East Sussex County Council, in exercise of their powers under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2), 4, 32, 35, 36, 45, 46 and 49, of, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act"), as amended, and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

#### **PART 1 - PRELIMINARY**

## Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as "The East Sussex (Eastbourne Town Centre) (On-Street Parking Places and Prohibition & Restriction of Waiting) Order 2008" and shall come into operation on 20 October 2008

#### Revocation

2. The following Orders are hereby revoked:-

The Eastbourne (Town Centre) Experimental Traffic Order 2007

The East Sussex (On-street Parking Places at Eastbourne) Order 1991

The Eastbourne (Town Centre) Experimental (Variation No 1) Traffic Order 2007 ('Experimental Variation Order No 1')

The Borough of Eastbourne (Parking For Residents of the Town Centre Controlled Zone) Order 1977.

#### **Interpretation**

#### 3. In this Order

"agents" means any person or persons authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and/or enforce any prohibition and restriction on the waiting by vehicles and/or any parking place;

"ambulance" has the same meaning as in the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 Schedule 2, Section 6;

"ambulance bay" means any area of the carriage way being appointed as a parking place for ambulances by the Council and which area is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"authorised agent" means the parking services contractor appointed by and acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of the supervision and enforcement of the provisions of this Order;

"bus" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted to carry more than eight passengers (in addition to the driver), or motor vehicle not so constructed or adapted used to provided local services;

"bus stop" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"business" means any Company limited by shares or guarantee, business partnership, sole trader or charitable organisation;

"business permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 29;

"business permit holder" means a person to whom a business permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 29;

"business user" means a person who carries out business at any premises the postal address of which is in any street or property specified in Schedule 14;

"coach" means a chartered private hire motor vehicle adapted to carry more than eight passengers (in addition to the driver);

"concessionaire", means a person who has been granted a concession by the Council to be eligible for a day permit for bona fide reasons;

"Council" means East Sussex County Council or its appointed agents;

"coach bay" means any area of the carriageway being an area appointed as a parking place for a coach by the Council:

"day permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 38;

"day permit holder" means a person to whom a day permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 38;

"delivering and collecting" in relation to any goods or postal packets includes checking the goods or postal packets for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"designated space" means a parking space designated by the Council for use by a particular class of vehicle or driver:

"disabled person" and "disabled person's badge" have the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's bay" means any area of carriageway being an area appointed as a parking place for a disabled person's vehicle by the Council and which area is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge and which is a vehicle, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 to be included in an Order under the Act, has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case may be, has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers;

"disabled person's badge" and "parking disc" have the same meanings as in Regulation 3(1) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 and "relevant position" has the same meaning as in Regulation 4 of those Regulations;

"disabled person's concession" has the meaning given by Section 117(3) of the Act;

"disabled persons parking place" means an area of highway authorised to be used as a parking place for the leaving of disabled persons' vehicles;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986;

"doctor" means a fully registered person within the meaning of section 55 of the Medical Act 1983;

"doctor's parking bay" means any area of carriageway being an area appointed as a parking place for a doctor's vehicle while on call by the Council and which area is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"doctor's permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 32;

"doctor's permit holder" means a person to who a doctors permit is issued under the provisions of Article 32

"doctor's vehicle" means a vehicle the registered owner of which is a fully registered person as in Section 55 of the Medical Act 1983;

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means that person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"dual purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986;

"electric vehicle" means a vehicle primarily powered by an electrical motor;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

""excess charge" in relation to on-street parking has the same meaning as in section 46 of the 1984 Act.

"goods" means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and includes postal packets of any description; and "delivering" and "collection", in relation to any goods, include checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"goods vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"goods carrying vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer;

"hackney carriage" means a hackney carriage in respect of which there is in force a licence granted under section the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 38;

"health care worker", means a person working for a Primary Care Trust or a health and community care organisation who needs to park in order to provide services to a resident of any street or property specified in Schedule 14 in pursuit of their duties;

"health care worker permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 38

"Guest House or Hotel" means any premises offering overnight accommodation to visitors on a commercial basis from a business rated premises, or a holiday home let to persons on holiday;

"hotel guest" means a person staying or lodging at a hotel or guest house being premises the postal address of which is in any street or property specified in Schedule 14;

"hotel guest permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 38;

"heavy commercial vehicle" means a "heavy commercial vehicle as defined in Section 138 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which has an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes";

"kerb-line" in relation to a scheduled road shall mean that imaginary line which is the projection of the line formed by the edge of the main carriageway and the other boundary of the scheduled road adjacent to its junction with the side in question of any other road;

"limited waiting area" means the lengths of road specified in the Schedule 14 to this Order the areas of which are bounded on one side by the edge of the carriageway and a traffic sign consisting of a longitudinal broken white line on the same side of the road as that edge "loading bay" means the part of the road authorised by this Order to be used as a goods vehicle loading and unloading area as stated in Schedule 6 and defined in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002

"local service" has the same meaning as in Section 67 of the Transport Act 1985;

"lpg vehicle" means a vehicle primarily powered by a motor using liquefied petroleum gas or a hybrid vehicle using either petrol, diesel or liquefied petroleum gas;

"medical practice" means a prescribed description of practice in which one or more medical practitioners provide general medical services under the National Health Service Act 1977,

"motor cycle" or "motor vehicle" and "invalid carriage" have the same meanings as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"motorcycle parking place" means any area of carriageway being an area appointed as a parking place for a motorcycle by the Council and which area is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"owner", in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used. In determining who was the owner of a vehicle at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;

"one-way street" means a highway in which the driving of vehicles otherwise than in a specified direction is prohibited;

"parking attendant" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to patrol, issue penalty charge notices in any parking place and to enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order;

"parking bay" means any area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place;

"parking charge" means an amount payable, subject to the provisions of this Order, at a ticket parking meter in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7;

"parking period" means a period of time for which payment of the parking charge has been paid in respect of a vehicle and during which that vehicle may be left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 inclusive, subject to the provisions of this Order;

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hours period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"parking place" means a parking place designated or authorised by this Order;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of their driver and not drawing a trailer;

"pay and display parking place" means a length of road authorised to be used as a parking place under the provision of the Articles included in Parts III and IV of this Order.

