THE BOROUGH OF EASTLEIGH (EASTLEIGH TOWN CENTRE) CONSOLIDATION ORDER 2008

The Council of the Borough of Eastleigh (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Hampshire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46 and 51 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

PART I- GENERAL

Commencement and Citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on 4 August 2008 and may be cited as the "Borough of Eastleigh (Eastleigh Town Centre) Consolidation Order 2008".

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"civil enforcement officer" shall have the same meaning as in section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"charged parking place" means a parking place referred to in the Fifth and Fourteenth (Part B) Schedules;

"chargeable hours" means between the hours and on the days specified in the Fifth and Fourteenth (Part B)Schedules;

"disabled parking disc" means a device which:-

- (a) is coloured blue;
- (b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
- (c) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun.

"disabled person's badge" means a badge which was-

(a) issued, or has effect as if issued, to a disabled person or an institution under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 or under regulations having effect in Scotland or

Wales under section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970; and

(b) has not ceased to be in force;

as defined in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled persons parking place" means each of the various areas of land specified in the Thirteenth Schedule to this Order;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled persons badge, as defined under Section 142 of the Act;

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place or street or part of a street specified in this Order, means the person in charge of the vehicle at the same time it was left in the parking place or street or part of a street aforesaid;

"entrance marking" means any area designated as such by Article 45 of this Order and are contained in the Fifteenth Schedule of this Order;

"goods" includes all chattels personal, other than things in action and money, including postal packets of any description and "delivery and collection", in relation to any goods, includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"goods vehicle" means a vehicle not exceeding 3.5 tonnes max gross weight and which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, and is not a drawing trailer;

"hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in the Town Police Clauses Act 1947 and The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976;

"invalid carriage" means a mechanically propelled vehicle of which the weight unladen does not exceed 254 kilograms and which is specially designed and constructed, and not merely adapted, for the use of a person suffering from some physical default or disability and is used solely by such person as defined in Section 136 of the Act;

"licensed taxi" has the same meaning as in section 13(3)(a) of the Transport Act 1985;

"loading bay" means an area on the highway designated and described as a loading bay by Article 13 and are contained in the Ninth, Tenth and Fourteenth Part C Schedules of this Order:

"motorcycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an invalid carriage) with fewer than 4 wheels, of which the weight unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms as defined in Section 136 of the Act;

"owner", in relation to a vehicle, means the person named in the vehicle registration document or the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used:

"parking charge" for a vehicle left in a charged parking place shall be determined by reference to the Fifth and Fourteenth (Part B) Schedules;

"parking period" for a vehicle left in a charged parking place shall be determined by reference to the Fifth and Fourteenth (Part B) Schedules;

"parking place" means an area on the highway designated and described as a parking place by any of the various Articles or Schedules of this Order including Motorcycle Bays and Disabled Persons Parking Places;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

"parking ticket" means a ticket issued by a ticket machine relating to a parking place;

"passenger vehicle" means a vehicle (other than a motorcycle or invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver, and not drawing a trailer;

"permitted hours" means between the times specified in the various Articles and Schedules to this Order.

"postal packet" means a letter, parcel, packet or other article transmissible by post as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000

"relevant position" in relation to a parking ticket means the ticket is exhibited on the dashboard or facia or windscreen of the vehicle, so that the front of the ticket is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle at all times.

"restricted zone" is all the lengths of road specified in the Fourteenth Schedule

"taxi rank" means any road or length of road or side of road appointed as a stand for hackney carriages by Article 25 of this Order;

"telecommunication apparatus" has the same meaning as in Section 4 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;

"ticket machine" means apparatus designed to indicate the time and to issue parking tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the period in respect of which it has been paid; "vehicle" means a motor vehicle and "motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Act.

"verge" means any unmetalled area between the edge of the carriageway and the highway boundary.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if it is displayed in accordance with The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.
- (3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
- (4) The conditions, provisions, prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other such matter imposed by any Order or regulation made, or having effect as if made, under the Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.
- (5) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

PART II- PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING, INCLUDING A BAN ON LOADING AND UNLOADING

No Waiting

- 3. Save as provided in Articles 10 and 29 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait-
 - (a) at any time in the roads, on the sides of roads, or in any of the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule and the Fourteenth Schedule Part A to this Order:
 - (b) between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm on any day other than a Sunday in the roads, on the sides of roads, or in any lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule to this Order;
 - (c) between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday in the roads, on the sides of roads, or in any lengths of roads specified in the Third Schedule to this Order;
 - (d) between the hours of 8.00am and 8.00pm on any day other than a Sunday in the roads, on the sides of roads or in any lengths of roads specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

Charged Parking Places

4. (1) Each of the parts of road specified in the Fifth and Fourteenth (Part B) Schedules is to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order and are hereby designed as charged parking places on such days, during

such hours and for such parking charges as are specified in those Schedules in relation to that part of the road in the said Schedules.

