THE BOROUGH OF EASTLEIGH (EASTLEIGH TOWN CENTRE) (OFF-STREET CAR PARKS) ORDER 1985

THE EASTLEIGH BOROUGH COUNCIL (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of their powers under section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers with the consent of the Hampshire County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

PART I

GENERAL

1. COMMENCEMENT AND CITATION

The provisions of this Order shall come into operation on  
and the Order may be cited as the Borough of Eastleigh (Eastleigh Town Centre, Off Street Car Parks) Order 1985

2. INTERPRETATION

(1) In this Order except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"car park permit" means a ticket or card issued by the Council in respect of a particular vehicle which entitles the holder to leave that vehicle in a parking place at any time in accordance with the provisions of this Order up to and including the date of expiry as shown on the ticket;

"charging hours" means the periods as specified in column 5 of the Schedule to this Order during which a charge as specified in column 6 of the Schedule to this Order is payable for leaving a vehicle of a class as specified in column 3 of the Schedule to this Order in a parking place;

"disabled persons badge" has the meaning assigned to it by The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;

"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"motor cycle" means a two-wheeled mechanically propelled vehicle not having a sidecar or trailer attached thereto;

"parking place" means the area specified by name in column 1 of the First Schedule to this Order provided by the Council under section 32(1) of the Act for use as a parking place;

"parking attendant" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and control vehicles in any parking place;

"ticket machine" means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment for the purpose of this Order being an apparatus designed to issue parking tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the date and time at which the charge was paid

(2) The Orders made under section 31 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 and as set out in the second schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

## PART II

### USE OF PARKING PLACES

#### 3. USE OF AREAS AS PARKING PLACES

The area specified by name in column 1 of the First Schedule to this Order may be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a parking place for such classes of vehicles in such manner and on payment of such charges on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to the area in the said Schedule.

#### 4. CLASS AND POSITION OF VEHICLES

Where in the First Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place -

- (a) unless it is of the specified class; or
- (b) in a position other than that specified

#### 5. TRAILERS

The driver of a vehicle drawing a trailer shall not permit the vehicle or the trailer to wait in a parking place unless they have been disconnected and for the purpose of this Order the vehicle and the trailer shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the said driver shall be deemed to be the driver of each of the said vehicles.

#### 6. USE OF VEHICLES IN PARKING PLACE

- (1) No person shall use a vehicle while it is in a parking place as a dwelling or for any domestic or sanitary purposes
- (2) No person shall use a vehicle while it is in a parking place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services other than with the consent of the Council

#### 7. DRIVING OF VEHICLES IN PARKING PLACES

No person shall except with the permission of a parking attendant drive any vehicles in parking places other than for the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.

#### 8. REPAIR OF VEHICLES IN PARKING PLACES

No person shall while a vehicle is in a parking place permit the carrying out of any work either of maintenance or repair thereto or of any other nature whatsoever except such as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to depart from the parking place.

#### 9. AMOUNT OF CHARGE AT PARKING PLACES

The charge for a vehicle left in a parking place for any period during the charging hours shall be as specified in column 6 of the First Schedule to this Order.

10. PARKING TICKETS

(1) The charge specified in Article 9 of this Order shall be paid on the leaving of a vehicle in a parking place during the charging hours by the insertion into the ticket machine of a coin or coins making up the amount of the charge for the period for which payment is being made

(2) Upon payment of the charge for a vehicle left in a parking place during the charging hours the driver thereof shall exhibit the ticket in a conspicuous position to the vehicle in respect of which it was issued

11. RESTRICTION ON REMOVAL OF TICKETS

When a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 10 of this Order no person shall remove the ticket from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place

12. EXCESS CHARGE

(1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours for a period longer than that for which payment was made an excess charge of £10.00 shall be payable *Amended*

(2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge has been incurred it shall be the duty of a parking attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:-

- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
- (b) the time at which it was noticed that the excess charge had been incurred;
- (c) a statement that an excess charge of £10.00 *Amended* is required to be paid;
- (d) the manner in which and the time within which the excess charge should be paid; and
- (e) a statement that it is an offence under section 35(4) of the Act for the driver of a vehicle who has left the vehicle in a parking place to fail to pay the excess charge

13. MANNER OF PAYMENT OF EXCESS CHARGE

The driver of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge has been incurred shall pay the excess charge to the Council either by cheque or postal order which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the Director of Finance's Department of the Council not later than 10.00 a.m. on the Tenth day following the day on which the excess charge was incurred or in cash in person at the said Department not later than aforesaid

PROVIDED THAT if the Tenth day falls upon a day on which the said Department is closed the period within which payment of the excess charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until 10.00 a.m. on the next full day on which the said Department is open



14. RESTRICTION ON REMOVAL OF NOTICES

Where a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 12 of this Order no person not being a parking attendant shall remove the notice from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place

15. EXEMPTION FROM CHARGES

(1) If at a time when a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours all the ticket machines at that parking place carry notices placed upon them by a person duly authorised by the Council indicating that they are out of order the driver of that vehicle shall be exempt from payment of the charge

(2) Any vehicle left in a parking place during the charging hours shall be exempt from the payment of any charges specified in column 6 of the First Schedule to this order if a current disabled person's badge is being displayed on the vehicle

(3) (i) Any vehicle left in a parking place shall be exempt from the payment of any charges specified in column 6 of the First Schedule to this Order if a current car park permit has been obtained and is being displayed on the vehicle

(ii) Car park permits shall be displayed in the same manner as that prescribed in Article 10 for the display of parking tickets purchased from the ticket machine

16. RESERVED PARKING BAYS

(1) No person other than the driver of a vehicle of the type specified in the second paragraph of Article 15 of this Order shall leave a vehicle in any parking bays in a parking place which are clearly shown as being reserved for disabled drivers

(2) No person other than the holder of a certificate issued by the Borough Council shall be permitted to park in those parking bays reserved for "Contract Parking" between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. Monday to Friday

17. REMOVAL OF VEHICLES FROM PARKING PLACES

When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of Articles 4 5 or 16 of this Order a parking attendant may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place

PROVIDED THAT where a vehicle is left in a parking place in a position other than that specified in column 2 of the First Schedule to this Order a parking attendant may move the vehicle or cause it to be moved to a position which complies with that specified in column 2 of the said First Schedule

18. MOVEMENT OF VEHICLES IN A PARKING PLACE IN EMERGENCIES

A parking attendant may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency to any place he thinks fit vehicles left in a parking place

19. MANNER OF MOVING VEHICLES

Any person removing or altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of Article

17 or Article 18 of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or any such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its positions

20. SAFE CUSTODY OF VEHICLES

When a parking attendant removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 17 of this Order he shall make such arrangements as may be necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle

21. ENTRY AND EXIT

Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of -

- (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place; or
- (b) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place;

no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle

- (i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance; or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit so indicated; or
- (ii) in a direction other than that specified

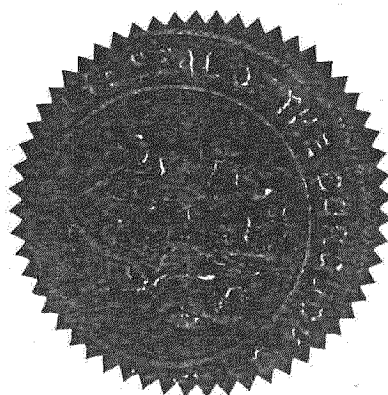
