THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM (DENE ROAD DALTON LE DALE) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND PROHIBITION OF LOADING/UNLOADING) ORDER 2003

The Durham County Council ('the Council') in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2), and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, ('the Act') and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

PARTI

General

1. This Order may be cited as The County Council of Durham (Dene Road Dalton le Dale) (Prohibition of Waiting and Prohibition of Loading/Unloading) Order 2003 and shall come into operation on the 20 October 2003.

PART II

Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time

- Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in or on the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. (1) Nothing in Articles 2 and 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the picking up and setting down of passengers:
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads;

- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (d) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the service of a universal service provider as defined in the
- (2) Nothing in Articles 2 and 4 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used for Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes.
- (3) Nothing in Articles 2 and 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit the following vehicles to wait:-
 - (a) a hackney carriage waiting at a duly authorised cab rank;
 - (b) a vehicle waiting on a parking place duly authorised by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act PROVIDED that the vehicle is parked in accordance with the provisions of such an Order.

Prohibition of Loading / Unloading

- 4. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Order for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, UNLESS the vehicle is in actual use for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the service of a universal service provider as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000.
- In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of THIS Order shall prevail.
- 6. The restrictions and prohibitions by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

No Waiting at any time and No Loading/Unloading at any time.
