place has been designated for use for Pay and Display parking.

2.13 The Driver of a Motor Vehicle using a Pay and Display Parking Place shall, unless payment of the parking charge has been made via mobile phone, immediately they have been purchased, place all of the Parking Tickets issued to him by the Ticket Machine or Civil Enforcement Officer referred to in article 2.11 above (on payment of the charge referred to in that paragraph) since his Motor Vehicle entered that Parking Place (including any Parking Tickets issued in respect of any form of Trailer or Caravan which may be, or may have been, towed by that Motor Vehicle), in the Relevant Position on the Motor Vehicle, with all of the details shown on the Front Sides of each of those Tickets (including their times of purchase and/or expiry and the amounts paid for them) clearly legible from outside of the vehicle. The driver shall ensure that the said Parking Ticket(s) remain so exhibited at all times until the vehicle departs the Parking Place.

2.14 A Driver who wishes to extend the duration of his Motor Vehicles' stay beyond that initially paid for on arrival at the Pay and Display Parking Place may, at any time during that initial period, purchase a further Parking Ticket, or Tickets, or may make a further payment, or payments, via mobile phone, provided that;

- (a) All of the provisions of this Order shall apply to any additional period of waiting time paid for in the same way as they would to the initial period of waiting time paid for.
- (b) The Motor Vehicle must not exceed any maximum period of stay which may be applicable to that Parking Place.
- (c) All of the Parking Tickets purchased since the Motor Vehicle arrived at the Parking Place must remain clearly displayed, in the Relevant Position, on the Motor Vehicle until such time as it departs the Parking Place.
- (d) The total amount of waiting time paid for by a driver during a continuous period of parking, as evidenced by the purchase and/ or exit times and the sum of the amounts paid on the Parking Tickets thus displayed, or by the sum of the amounts paid via mobile phone, shall be accorded to the Motor Vehicle in accordance with the scale of charges relating to that Parking Place specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- (e) Additional periods of waiting cannot be paid for by the retrospective purchase of Parking Tickets, or by retrospective payments via mobile phone.

Exemptions

2.15 The following exemptions from Pay and Display parking charges shall apply;

- (a) **A Solo Motor Cycle** shall, when using a Pay and Display Parking Place, be exempted from the charges set out in the scale of charges relating to that Parking Place in Schedule 1 of this Order if there is an area within that Parking Place which has been specifically designated for the parking of that class of vehicle and it has been parked wholly within that designated area.
- (b) **Disabled Persons Vehicles:** Provided that at least the minimum tariff payable within a Parking Place (as specified in Schedule 1 to this Order) has been paid in respect of the parking of a Disabled Persons Vehicle, then that vehicle shall be entitled to remain parked within that Parking Place for a maximum period of one hour in excess of the period of parking time which has been paid for.
- (c) **Emergency vehicles of the Fire, Police, Ambulance and HM Coastguard services** shall be exempted from the Pay and Display charges and/or from any maximum period of stay specified in Schedule 1 of this Order whilst using the Parking Places specified therein, provided that they are in active use on service.

The foregoing exemptions apply to Pay and Display parking charges only and do not apply to Penalty Charges or Reduced Penalty Charges.

Permits, Season Tickets and Dispensations

2.16 The owner of a Motor Vehicle may apply to purchase from the Council a Season Ticket, Permit or Scratchcard Permit for the parking of that Motor Vehicle (subject to the terms and conditions of each individual scheme), subject to the charges referred to in either Schedule 2 or Schedule 3 to this Order and;

- (a) A Season Ticket shall only be valid in such Parking Places as are specified in relation to that Season Ticket in Schedule 2 of this Order, during the period for which it is issued and subject to the condition that Season Ticket Holders are not guaranteed a space. Should any Parking Place be full, the Season Ticket Holder will have the right to use one of the other Parking Places listed as valid for the use of that Season Ticket.
- (b) A Season Ticket shall cease to be valid at the expiration of any period of validity specified thereon.
- (c) A Permit shall be valid only in those Parking Places, on such days, between such hours and, if applicable, in such designated areas or Parking Bays within those Parking Places as are specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.
- (d) A Permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of any period of validity specified thereon.