"permit" means a permit issued in accordance with the Articles and Schedules of this Order;

"permitted hours", in relation to a parking place means the period specified at the beginning of the Schedule relating to that parking place;

"permit holder" means a holder of a valid permit issued by East Sussex County Council under this Order provided it is used accordance with the provision of the Articles in Parts III and IV of this Order.

"permit holder's bay" means any area of the carriageway being an area appointed as a parking place for valid permit holders issued by the Council and which area is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"police bay" means any area of carriageway being an area appointed as a parking place for a police vehicle by the Council and which area is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"police vehicle" means any motor vehicle used by a police officer in exercise of his duties as a member of Sussex Police;

"postal packets" have the same meaning as in Sub-section (1) of Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000;

"prescribed hours" in relation to a street or length of street specified in any part of Schedule means the time specified at the beginning of the Schedule or Part of the Schedule relating to that street or length of street;

"protective cover", means a protective cover issued by the Council under the provisions of Articles 26 and 29;

"registered keeper" in relation to a vehicle means the person in whose name the vehicle is registered under the provisions of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;

"relevant position" means for the purposes of this Order that,

A disabled person's badge is displayed on a vehicle in a relevant position if -

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from the outside of the vehicle

A vehicle displays a parking disc in a relevant position if -

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from the outside of the vehicle; or
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter -hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from the outside of the vehicle.

"resident" means,

- (i) a person whose usual residence;
- (ii) the owner or owners of a business whose place of work; or
- (iii) the owner or owners of a Hotel or Guest House, where temporary residence,

is at premises, the postal address of which is in any street specified in the list of qualifying streets in Schedule 14 to this Order:

"resident's permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 26;

"resident's permit holder", means a person to whom a permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 26;

"resident's visitor" means a person who is visiting a resident;

"resident's visitor permit" means a permit issued under the provision of Article 38;

"residents parking place" means an area of highway authorised to be used as a parking place for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Article 12 a valid permit issued in respect of that vehicle;

"restricted road" has the same meaning as defined under Section 82 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984;

"rider" in relation to a motorcycle waiting in a parking place means that person driving the motorcycle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"road" includes part of a road and has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;

"shared use parking place " means any area of carriageway being an area appointed as a parking place for any

vehicle displaying a valid pay and display parking ticket or valid permit issued by the Council and which is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"solo motor cycle" has the same meaning as in Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"street" includes any part of a street;

"street parking place" has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"Sub-zone" means a street, number of streets or part thereof grouped together for the purposes of issuing and controlling the use of resident's parking permits in accordance with Article 26;

"taxi bay" means any area of carriageway being an area appointed as a standing for hackney carriages by the Council and which area is bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is complaint with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"telecommunications system" has the same meaning as in Section 12 in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

"ticket" means a ticket issued by a ticket parking meter relating to a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7;

"ticket parking meter" means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State for Transport for the purposes of this Order being an apparatus designed to issue a ticket indicating the payment of the parking charge and the time by which the parking period will expire;

"tradesperson", means a person who in the course of their business is engaged in work at any premises the postal address of which is in any street or property specified in Schedule 14, provided that such a person's business is not based at those premises;

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or as having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"trailer" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and includes any part of which is superimposed on the drawing vehicle;

"universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal service" and "postal packet" have the same meanings as in Section 26 of the Postal Services Act 2000;

"usual place of abode" means premises where a person ordinarily resides and shall not include premises where a person is occupying accommodation for each person but with shared bathroom and/or kitchen facilities;

"vehicle" means mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"voluntary sector worker" means a person working for a religious organisation or voluntary organisation registered with the Charity Commission who needs to park in order to provide services to a resident in any street or property specified in Schedule 14.

"voluntary sector worker's permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 35;

"visitor" means a person who is visiting a resident and who is not ordinarily resident or resident at that resident's usual place of abode being premises the postal address of which is in any road or part of a road specified and described in Schedule 14;

"Waiver Certificate" means a certificate issued on behalf of the Council for the purposes of Articles 7 permitting a specified vehicle to wait in special circumstances on a length or lengths of roads where the waiting of that

vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited.

#### PART II – WAITING RESTRICTIONS

## No waiting at any time

4. Save as provided in Articles 6, 7, 8, and 9 of this Order, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of roads specified in Part A of Schedule 1 to this Order, except on any length of road specified in Part B of Schedule 1 to this Order, or in any parking place listed in Schedules 2, 3, and 4 to this Order, where such waiting is in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

## No waiting at specified times

5. Save as provided in Articles 6, 7, 8, and 9 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any lengths of roads specified in Part B Schedule 1 within the limited waiting area between the hours of 8 a.m to 6 p.m Monday – Saturday.

## **Exceptions**

- 6. Nothing in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle save where such loading and unloading is prohibited under any other Order
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -
    - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
  - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets.

## Waiver certificate

- 7. (a) Nothing in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article for so long as the vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council and is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate;
  - (b) and provided that a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and

the notification of the cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.

