# (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND STOPPING, PARKING PLACES AND DISABLED PARKING) ORDER 2011 (AMENDMENT NO. 2) ORDER 2015

The County Council of Durham ("the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32 and 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ("the Act") and Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

#### General

This Order may be cited as The County Council of Durham (Sedgefield) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Stopping, Parking Places and Disabled Parking) Order 2011 (Amendment No. 2) Order 2015 and shall come into operation on 12 December 2016.

#### Purpose of Amendments

The following brief synopsis of amendments should be viewed in conjunction with the plans identified within the Schedules to the above Order, however the plan(s) should prevail in the event of any discrepancy:

- 1. To introduce a length of No Waiting At Any Time on both sides of Salters Lane Industrial Estate Road from its junction with roundabout on Salters Lane easterly to the entrance into Sainsburys.
- Make minor administrative amendments to the Order to which the under-noted apply.

•	12	Use of Parking Places & Parking Bays during permitted hours without payment
		12. (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order relating to vehicles which are left in a parking place or parking bay in accordance with those provisions any other vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in a parking place or parking bay if:-  (i) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;  (ii) the vehicle is waiting due to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to

avoid an accident: the liveried vehicle is used for police. (iii) fire & rescue service or ambulance, or is a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of a local authority, being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; the vehicle is waiting for so long as may (iv) be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic: the vehicle is in the service of or (v) employed by a universal service provider and is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place or parking bay, in which the vehicle is waiting, or being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded, are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place or parking bay in which the vehicle is waiting; the vehicle, not being a passenger (vi) vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in paragraph (1) (b) of Article 35 of this Order: (vii) the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of posting or removing advertising material in the form of posters on or from premises adjacent to the parking place or parking bay in which the vehicle is waiting: or in any other case the vehicle is waiting (viii) for the purpose of active delivery or collecting goods or active loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place or parking bay in which the vehicle is waiting. Save as provided in paragraph (5) of this Article no charge specified in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a parking place or parking bay in accordance with the provisions of this Article. Nothing in the provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having affect as if made under Section 25 of the Any person who leaves or causes a vehicle to

be left in a parking place or parking bay by virtue of provisions (v), (vi), (vii) of paragraph (1) (a) or by virtue of paragraph (1) (b) of this

		Article shall so stand as to be in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of Article 34of this Order.  (5) When a vehicle is left in a parking place or parking bay designated under Articles 12, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31 and 32 of this Order, in contravention of the provisions of this article a penalty charge shall be payable.

	14 15	Contravention and Enforcement  14. If a vehicle is in contravention of a provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.  15. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice may then be issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with the requirements of Section 78 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended.