- (2) Nothing in paragraph (1) of this Article shall restrict the power of the Council to close any parking place.
- 5. Save as provided in Articles 11 and 29 of this Order no person shall, except on direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait during the chargeable hours in a charged parking place described in the Fifth or Fourteenth (Part B) unless it is a vehicle of appropriate class for that parking place and unless the parking charge has been paid in accordance with the Fifth and Fourteenth (Part B) Schedules.
- 6. Provided always that the payment of the parking charge shall be indicated by the vehicle displaying in the relevant position at all times whilst so parked a parking ticket issued by the ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle has been left.
- 7. Each of the parts of road specified in the Sixth, Eleventh, Thirteenth and the Fourteenth (Parts D & E) Schedules to this Order is to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as street parking for the parking during the permitted hours by such classes of vehicles specified in relation to that part of the road in the said Schedules.
- 8. Save as provided in Articles 11 and 29 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm on any day other than a Sunday on the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in the Fifth and Fourteenth (Part B) Schedules to this Order-
 - (a) for a longer period than 1 hour; or
 - (b) if a period of less than 2 hours have elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on those sides of roads or in those lengths of roads.
- 9. Save as provided in Articles 11 and 29 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in the Sixth Schedule to this Order-
 - (a) for a longer period than 1 hour; or
 - (b) if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on those sides of roads or in those lengths of roads.

Exemptions for Disabled Persons Vehicles

- 10. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge and a disabled parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) issued by any local authority to wait on the sides of roads referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road.
- 11. Nothing in Articles 5, 8 and 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge to wait on the sides of roads referred to in that Article.

Prohibition on Loading and Unloading

- 12. No person shall cause goods to be loaded or unloaded from a vehicle:
 - (a) at any time on the sides of the roads or in the lengths of roads specified in the Seventh Schedule to this Order;
 - (b) between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm on any day other than a Sunday the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in the Eighth Schedule to this Order.

Designation of Loading Bays

- 13. Each of the parts of roads specified in the Ninth, Tenth and the Fourteenth Part C Schedule to this Order is hereby designated as and is authorised to be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a loading bay.
- 14. Save as provided in Article 29 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the loading bays specified in the Ninth and the Fourteenth Part C Schedule to this Order unless loading or unloading is taking place.
- 15. Save as provided in Article 29 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the loading bays on any day other than a Sunday between 8.00am and 6.00pm specified in the Ninth Schedule to this Order unless loading or unloading is taking place.

Designation of Motorcycle Bays

16. Each of the parts of roads specified in the Eleventh and Fourteenth Part D Schedule to this Order are hereby designated as, and is authorised to be

- used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a parking place for motorcycles.
- 17. Save as provided in Article 29 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit any motorcycle to wait between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm on any day other than a Sunday on the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in the Eleventh Schedule to this Order-
 - (a) for a longer period than 30 minutes; or
 - (b) if a period of less than 30 minutes has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the motorcycle on those sides of roads or in those lengths of roads.
- 18.Save as provided in Article 29 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit any motorcycle to wait between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm on any day other than a Sunday on the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in Part D of the Fourteenth Schedule to this Order-
 - (a) for a longer period than 1 hour; or
 - (b) if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the motorcycle on those sides of roads or in those lengths of roads.

PART III- DISABLED PERSONS PARKING PLACES

- 19. Each of the parts of roads specified in the Thirteenth Schedule and the Fourteenth Part E Schedule to this Order are hereby designated as, and is authorised to be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a street disabled persons parking place for disabled persons vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that part of the road in the said Schedule.
- 20. Nothing in Article 19 of this Order shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets, by Order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, to close any disabled persons parking place.
- 21. At all times which a vehicle is left in a disabled persons parking place during the permitted hours there shall be displayed in the relevant position a valid disabled persons badge.
- 22. Where a disabled persons badge has been displayed on the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of this Order, no person, not

being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the badge from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.