## Holders of disabled person's badge

- 8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc, may be left in any part of a street or length of street specified in Schedule 1 for a period of not more than 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road), except where loading and unloading is prohibited under the provisions of any other Order and provided that:-
  - (a) the driver of the vehicle or other person in charge of the vehicle marks on the parking disc the time at which the period of waiting has begun;
  - (b) and the vehicle is not causing obstruction or inconvenience to other road users, including pedestrians.

## Restrictions which do not apply

- 9. The restrictions imposed by Articles 4 and 5 of this Order shall not apply:-
  - (a) in relation to a bus being used to provide a local service, whilst waiting at any authorised stopping place, terminal or turning point, providing such waiting is not prohibited by virtue of any other enactment;
  - (b) in relation to a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes;
  - (c) in relation to a hackney carriage, whilst waiting on any duly authorised taxi rank;
  - (d) in relation to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances the vehicle cannot reasonably be used for such purpose in a street not being a restricted street;
  - (e) in relation to a vehicle whilst waiting for so long as may be necessary in connection with the taking in of petrol, oil, water or air, if such taking in cannot be effected unless the vehicle waits in the place in which it is waiting;
  - (f) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a parking attendant and;
  - (g) to anything done where notice has been given to the Council or authorised agent and their consent has been obtained in writing and any conditions as they may impose are complied with.

#### PART III - DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES

## **Designation of parking places**

10. Whilst this Order continues in force, each area of highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in Schedules 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 bounded by a traffic sign comprising a road marking that is compliant with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 is designated as a parking place.

## Vehicles for which parking places are designated

11 (1) Save as authorised by this Article no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait for

loading or unloading or any other purpose at any time in any of the parking places or parts of the roads referred to in this Article.

- (2) Save as authorised by Article 19(5)(b) each parking place referred to in Schedules 2, 3, and 4 may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of vehicles of the following classes, that is to say, passenger vehicles or goods carrying vehicles the gross weight of which does not exceed 5 tonnes, the height of which is not more than 2.08 metres (6 feet 10 inches) and the overall length of which does not exceed 5.49 metres (18 feet), motor cycles or invalid carriages.
- (3) Save as authorised by Article 19(5)(b) each parking place referred to in Part A of Schedule 2 (Permit Holder Only Parking Places) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in paragraph (2) of this Article as display in the manner specified in Article 12(l) either a valid resident's, business, voluntary sector worker or day permit issued in respect of that vehicle under the provisions of this Order.
- (4) Save as authorised by Article 19(5)(b) each parking place referred to in Part B of Schedule 2 (Resident Permit Holder Only Parking Places) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in paragraph (2) of this Article as displayin the manner specified in Article 12(2) a valid resident's permit issued in respect of that vehicle under the provisions of this Order.
- (5) Save as authorised by Article 19(5)(b) each parking place referred to in Schedule 3 (Pay and Display Parking Places) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in paragraph (2) of this Article as display in the manner specified in Article 12(3) a valid ticket issued in respect of that vehicle under the provisions of this Order.
- (6) Save as authorised by Article 19(5)(b) each parking place referred to in Schedule 4 (Shared Use (Permit Holder and Pay and Display) Parking Places may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles of the class specified in paragraph (2) of this Article as displayed in the manner specified in Article 12(4) either a valid resident's, business, voluntary sector worker or day permit or a valid ticket issued in respect of that vehicle under the provisions of this Order.
- (7) Each parking place referred to in Schedule 5 (Disabled Persons Parking Places) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are disabled person's vehicles.
- (8) The part of the roads specified in the Schedule 6 (Goods Vehicle Loading Only Bays) to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a loading bay area, for goods vehicles, in such positions as specified and at any time as specified in relation to that part of the road in Schedule 6 to this Order for the purposes of loading and unloading only.
- (9) The part of the roads specified in the Schedule 7 Part A (Coach Bays) to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are coaches in such positions and on such days as specified in relation to that part of the road in Schedule 7 Part A to this Order.
- (10) The part of the roads specified in the Schedule 7 Part B (Coach Bays) to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are coaches in such positions and on such days during the permitted hours as specified in relation to that part of the road in Schedule 7 Part B to this Order.
- (11 The part of the roads specified in the Schedule 8 (Bus Stops) to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are buses in such positions and on such days as specified in relation to that part of the

road in Schedule 8 to this Order.

- (12) The part of the roads specified in the Schedule 9 (Ambulance Bays) to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are ambulances in such positions and on such days hours as specified in relation to that part of the road in Schedule 9 to this Order.
- (13) Each parking place referred to in Schedule 10 (Motorcycle Bays) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are solo motor cycles in such positions and on such days as specified in relation to that part of the road in Schedule 10 to this Order.
- ((14)Each parking place referred to in Schedule 11 ( Police Bays) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are police vehicles.
- (15)Each parking place referred to in Schedule 12 (Doctors Bays) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are doctor's vehicles.
- (16)Each parking place referred to in Schedule 13 (Taxi Bays) may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, for the leaving at any time of such vehicles as are hackney carriages.

