THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM (CHESTER-LE-STREET AND BIRTLEY) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING, LOADING/UNLOADING & PARKING PLACES) CONSOLIDATION NO. 2 ORDER 2012

The County Council of Durham ("the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35 and 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ("the Act") and Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

Part 1

General

 This Order may be cited as The County Council of Durham (Chester-le-Street and Birtley (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading/Unloading & Parking Places) Consolidation No. 2 Order 2012 and shall come into operation on 16 July 2012.

Interpretation

 In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"carer" means a person providing care and attending a person who is a resident.

"civil enforcement officer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to the provisions of Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.

"contractor" means a person or persons working at the address of a resident.

"council" means The County Council of Durham;

"credit card" has the same meaning as in Section 35A of the Act;

"debit card" has the same meaning as in Section 35A of the Act;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Person's (Badge's for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended);

"disabled person's parking disc" means a device which:

- (a) is 125 millimetres square coloured blue, if issued on or after 1 April 2000, or orange if issued before that date
- (b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid and
- (c) is capable of showing the quarter hour during which a period of waiting began.

"driver" in relation to a vehicle parked in a parking place means the person driving or riding the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"dual purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as in Regulation 3 of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, as amended;

"goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and which has an unladen weight not exceeding 7.5 tonnes and is not drawing a trailer;

"liveried vehicle" means a vehicle having a distinctive design and colour scheme used to distinguish a police, fire brigade or ambulance vehicle;

"loading bay" means an area of highway designated as a loading bay under the provisions of this Order;

"masterplan" means the plan showing the total area covered by all of the individual map schedules for each location included in a Map Based Road Traffic Regulation Order"

"medical/health care professional" means a person (being a doctor, nurse or similar qualified professional) attending a patient/client who is a resident;

"motor cycle" has the same meaning as defined by Section 136 of the Act;

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act;

"owner" in relation to a vehicle, shall mean the person by whom it is kept or used;

"parking bay" means an area of highway designated as a parking bay under the provisions of this Order;

"parking contravention" has the same meaning assigned to it by Section 73 and Part 1 of Schedule 7 to the Traffic Management Act 2004.

"parking place" means an area of highway designated as a parking place under the provisions of this Order;

"parking place" means an area of highway designed as a parking place under the provisions of this Order;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver, and not drawing a trailer;

"penalty charge" means a charge set by Durham County Council pursuant to the provisions of Section 77 of the Traffic management Act 2004.

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions of Section 78 of the Traffic management Act 2004

"permit" means a permit and a "valid permit" issued under the provisions of Article 10 of this Order:

"permit holder" means a person to whom a permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 10 of this Order;

"relevant position" means:-

- in the case of a disabled person's badge;
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the badge is exhibited thereon; or

- (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position in the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; and
- (ii) in respect of a disabled person's parking disc:-
 - in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the badge is exhibited thereon; or
 - (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle; so that when marked to show the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside of the vehicle;

"resident" means a person whose usual residence, either private or business, is premises the postal address of which is in any street or part of a street specified Schedule 7 to this Order;

"scheme operating conditions" means the conditions adopted by the Council settin down the requirements for the Parking Scheme as approved by the Highways an Design Services Sub-Committee on 21 December 1999 (as amended) or a subsequently amended from time to time;

"taxi" has the same meaning as "hackney carriage" as defined in Section 80 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976;

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorise under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the Act; and

"universal service provider" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Ac 2000

"visitor's permit" means a permit issued to a resident for a visitor is accordance with the provisions of Article 10 of this Order.

Part II

Revocation

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Part III

Prohibition of Waiting At Any Time

4. Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of an enforcement officer or a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 1 to this Order.

Prohibition of Waiting and Loading/Unloading At Any Time

- 5. Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of an enforcement officer or a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to:
 - a. wait, or
 - b. wait for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, at any time, on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 2 to this Order.