Ticket Machines

- 23. There shall be a ticket machine on or in the vicinity of each of the parking places referred to in the Fifth and Fourteenth Part B Schedules to this Order.
- 24. No parking charge shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a charged parking place during the chargeable hours if:
 - (a) At the time the vehicle was left in that charged parking place there was on that ticket machine relating to that charged parking place a notice placed by a civil enforcement officer or any person duly authorised by the Council indicating that the ticket machine relating to that charged parking place was out of order; and
 - (b) There is no other ticket machine available to be used for that charged parking place; and
 - (c) The vehicle is removed within one hour of the ticket machine defect being rectified.

PART IV- DESIGNATION OF TAXI RANKS

- 25. Each of the parts of roads specified in the Twelfth Schedule to this Order are hereby designated as, and is authorised to be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a taxi rank for hackney carriages on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that part of the road in the said Schedule.
- 26. Save as provided in Article 27 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle other than a hackney carriage to stop or wait during the period indicated on a taxi rank.
- 27. Nothing in Article 25 and 26 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on a taxi rank-
 - (a) if the vehicle is being used in connection with any of the following operations and it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road:
 - i. building, industrial or demolition operation;
 - ii. the removal of any obstruction by traffic;
 - iii. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road or length of road;
 - iv. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said sides of roads or lengths of roads of any sewer or of

- any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus;
- (b) if the vehicle is being used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and it cannot be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road;
- (c) if the vehicle is being used for Fire Brigades, Ambulance or Police purposes.
- (d) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his or her control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
- (e) if the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (2) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 35 of the Act.
- 28. The following Part V to this Order, except Articles 29, 32 and 41 will apply to taxi ranks as if where the words "parking place or loading bay" and "vehicle" were substituted by "taxi rank" and "hackney carriage" respectively.

PART V- AUTHORISATION AND USE

General Exemptions

- 29. Nothing in Part II of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as is necessary to enable-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - i. building, industrial or demolition operation;
 - ii. the removal of any obstruction by traffic;
 - iii. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road or length of road;
 - iv. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said sides of roads or lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000; or

(f) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigades, Ambulance or Police purposes.

Use of Parking Places

- 30. Where in the Articles and Schedules to this Order a parking place or loading bay is described as available for vehicles of a specified class, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place or loading bay unless it is:
 - (a) of the specified class; and
 - (b) parked wholly within the limits of the parking place or loading bay.
- 31. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place or loading bay:
 - (a) so as to unreasonably prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance:
 - (b) when the Council has closed that parking place or loading bay.
- 32. The driver of a vehicle using a parking place or loading bay shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place or loading bay, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or depart from the parking place or loading bay.
- 33. When a vehicle is left in a parking place or loading bay in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Article 30 or Article 31 of this Order, a person authorised by the Council to do so may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place or loading bay. Provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place or loading bay in contravention of the provision of Article 30(b) of this Order, a person authorised by the Council to do so may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position shall comply with that provision.
- 34. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Article 33 of this Order may do so in such a manner as appears necessary.
- 35. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place or loading bay by virtue of Article 33 of this Order, that person shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

Placing of Traffic Signs

36. The Council shall:

(a) cause the limits of each parking place or loading bay to be indicated on the carriageway by placing and maintaining thereon traffic signs of any

- size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the Act:
- (b) place and maintain on or in the vicinity of each parking place or loading bay traffic signs of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the Act indicating that such parking place or loading bay may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified by this Order; and
- (c) carry out such other works as are reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place or loading bay.

Manner of Standing in Parking Places

- 37. Every vehicle left in a parking place or loading bay in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall so stand, in the case of any parking place or loading bay:-
 - (a) That except where the limits of the parking place or loading bay are marked out otherwise the left or nearside of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway and that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres;
 - (b) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the parking place or loading bay.

Alteration of Position of Vehicles in Parking Places

38. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place or loading bay in contravention of the provisions of the last preceding Article of this Order a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with these provisions.

Removal of Vehicles from Parking Places

39. Where a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil enforcement officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Article 43(1) of this Order have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place or loading bay, he or she may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking place or loading bay, and where it is so removed shall provide for safe custody of the vehicle.