#### PART IV - SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

#### Section 1 – General

# <u>Tickets, resident's permits, business permits and day permits to be displayed on vehicles left in certain designated parking places</u>

- 12. (1) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Part A of Schedule 2 (Permit Holder Only Bays) during the permitted hours, the driver shall cause to be displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle either a valid resident's, business, voluntary sector worker or day permit issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order, so that all the particulars on that permit are readily visible from the front or nearside of that vehicle.
  - (2) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Part B of Schedule 2 (Resident Permit Holder Only Bays) during the permitted hours, the driver shall cause to be displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle a valid resident's permit issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order, so that all the particulars on that permit are readily visible from the front or nearside of that vehicle.
  - (3) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Schedule 3 (Pay and Display Parking Bays) or Part B of Schedule 7 (Coach Parking Bays) during the permitted hours, the driver shall cause to be displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle a valid ticket issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order, so that all the particulars on that ticket (are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle.
  - (4) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Schedule 4 (Shared Use (Permit Holder and Pay and Display) Parking Places) during the permitted hours, the driver shall cause to be displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle either a valid resident's, business, voluntary sector worker or day permit or a valid ticket issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order, so that all the particulars on that permit or on that ticket, as the case may be, are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle.
  - (5) At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Schedule 12 (Doctor's

Bays) during the permitted hours, the driver shall cause to be displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle a valid Doctor's Permit issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order, so that all the particulars on that permit are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle.

(6) In this Article any reference to particulars on a ticket shall be construed as those particulars which indicate that the parking charge has been paid and the day and time by which the parking period will expire and any reference to particulars on either a resident's, business voluntary sector worker or day permit shall be construed as those particulars referred to in Article 42 of this Order.

## **Contravention in a parking place**

13. If a vehicle is left in a parking place without complying with the provisions of this Order, then a contravention shall be deemed to have occurred and an excess charge shall be payable.

## Alteration of position or movement of a vehicle in a parking place

- 14. (1) Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 16, a parking attendant may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.
  - (2) A police officer in uniform or a parking attendant may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, any vehicle left in a parking place.

## Exemptions for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge when left in certain parking places

- 15. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge may be left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3 and 4 without charge or time limit provided that the use of that part of the parking place in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended.
  - (2) Without prejudice to the generality of this Article, a disabled person's vehicle shall only stand in a parking place in accordance with the provisions of Article 16.

## Manner of standing in a parking place

- 16. (1) The driver of a vehicle waiting in a parking place referred to in Schedules 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 at any time shall cause it so to stand:-
  - (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified, so as to be in accordance with those provisions;
  - (b) in the case of any other parking place so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the wheels of the vehicle are not more than 30 centimetres away from the edge of the carriageway nearest the vehicle.
    - (c) so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking place; and
  - (d) so that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting.
  - (e) Motorcycles must be parked perpendicularly to the kerb line with the front wheel of the motorcycle facing away from the kerb line.
  - (2) Articles 16(1)above does not apply where:

- (a) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office or dwelling-house;
- (b) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a parking attendant may approve.

## Power to suspend the use of a parking place

- 17. (1) The Chief Officer of Police or any police officer above the rank of Chief Inspector may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof for a period not exceeding twenty-eight days whenever he considers such suspension necessary for maintaining the security of premises in the vicinity of that parking place.
  - (2) At the expiration of the period of twenty-eight days mentioned in paragraph (1) of this Article, the suspension of the parking place, as the case may be, or any part thereof shall be reviewed by the person who suspended its use and any continuation of the suspension that they consider necessary shall be notified to the Council and shall not exceed a further period of twenty-eight days without similar review.
  - (3) Any person duly authorised by the Council or authorised agent may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:-
    - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
    - (b) on any occasion on which it is likely, by reason of some special attraction or occurrence, that any street will be throughd or obstructed;
    - (c) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place or loading area, as the case may be, the laying, erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication system or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign;
    - (d) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to that parking place from or to a depository, or another office or dwelling-house; or
    - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.
  - (4) A police officer in uniform may suspend for not longer than seven days the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
    - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety; or
    - (b) on any occasion on which it is likely, by reason of some special attraction or occurrence, that any street will be throughd or obstructed.
  - (5) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article, the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place, or that part thereof, as the case may be, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
  - (6) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place or any part thereof at any time during which there is displayed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof, as the

case may be, a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (5) of this Article:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply:-

- (a) in respect of any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 19(4) (b) (c) (d) (e)
- (b) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or the part thereof, as the case may be, in pursuance of paragraph (1), (3) or (4) of this Article, a police officer in uniform or a parking attendant.

## Restriction on the use of a parking place

- 18. (i) No driver or other person in charge of any vehicle which has left a parking place specified in Schedules 2, 3 and 4 after waiting therein shall, during the period of 2 hours after so leaving again cause or permit such vehicle to wait on that parking place.
  - (ii) No driver or other person in charge of any vehicle which has left a parking place specified in Part a of Schedule 5 after waiting therein shall, during the period of 2 hours after so leaving again cause or permit such vehicle to wait on that parking place.
  - (iii) No driver or other person in charge of any vehicle which has left a parking place specified in Part A of Schedule 7 after waiting thereon shall, during the period of 1 hour after so leaving again cause or permit such vehicle to wait on that parking place.
  - (iv) During the permitted hours no person shall use any parking place or any vehicle while it is in a parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of their skill in handicraft or their services in any other capacity:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale or offering or exposing for sale of goods from a vehicle:-

- (a) if the vehicle is a passenger vehicle, a goods carrying vehicle, a motor cycle or an invalid carriage and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected; or
  - (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 19 (4) apply.