- 2.17** A Dispensation issued by the Council shall be valid only in those Parking Places, on such days, between such hours and, if applicable, in such designated areas or Parking Bays within those Parking Places as are specified thereon. A Dispensation shall cease to be valid at the expiration of any period of validity specified thereon.
- 2.18** Subject to the provisions of paragraphs 2.16 and 2.17 above the Driver of a Motor Vehicle displaying a valid Permit, Season Ticket, Scratchcard Permit or Dispensation, shall be exempt from the 'Pay and Display'/'Pay via mobile phone'/'Pay on Exit' charges specified in Schedule 1 herein, subject to any maximum period of exemption from such charges stated in either Schedule 2 or Schedule 3 to this Order.
- 2.19** No Permit or Season Ticket shall be issued when the number already issued is equal to the maximum number approved by the Council from time to time or to the maximum number of Parking Bays available for use by Permit Holders in a particular Parking Place.
- 2.20** The Driver of a Motor Vehicle for which a Season Ticket, Permit, Scratchcard Permit or Dispensation has been issued in accordance with paragraphs 2.16, 2.17, 2.18 and 2.19 above, shall ensure that the said Season Ticket, Permit, Scratchcard Permit or Dispensation is displayed, on that Motor Vehicle, in the Relevant Position, at all times when it is parked in a Parking Place.
- 2.21** The driver of a Motor Vehicle shall not cause it to wait in a Parking Bay reserved for use by Permit Holders unless a Permit, valid for use in that Parking Bay and at that time, is clearly displayed on the vehicle, in the Relevant Position, at all times when it is parked in that Parking Bay.
- 2.22** (a) The Council may at its discretion issue from time to time a Permit to any member of its staff whose duties necessitate their use of a Parking Place.
- (b) The Permit shall be displayed on the Motor Vehicle, in the Relevant Position, at all times whilst it is parked. It is only valid for use when the member of staff is on duty for the Council, only in the Parking Places specified on the Permit and only on the days and between the hours also specified thereon.

Penalty Charges

- 2.23** Where, in any of the Parking Places listed in schedule 1 to this order;
- (a) A Motor Vehicle has been parked;
- (i) For longer than the maximum period permitted, or
- (ii) Which is of a class of vehicle other than those detailed in Schedule 1 to this Order as permitted to use that Parking Place, or in an area within a Parking Place not designated for use by that class of vehicle, or
- (iii) Beyond the markings of a Parking Bay, or

- (iv) In a restricted area within that Parking Place, or
 - (v) In a Parking Bay, or in an area within the Parking Place, which has been reserved for use by specific users or for specified purposes, when the Driver and/ or his Motor Vehicle are not the specified user or are not conducting the specified purpose, or
 - (vi) In a Parking Bay reserved for use by Permit Holders without clearly displaying a Permit which is valid for use in that Parking Bay at that time, or
 - (vii) In a Parking Bay reserved for use by Disabled Persons without clearly displaying a valid Disabled Persons Badge and a Disabled Persons Parking Disc, or
 - (viii) In a Parking Bay reserved for the charging of electric vehicles only without charging actively taking place, or
 - (ix) In a Loading Bay or Loading Area whilst loading/unloading is not seen to be actively taking place, or
 - (x) In a Coach/Lorry parking bay with the engine running, where it is indicated by signage and/or surface markings that the running of engines is prohibited, or
 - (xi) In a manner which is causing an obstruction, or
 - (xii) In contravention of a provision of this Order, or
 - (xiii) When the Parking Place is closed, **OR**
- (b) A 'No return' period has been specified for Motor Vehicles leaving that Parking Place and the Motor Vehicle has been re-parked within that period, **OR**
 - (c) A maximum weight and/or height and/or length of vehicles permitted to use that Parking Place, or an area or parking bay(s) within that parking place has been specified and the vehicle parked exceeds that maximum weight, height or length, **OR**
 - (d) A Motor Vehicle is used in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of goods, without having the express licence in writing of the Council to do so, **OR**
 - (e) In which Pay on Exit charges are payable and the required parking charge has not been paid prior to the vehicle exiting the Parking Place, **OR**
 - (f) In which Pay and Display charges are payable and;
 - (i) A valid Parking Ticket is not clearly displayed on the Motor Vehicle in the Relevant Position and, where such payments are accepted, the required parking charge has not been paid via mobile phone, or

- (ii) Sufficient valid Parking Tickets are not clearly displayed in the Relevant Position on the motor vehicle (or, where such payments are accepted, sufficient parking charges have not been paid via mobile phone) in respect of either;
 - (a) The Motor Vehicle and of each Trailer or Caravan which may either be attached to that Motor Vehicle or may have been towed into that Parking Place by that Motor Vehicle, or
 - (b) in the case of a Parking Place which has marked Parking Bays, in respect of the total number of individual Parking Spaces occupied (or partially occupied) by that Motor Vehicle and by any form of trailer or caravan which may be, or may have been, towed by or attached to that Motor Vehicle, or
- (iii) The parking time paid for in respect of a Motor Vehicle, or in respect of any Trailer or Caravan which may be or may have been attached to that Motor Vehicle, as evidenced by either the purchase and/or exit time and the amount(s) paid on the Parking Ticket(s) displayed on the Motor Vehicle, or by the sum of the amounts paid via mobile phone in respect of the parking of those vehicles, has expired, **AND**
- (iv) No Permit, Scratchcard Permit or Dispensation, valid for use in that part of that Parking Place at that time, is displayed on the Motor Vehicle in the Relevant Position,

A Penalty Charge for such contravention of the parking regulations shall be payable.

2.24 When a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a Motor Vehicle, it shall not be removed or interfered with except by or under the authority of;

- i) The owner of the vehicle or the person in charge of it, or
- ii) A Civil Enforcement Officer or other person duly authorised by the Council.

