THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM (VARIOUS LOCATIONS, COUNTY DURHAM) (BUS, CYCLE, MOTORCYLE & TAXI LANES 7am-7pm) ORDER 2014

The County Council of Durham ("the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

Part I Commencement, General and Definitions

Citation and Commencement

 This Order may be cited as The County Council of Durham (Various Locations, County Durham) (Bus, Cycle, Motorcycle & Taxi Lanes 7am-7pm) Order 2014 and shall come into operation on the 15th September 2014.

Interpretation

2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"bus-lane" means-those parts of the carriageway-of-a road-described-in-Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order:

"bus" has the same meaning as in Regulation 22 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002;

"enforcement officer" means a uniformed police officer, policy community support officer or any subsequent designation of these officers";

"liveried vehicle" means a vehicle having a distinctive design and colour scheme used to distinguish a police, fire brigade or ambulance vehicle;

"motor cycle" has the same meaning as defined by Section 136 of the Act;

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act;

"pedal cycle" means a cycle whose motive power is provided solely by the legs of its rider or riders or which complies with the requirements specified in Regulation 4 of the Electrically Assisted Pedal Cycles Regulations 1983;

"penalty charge" means a charge set by the Council under the provisions of section 77 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, in accordance with the relevant statutory regulations or guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport";

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued by a civil enforcement officer pursuant to the provisions of section 78 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended";

"taxi" has the same meaning as "hackney carriage" as defined in Section 80 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976;

"white line" has the same meaning as diagram 1049 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

3. For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be deemed to wait for more than two minutes in the same place if any part of the road is below any part of the vehicle or its load (if any) throughout a period exceeding two minutes whether or not the vehicle is moved during that period.

Part III

Bus, Cycle, Motorcycle & Taxi Lanes

6. Save as provided in Article 7 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of an enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle other than buses, cycles, motorcycles and taxis to enter, proceed or wait in the bus, cycle, motorcycle & taxi lanes specified in the Schedule to this Order between the hours of 7.00am to 7.00 pm on any day, other than for the purpose of crossing it.

- 7. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall apply to:-
 - (a) any liveried vehicles being used by police, fire & rescue service or ambulance vehicles on emergency call;
 - (b) a vehicle which is being used for the purpose of loading or unloading goods or merchandise to or from premises adjacent to, or accessible only from the bus lane PROVIDED that:
 - such loading or unloading can be reasonably carried out only from the bus, cycle, motorcycle & taxi lanes and that it takes place only whilst no prohibition of loading and unloading in the bus lane by virtue of the provisions of any other Order is in force;
 - (ii) such vehicle shall proceed to gain access to or from premises across the bus, cycle, motorcycle & taxi lanes using the shortest possible route;
 - (c) a vehicle being used for the conveyance of persons to or from premises adjacent to the bus lane PROVIDED that such boarding or alighting does not cause the vehicle to wait in the same place for more than two minutes and such vehicle shall proceed to gain access to and from the premises across the bus, cycle, motorcycle & taxi lanes using the shortest possible route;
 - (d) any-vehicle-which-is-being-used (and which cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road or part of a road other than the bus, cycle, motorcycle & taxi lanes) in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to the bus lane, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the bus lane or the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or adjacent to the bus lane of any service or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (e) a mechanical road cleansing vehicle.
- 8. (1) Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of an enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in a bus, cycle, motorcycle & taxi lanes in a direction other than that specified in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Order.
 - (2) Nothing in this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any authorised vehicle which is proceeding in a bus, cycle, motorcycle & taxi lanes to cross over the white line if it is necessary to do so in order to overtake a vehicle that is stationary in the bus lane.
- 9. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of **THIS** Order shall prevail.
- 10. The restrictions and prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

Part III

Contravention and Enforcement

- 11. If a vehicle is in contravention of any provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
- 12. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice may then be issued by a civil enforcement officer in accordance with the requirements of section 78 of the Traffic management Act 2004, as amended.

PART V

Saving

- 13. In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of THIS Order shall prevail.
- 14. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