## Restrictions on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

- 19.
- (1) Except as provided by this Order, the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit that vehicle to wait in a parking place during the permitted hours.
- (2) The driver of a vehicle waiting in a parking place by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1) (2) or (3) of this Article shall cause it so to stand in accordance with the provisions of Article 16
- (3) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any Regulations made or having effect as if made under section 25 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- (4) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage;

- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond their control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident:
- (c) the vehicle is being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes or, not being a passenger vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (e) the vehicle is being used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service and the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be collected or delivered at premises or posting boxes adjacent to the place in which the vehicle is waiting;
- (f) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 18 (3)(c); or
- (g) the vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council and is waiting to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate. Provided that a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.
- (5) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
  - (a) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office or dwelling-house;
  - (b) and in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or in the case of a parking place specified in Schedules 2, 3 or 4, the vehicle is loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a parking attendant may approve

## Section 2 - Parking charge and ticket parking meter indications in relation to certain designated parking places

## Amount of the parking charge paid at ticket parking meters and maximum parking periods

- 20. (1) Except as provided in Article 24, the relevant parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 during the permitted hours shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be as specified in Schedule 15.
  - Where payment of the parking charge has been made in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place in Part A of Schedules 3 and Part A of Schedule 4, the period during which the vehicle is left shall not exceed 2 hours.
  - (3) Where payment of the parking charge has been made in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place in Part B of Schedule 3 and Part C of Schedule 4 the period during which the vehicle is

left shall not exceed 23 hours 55 minutes.

(4) Where payment of the parking charge has been made in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place in Part B of Schedule 4 and Part B of Schedule 7, the period during which the vehicle is left shall not exceed 4 hours.

## Payment of the parking charge

- 21. (1) Except as provided in Article 24, payment of the parking charge shall be made, in accordance with the next following paragraph, immediately a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7.
  - (2) The parking charge shall be payable on the leaving of a vehicle in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 by the insertion in a ticket parking meter relating to that parking place the amount of the parking charge for the parking period for which payment is being made.
  - (3) Upon payment of the parking charge, the driver shall display or cause to be displayed on the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of the next following paragraph, the ticket issued by the ticket parking meter following payment of the parking charge in accordance with the provisions of the last preceding paragraph.
  - (4) Except as provided in Article 24, the ticket referred to in the last preceding paragraph shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued at all times during which the vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 during the permitted hours, so that all the particulars on that side of the ticket which bears the indication that a parking charge has been paid and the day and time by which the parking period will expire, are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle.
  - (5) In any case where payment of the parking charge as described in paragraph (2) of this Article is attempted and the ticket parking meter fails to accept or register the coins inserted into that ticket parking meter, such payment must be made at another ticket parking meter relating to that parking place.
  - In any case, where every ticket parking meter relating to a parking place is out of order or, where there is over every ticket parking meter a notice placed by any person duly authorised by the Council or authorised agent or by the Chief Officer of Police indicating that every ticket parking meter relating to a parking place is out of order, any vehicle left in the parking place shall be exempt from the parking charge provided that in the case of a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7, if the said ticket parking meter is rectified or replaced not later than two hours before the expiration of the permitted hours, the vehicle is removed within two hours of such rectification or replacement. If the vehicle is not so removed the parking charge for a period of two hours shall be deemed to have been incurred and paid at the time when the vehicle was left in the parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 by the insertion of a coin or coins for payment of the parking charge in the ticket parking meter relating to that parking place, and all the provisions of this Order shall apply accordingly.
  - (7) In any case where payment of the parking charge as described in paragraph (2) of this Article has been made and a ticket has been issued by a ticket parking meter in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7, that ticket shall not be transferred to another vehicle under any circumstances.

## **Indications by tickets**

- 22. (1) Payment of the parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 shall be indicated by the issue by a ticket parking meter of a ticket indicating that a parking charge has been paid, and the day and time by which the parking period will expire, and by the display of that ticket in the manner specified in Article 21(3)
  - (2) The expiry of the parking period in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in

Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 shall be indicated when there is displayed on the vehicle a ticket issued by a ticket parking meter relating to that parking place, showing the day and time by which the parking period will expire, and the day so shown is not the day on which the vehicle is left or the time shown on the clock of that ticket parking meter is later than the time shown on the ticket.

#### No ticket to be displayed other than that obtained on payment of the parking charge

No person shall display on a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 3, 4 and Part B of Schedule 7 during the permitted hours any ticket other than that issued by the ticket parking meter relating to that parking place upon payment of the parking charge in respect of that vehicle.

#### **Exemptions from the parking charge**

24.

- (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Articles 20 or 21 a vehicle which displays either a valid resident's, business voluntary sector worker or day permit issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order, may be left in a parking place referred to in Schedule 4 without time limit, provided that the use of that parking place has not been suspended.
- (2) No parking charge shall be incurred or payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 21(2) in respect of any vehicle referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article.

## Interval before a vehicle may again be left in a parking place

25. No vehicle which, having displayed a ticket, has been taken away from a parking place during the permitted hours shall, until the expiration of two hours from the time it was taken away, again be left in that parking place during the permitted hours.

## Section 3 – Application for and issue of permits

## Application for and issue of resident's permits

- 26. (1) A resident who is the registered keeper of a vehicle of A class specified in Article 11(2) and whose usual residence is at premises, the postal address of which is in any street specified in the list of qualifying streets in Schedule 14 to this Order, may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue of a resident's permit in respect of that vehicle and any such application shall be made on a form obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the remittance of the relevant charge specified in Schedule 15:-
  - (2) On receipt of an application for a resident's permit or after the issue of a resident's permit, the Council or authorised agent may at any time require an applicant for a resident's permit or a resident's permit holder, as the case may be, to produce to an officer of the Council or a representative of the authorised agent:-
    - (a) in respect of any application, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify the details of that application; or
    - (b) in respect of any resident's permit that has been issued, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify that the resident's permit is valid.
  - (3) Subject to the number of permits issued to a single household normally being limited to 2 on receipt of an application made under the provisions of this Article and on receipt of the relevant charge specified in Schedule 15, the Council or authorised agent, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the registered keeper of the vehicle in respect of which the application is made and the vehicle is of the class specified in Article 11(2) and that no other permit which remains valid has been issued under the provisions of this Order in respect of that vehicle, shall issue to the applicant:-

- (a) one resident's permit for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Schedules 2 and 4 inclusive of the vehicle to which such resident's permit relates by the resident's permit holder or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the resident's permit holder, other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward; and
  - (b) protective cover(s) in which the resident's permit(s) must be displayed.

