# THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM (WEST CORNFORTH) (TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER 2006

The Durham County Council ("the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

## Part I

## General

 This Order may be cited as The County Council of Durham (West Cornforth) (Traffic Management) Order 2006 and shall come into operation on 18<sup>th</sup> September 2006.

# Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"disabled person's badge has the same meaning as in the Disabled Person's (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"parking disc" means a device, issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be in force, 125 millimetres square coloured blue, if issued on or after 1 April 2000, or orange if issued before that date, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"Universal service provider" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

"hackney carriage" means a vehicle that is licensed as a hackney carriage and the driver of which is licensed in accordance with the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 and the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
  - (a) A disabled person's badge in the relevant position if -
    - the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle; or

 (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle;

So that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.

- (b) A parking disc in the relevant position if -
  - the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle;

or

(ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or fascia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle, so that when marked to show the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside of the vehicle.

## Part II

## Revocation

3. The Orders detailed in Schedule 1 are hereby revoked.

#### Part III

# **Prohibition of Waiting**

- 4. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in or on the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) the picking up or setting down of passengers;
  - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely -

- (i) building or demolition;
- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;
- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (d) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the service of a universal service provider.
- (2) Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.
- (3) Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of road or the sides of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day).

#### Part IV

# No Waiting 8.00 a.m. - 6.00 p.m.

6. Save as provided in Article 7 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8am and 6pm on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order:-

- 7. (1) Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the roads or sides of lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) the picking up or setting down of passengers;
  - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely
    - (i) building or demolition;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
  - (d) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
  - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the service of a universal services provider.
  - (2) Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.
  - (3) Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article.

## Part V

# Saving

- 8. In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of THIS Order shall prevail.
- The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

## **SCHEDULE 2**

# No Waiting At Any Time

Item 1/	C24 Station Road	On the eastern side of the road, from a point 25 metres north west of its junction with U35.14 High Street, in a south easterly direction, to a point 17 metres south of its junction with U35.14 High Street, a distance of 45 metres.
Item 2/	U35.14 High Street	On the northern side of the road, from its junction with C24 Station Road, in a north easterly direction, for a distance of 15 metres.
Item 3	U35.14 High Street	On the southern side of the road, from its junction with C24 Station Road, in a north easterly direction, for a distance of 18 metres.

Item 4	U35.14 High Street	On the northern side of the road, from a point 28 metres west of its junction with Cuthbert Road, in an easterly direction, to a point 26 metres east of its junction with Cuthbert Road, a distance of 54 metres.
Item 5 <sub>/</sub>	Cuthbert Road	On both sides of the road, from its junction with U35.14 High Street, in a northerly direction, for a distance of 11 metres.

## **SCHEDULE 3**

# No Waiting between the hours of 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m.

Item 1	U35.14 High Street	On the southern side of the road, from a point 42 metres south west of its junction with Hollyhurst Road, in an easterly direction, to a point 46 metres west of its junction with St Cuthberts Way, a distance of 282 metres.
Item 2	Hollyhurst Road	On both sides of the road, from its junction with U35.14 High Street, in a south easterly direction, for a distance of 10 metres.