2.25 A vehicle which has incurred a Penalty Charge and which, having not since been moved, remains parked in contravention of the parking regulations, will not incur any further Penalty Charges until a period of 24 hours has elapsed from the time at which the first Penalty Charge Notice was issued to it. Provided that, if a Civil Enforcement Officer has cause to re-issue that first Penalty Charge Notice, they may do so and, in such circumstances, the 24 hour period shall then be recommenced from the time of issue of that re-issued Penalty Charge Notice. Should such a vehicle remain in situ once that 24 hour period has expired, further Penalty Charges may be incurred. This is subject to the proviso that a period of at least 24 hours must be allowed to pass between the times of issue of each of the subsequent Penalty Charge Notices issued to that vehicle.

In the case of a Vehicle which, within 24 hours of a Penalty Charge Notice having been issued to that Vehicle, has either been re-parked within the same Parking Place, has departed from and then returned to that Parking Place, or has been re-parked within a different Parking Place, if it has again been parked contrary to

either the same, or to other parking regulations, it will be deemed to have committed an additional and entirely separate parking contravention, for which Penalty Charges shall be payable in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

- 2.26** Where the Driver of a Motor Vehicle appears to have contravened the provisions of this Order;
- (a) The Owner of that Motor Vehicle shall give any such information as to the identity of the Driver as may be required by the Council, upon demand and
 - (b) Any other person shall, if required to do so by the Council or by any person duly authorised by the Council, give any information which it is in his power to give which may lead to the identification of the Driver, upon demand.

Immobilisation and removal of vehicles

- 2.27** Where there is reason to believe that a vehicle has been permitted to remain at rest within a parking place in circumstances in which a Penalty Charge has become payable and a Penalty Charge Notice in respect of such contravention has been issued in accordance with Regulation 9 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 (the General Regulations), a Civil Enforcement Officer or person acting under his direction may fix an Immobilisation Device to the vehicle in exercise of the Council's powers under Section 79 and Part 3 of Schedule 9 of the Act of 2004 and Part 3 of the General Regulations. The vehicle shall be released from the Device on payment of the charges referred to in Regulation 14 of the General Regulations.
- 2.28** A vehicle which has been left in a Parking Place and which appears to have been abandoned may be dealt with under the Council's powers to remove and dispose of such vehicles.

Conditions of use

- 2.29** (a) No person shall, except with the permission of any person authorised by the Council in that behalf, drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in a Parking Place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the Parking Place in accordance with the provisions of this Order, or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.
- (b) The Driver of a Motor Vehicle using a Parking Place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the Parking Place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the said Motor Vehicle in or to depart from the Parking Place.
- (c) (S)He shall drive at all times with consideration for other users and, in particular, shall not use the Parking Place for racing or driving furiously and, where speed limits are indicated in any Parking Place, the Driver of the Motor Vehicle must not exceed them.

- (d) Parking Places are to be used for the parking of Motor Vehicles in accordance with the provisions of this Order and drivers shall not use them as a means of proceeding from one road to another.

2.30 Where in a Parking Place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of either indicating the entrance to, or the exit from, the Parking Place, or indicating that a Motor Vehicle using the Parking Place is to proceed in a specified direction, no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any Motor Vehicle:

- (a) So that it enters the Parking Place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the Parking Place otherwise than by an exit so indicated, **or**

- (b) In a direction other than that specified as the case may be,

Unless specifically instructed to do so by a Civil Enforcement Officer.

2.31 Any person entering a Parking Place shall at all times abide by instructions given by a Civil Enforcement Officer and, in particular, if they are directed by a Civil Enforcement Officer to park their Motor Vehicle in a particular area within the Parking Place, they shall park only where so directed.

2.32 No persons while in any Parking Place shall;

- (a) sell, advertise or offer for sale any articles, goods or services, obtain custom, tout, importune, offer the hire of his skill or service, carry on any trade or business or distribute advertising leaflets or similar material except with the express licence in writing of the Council, or
- (b) use any Motor Vehicle to conduct any of the activities referred to herein except where (s)he is operating as a Market Trader.

2.33 No person shall use any part of a Parking Place or any Motor Vehicle left in a Parking Place;

- (a) For sleeping or camping purposes
- (b) For eating or cooking purposes
- (c) For the purpose of servicing or cleaning any Motor Vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that Motor Vehicle to depart from the Parking Place; or
- (d) For playing or participating in any games, sport or recreation.

2.34 In a Parking Place no person shall:

- (a) Erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written consent of the Council.
- (b) Light, or cause, or permit to be lit, any fire.

- 2.35** The Driver of a Motor Vehicle using a Parking Place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except, if necessary, when changing the position of the vehicle within or when departing from the Parking Place, to warn a pedestrian or another Motor Vehicle of his presence.
- 2.36** No person shall, in a Parking Place, shout or otherwise make any loud noise which may be liable, in the opinion of any officer of the Council or any Police Officer, to cause disturbance or annoyance to users of the Parking Place, any member of the public or residents of adjacent premises in the neighbourhood.
- 2.37** No person shall, in a Parking Place, use any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned.
- 2.38** Any person shall immediately leave a Parking Place if required to do so by a Civil Enforcement Officer.