## Surrender, withdrawal and validity of resident's permits

- 27. (1) A resident's permit holder may surrender a resident's permit to the Council or authorised agent at any time and shall surrender a resident's permit to the Council or authorised agent on the occurrence of any one of the following events:
  - (a) the resident's permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
  - (b) the resident's permit holder ceasing to be the registered keeper of the vehicle in respect of which the resident's permit was issued;
  - (c) the withdrawal of such resident's permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article;
  - (d) the vehicle in respect of which such resident's permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of a class specified in Article 11(l);
  - (e) the issue of a duplicate resident's permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of Article 28, save where the permit has been lost or destroyed.
  - (2) The Council or authorised agent may, by notice in writing served on the resident's permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to the resident's permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the resident's permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, withdraw a resident's permit if it appears to the Council or authorised agent that any of the events set out in paragraph (1)(a), (1)(b) or (1)(d) of this Article has occurred and the resident's permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.
  - (3) Where a resident's permit is issued to any person upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured, the resident's permit shall cease to be of any effect and the Council or authorised agent shall, by notice served on the person to whom such resident's permit was issued, by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to him or her at the address shown by that person on the application for the resident's permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, require that person to surrender the resident's permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.
  - (4) A resident's permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified on it or on the occurrence of one or more of the events referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article, whichever is the sooner.

#### Application for and issue of duplicate resident's permits

- 28. (1) If a resident's permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the residents' permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the resident's permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or authorised agent or apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate resident's permit and the Council or authorised agent, upon receipt of the resident's permit, shall issue a duplicate resident's permit, so marked, and upon such issue the resident's permit shall become invalid.
  - (2) If a resident's permit is lost or destroyed, the resident's permit holder may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate resident's permit and the Council or authorised

agent, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate resident's permit, so marked, and upon such issue the resident's permit shall become invalid.

(3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate resident's permit and an application for a duplicate resident's permit, as if it were a resident's permit or, as the case may be, an application for a resident's permit.

#### **Application for and issue of business permits**

- 29. (1) A business user who uses a vehicle of a class specified in Article 11(2 that:-
  - (a) is essential to the operation of a business carried out at any premises the postal address of which is in a street or property specified in Schedule 14; and
  - (b) is used for the purchase or sale of goods or services or for delivering goods or providing a service, in connection with that business –

may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue of a business permit in respect of that vehicle and any such application shall be made on a form obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the remittance of the relevant charge specified in Schedule 15:-

- (2) On receipt of an application for a business permit or after the issue of a business permit, the Council or authorised agent may at any time require an applicant for a business permit or a business permit holder, as the case may be, to produce to an officer of the Council or a representative of the authorised agent:-
  - (a) in respect of any application, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify the details of that application; or
  - (b) in respect of any business permit that has been issued, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify that the business permit is valid.
- (3) Subject to the number of permits issued to a single business normally being limited to 6, on receipt of an application made under the provisions of this Article and on receipt of the charge specified in Schedule 15, the Council or authorised agent, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a business user and uses the vehicle in respect of which the application is made and the vehicle is of a class specified in Article 11(2) shall issue to the applicant:-
  - (a) business permits for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Part A of Schedule 2 and Schedule 4 inclusive, of the vehicle to which such business permit relates, by the business permit holder or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the business permit holder, other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward; and
  - (b) protective covers in which the business permit(s) must be displayed.

#### Surrender, withdrawal and validity of business permits

- 30. (1) A business permit holder may surrender a business permit to the Council or authorised agent at any time and shall surrender a business permit to the Council or authorised agent on the occurrence of any one of the following events:
  - (a) the business permit holder ceasing to be a business user;
  - (b) the business permit holder ceasing to be the user of the vehicle in respect of which the business permit was issued;

- (c) the withdrawal of such business permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article;
- (d) the vehicle in respect of which such business permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified in Article 11(2); or
- (e) the issue of a duplicate business permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of Article 31 save where the permit has been lost or destroyed.
- (2) The Council or authorised agent may, by notice in writing served on the business permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to the business permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the business permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode or business, withdraw a business permit if it appears to the Council or authorised agent that any of the events set out in paragraph (1)(a), (1)(b) or (1)(d) of this Article has occurred and the business permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.
- (3) Where a business permit is issued to any person upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured, the business permit shall cease to be of any effect and the Council or authorised agent shall, by notice served on the person to whom such business permit was issued, by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to him or her at the address shown by that person on the application for the business permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode or business, require that person to surrender the business permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.
- (4) A business permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified on it or on the occurrence of one or more of the events referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article, whichever is the sooner

#### Application for and issue of duplicate business permits

- 31 (1) If a business permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the business permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the business permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or authorised agent or apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate business permit and the Council or authorised agent, upon receipt of the business permit, shall issue a duplicate business permit, so marked, and upon such issue the business permit shall become invalid.
  - (2) If a business permit is lost or destroyed, the business permit holder may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate business permit and the Council or authorised agent, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate business permit, so marked, and upon such issue the business permit shall become invalid.
  - (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate business permit and an application for a duplicate business permit, as if it were a business permit or, as the case may be, an application for a business permit.

