The Borough of Weymouth and Portland (Chapelhay Street, Weymouth) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting and Loading/Unloading) Order 2012

The Weymouth and Portland Borough Council, acting on behalf of Dorset County Council pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, hereby makes the following Order in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers and in accordance with the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Procedure Regulations 1992.

- 1. This Order will come into operation on Saturday 7th January 2012 and may be cited as the Borough of Weymouth and Portland (Chapelhay Street, Weymouth) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting and Loading/Unloading) Order 2012.
- 2. This Order has been made in the interest of public safety as a result of a collapsed wall. It continues in force the temporary No Waiting and No Loading restriction which was introduced under the Borough of Weymouth and Portland (Chapelhay Street, Weymouth) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting and Loading/Unloading) Order 2010.
- 3. Whilst this Order remains in force, no person shall permit any vehicle to wait or to load/unload in the length of road detailed in the Schedule below.
- 4. Emergency services vehicles shall be exempt from this Order.
- 5. This Order may remain in force for eighteen months but it will expire upon completion of the works. If the works have not been completed within eighteen months, the Order may be extended with the approval of the Secretary of State for Transport.
- 6. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the Interpretation of this Order as it applies for an Act of Parliament.
