ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
The East Sussex (Lewes District)(Traffic Regulation) Order 2004 (as amended)
(Amendment No.1)(Part1) Order 2011

East Sussex County Council, in exercise of their powers under sections under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), as amended, and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act and Traffic Management Act 2004, hereby make the following Order:-

1. In this Order

"disabled person" and "disabled person's badge" have the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's concession" has the meaning given by Section 117(3) of the 1984 Act;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge and which is a vehicle which, immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 to be included in an Order under the Act of 1984, has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case may be, has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers;

" parking disc" means a device which-

(a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue, if issued on or after 1 April 2000; and

(b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and

(c) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun; and

"relevant position" means for the purposes of this regulation, In the case of a Disabled Person's Badge -

(a) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from the outside the vehicle; or

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.

(b) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

2. Save as provided in Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
- (f) the vehicle to be used for emergency services purposes.

4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding one hour (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).

5. This Order shall come into operation on 18th March 2011 and may be cited as The East Sussex (Lewes District) (Traffic Regulation) Order 2004 (as amended) (Amendment No.1)(Part1) Order 2011.

6. The lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be added to Schedule 1A of the "The East Sussex (Lewes District)(Traffic Regulation) Order 2004 Amendment Order 2005 No.1" in the correct alphabetical sequence.

Seaford Avondale Road -	South West Side	from a point opposite the north eastern boundary of No. 4 High Point, south westwards for a distance of 11 metres.
	South East Side	from the north eastern boundary of No. 4 High point, south westwards for a distance of 47 metres.
Blatchington Road -	North East Side	from its junction with Blatchington Hill, southwards for a distance of 15 metres.
	North West Side	From its junction with Blatchington Hill, southwards for a distance of 26.5 metres.
Blatchington Hill -	East Side	15 metres north of the northern kerbline of Homefield Road, southwards for a distance of 31 metres.
Avondale Road/ Blatchington Hill -	East Side	From a point 17.5 metres north of the northern kerbline of Sutton Drove, southwards and

			south westwards for a distance of 132.5 metres.
	West Side		From a point 17.5 metres north of the northern kerbline of Sutton Drove, south eastwards and south westwards for a distance of 102 metres.
Homefield Road -	Both Sides		From its junction with Blatchington Hill, eastwards for a distance of 10 metres.
Grosvenor Road -	North West Side		From a point 24 metres northeast of its junction with Claremont Road, north eastwards for a distance of 12 metres.
	South East Side		From a point 15 metres northeast of its junction with Claremont Road, north eastwards for a distance of 18 metres.
Alfriston Road -	East Side		From a point 15 metres south east of its junction with the south eastern kerbline of Sandore Road, southwards and south eastwards to its junction with the A259 Sutton Road.
	West Side		From a point 90 metres south east of its junction with the south eastern kerbline of Hindover Road, southwards and south eastwards to its junction with A259 Sutton Road.
Sutton Drove -	Both Sides		From its junction of Alfriston Road westwards for a distance of 20 metres and to include the entire circumference of the centre island.
	Both Sides		From its junction with Blatchington Hill, eastwards for distance of 15 metres.
Cricketfield Road -	Both Sides		From a point 15 metres south of its junction with Steyne Road, southwards for a distance of 12 metres.
Kingsmead -	Both Sides		From its junction with Belgrave Road north westwards for a distance of 15 metres.
Belgrave Road -	North West Side		From a point 15 metres northeast of the eastern kerbline of Kingsmead, south westwards for a distance of 37 metres.
	South East Side		From a point 15 metres northeast of the eastern kerbline of Kingsmead south westwards for a distance of 37 metres.