Restricted Waiting and Loading/Unloading

- 6. Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of an enforcement officer or a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to:
 - a. wait, or
 - b. wait for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads on such days and during such times as identified within the individual plan(s) detailed in Schedule 3 to this Order.

Restricted Waiting

7. Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle, other than those vehicles so authorised in this Order, to wait on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads on such days and during such times as identified within the individual plan detailed in Schedule 4 to this Order.

Part IV

Loading Bays

- 8. (1) The areas of highway identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 5 to this Order are hereby authorised to be used as loading bays, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the waiting of vehicles for the purpose of loading or unloading goods only on such days and during such times as identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 5 to this Order.
 - (2) Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle, other than a vehicle loading or unloading goods, to wait in a loading bay on such days and during such hours as identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 5 to this Order.
 - (3) The limits of each loading bay shall be indicated, by the Council, on the carriageway by the appropriate traffic signs.
 - (4) Every vehicle using a loading bay shall so stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the loading bay AND in those cases where special provision is made is identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 5 to this Order, in accordance with those provisions.

Parking Places

- 9. (1) The areas of highway identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 6 to this Order are hereby designated as parking places.
 - (2) Each parking place identified within the individual plan(s) detailed in Schedule 6 to this order, authorised under paragraph (1) of this Article may be used for the leaving of motor vehicles and motor cycles of a type specified within the individual plan(s) detailed in that Schedule in on such days and during such times as identified.
 - (3) The limits of each parking place and of each parking bay shall be indicated by the Council, on the carriageway by the appropriate traffic signs are identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 6 to this Order.
 - (4) The driver of a motor vehicle or a rider of a motor cycle shall not permit it to enter or wait in a parking place, authorised by paragraph (1) of this Article, for a period exceeding the maximum stay identified within the individual plans or to return within the period also specified those plans.

Permit Holders - Parking Places

- 10. (1) The areas of highway identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 7 to this Order are hereby authorised as Permit Holder parking places.
 - (2) Each parking place identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 7 to this order, authorised under paragraph (1) of this Article may be used for the leaving of motor vehicles and motor cycles of a type specified in paragraph (3) and which displays a valid permit issued in accordance with this Order, on such days and during such hours, as identified within the individual plan(s) detailed in Schedule 7.

- (3) Any resident being the owner of a passenger vehicle, dual purpose vehicle goods vehicle not exceeding 7.5 tonnes in weight or 6 metres in length invalid carriage and resides or carries out business in the streets specified in Schedule 7 to this Order, may apply to the Council for the issue of a residents permit to enable them to park in the appropriate parking place(s) as defined in the Scheme Operating Conditions, as amended from time to time.
- (4) Any resident who resides in the streets identified in the within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 7 to this Order, may apply to the Council for the issue of a visitors' permit for visitors to their residence, such person being the owner of a vehicle of a type specified in paragraph (3) of this Article, to enable them to park in the appropriate parking place(s) as defined in the Scheme Operating Conditions, as amended from time to time.
- (5) Any resident who resides in the streets identified in the within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 7 to this Order, may apply to the Council for the issue of a carers' permit for the purpose of a carer visiting them at their residence, such person being the owner of a vehicle of a type specified in paragraph (3) of this Article, to enable them to park in the appropriate parking place(s) as defined in the Scheme Operating Conditions, as amended from time to time.
- (6) A medical/health care professional, being the owner of a vehicle of a type specified in paragraph (3) of this Article, identified by the Health Care Trust may be issued with a permit to enable them to park in the appropriate parking place(s), WHILST ATTENDING to a patient/client who resides in one of the streets identified in the individual plans detailed in Schedule 7 as defined in the Scheme Operating Conditions, as amended from time to time.
- (7) A builder/contractor being the owner of a vehicle of a type specified in paragraph (3) of this Article, may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit to enable them to park in the appropriate parking place(s), WHILST WORKING at an address in one of the streets identified in the individual plans detailed in Schedule 7 as defined in the Scheme Operating Conditions, as amended from time to time.
- (8) An application for a permit shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall be returned to the Council completed and accompanied by a remittance for such charge, which the Council may require, as specified in paragraph (19) of this Article, as is appropriate in respect of the permit for which application is made.
- (9) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them.
- (10) A permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a permit to the Council on the occurrence of any of the events set out in paragraph (12) below.
- (11) The Council may, by Notice, in writing served on the permit holder, at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's residence, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council that any of the events set out in paragraph 12 of this Article has occurred and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of such notice.