Movement of Vehicles in Parking Places in Emergencies

40. A Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may remove or cause to be moved in cases of emergency, to any place he or she thinks fit, any vehicle left in a parking place or loading bay.

Power to Suspend the Use of Parking Places

- 41.(1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or loading bay or of any part thereof whenever he or she considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or loading bay or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or loading bay or adjacent highway or part of the highway or the highway or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place or loading bay of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus or traffic sign;
 - (c) for the purpose of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository provided that such removal is for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place or loading bay;
 - (d) for the purpose that any street may be thronged or obstructed by reason of some special attraction;
 - (e) for the purpose of parking at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions provided that such parking is for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place or loading bay;
 - (2) A Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may suspend for not longer than 24 hours the use of a parking place or loading bay or any part thereof whenever he or she considers that such suspension is reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting safety.
 - (3) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or loading bay or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or loading bay or a part thereof the use of which is suspended a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
 - (4) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any parking place or loading bay or part of a parking place or loading bay during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or loading bay or part of a parking place or loading bay a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article provided that nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes or any vehicle being used for any purpose specified in Article 43(1)(b), (d) or (e) of this Order to be left in the parking place or loading bay or part of a parking place or loading bay during any such period, or to cause or to permit any other vehicle to be so left if that vehicle is left with the permission:-

- (a) of the person suspending the use of the parking place or loading bay or a part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article,
- (b) of a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer.

Restriction of Use of Vehicles at Parking Places

- 42.(1) No person shall use any vehicle, whilst it is in a parking place or loading bay during the permitted hours, in connection with the sale of any article to any person in or near the parking place or loading bay or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of a skill or handicraft or service in any other capacity.
 - (2) Provided that nothing in Part (1) of this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle if the vehicle is a passenger vehicle, goods vehicle of any weight or motorcycle or invalid carriage and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into the premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.

Restriction of Waiting of Vehicles in Parking Places

- 43.(1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order with respect to vehicles left in parking places or loading bays in accordance with those provisions, any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere on the carriageway in a parking place or loading bay, other than a parking place or loading bay, or part of a parking place or loading bay the use of which has been suspended, if:-
 - (a) the vehicle is waiting only so long a is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his or her control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
 - (c) the vehicle is a vehicle used for Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes or a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of the local authority or water authority or a vehicle in the service of the Police Force in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers of duties;
 - (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (e) the vehicle is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place or loading bay in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle, or, having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting;
 - (f) the vehicle is in use in connection with the servicing of telephone kiosks;
 - (g) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 41(1) of this Order;

- (h) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or household to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- (i) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the posting or removing of advertising materials in the form of posters, or cleaning windows or chimneys in premises adjacent to the parking place or loading bay in which the vehicle is waiting; or
- (j) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for as long as is necessary for the purpose of delivery or collection of goods or mechanise, including, as far as a bank is concerned, cash or other valuables or valuable securities, or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place or loading bay in which the vehicle is waiting.
- (2) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 35 of the Act.

PART VI- PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON ENTRANCE MARKINGS

- 44. Save as provided in Article 45 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or remain at rest on an entrance marking at any time on the roads specified in the Fifteenth Schedule to this Order;
- 45. Nothing in Article 44 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to stop or wait on an entrance marking:
 - (a) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his or her control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
 - (b) the vehicle is a vehicle used for Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes or a vehicle in the service of the Police Force in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - i. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road or length of road;
 - ii. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said sides of roads or lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus;

PART VII- PROHIBITION OF VERGE PARKING

- 46. Save as provided in Article 47 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the verge of any of the roads the Sixteenth Schedule to this Order.
- 47. Nothing in Article 46 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the verge of roads referred to therein for so long as is necessary to enable-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - i. the removal of any obstruction by traffic;
 - ii. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road or length of road;
 - iii. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said sides of roads or lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000; or
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigades, Ambulance or Police purposes.

PART VIII- REVOCATION OF EXISTING TRAFFIC REGULATION PROVISIONS

- 48. The Orders specified in Column One of the Seventeenth Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked insofar as specified in Column Two of the Seventeenth Schedule.
- 49. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with a provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 and existing at the time when this Order comes into operation and is not revoked by this Order, and which imposes a restriction or prohibition on waiting by vehicles other than stage carriages or express carriages in a bus stop area or grants an exemption from such restriction or prohibition, that provision of that Order shall prevail.