## Application for and issue of doctor's permits

- 32. (1) A medical practice at which are based doctors who are liable to be called, of necessity to emergencies away from the medical practice and who use vehicles of a class specified in Article 11(2 for the purpose of such emergencies and are based at a medical practice the postal address of which is in a street or property specified in Schedule 14 and may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue of a doctor's permits in respect of those vehicles and any such application shall be made on a form obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the remittance of the relevant charge specified in Schedule 15:-
  - (2) On receipt of an application for a doctor's permit or after the issue of a doctor's permit, the

Council or authorised agent may at any time require an applicant for a doctor's permit or a doctor's permit holder, as the case may be, to produce to an officer of the Council or a representative of the authorised agent:-

- (a) in respect of any application, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify the details of that application; or
- (b) in respect of any doctor's permit that has been issued, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify that the doctor's permit is valid.
- (3) On receipt of an application made under the provisions of this Article and on receipt of the charge specified in Schedule 15, the Council or authorised agent, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a medical practice and whose doctors use the vehicles in respect of which the application is made for the purpose of emergencies and the vehicles are of a class specified in Article 11(3), shall issue to the applicant:-
  - (a) a maximum of one permit for each 5 metre length of doctor's bay and one spare permit leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Schedule 12 inclusive, of the vehicle to which such doctor's permit relates, by the doctor's permit holder or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the doctor's permit holder, other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward; and
  - (b) protective covers in which the doctor's permit(s) must be displayed.

## Surrender, withdrawal and validity of doctor's permits

- 33. (1) A doctor's permit holder may surrender a doctor's permit to the Council or authorised agent at any time and shall surrender a doctor's permit to the Council or authorised agent on the occurrence of any one of the following events:
  - (a) the withdrawal of such doctor's permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article;
  - (b) the vehicle in respect of which such doctor's permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified in Article 12(l);
  - (c) the issue of a duplicate doctor's permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of Article 35 save where the permit has been lost or destroyed.
  - (2) The Council or authorised agent may, by notice in writing served on the doctor's permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to the medical practice at the address shown by that person on the application for the doctor's permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode or business, withdraw a doctor's permit if it appears to the Council or authorised agent that any of the events set out in paragraph (1)(a), (1)(b) or (1)(c)) of this Article has occurred and the doctor's permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.
  - (3) Where a doctor's permit is issued to a medical practice upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured, the doctor's permit shall cease to be of any effect and the Council or authorised agent shall, by notice served on the person to whom such doctor's permit was issued, by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to him or her at the address shown by that person on the application for the doctor's permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode or business, require that person to surrender the doctor's permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.
  - (4) A doctor's permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified on it or on the occurrence of one or more of the events referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article, whichever is the sooner.

## Application for and issue of duplicate doctor's permits

- 34. (1) If a doctor's permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the doctor's permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the doctor's permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or authorised agent or apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate doctor's permit and the Council or authorised agent, upon receipt of the doctor's permit, shall issue a duplicate doctor's permit, so marked, and upon such issue the doctor's permit shall become invalid.
  - (2) If a doctor's permit is lost or destroyed, the doctor's permit holder may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate doctor's permit and the Council or authorised agent, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate doctor's permit, so marked, and upon such issue the doctor's permit shall become invalid.
  - (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate doctor's permit and an application for a duplicate doctor's permit, as if it were a doctor's permit or, as the case may be, an application for a doctor's permit.

## Application for and issue of voluntary sector worker permits

- 35. (1) A person working for a religious or voluntary sector organisation who uses a vehicle of a class specified in Article 11(2) to provide service to a resident in any street or property specified in Schedule 14 may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue of a voluntary sector worker permits in respect of that vehicle and any such application shall be made on a form obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied.
  - (2) On receipt of an application for a voluntary sector worker permit or after the issue of a voluntary sector permit, the Council or authorised agent may at any time require an applicant for a voluntary sector permit or a voluntary sector worker permit holder, as the case may be, to produce to an officer of the Council or a representative of the authorised agent:-
    - (a) in respect of any application, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify the details of that application; or
    - (b) in respect of any voluntary sector worker permit that has been issued, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify that the voluntary sector worker permit is valid.
  - (3) On receipt of an application made under the provisions of this Article the Council or authorised agent, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a voluntary sector worker and uses the vehicle in respect of which the application is made and the vehicle is of a class specified in Article 11(2), shall issue to the applicant:-
    - (a) a voluntary sector permit for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Part A of Schedule 2 and Schedule 4 inclusive, of the vehicle to which such voluntary sector worker permit relates, by the voluntary sector worker permit holder or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the voluntary sector worker permit holder, other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward; and
    - (b) a protective cover in which the voluntary sector worker permit must be displayed.

## Surrender, withdrawal and validity of voluntary sector worker permits

36. (1) A voluntary sector worker permit holder may surrender a voluntary sector worker permit to the Council or authorised agent at any time and shall surrender a voluntary sector worker permit to the Council or authorised agent on the occurrence of any one of the following events:

- (a) the withdrawal of such voluntary sector worker permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article;
- (b) the vehicle in respect of which such voluntary sector worker permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified in Article 12(1);
- (c) the issue of a duplicate voluntary sector worker permit by the Council or authorised agent under the provisions of Article 31 save where the permit is lost or destroyed.
- (2) The Council or authorised agent may, by notice in writing served on the voluntary sector permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to the voluntary sector worker permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the voluntary sector worker permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode or business, withdraw a voluntary sector worker permit if it appears to the Council or authorised agent that any of the events set out in paragraph (1)(a), (1)(b) or (1)(c) of this Article has occurred and the voluntary sector worker permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.
- (3) A voluntary sector worker permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified on it or on the occurrence of one or more of the events referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article, whichever is the sooner.