- (12) The events referred to in paragraphs (10) and (11) above of this Article are:
 - (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
 - (b) the medical/health care professional or carers' patient/client ceasing to be a resident at defined in this Order;
 - (c) the vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph 3 of this Article.
 - (d) a builder/contractor ceasing to work at a residential address as defined in this Order.
 - (e) a visitor ceasing to have any connection or any reason to visit a resident at a residential address as defined in this Order.
 - (f) a carer ceasing to visit a resident at an address as defined in this Order.
- (13) A permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (12) of this Article, whichever is the sooner.
- (14) If a permit is mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars on it have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and may apply to the Council for the issue of a replacement.
- (15) If a permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a replacement permit.
- (16) Upon the issue of a replacement permit, by virtue of the provisions of paragraphs (14 and 15) of this Article, the permit which it replaces shall be rendered invalid.
- (17) A permit shall be issued on behalf of the Council and include such information or particulars which the Council may determine.
- (18) On receipt of an application, made under the foregoing provisions of this Article, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident, a medical/health care professional or Contractor may issue a permit subject to the Scheme Operating Conditions.
- (19) The Council may levy a charge in connection with the issue of a permit, subject to the Scheme Operating Conditions and the provisions of this Order; such charges are attached to this Order at Schedule 7(a).
 - (a) The maximum number of permits which may be issued to an applicant shall be subject to a maximum number of permits as defined in the Scheme Operating Conditions, as amended from time to time.
 - (b) The Scheme Operating Conditions may be varied from time to time, details of which will be made available from the Council's Traffic Section; by public notice and via the Council website.

- When a vehicle, for which a permit has been issued, is left in a parking place, there shall be displayed on the front of the vehicle a valid permit applicable to that parking place, so that the information and particulars contained in the permit are clearly visible from outside the vehicle.
- When a permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (20) of this Article no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.
- Where an authorised officer of the Council has reasonable cause to believe that a permit issued in accordance with provisions of this Article has been wrongly acquired or is a forgery, he may detain the permit or require its submission under the provisions of Section 116 of the Act.

Disabled Badge Holders Only:

- 11. (1) The areas of highway identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 8 to this Order are hereby authorised as disabled persons parking places.
 - Each parking place identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 8 to this order, authorised under paragraph (1) of this Article may be used only on such days and during such times as identified within the individual plan(s) detailed in that Schedule by vehicles which display in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a disabled persons parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) on any day.
 - (3) The limits of each parking place shall be indicated by the Council, on the carriageway by the appropriate traffic signs and the parking bay shall be identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 8 to this Order.
 - (4) Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle, other than one displaying a Disabled Person's Badge/Disabled Person's Parking Disc to park in a Disabled Badge Holders Only Parking Place on such days and during such times as identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 8 to this Order.

Manner of Standing in Parking Places and Loading Bays

- 12. (1) Every vehicle left in a parking place or loading bay, identified in within the individual plans detailed in Articles 8, 9, 10 and 11 of this Order, shall so stand, subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking place or loading bay.
 - Where a vehicle has been left in a parking place or loading bay, referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article, is to long to comply with the provisions of that paragraph such vehicle shall be deemed to be within the limits of the parking place or loading bay if:
 - the extreme front or rear portion of the vehicle is within 300 mm of the carriageway indication provided under paragraph (3) of Articles 8, 9, 10 and 11 of this Order;
 - (b) the vehicle, or any part of it, is not within the limits of any adjoining parking place or loading bay.

