EAST HERTFORDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE EAST HERTFORDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL (APTON ROAD, BISHOP'S STORTFORD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING and LOADING) ORDER 2013

The East Hertfordshire District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with Hertfordshire County Council ("the County Council") in exercise of the powers of the County Council under Sections 1, 2, 3 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and in accordance with the provisions of Part 6 of The Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and of all other powers enabling in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby make the following order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The East Hertfordshire District Council (Apton Road, Bishop's Stortford) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 2013" and shall come into operation on 28 June 2013.
- 2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait load or unload between the hours of 8:00am and 8:00pm Monday to Saturday in those lengths of Apton Road, Bishop's Stortford as specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to
 - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
 - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of -
 - (i) a police constable in uniform:
 - (ii) a Civil Enforcement Officer as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and appointed by East Hertfordshire District Council.
 - (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
 - (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
 - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

In this Article -

The expressions "universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal Service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

- (2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are -
 - (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
 - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
 - (d) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
 - (e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.

- 4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 5. The provisions of the following Order are hereby revoked but only in so far as they are affected by the restrictions imposed by this Order –

The East Hertfordshire District Council (Control of Parking) (Consolidation) Order 2012 (Plan EAS1862)

6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

Street Name	Side of Street	
Apton Road	North west	From a point 10 metres south west of its junction with the south western kerb line of Potter Street, south westwards for a distance of 17.5 metres.
Apton Road	South east	From a point 10 metres south west of its junction with the south western kerb line of Potter Street, south westwards for a distance of 34.5 metres.