## Application for and issue of duplicate voluntary sector worker permits

- 37. (1) If a voluntary sector worker permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the voluntary sector worker permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the voluntary sector worker permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or authorised agent or apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate voluntary sector worker permit and the Council or authorised agent, upon receipt of the voluntary sector worker permit, shall issue a duplicate voluntary sector worker permit, so marked, and upon such issue the voluntary sector worker permit shall become invalid.
  - (2) If a voluntary sector worker permit is lost or destroyed, the voluntary sector worker permit holder may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to them of a duplicate voluntary sector worker permit and the Council or authorised agent, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate voluntary sector worker permit, so marked, and upon such issue the voluntary sector worker permit shall become invalid.
  - (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate voluntary sector worker permit and an application for a duplicate voluntary sector worker permit, as if it were a voluntary sector worker permit or, as the case may be, an application for a voluntary sector worker permit.

## Application for and issue of day permits

38. (1) An employer, hotelier or resident may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue of a day permit for use by either a concessionaire, health care worker, hotel guest, resident's visitor or tradesperson, as the case may be, in respect of a vehicle of a class specified in Article 11(2) being used by that person and any such application shall be made on a form obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the remittance of the relevant charge specified in Schedule 15.

Providing that the quota of day permits issued to either a concessionaire, health care worker, hotel guest, resident's visitor or tradesperson, that the Council may from time to time resolve to limit, has not been exceeded.

(2) On receipt of an application made under the provisions of this Article and of the relevant charge specified in Schedule 15 and on being satisfied that the applicant is either a concessionaire, health care worker, hotel guest, resident's visitor or tradesperson and that they satisfy the Council's

criteria, the Council or authorised agent shall issue to the applicant a book of ten appropriate day permits, or in the case of a tradesperson, a book of five day permits, for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Part A of Schedule 2 and Schedule 4 inclusive of vehicles of a class specified in Article 11(2)

Provided that the Council or authorised agent shall not issue more than the quota of day permits that the Council may from time to time resolve to supply.

- (3) The Council may at any time require an applicant for day permits to produce to an officer of the Council or the authorised agent such evidence in respect of an application for day permits as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any day permits issued by them as they may reasonably call for to verify that the day permits are valid.
- (4) A resident visitor, heath care worker or tradesperson's permit shall be valid during the permitted hours from the beginning of the day on which it is first validated by the day permit holder until 10 a.m. on the following day.
- (5) A hotel guest permit shall be valid during the permitted hours from the beginning of the day on which it is first validated by the day permit holder until 11 a.m. on the following day.

## Surrender, withdrawal and validity of day permits

- 39. (1) An employer, hotelier or resident may surrender a day permit to the Council or authorised agent at any time and shall surrender a day permit to the Council or authorised agent on ceasing to be either a concessionaire, health care worker, hotel guest, resident's visitor or tradesperson.
  - (2) The Council or authorised agent may, by notice in writing served on the day permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to the day permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the day permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, withdraw all day permits if it appears to the Council or authorised agent that the person has ceased to be a day permit holder and they shall surrender the permits to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice.

## Refunds of charges paid for resident's permits and business permits

40. A resident's permit holder or a business permit holder who surrenders a resident's permit or a business permit respectively to the Council or authorised agent, shall be entitled to a refund of the charge paid or part of the charge paid, in accordance with the provisions set out in Schedule 15.

## Restriction on the removal of permits

41. Where a resident's permit, a business permit or a day permit has been displayed in accordance with the provisions of Article 12, no person not being the driver of the vehicle shall remove that permit unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to a parking attendant or a police officer in uniform or any other person removing the vehicle in pursuance of an arrangement made under regulations in pursuance of powers contained in sections 99, 100 and 101 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

## Form of permits

- 42. (1) A resident's permit or a business permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
  - (a) the registration mark(s) of the vehicle(s) in respect of which the permit has been issued;
  - (b) the period during which the permit shall remain valid, subject to the provisions of Article 26 or 29 as the case may be;

- (c) an indication that the permit has been issued by the Council or authorised agent; and
- (d) an indication of the parking sub-zone or sub-zones within which the permit is valid.
- (2) A voluntary sector worker's or a doctor's permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
  - (a) the period during which the permit shall remain valid, subject to the provisions of Article 35 or 32, as the case may be;
  - (c) an indication that the permit has been issued by the Council or authorised agent; and
  - (d) an indication of the parking sub-zone or sub-zones within which the permit is valid.
- (3) A day permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
  - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been validated;
  - (b) the date on which the permit has been validated;
  - (c) an indication that the permit has been issued by the Council or authorised agent; and
  - (d) an indication of the parking sub-zone or sub-zones within which the permit is valid.
- (4) The particulars specified in paragraphs 3(a) and (b) of this Article are to be completed by the person who applied for the day permit before the permit is displayed in accordance with the provisions of Article 12.

#### Section 4 – Enforcement

## **Amount of excess charge**

44. The excess charge for contraventions committed in designated parking places shall be as set out in Schedule 15 to this Order.