Power to Suspend Parking Places and Loading Bays

- 13. (1) Any person authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or loading bay or any part thereof whenever he consider such suspension is reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or loading bay, or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or loading bay of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place or loading bay on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises
 - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
 - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place or loading bay at times of weddings, funerals or on other special occasions.
 - (2) A civil enforcement officer may suspend the use of a parking place or loading bay or any part thereof, whenever such suspension is reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
 - (3) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or loading bay or any part thereof, in accordance with paragraph (1) or (2) of this Article shall, thereupon, place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the parking place or loading bay, or part thereof, as the case may be, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
 - (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place or loading bay or any part thereof, during such period as there is placed in or adjacent to the parking place or loading bay, as the case may be, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
 - Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply to any vehicle waiting in the parking place or loading bay or part thereof which is suspended with the permission of the person suspending the parking place or loading bay or part thereof, in pursuance of paragraph (1) or (2) of this Article.
 - (5) No person shall use a parking place or loading bay in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or loading bay or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of their skills or services.

Relocation and Removal of Vehicles and Other Equipment

14. (1) If a vehicle is left within a parking place in a position other than in accordance with the provisions of this Order the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of that vehicle so that it is accordance with those provisions.

- (2) The terms and conditions shall apply equally to any other equipment deposited in the parking place which in the opinion of a person authorised by the Council constitutes a contravention of the provisions of this Order and these provisions are extended to include for the disposal of the equipment where it is deemed appropriate by the Council.
- (3) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of the Order a person authorised by the Council in that respect may remove the vehicle from the parking place or arrange for such removal.
- (4) If an emergency occurs, the Council or a police officer in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a parking place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place.
- (5) Any person altering or causing the alteration of the position of a vehicle or removing or causing the removal of a vehicle may do so by towing, lifting or driving the vehicle or using such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed.

Part V

No Stopping on Entrance Markings

15. Save as provided in Article 16 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the written permission of an enforcement officer or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait on the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads identified in the individual plan(s) detailed in Schedule 9 to this Order.

Part VI

Exemptions

16

- (1) Nothing in Articles 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 15 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads referred to therein, for so long as may be necessary to enable;
 - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following:-
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or re-construction of the said roads:
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
- (c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the service of a universal service provider.
- (2) Nothing in Articles 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 15 of this Order shall apply to any liveried vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes in pursuance of statutory duties.
- (3) Nothing in Articles 4 and 7 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and disabled person's parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of road or on the sides of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same road on the same day).
- (4) Nothing in Articles 9 and 10 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait in the lengths or road referred to in those Articles.
- (4) Nothing in Articles 5, 6 or 8 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable the picking up or setting down of passengers.
- (5) Nothing in Articles 4, 7, 9, 10 or 11 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:
 - (a) the picking up or setting down of passengers;
 - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;

Part VI

Contravention and Enforcement

- 17. (1) If a vehicle is in contravention of a provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
 - (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice may then be issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with the requirements of Section 78 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended.

Part VII

Saving

- 18. In so for as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of this Order shall prevail.
- 19. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

If a parking permit becomes invalid, a quarter of the annual fee may be refunded for every remaining whole quarter for which the parking permit remains valid.

Resident and Business permits can be transferred to a new vehicle on return of the permit at no cost.

All lost or stolen permits must be reported immediately. Lost or stolen permits will be cancelled and replacements charged at £10.00 per permit.

Parking place suspensions

Parking place suspensions are charged at £20 per space per week or part thereof and may only be suspended for the duration of the activity. Note: the County Council does **not** charge for funerals, deliveries or removals or the suspension of an unmarked space within a permit holders only area.

A refund may be available when a suspension is not required. The parking office **must** be contacted at least 24 hours prior to the suspension.

Where Durham County Council require a parking place suspension, the suspension will be offered free of charge.
